



PROCEEDINGS

OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH ONE ANNUAL SESSION OF THE UNION ASSOCIATION OF THE FREEWILL BAPTIST WHEN CONVENED WITH FRIENDSHIP CHURCH, AUGUST 31 AND SEPTEMBER 1, 2000.

7:30 P.M., THURSDAY, AUGUST 31, 2000

The one hundredth one annual session of the Union Association convened with the Friendship Church. The Association was called to order by the Clerk and she called Moderator Bro. Jim Ragsdale to the chair.

Moderator asked Bro. Donald Potter to lead in prayer.

The Moderator called for singing, the congregation sang "Love Lifted Me", I Know Who Holds Tomorrow" and "lesus is Coming Soon"

Moderator asked Bro. Jimmie Ragsdale to lead in prayer.

Moderator read for a scripture, James 4:17.

Moderator called for special singing, Sis. Pam Cottengim sang "Sheltered in the Arms Of God". Bro. Ralph Marliere read a poem "A Soldier of the Cross", Bro. Walter Eyman read "No Greater Love", Emily Potter and Mary Ann Parmenter sang "Don't Wipe Those Tears From the Alter", and "From the Manger to the Cross", Sis. Betty Dye sang "You Never Mentioned Him to Me"

Bro. Frank McCune was to bring the Introductory Sermon, but he was not present and the Church doesn't have a Paster. Bro. Woodrow Coonce took the stand to bring the Introductory Sermon. He prayed then read II Tiimothy 4:1-4 and I Kings 18:21-26, and preached a very good sermon on "How Long Halt Ye Between Two Opinions". Turned back to the Moderator.

A song of invitation was asked for "Where He Leads Me". After prayer was led by Bro. Jim Ragsdale.

Moderator asked for roll call, and it was given.

Moderator chose the Credential Committee: Bro. Woodrow Coonce, Bro. Donald Potter and Bro. Jimmie Ragsdale.

Moderator chose the Divine Committee: Sis. Maydell Dake, Sis. Vera Dixon, and Sis. Velma Gray. Committees were excused to read the letters.

Moderator called for church letters, and Quarterly meeting letters.

Testamonies were called for, several were given: Bro. Bentley Walker, Bro. Walter Eyman, Sis. Linda Cottengim, Bro. Ralph Marliere, Bro. Roy Gray, Sis. Maydell Dake, Sis. Gloria Ragsdale, Sis. Leota Urdahl, Sis. Mary Ann Coonce, Bro. Jimmie Ragsdale, and Sis. Pam Cottengim.

Moderator called for a report of the Divine Committee, they reported that Bro. Donald Potter would preach at 11:00 Friday morning. Credential Committee reported favorably on three churches, stating their two requests. Cold Springs and Mt. Zion #1. Delegates were registered, seated with right hand of fellowship while we sang "That Glad Reunion Day".

Linda Cottengim announced that Mt. Zion would have their 75th anniversary and homecoming on Sunday, September 17, 2000.

Service was dismissed with prayer led by Bro. Bobbie Dixon.

As reported last year, the weather kept the attendance down in number, again this year, but the Church was full of God's love and spirit. We enjoyed four spiritual sermons, several songs and testamonies.

Clerk read the petitionary letters.

Call for Corresponding delegates. 123rd Annual Session of the Little Yine Associations of General Baptists convened with Lilly Ridge Church — Dale Roberts, Pastor. (Date should have been March 24 — 25, but was changed to March 31 and April 1.) Called to order and sang some songs, prayer by Bro. Wieman King. Women's age Handbell ringers who played "In The Garden". Also have a teenage group of bellringers and young ones starting with colored bells.

Theme for session this year was "Importance of Families". Friday night message was on "How to Fecognize Hurting Families" and used Joshua 24: 14-26.

Saturday morning business sessions: Read letter from Union Association

Letter from White River Association of General Baptist — 118th session 9 churches, 682 members.

Home Missions report by Bob Comer — Nixa Church is now self-supporting and ready to build on or build a new church which would seat 250-300 people. Springfield South Park — had 150 for grand opening and 100 Sunday before session. Mammoth Springs, Ark. — New church opening in former General Baptist facility. Olathe, Kansas — Hispanic church which also teaches English classes.

Gave a very good and interesting report.

Report of Hammonds Mill Camp — 21 people saved or rededicated

Report from Dennis Johnson from Council Association — not having problems with Sunday School literature as in the past. Had 265 churches in 1999 and 274 in 2000, 5 new missionaries or 7 if you count husband and wife teams.

