Of the Forty-Eighth Annual Session of Union Association of Free Will Baptists, convened with Oak Grove Church, Wright County, on Wednesday 4 P. M., September 3, 1947. Services opened by singing; prayer with Brother Oliver Letterman. The Moderator Elder Ben R. Scott called the conference in session to transact any legal business that should properly come before the body.

Beginning with 24th verse, scripture text 22 Chapter 31-32 verse. "And The Lord Said Simon, Be Hold, Satin has desired To Have you, That He May Sift you as wheat." "But I have Prayer For Thee That Thy Faith Fail Not. And when Thou art Converted, Strengthen Thy Brethern.

11 O'clock Divine Service.—Service opened by singing. Song. The Old Time Christian, Guess I'm Just a Little Old Fachion. Prayer by Brother John Scott. Song by class, Glory to His Mame.

Special Song by Sister Mary Moore, The Great Home Coming. Scripture lesson read by Brother Dean Moore, 5th Chapter and 28th verse of Acts, and St. John, 7th Chapter, 14th verse. Theme of subject, The Doctrine. Message by Brother Dean Moore and G. W. Scott, Jr. Both brought scriptural and spiritural message. Brother Scott called for handshake. Session of rejoicing followed.

Dismissed for noon hour with prayer by Brother Mose Johnson.

Thursday Afternoon Service.

Service opened by singing. Song, I Left The Land of Egypt. He Bore It All. Scripture lesson read by Moderator, 13th Chapter, 1st Cor. Prayer by Sister Emma Pryor. Song by class, Everybody Will Be Happy Over There.

2nd Call for Report of Credential Committe.—Reported favorable on the following churches: Lebanon, Cabool, Mountain Valley, Rock Springs, Big Creek, Cold Springs, Mt. Pisgah, New Home, Tyrone, Pleasant Ridge, Union Chapel No. 1, Providence, Moore Chapel Texas County, Pleasant Home No. 1, Pleasant Grove, Faith and Hope. Motion carried report be adopted. Delegates seated.

Brother Ben R. Scott made written statement on New Harmony Church in Dallas County as follows:

Statement concerning the New Harmony Free Will Baptist church in Dallas County, formerly of Union Association.

On September 15, 1946, the New Harmony church and Cedar Ridge Free Will Baptist church, both in the same community, by mutual agreement came together in a union revival meeting. After members of both churches confessed their wrongs and begged forgiveness of each other, both churches agreed that they should discontinue as separate churches and unite as one church.

On September 30, 1946, at a special business conference, the New Harmony Church voted unanimously to discontinue as a church. After doing this, they were united with the Cedar Ridge Free Will Baptist church, being in perfect agreement and peace with the members of that church.

The chuurch then agreed to remain a member of the Niangoa Association of Free Will Baptist, since the original church of the Cedar Ridge community was a member of the association.

The forgoing business was done at Cedar Ridge Free Will Baptist church on September 30, 1946.

This statement respectfully submitted to Union Association by B. R. Scott, Moderator of said Church.

After hearing Brother Scott's statement read, motion carried New Harmony Church be dropped from role of this association.

At this time an hour was given our league.

ning at the 8th verse, and reading to the 20th verse. Scripture text 17th verse. That Christ may dwell in your heart by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love. Theme of subject, Rooted and grounded in Love. Message brought by Brother Rupert Craven & Brother G. J. Pingleton, and truly we could say the Lord was leading and God's children drank from that fountain that never runs dry.

Dismissed until 7:45. Divine service closed in prayer with Brother C. A. McAllister.

Thursday Night Divine Service.—Service began by singing by Brother E. E. Simpson. Song by Class. Special songs by Ministers of Cavesprings Association, Bearing The Cross To Wear a Crown. Scripture lesson read by Brother J. E. Rolen, 1st Chapter St. John up to 18th verse, 4th chapter 2nd Timothy. Scripture Text, Preach The Word, brought by Brother J. E. Rolen and F. J. Johnson from Cavesprings Association. Both brought good messages. Good spirit existed.

