# Resolution Concerning The Affirmation of Who is Qualified to Pastor

Whereas the matter of who qualifies to be a pastor in the Twin Cities Association of Free Will Baptists continues to be challenged, And whereas the question of what is appropriate for a pastor concerning marriage continues to be brought up for review, and whereas the Twin Cities Association does not have a clear policy concerning whether the pastor may be divorced and remarried, or whether his wife may be divorced and remarried,

Be it resolved that the association affirm its commitment regarding the office of pastor as an office to be held in very high esteem without reproach and affirm the following thoughts to be the policy for pastors.

First, that the Twin Cities, from this day forth, will not ordain a man that is divorced and remarried, nor will it ratify the credentials of an incoming minister who has been divorced and remarried, nor will it sanction any future violation of this standard among its present constituency.

Secondly, that the Twin Cities will not ordain a man whose wife is divorced and remarried, nor will it ratify the credentials of an incoming minister whose wife has been divorced and remarried, nor will it sanction any future violation, from this day forth, of this standard among its present constituency.

Thirdly, that every church in our association refuses to request that the association violates these standards.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Titus 1:7 reads, "For a bishop must be blameless, as the steward of God..." Vines Expository Dictionary of New Testament Words says the word *blameless* "signifies that which can not be called to account...i.e., with nothing laid to one's charge (as the result of a public investigation)...It implies not merely acquittal, but the absence of even a charge or accusation against a person." I Timothy 3:2 & 7 also support the idea that the pastor's office should be clear of reproach, leaving no doubt or question in anyone's mind.

The office of the present day pastor is significantly similar to the office of priest and prophet in the Old Testament. That being the case Leviticus 21:7 demands "They shall not take a wife that is a whore, or profane; neither shall they take a woman put away from her husband: for he is holy unto his God." (See also Leviticus 21:13 & 14). Ezekiel 44:22 teaches the same "Neither shall they take for their wives a widow, nor her that is put away: but they shall take maidens of the seed of the house of Israel, or a widow that had a priest before."

#### General Resolutions

Whereas the minutes of the Twin Cities Association is official documentation for the association, and whereas the minutes contain the officers, board members, etc. for the association, and whereas several other positions of importance to our association are not listed, and whereas other information pertinent to these offices is not included in the minutes,

Be it resolved that all officers, executive board members, ordaining council, state board members, camp director, and youth rally personnel be listed along with the expiration of terms of office.

Be it further resolved that a person, and an assistant, be elected to encourage and oversee registration at each association meeting, and that they submit the statistical information to the clerk as soon as possible during the meeting, and that their terms of office be 2 years, and that their terms be listed along with their names and position in the minutes.

The Mission's Board met on Tuesday July 5<sup>th</sup> at the White Oaks FWB church in Macon. Our two home missionaries were present and we received a report from both of them. Bro. Bill Crank, missionary to Bartow County, Cartersville, gave a good report on the starting of his work in that area. He has begun a Bible study with nine people (some neighbors and some prospects) on Tuesday night. He is also making new contacts through referrals and their web site and some personal visits.

He is looking for a building to rent so that he can begin regular Sunday service in September. The Mission's Board will help to pay the rent until the church can establish itself. Bro. Crank is excited about the plans for the future and we are too!

Bro. Bill Lewis gave a good report on the Valdosta work. He said they are seeing an increase in attendance. He has planned some special days and has made a commercial about the church that is airing on the local cable stations. Also, they have started a morning Bible study followed by a fellowship lunch on Wednesday, and he has had a good response. Their Sunday morning attendance has increased from the teens into the thirties. This is good considering they have only been having service for a couple of months. The Lord also has blessed them with a couple of new young couples of which one of the couples' husband leads the music and his wife plays the piano.

Bro. Bill Lewis also told us that there is another church that has approached them about buying the church. The Mission's Board has always felt that we might have to relocate the church to the growing area of North Valdosta. The Mission's Board and Bro. Bill are in negotiations with this church and we will report back on the prospect of selling and buying new property.

Bro. Len Blanchard gave a report on the sale of the Hampton Church property. We have a serious offer on the table, but it is \$100,000 below our asking price. We will try to negotiate with this group and see if they are truly serious. Pray that they are and that we can reach an agreement. The money from the Hampton property would help us to hire another missionary possibly for Harris County, Georgia, which would benefit our Association.