Set time of Association as 3rd Friday night in March every year. Will convene for the 124th session with Cabool General Baptist Church March 16 and 17, 2001.

Dale Roberts took over to bring message. Gave definition of family as household, group of people, fellowship together. Christian influence in the home makes a family. Adam was lonely, God made woman and passed a divine blessing on the family. Parental authority was instigated and is held together by love. Need family religion to be a stable family able to get through the storms which come.

Saturday afternoon turned to David Evans — worked at Fordland Honor Camp for 3 years as Chaplain. 740 in Fordland mostly from alcohol and drug abuse and have to be taught to break the cycle. Read from and named 8 things we should be doing:

- 1. Concern for our self and family
- 2. Search for meaning
- 3. Challenge and admonish one another with love
- 4. Be accountable to Church family
- 5. Public disclosure of acts and facts
- 6. Banishment is possible in family. No secrets as many churches died over "secrets"
- 7. Leadership by ideas and pastors.

Closed by reading Matthew 25. I was hungry and you fed me. Dismissed by Bob and Vera Dixon

Moderator called for election to the Executive Board: Donald Potter was nominated and elected.

Moderator called for a motion to send Bro. Bion Irwin a card when we get his letter. Motion made, seconded and passed to do so.

Call for Evangelist report was none, Bro. Ralph Marliere volunteered to be Evangelist for the coming year.

Moderator called for volunteers to go to Little Vine Association: Linda Cottengim and MayDell Dake. Mission Association: Bob and Vera Dixon. Missouri Association: Donald and Portia Potter. Cave Springs Association: Ralph Marliere and wife.

Bro. Roy Gray dismissed for recess.

After recess Bro. Ronnie Epps led in prayer.

Moderator read Luke 9:18. Congregation songs were "Won't It be Wonderful There?" and "Victory in Jesus".

Moderator called for specials: Sis. Betty Dye sang "Take Him Down", Bro. Roy Gray sang "When I Make My Last Move", Bro. Rolph read a reading "The Tablecloth", Sis. Pam Cottengim sang "Is My Lord Satisfied with Me?"

Moderator called Bro. Donald Potter to the stand, he read Revelations 7:13, prayed and preached a good sermon on "Are We Hanging On or Hanging Loose?"

Turned back to the Moderator who asked for a song of invitation "Have Thine Own Way".

Dismissed for lunch and asked blessing on the noon meal by Bro. Don Ratterree.

FREEWILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world; from all sanction of the use and sole of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come and His will be done in earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worships; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ". We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

FREEWILL BAPTIST ARTICLES OF FAITH

- THE BIBLE The Scriptures of the authorized King James version, both Old and New
 Testament were given by inspiration of God and are our only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- GOD There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and
 Righteous Governor of the universe, and in the scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet
 as one God infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are to supremely love,
 adore and obey.
- CHRIST Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man. Once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of grace not otherwise provided as far as the highest welfare of man requires.

- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to the years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the grounds of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- ELECTION God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the
 conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE God desires the salvation of all. The gospel invites all; the Holy Spirit strives with all; and whosoever will, may come and take the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and The Lord's Supper are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet washing is an ordinance teaching humility and is of universal obligation to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 15. WAR War destroys the lives of innocent people and is contrary to the New Testament; therefore, we are opposed to war.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION The scriptures teach resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life".

CONSTITUTION

From long experience we, the Freewill Baptist Quarterly Meetings and churches, are convinced of the necessity of a combination of quarterly meetings and churches, to perpetuate our union and communion among us and preserve and maintain a correspondence among each other in our union; therefore, we propose to maintain and keep the orders and rules of our Association according to the following plan and form of government.

 This Association shall be called the Union Association of Freewill Baptist and shall be composed of such well regulated Freewill Baptist Quarterly Meetings and churches as may embody themselves under the constitution.

