Bill and Ms. Lorraine Crank need our prayers. They have taken the sign down at the church, and the building has been put up for sale. Three families have committed to help. The Cartersville area is still growing. Pray for International Missions. Giving is down, and they are not allowing any missionaries to leave home on furloughs. Heath and Joni Hubbard are not able to go. M/S/C to receive as information.

No State Trustee Board report was given.

Women Active for Christ report was given by Sis Debra Van Pelt. It is attached to the minutes. She urged other ladies of the association to get involved with Women Active for Christ. M/S/C to receive as information.

State Christian Education Board report given by Rev. Willie Martin. They have not met, therefore, there was nothing to report. He stated that the Promotional Bulletin has the latest information regarding the 2012 retreats. M/S/C to receive as information.

Whiterock and Bethel also agreed to take him for one Sunday Service each, and give an offering of \$100 to the intern.

Rev. Earl Ransom stated that Bethel would be having a business meeting the second week of February, and that they would discuss participating and as to what degree they could participate. By the second Thursday of February they will advise. M/S/C to approve extra week of camp to come out of Associational Camp fund.

Report to the Twin Cities Association Concerning a Summer Intern April 14, 2012

A small sub-committee of preachers has been busy the last few months trying to obtain a summer intern for our Twin Cities Association. Bro. Willie, and Bro. Aaron Baldridge, attempted to secure an intern, in March, at the Bible Conference in Nashville which Free Will Baptist Bible College hosts every year. The only interest shown at the time was from someone preparing to teach school, which probably had the ability to do what we wanted, but we decided for other reasons not to pursue him.

Another name came to us indirectly, but the person did not attempt to contact us. He was contacted, but after learning we were already discussing our plans with another person, he deferred any further discussion until we had made a decision on the one we have recently secured.

Matthew Casey a 27 years old student at Free Will Baptist Bible College accepted our offer. Matthew is perhaps a junior at Free Will Baptist Bible College. I understand he has excellent grades, but has had very little opportunity to serve the Lord in the capacity for which we are calling him. However he seems to be a very energetic young man, ready for an opportunity to preach and minister in whatever direction the Lord leads him. Aaron Harris and Willie Martin interviewed him via phone, and we concluded that he could handle the responsibility.

Now our association must be willing to provide for him and give him the opportunity. I am certain in my heart that our association is prepared to receive and use him this summer.

Concerning the matter of hosting him as our guest: If you lost your calendar, the intern was originally scheduled to labor in each church during the following times.

May 20th-June 2nd – First June 3rd-June 16th – Bethel

June 17^{th} –June 30^{th} – Calvary July 1^{st} – July 14^{th} – White Rock July 15^{th} – July 28^{th} – Weems Road July 29^{th} – August 11^{th} – St. Mark

Concerning arrangements for provisions: It would be very helpful if each church, during their designated weeks, could provide breakfast and lunch items. Remember this is only for one person. Please contact Bro. Willie, or Matthew (phone number will be given later) to see how the provisions are holding up. Evening meals may be provided, or he will be responsible. It would be gracious of his hosts to provide meals on Sunday if possible. We believe our association can be creative and generous in hosting Matthew, so ladies we are counting on you.

Concerning financial matters: Our association agreed to give Matthew \$350 a week (for 12 weeks) for his salary during this time (\$4,200). The association determined that Matthew will be paid \$700 from the camp fund, and that another \$700 will be paid from association funds. Our churches are responsible for the balance of \$2800. This will require each church to give approximately \$470 (rounded up) for the two weeks they have access to the intern. If any church is unable to give this amount, or to use Matthew during their designated weeks, please let Bro. Willie know.

It will also be okay to raise any other money that you can to help Matthew financially with his school bills.

TWIN CITIES 2012 CAMP REPORT

Held at Camp Joy, Hamilton, Georgia May 27th-May 30th

I love our association because we work together to make things happen. Camp has become a very significant event in our association and our churches have worked together well to make it successful.

This year the ladies of Calvary labored to keep us fed as usual. We thank the Lord for their desire and commitment. They actually have one of the most difficult jobs, but their love for the Lord sustains them as they toil in the kitchen. While First church had the most campers, it is refreshing to see the good number of campers from our other churches. St. Mark and Weems Rd. each had over a half a dozen campers. Most of our churches also had campers present.

Numerically we had 51 campers, and two 5 year olds, for a total of 53. That is 9 more than we had last year. We had 19 workers for a total number of 72. Two or three other workers assisted us at different times.

Heather Ransom kept recreation running smoothly this year. Her organizational skills, enthusiasm and administrative abilities were very obvious. The children enjoyed activities that challenged them and burned their energy.

Cora Suggs volunteered to lifeguard again this year. The stress of watching children swim for several hours cannot be easy, but Cora handles the job well and even manages to spend some time in lake activities with the children.

The Summer Association Intern, Matthew Cayce, was the camp evangelist. He did very well in his preaching appeals to the children. Aaron Harris, the pastor of St. Mark, and Camp MC, effectively challenged the children to make decisions. The altar response was very good with at least one profession of faith.