Dismissed until Friday morning at 9:00 o'clock with prayer by Brother Elmer Snyder.

FRIDAY MORNING SESSION

Service opened by singing.

Prayer by Brother Homer Vandivort.

Scripture lesson read by Moderator, 37th Psalms.

Credential Committee reports that Sister Rosa Simpson, formerly of Douglas County quarterly meeting now in Jefferson City, Missouri, sends three dollars for the benefit of the association. Clerk was instructed to write a letter of thanks to Sister Simpson.

Third call for report of Credential Committee, reported favorable on the following churches: Mt. Zion No. 2, Mountain Grove, Willow Springs No. 1, and Friendship. Motion carried report be adopted and delegated seated.

Call for report of Temperance Committee. Motion carried report be adopted as follows

"We, as your temperance committee, would recommend that all people abstain from all things to the extreme and from things that are unholy. Since we are slowly winning back prohibition, may we pledge ourselves anew to do all we can to wipe out the liquor business entirely."

"We, the committee on the State of Religion, wish to submit the following report: We find that there is a continuing growth of churches as there has been three more churches organized since the last setting of the association. Good success is reported of most all the revivals. We feel that there is a lot of work to be done and our prayer should be that we all get the cause at hear: to the extent that God will open the fields and we ministers get in them and preach the full Gospel that it may grow and keep growing.

We further recommend that the Free Will Baptist abstain from all worldly amusements at all times so that our church might have a greater drawing power among the world—For ye are the light of the World, Matt. 5-14.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace ,to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligatons and enterprises, supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

FREE WILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God is manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide, and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace, not otherwise provided for as the highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation, His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendicies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are:
 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death,
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men became His elect.
- 10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvaton Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosover will may come and take of the water of Life freely.

- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of your life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances, to be perpetuated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, and the ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, holy work, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 15. War. War destroys the lives of innocent, and is contrary to the New Testament, therefore, we are opposed to war.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

CONSTITUTION.

From long experience, we the Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings and churches are convinced of the necessity of a combination of Quarterly Meetings and churches, to perpetuate our union and communion among us and preserve and maintain a correspondence among each other in our union; therefore, we propose to maintain and keep the orders and rules of our Association according to the following plan and form of government.

- 1. This Association shall be called the Union Association of Free Will Baptist and shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings and churches as may embody themselves under this constitution.
- 2. The acting members of the conference of this association shall be two delegates from each church, chosen by the members of their respective churches while in conference, together with all ministers, deacons and church clerks belonging to any church composing this body; also three members from each Quarterly Meeting under the Association, two to be chosen by each Quarterly Meeting, and the other shall be the Permanent Clerk of the Quarterly Meeting.
- 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator and an Assistant Moderator, who shall be elected annually, and hold their office until their successors shall be elected; a permanent Clerk and Treasurer, who shall superintend the printing of the minutes; an Executive Board of five members whose duty it shall

be to transact all business of this Association when this body is not in session, and whose term of office shall be as follows: One for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years, and one for five years; and at the expiration of each of these terms, one is to be elected for a term of five years and who shall hold their office until their successors are elected. And further, if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next session of the Association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve uopn such officers.