- 2. The active members of the conference of the Association shall be two delegates from each church, chosen by the members of their respective churches while in conference, together with all ministers, ministers' wives, deacons, deacons' wives who belong to a Freewill Baptist Church in the Association, church clerks belonging to any church composing this body. Also three members from each quarterly meeting under the Association, two to be chosen by each quarterly meeting and the other shall be the permanent clerk of the quarterly meeting.
- 3. The officers of the Association shall be a Moderator and an Assistant Moderator, who shall be elected annually, and hold their office until their successors shall be elected; a permanent Clerk and Treasurer, who shall superintend the printing of the minutes; an Executive Board of five members whose duty it shall be to transact all business of the Association when this body is not in session, and whose term of office shall be as follows: one for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years, and one for five years; and at the expiration of each of these terms, one is to be elected for a term of five years; and who shall hold their office until their successor is elected. And further, if any vacancies occur between sessions of the Association, the board shall fill such vacancy or vacancies until the next session of the Association; all of whom shall perform such duties as usually devolve upon such officers.
- 4. Any regularly organized Freewill Baptist Quarterly Meeting or church maintaining Gospel order, agreeing with this denomination in doctrine and practices in favor of benevolent enterprises, as Sabbath Schools, Missions, Temperance, and Education, may be received into this Association by presenting a petition asking to be received; and ministers and deacons desiring to become members must be recommended by the church to which they belong, appear in person and then by a vote of this Association, when such vote shall be decided by the majority of all votes cast.
- 5. This Association shall have power to discipline its Quarterly Meetings, or churches may refer to them to make any rules or By-Laws necessary to its regulation and not inconsistent with its Constitution; but in no case shall this Association reverse a decision of its Quarterly Meetings or in any way interfere with its internal regulations, nor hold any ecclesiastical power over the Quarterly Meetings or churches composing this Association.
- 6. The sessions of this Association shall be held with only such churches that call for it by a vote of the church while in conference, and when two or more churches make such a request for the same session, it shall be decided by a vote and the majority of all votes cast shall be final.

- 7. The sessions of the Association shall convergentually at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday before the first Sunday in September at which time it shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meetings and churches composing this Association to represent themselves by delegates and send written reports. The Quarterly Meetings are to report their spiritual standing, benevolent work, ministers licensed or ordained, and appeals, if any have been taken. The churches are to report their spiritual standing, benevolent work, names and addresses of their ministers and clerks, the names of their deacons, meeting days and statistics; at which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to them through their committee; and transact such other business not repugnant to this Constitution nor to the usage of the denomination as in their judgment may promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the Quarterly Meetings and churches within the limits of this Association.
- 8. It is the duty of this Association to provide for the general union of the churches, to point out their interests and aid them in securing pastors, to put out evangelists and other ministers in places where the gospel is most needed, and require a written annual report of each minister belonging to this body.
- This Constitution maybe altered or amended by two-thirds majority of all members voting at any regular session of this Association when written notice setting forth the exact intended alterations or amendments shall be given at previous meetings.

BY-LAWS

- The Clerk or Assistant Clerk, and in their absence, the senior minister in years of service, shall
 call the Association into conference and if a quorum be present, the Moderator, or in his
 absence, the Assistant Moderator, shall take charge and if neither are present then the senior
 minister in years of service shall act as Moderator.
- All persons declared by the Committee on Credentials to be duly entitled to a seat in this Association and accepted by this body are hereby made full members of this Association.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; a less number shall adjourn until that number is present.
- Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and prayer, and closed by prayer.
- All Christians shall be entitled to a seat in council, and may take part in all discussions, but members only shall be allowed to vote.
- 6. Any ruling of the Moderator may be over-ruled by a two-thirds majority of all members voting.
- This Association shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- 8. It shall be the duty of the members of this Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain the leave of the Moderator.

- 9. All business, except routine, shall be brought before this body by committees, but should any committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given to it by any member of this Association, then such business may be presented to this body by any member but cannot be discussed, unless by a vote of this body.
- 10. All resolutions and reports shall bear the names of all members of the committees who favor them; and if the names be not a majority of all members of the Committee, then the Clerk shall not read the resolution or report.
- 11. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit, or when he thinks it will lead to discord and division.
- 12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the Moderator by appellation,
 "Brother Moderator", but shall not speak until recognized by the Moderator.
 13. No person shall be allowed to speak more than 10 minutes each time, no more than twice on the
 - same subject without permission of the Association.

 14. No one shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion.
- No one shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or uses words that cast reflection upon the denomination or on one or more of its members.
 This Association may correspond by message or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- Anyone violating these By-Laws shall be subject to a public reprimand by the Moderator.
- 17. A majority of all votes cast shall be final upon all subjects except to amend the Constitution and By-Laws, and over-rule the Moderator, then it shall require a two-thirds majority.
 18. Each minister shall be given a yearly certificate by the Association, provided there is no charge
- against him.

 19. No minister of this Association shall pastor any church that has been excluded from this or any
- other Association until they set their house in order.

 20. The ordaining or licensing council shall be composed of only ordained ministers of the
 - Association in good standing present at each session.
- 21. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association. \sim
