PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

MINISTER'S MEETING.

According to previous announcement, ministers from the Eastern, Western and Cape Fear Conferences of the Original Free Will Baptist, met with the church at Pine Level, N. C., on September 27th, 1894, and organized a

MINISTER'S MEETING.

Eld. R. C. Jackson, of the Cape Fear Conference, preached the Introductory sermon—Text Matt. 4th chapter, and part of the 10th verse, "It is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and him only shalt thou serve."

On motion of Eld. D. Davis, Eld. J. H. Worley

was elected Chairman of the meeting.

On motion of Eld. Lunda Lee, Eld. E. T. Phillips was chosen Secretary.

The following ministers were enrolled as mem-

bers:

Eld. D. Davis addressed the meeting for a short while, and earnestly plead with the ministers to

hold to the doctrine of the Bible, and to reject all else. Eld. J. L. Ennis offered the following resolution:

Resolved, That this body, composed of ministers from the different Conferences, devise some plan by which to better systemize the several churches, both in labor and finance, and that the ministers so instruct the churches.

On motion of Eld. J. L. Ennis, speeches on the resolution were limited to ten minutes. Speeches on the resolution were made by Elders Lee, Lucas, Ennis, Jackson, L. T. Phillips, E. T. Phillips, D. Davis, and G. W. Davis.

On motion of Eld. Lunda Lee, the resolution

was not adopted.

The following resolution, offered by Eld. Lun-

da Lee, was adopted:

Resolved. That each minister be requested to impress upon the churches the necessity of their contributing to the support of their ministers.

Eld. J. A. Hodges and others spoke of the im-

portance of a minister's meeting.

On motion of Eld. Lunda Lee, the Chair appoint a committee of five, to draft resolutions for the government of the body. Elders L. T. Phillips, G. W. Davis, P. T. Lucas, Lunda Lee, and Bro. H. W. Jernigan, were appointed said committee.

On motion of Eld. P. T. Lucas, the meeting close until 3 o'clock Friday evening. Meeting closed in due form.

FRIDAY EVENING 3 O'CLOCK.

The Chairman called the meeting to order. Minutes of the previous day were read and approved.

The committee to draft resolutions for the government of the body, submitted their report, which was adopted by sections. (See Constitution).

On motion of Eld. P. T. Lucas, Eld. T. F. Harrison, of Ayden, N. C., be the Corresponding Sec-

retary of the Minister's Meeting.

On motion of Eld. E. T. Phillips, Eld. P. T. Lucas preach the Introductory Sermon at the next Annual Meeting.

On motion of Eld. L. T. Phillips, Eld. E. T.

Phillips be the alternate of Eld. Lucas.

Eld. T. F. Harrison made a very interesting talk on the importance of education among the ministry

On motion of Eld. D. Davis, the meeting close until the Annual Meeting. Praise and prayer by Eld. P. T. Lucas.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MINISTER'S MEETING.

Article 1. A minister's meeting of the "Original Free Will Baptist" of North Carolina, shall meet at least, once every year, Thursday after the fourth Sunday in September, at the appointed place for the Union Conference.

Art. 2. An introductory sermon shall be preached at the sitting of the minister's meeting

each year.

Art. 3. The minister who preaches the introductory shall preside over said meeting until a chairman is appointed.

Art. 4. Each meeting shall have power to elect

such officers as may be needful.

Art. 5. The meeting shall be to devise plans for the advancement of the Gospel of Christ.

Art. 6. It shall be the duty of the meeting to keep unity between the brother ministers, and to understand each other's work, so our preaching will not conflict with each other in preaching the Gospel.

Art. 7. All ministers who wish to become members of the "Minister's Meeting," shall make application at the regular sitting of said meeting, and shall be received by the regular vote of that meeting.

Art. 8. All members composing said meeting shall be required to attend annually, unless

providentially hindered.

Art. 9. This meeting shall have the power to exclude any member of said meeting, for any disorderly walk.

Art. 10. This meeting shall have the power to make or amend any rule or by-law they may think necessary, in carrying out its benevolent purposes.

Art. 11. All members composing this meeting shall be required to vote pro or con, unless ex-

cused by the chairman.

Art. 12. The chairman shall have supreme power to call any person to a point of order dur-

ing the sitting of the meeting.

Art. 13. No person shall speak over ten minutes on any subject, without the consent of the chairman, and shall be allowed to speak twice if necessary.

Art. 14. The proceedings of the "Minister's Meeting" shall be published in connection with

her minutes of the Union Conference.

RESOLUTION BY H. W. JERNIGAN.

The following resolution by H. W. Jernigan

Resolved, That Art. 3rd, of the Constitution be changed to read as follows: "The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, Corresponding and recording Secretary, who shall be elected for a term of two years, who shall hold their office until their successors are elected, which election shall take place one year previous to their entering upon the duties of their office.

On motion of Eld. P. T. Lucas, we have 500 minutes printed, and send 25 to the South Carolina Conference, 50 to the Eastern Conference, and distribute the remainder among the churches of the Western and Cape Fear Conferences.

On motion of Eld. D. Davis, we pay the Secretary \$5,00 for his services, and that he draw on the Treasurer for all other necessary expenses.

On motion of Eld. P. T. Lucas, thanks be extended to the people of Pine Level for the generous manner in which they have entertained this Conference.

On motion of Eld. D. Davis, thanks be extended to the different Rail Roads that have given reduced rates to the Conference.

On motion of Eld. D. Davis, Conference close, to meet with the church at Wood's Grove, Wayne county, Friday after the 4th Sunday in September, 1895.

CONSTITUTION.

Article 1. This body shall be known as the "Original Free Will Baptist General Union Conference."

Article 2. The object of this Conterence shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men, by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures, in our co-opperation together in having the doctrine of Christ preached for the salvation of souls.

Article 3. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, corresponding and recording Secretary, who shall remain in office until their successors are elected.

Article 4. This Conference shall be composed of the ministers who are members of churches belonging to the body, and of delegates from

these churches, each church being entitled to one delegate.

Article 5. The delegate from each church shall bear to the Conference a letter, certifying his appointment, showing the amount of contribution raised for benevolent purposes during the year.

Article 6. This Conference may, at each regular meeting, elect as many boards of standing committees as may be necessary in carrying out its benevolent purposes. These shall keep a record of their proceedings and make a report at each regular meeting of this Conference.

Article 7. Any minister or Conference desiring to become a member of this body shall present his or her petition at a regular session of Conference through delegates appointed for that purpose. If he or she be received, the Moderator shall extend to her delegate, the right hand of fellowship.

Article 8. The Moderator may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save that of voting.

Article 9. Each annual Conference is a distinct and independent organization with full authority to manage its own internal affairs, elect its own officers &c.

Article 10. This Constitution may be amended at any regular session by a vote of two-thirds of the members present.