The Damon Dodd Georgia Home Missions offering was a success for our first year. We collected nearly \$14,000.00. We believe this will grow every year! Has your Church took up this offering and sent it in? If not, it is not too late. We must build a new church in Georgia. Our small town and country churches are dying and declining. We who are member of this state must be concerned about the future of Free Will Baptist. If not us, then who? If not now, then when? We need your help and prayers.

# TWIN CITIES DISTRICT ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer.

- Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over all business of this Association. He shall keep order and, in general, direct all business of the Association. He shall serve as ex-officio member of all standing committees or boards.
- Section 2: The Assistant Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence. In the absence of both the Moderator and his Assistant, the Clerk shall call he meeting to order and the Standing Delegates shall elect someone to preside at the meeting.
- Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association. He/She shall be responsible for the printing and discharge of the Associational minutes to all churches, and shall enroll delegates at each session corresponding necessary for the Association. He/She shall receive all monies contributed to the Association, and make disbursements as authorized by the Association and/or the Executive Board. (Committee)
- Section 4: The Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall discharge the duties of the Clerk-Treasurer in his/her absence.

The Association shall appoint or elect any other officers, boards, or committees it deems necessary for its business.

# ARTICLE IV - BOARDS AND COMMITTEES

Section 1: There shall be an Executive Board (Committee) composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and at least three (3) men not holding any other office in the Association. This Committee shall act in behalf of the Association in case of any emergency and shall act as the Association when the Association is not in session; however, any action taken by this Committee is subject to the approval or disapproval of the Association at its next meeting. This Committee shall plan and prepare the programs of the Association. It shall be responsible to the Association for the questioning and examination of churches petitioning this body for membership. This Committee shall have power to deal with any officer of the Association who fails to function in his/her office or indulge in

unchristian like conduct. However, this action is temporary pending their report to the Association and final action by the body while in session. This Committee shall be available to mediate any dissension or offer any help to member churches providing their help is requested by the church. In such cases, their traveling expenses shall be paid by the church desiring their assistance.

Section 2: There shall be an Ordaining Council composed of at least three (3) deacons or ministers whose duties consist of those set forth in Article IX, Ministerial Relations of this document.

#### ARTICLE V - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 1. The term of the Moderator shall be two (2) years. He shall not succeed himself more than once.
- 2. The length of service for the Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and the Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall be at the discretion of the Association.
- 3. The members of the Ordaining Council shall serve three (3) years. A new member to be added at the annual meeting each year.
- 4. The officers shall be elected at the regular annual session of the Association on the second Saturday in October.
- 5. Any additional Boards, Committees, or Officers needed shall be appointed or elected by the Association at its discretion.

#### ARTICLE VI - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

- 1. Full acceptance of the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist.
- 2. The churches of this Association shall practice consistency in supporting missions and Christian education.
- 3. Churches who petition this Association shall be examined concerning their spiritual and moral standard before the Associational acts.
- 4. Churches expelled from other Associations for any cause may not be received until their expulsion is satisfactorily explained to the Association.

- 5. Each church is allowed five (5) delegates. All ordained men in good standing with the church are standing delegates.
- 6. The Association shall meet four (4) times a year, three (3) quarterly meetings and one (1) annual meeting. Regular quarterly meetings of this Association shall be on the second Saturday in January, April, and July. The annual meeting shall be on the second Saturday in October.

#### ARTICLE VII - VOTING

- 1. The Moderator shall keep order and in general direct all business of the Association. He shall vote only in a tie vote, shall rule any person to silence who refuses to come to order, and in case of extreme disorder, may rule the meeting closed. The Moderator shall not allow any discussion on any subject unless it is placed before the body by a move and a second.
- 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any one subject or more than five (5) minutes without permission from the Moderator.
- 3. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee/board provided the person nominated is elected.
- 4. Any person desiring to speak shall rise and address the Moderator but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 5. Any ruling by the Moderator may be set aside by 2/3 majority of voting delegates.
- 6. All voting in this Association shall be as agreed upon by its delegates while in session.
- 7. The Moderator shall follow the Principles of Parliamentary Procedure in moderating the business of this Association.
- 8. The Moderator shall limit voting to authorized delegates only, and no delegate shall leave the building during a business session without being excused by the Moderator.

# ARTICLE VIII - MINISTERIAL RELATIONS

1. The Ordaining Council shall examine any candidate for license upon request from his home church. A license may be granted by the Association for no more than one year.

However, a license may be renewed after one complete year, for no more than one more year (or for a total of two years).