We were able to make another major purchase for camp recreation this year. Most have never heard of such, but we purchased some Mobo-Triton Cruiser Bikes for camp. They are low riding bikes with the peddling wheel out front instead of being under you. They are fun to maneuver and ride. The children enjoyed them. We have three and the cost was significant, about \$1100.00. Thanks to our association for making this possible with your gifts and campers.



TWIN CITIES DISTRICT ASSOCIATION

<u>CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS</u> <u>OF THE</u> <u>TWIN CITIES ASSOCIATION</u> OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

We, being the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, having adopted the Treatise of the Faith and Practices of the National Association of Original Free Will Baptists, realizing the necessity of fellowship among sister churches of like faith, do bond ourselves together to form an Association, and do therefore ordain this Constitution and By-Laws to the glory of God and to the improvement of denominational relations.

ARTICLE 1 - NAME

This organization shall be known as the Twin Cities Association of Original Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The purpose of the Twin Cities Association is to promote greater fellowship among its member churches and to realize a greater harvest in the vineyard of the Lord through the combined efforts of the churches. The Association shall encourage the forming of such auxiliaries as are beneficial to the work of the churches, such as Sunday School, Church Training Service, Master's Men, Women's Auxiliary, Prayer Meetings, Youth Organizations, and Missionary and Educational endeavors.

With this Divine purpose in view, we set forth the following statements of truth:

This Association neither claims nor desires to hold nor wield any power or authority over its member churches which are Divine Right reserved to the churches themselves. We emphasize anew that the local church is its own independent body so far as it relates to its own government, the transactions of its business, the choice of its officers, and the discipline of its members. However, we do hold that churches who have the right and privilege of the above liberty and fellowship are composed of persons who believe the truth as it is in Christ, and give evidence of true piety, are, upon examination or recommendation, received into membership according to regular methods of the local church and upon condition of Baptism.

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer.

- Section 1: The Moderator shall preside over all business of this Association. He shall keep order and, in general, direct all business of the Association. He shall serve as ex-officio member of all standing committees or boards.
- Section 2: The Assistant Moderator shall discharge the duties of the Moderator in his absence. In the absence of both the Moderator and his Assistant, the Clerk shall call the meeting to order and the Standing Delegates shall elect someone to preside at the meeting.
- Section 3: The Clerk-Treasurer shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association. He/she shall be responsible for the printing and discharge of the Associational minutes to all churches, and shall enroll delegates at each session corresponding necessary for the Association. He/she shall receive all monies contributed to the Association, and make disbursements as authorized by the Association and/or the Executive Board. (Committee)

Section 4: The Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall discharge the duties of the Clerk-Treasurer in his/her absence.

The Association shall appoint or elect any other officers, boards, or committees it deems necessary for its business.

<u>ARTICLE IV - BOARDS AND COMMITTEES</u>

Section 1: There shall be an Executive Board (Committee) composed of the Moderator, Clerk, and at least three (3) men not holding any other office in the Association. This Committee shall act in behalf of the Association in case of any emergency and shall act as the Association when the Association is not in session; however, any action taken by this Committee is subject to the approval or disapproval of the Association at its next meeting. This Committee shall plan and prepare the programs of the Association. It shall be responsible to the Association for the questioning and examination of churches

petitioning this body for membership. This Committee shall have power to deal with any officer of the Association who fails to function in his/her office or indulge in unchristian like conduct. However, this action is temporary pending their report to the Association and final action by the body while in session. This Committee shall be available to mediate any dissension or offer any help to member churches providing their help is requested by the church. In such cases, their traveling expenses shall be paid by the church desiring their assistance.

Section 2: There shall be an Ordaining Council composed of at least three (3) deacons or ministers whose duties consist of those set forth in Article IX, Ministerial Relations of this document.

ARTICLE V - ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- The term of the Moderator shall be two (2) years. He shall not succeed 1. himself more than once.
- The length of service for the Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and the 2. Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall be at the discretion of the Association.
- The members of the Ordaining Council shall serve three (3) years. A new 3. member is to be added at the annual meeting each year.
- The officers shall be elected at the regular annual session of the Association 4. on the second Saturday in October.
- Any additional Boards, Committees, or Officers needed shall be appointed 5. or elected by the Association at its discretion.

ARTICLE VI - MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION

Representation in this Association is conditioned upon meeting the following requirements:

- Full acceptance of the Treatise of the National Association of Free Will 1. Baptists.
- 2. The churches of this Association shall practice consistency in supporting missions and Christian education.

- 3. Churches who petition this Association shall be examined concerning their spiritual and moral standard before the Associational acts.
- 4. Churches expelled from other Associations for any cause may not be received until their expulsion is satisfactorily explained to the Association.
- 5. Each church is allowed five (5) delegates. All ordained men in good standing with the church are standing delegates.
- 6. The Association shall meet four (4) times a year, three (3) quarterly meetings and one (1) annual meeting. Regular quarterly meetings of this Association shall be on the second Saturday in January, April, and July. The annual meeting shall be on the second Saturday in October.