- 4. Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meeting or church maintaining Gospel order, agreeing with this denomination in doctrine and practices in favor of the benevolent enterprises, as Sabbath Schools, Missions, temperance, and education, may be received into this Association by presenting a petition asking to be received; and ministers and deacons desiring to become members, must be recommended by the church to which they belong, appear in person and then by a vote of this Association, when such vote shall be decided by a majority of all votes cast.
- 5. This Association shall have power to discipline its Quarterly Meetings and churches, exclude them for disorderly walk, if labor proves unsuccessful; or ordain deacons, to license and ordain ministers, such as give evidence of being qualified and called of God, by request of the church to which such persons belong; to settle such questions of discipline and doctrine as the Quarterly Meetings or churches may refer to them; to make any rules or By-Laws necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its Constitution; but in no case shall this Association reverse a decision of its Quarterly Meetings or in any way interfere with its internal regulations, nor hold any ecclesiastical power over the Quarterly Meetings or churches composing this Association.
- 6. The sessions of this Association shall be held with only such churches that call for it by a vote of the church while in conference, and when two or more churches make such a request for the same session, it shall be decided by a vote and the majority of all votes cast shall be final.
- 7. The sessions of the Association shall convene annually at four o'clock p. m. on Wednesday before the first Sunday in September, at which time it shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meetings and churches composing this Association to represent themselves by delegates, and send written reports. The Quarterly Meetings are to report their spiritual standing, benevolent work, ministers licensed or ordained, and appeals if any have been taken. The churches are to report their spiritual standing, benevolent work, names and addresses of their ministers and clerks, the names of their deacons, meeting days, and statistics; at which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as

may be referred to them through their committees; and transact such other business, not repugnant to this Constitution nor to the usages of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the Quarterly Meetings and churches within the limits of this Association.

- 3. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general union of the churches, to point out their interests and aid them in securing pastors, to put out evangelists and other ministers in places where Gospel is most needed, and require a written annual report of each minister belonging to this body.
- 9. This Constitution may be altered or amended by a twothirds majority of all members at any regular session of this Association, when written notice setting forth the exact intended alterations or amendments shall have been given at previous meetings.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, in their absence the senior minister in years, shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum be present the Moderator, or in his absence, the Assistant Moderator shall take charge: and if neither are present, then the senior minister in years of service shall act as Moderator.
- 2. All persons declared by the Committee on Credentials to be duly entitled to a seat in this Association and accepted by this body, are hereby made full members of this Association.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum for the transacting of business; a less number shall adjourn until that number is present.
- 4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and prayer, and closed by prayer.
- 5. All Christians shall be entitled to a seat in council and may take part in all discussions, but members only shall be allowed to vote.
- 6. Any ruling of the Moderator may be overruled by a twothirds majority of all members voting.
- 7. This Association shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the members of this Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and any one wishing to retire, shall first obtain leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All business, except routine, shall be brought before this body by committees; but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given to it by any member of this Association, then such business may be presented to this body by any member, but cannot be discussed, unless by a vote of this body.
 - 10. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all

members of the committee who favor them, and if the names be not a majority of all members of the Committee, then the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report.

- 11. The Moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it will lead to discord and division.
- 12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the Moderator by appellation, "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak until recognized by the Moderator.
- 13. No member of this Association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes or twice on the same subject without permission of the Association.
- 14. No one shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion, or uses words that cast, reflection upon the denomination or of one or more of its members.
- 15. This Association may correspond by message or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 16. Anyone violating these By-Laws shall be subject to a public reprimand by the Moderator.
- 17. A majority of all votes cast shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the Constitution or By-Laws, and overrule the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.
- 18. Each minister shall be given a yearly certificate by the Association, provided there is no charge against him.
- 19. No minister of this Association shall pastor any church that has been excluded from this or any other association until they set their house in order.
- 20. The ordaining or licensing council shall be composed of only ordained ministers of the Association in good standing, present at each sessin.
- 21. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association.

- 15. Invite all Christians to seats in council.
- 16. Call for corresponding letters and delegates.
- 17. Seat delegates.
- 18. Read the By-Laws.
- 19. Appointment of committees,
- 20. Call for appeal from Quarterly Meetings.
- 21. Call for report of Executive Board.
- 22. Call for Treasurer's report.
- 23. Call for report of Evangelist.
- 24. Call for report of corresponding delegates.
- 25. Elect a member of Executive Board, or more if vacancy exists.
 - 26. Miscellaneous business.
 - 27. Moderator inquires: Are all churches represented?
 - 28. Call for ordination of ministers.
 - 29. Call for pastorless churches.
 - 30. Call for ministers' written report.
 - 31. Call for election of Evangelist.