- 2. The Ordaining Council shall examine any candidate for ordination upon request from the church to which he has been called and is pasturing provided he has been licensed and has met the qualifications as stated in Item #5 of this same article.
- 3. Any Free Will Baptist Minister presenting himself for membership to this Association must, after a request from the church to which he has been called, appear before the Ordaining Council for questioning, and upon the recommendation from the Ordaining Council be received into full fellowship pending a letter of good standing from his former Association.
- 4. Any minister, from another domination presenting himself for membership to this Association must, after a letter of request from the church to which he has been called appear before the Ordaining Council for questioning. It is agreed that he will, upon recommendation from the Ordaining Council, be received under the watch care of the Association for a period of no less than one year from the time of licensor, during which time the minister will have proved himself, as well as his desire to be a Free Will Baptist, and then will be received into full fellowship by the Association.
- 5. Any minister presenting himself to this Association for license, ordination, etc. . . from another denomination, shall be examined by the Ordaining Council. The Examination shall include the following: A) A thorough investigation of his character shall be made. B) Close questioning concerning a Divine call to the office. C) He must be thoroughly familiar with and a firm believer in the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist Church. D) His educational qualifications should be in keeping with his office and he must show a willingness to further his knowledge by additional study. E) Any candidate for ordination must have been licensed and called to pastor one or more churches or hold a position in a member church that would require ordination such as Associate Pastor, etc. . . He must be a practicing tither, and an active supporter of world-wide missions. F) The candidate shall also be examined according to the Word as found in 1 Timothy 3. G) The Council shall not recommend the ordination of any person whom they have honest doubt concerning his character, qualifications, and Divine Call to the work.

#### ARTICLE IX - ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. This Association shall be opened with Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.

- 2. The Association shall convene at 10:00 AM on the date set by the body.
- 3. At each quarterly meeting, business shall be kept to a minimum with a delegate report and representation fee (fifty-five (\$55) dollars per church quarterly and fifty-five (\$55) dollars at the annual meeting) report being made and any other pressing item of business being left for the annual meeting.
- 4. At the annual meeting, the annual reports from the churches shall be compiled for the convenience of the Clerk-Treasurer in preparation of the Associational minutes.
- 5. The meetings of the Association shall rotate among the member churches in succession.
- 6. This Constitution and By-Laws may be altered by a 2/3 majority vote of the voting delegates present.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE The scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of Faith and Practice.
- 2. GOD There is one living and true God revealed in nature as the Creator of the universe; and in the Scripture as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, obey.
- 3. CHRIST Christ is God manifest in flesh, in His divine nature truly God, in His nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, one crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The Scripture assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide, and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts if grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, to inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin, and become guilty before God.

- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God by His incarnation, life suffering, death, and resurrection, effected for all a redemption from sin, that is full and free, is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. TERMS OF SALVATION The conditions of salvation are:
  - (1) Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation or it.
  - (2) Faith of the unserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith with the soul renewed by the Holy Spirit freed from denomination of sin and become a child of God.
  - (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the condition of salvation, hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, whosoever will may come and take the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE All believers in Christ, who through grace perseveres in holiness to the end of life, have promises of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES Baptism, or immersion believers in water, and teaching humility, or universal obligation and to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. TITHING God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorses it in gospel (Matthew 23:23) and the Apostle Paul said, "upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (1 Corinthians 16:2)
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, and Holy works.

#### 1992 ADDENDUM TO THE BY-LAWS

The Youth Rally Committee Report states:

- 1. That a director, assistant director, and secretary should be elected at each annual meeting.
- 2. That they welcome and recognize each church at the rally. That they take an attendance count and give an attendance banner to the church with the most in attendance. This church will be responsible to bring the banner to the next rally.
- 3. That the rallies be held on the 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of January, April, July, and October, and that each church shall host and provide the program of the rally in alphabetical order.
- 4. Each program should include devotion from the Bible.
- 5. Offering may be taken only if they are designated toward the rally program.

#### CHANGES AND UPDATES

1991 - Article IX; Item 3. The representation fee for each church will be increased from \$10.00 to \$35.00 quarterly.

1993 - Article IX; Item 3. The \$10.00 paid at the annual meeting for National dues will be increased to \$25.00 effective October 1994.

1999 - (October) - Article IX; Item 3. Voted to increase dues from \$35.00 to \$55.00 quarterly per church.