ARTICLE VII - VOTING

- 1. The Moderator shall keep order and in general direct all business of the Association. He shall vote only in a tie vote, shall rule any person to silence who refuses to come to order, and in case of extreme disorder, may rule the meeting closed. The Moderator shall not allow any discussion on any subject unless it is placed before the body by a move and a second.
- 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on any one subject or more than five (5) minutes without permission from the Moderator.
- 3. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee/board provided the person nominated is elected.
- 4. Any person desiring to speak shall rise and address the Moderator, but shall not speak further until recognized by the Moderator.
- 5. Any ruling by the Moderator may be set aside by 2/3 majority of voting delegates.
- 6. All voting in this Association shall be as agreed upon by its delegates while in session.
- 7. The Moderator shall follow the Principles of Parliamentary Procedure in moderating the business of this Association.

The Moderator shall limit voting to authorized delegates only, and no 8. delegate shall leave the building during a business session without being excused by the Moderator.

ARTICLE VIII - MINISTERIAL RELATIONS

- The Ordaining Council shall examine any candidate for license upon 1. request from his home church. A license may be granted by the Association for no more than one (1) year. However, a license may be renewed after one complete year, for no more than one more year (or for a total of two years).
- The Ordaining Council shall examine any candidate for ordination upon 2. request from the church to which he has been called and is pastoring provided he has been licensed and has met the qualifications as stated in Item #5 of this same article.
- Any Free Will Baptist Minister presenting himself for membership to this 3. Association must, after a request from the church to which he has been called, appear before the Ordaining Council for questioning, and upon the recommendation from the Ordaining Council be received into full fellowship pending a letter of good standing from his former Association.

Any minister, from another domination presenting himself for membership 4. to this Association must, after a letter of request from the church to which he has been called appear before the Ordaining Council for questioning. It is agreed that he will, upon recommendation from the Ordaining Council, be received under the watch care of the Association for a period of no less than one year from the time of licensor, during which time the minister will have proved himself, as well as his desire to be a Free Will Baptist, and then will be received into full fellowship by the Association.

Any minister presenting himself to this Association for license, ordination, 5. etc., from another denomination, shall be examined by the Ordaining Council. The Examination shall include the following: A) A thorough investigation of his character shall be made. B) Close questioning concerning a Divine call to the office. C) He must be thoroughly familiar with and a firm believer in the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist Church. D) His educational qualifications should be in keeping with his office and he must show a willingness to further his knowledge by additional study. E) Any candidate for ordination must have been licensed and called to pastor one or more churches or hold a position in a member church that would require ordination such as Associate Pastor, etc. He must be a practicing tither, and an active supporter of world-wide missions. F) The candidate shall also be examined according to the Word as found in 1Timothy 3. G) The Council shall not recommend the ordination of any person whom they have honest doubt concerning his character, qualifications, and Divine Call to the work.

ARTICLE IX - ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 1. This Association shall be opened with Scripture reading and prayer and shall be closed with prayer.
- 2. The Association shall convene at 10:00 AM on the date set by the body.
- 3. At each quarterly meeting, business shall be kept to a minimum with a delegate report and representation fee (fifty-five (\$55) dollars per church quarterly and fifty-five (\$55) dollars at the annual meeting) report being made and any other pressing item of business being left for the annual meeting.
- 4. At the annual meeting, the annual reports from the churches shall be compiled for the convenience of the Clerk-Treasurer in preparation of the Associational minutes.
- 5. The meetings of the Association shall rotate among the member churches in succession.
- 6. This Constitution and By-Laws may be altered by a 2/3 majority vote of the voting delegates present.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE The scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of Faith and Practice.
- 2. GOD There is one living and true God revealed in nature as the Creator of the universe; and in the Scripture as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, obey.
- 3. CHRIST Christ is God manifest in flesh, in His divine nature truly God, in His nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, one

crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our present Savior and Lord.

- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The Scripture assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide, and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts if grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, to inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin, and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God, by His incarnation, life suffering, death, and resurrection, effected for all, redemption from sin, that is full and free, is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. TERMS OF SALVATION The conditions of salvation are:
 (1) Repentance of sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
 (2) Faith of the un-served committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith with the soul renewed by the Holy Spirit freed from denomination of sin and become a child of God.
 (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the condition of salvation, hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, whosoever will may come and take the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE All believers in Christ, who through grace perseveres in holiness to the end of life, have promises of eternal salvation.

- GOSPEL ORDINANCES Baptism, or immersion of believers in water, and teaching humility, or universal obligation, is to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. TITHING God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorses it in gospel (Matthew 23:23) and the Apostle Paul said, "upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (1 Corinthians 16:2)
- THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, and Holy works.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men on the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

YOUTH RALLY BY-LAWS

The Youth Rally Committee Report states:

- 1. A director, assistant director, and secretary should be elected at each annual meeting.
- 2. They shall welcome and recognize each church at the rally. That they take an attendance count and give an attendance banner to the church with the most in attendance. This church will be responsible to bring the banner to the next rally.
- The rallies shall be held on the 4th Saturday of January, April, July, and October, and each church shall host and provide the program of the rally in alphabetical order.
- 4. Each program should include devotion from the Bible.
- 5. Offering may be taken only if they are designated toward the rally program.
