PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

MINISTER'S MEETING.

According to previous announcement, ministers from the Eastern, Western and Cape Fear Conferences of the original Free Will Baptist, met with the church at Wood's Grove, Wayne Co., N. C., on Sept. 26th, 1895.

According to appointment, Eld. P. T. Lucas preached the introductory sermon—Text: John. 21st chapter, and latter clause of 15th verse—"Lovest thou me more than these?"

On motion, Eld. P. T. Lucas was elected President.

On motion, J. F. Jackson, of the Cape Fear

Conference, was elected Secretary.

On motion, Eld. J. F. Hill was appointed chairman of a committee on Devotional Exercises, and he be empowered to select two others to co-opperate with him. Eld. Hill appointed Bros. J. L. Aulphin and M. S. Smith on this committee.

On motion, the word "Chairman" of the constitution be stricken out, and the word, "President", be inserted.

FRIDAY, SEPT. 27th.

According to adjournment, the Minister's Meeting met at 8:30 o'clock.

On motion, Eld. B. W. Nash be invited to a man of a committee on seat in this body.

The following resolution by Eld. R. C. Jackson, was received for discussion and adopted.

Resolved-That the President be empowered to appoint a committee of five to draft a form of ceremonies for administering Baptism, Communion services, and questioning applicants for admission to the church. The same to be presented at our next Annual Meeting for ratification or rejection.

The President appointed on this committee-Eld's E. T Phillips, L. T. Phillips, J. M. Barfield, R. C. Jackson and J. F Hill.

The following resolution by R. C. Jackson was

adopted. Resolved-That the ministers of this Meeting instruct the churches under their charge, to allow no Adventist, Mormon, Latter Day Saints, Universalist, or any other who seek to destroy the peace of our churches, to hold services in our houses of worship.

On motion, the proceedings of the Minister's Meeting be printed in the FREE WILL BAPTIST

and the Baptist Review.

On motion by Eld. R. C. Jackson, Eld. J. F. Hill preach the introductory sermon at our next Annual Meeting.

On motion by Eld. E. T. Phillips, Eld. R. C.

Tackson be his alternate.

On motion, we adjourn. Praise and prayer by Eld. B. W. Nash.

CONSTITUTION OF THE MINISTER'S MEETING.

Article 1. A minister's meeting of the "Original Free Will Baptist" of North Carolina, shall meet at least, once every year, Thursday after the fourth Sunday in September, at the appointed place for the Union Conference.

Art. 2. An introductory Sermon shall be preached at the sitting of the minister's meeting each vear.

Art. 3. The minister who preaches the introductory shall preside over said meeting until a President is appointed.

Art. 4. Each meeting shall have power to elect such officers as may be needful.

Art. 5. The meeting shall be to devise plans for the advancement of the Gospel of Christ.

Art. 6. It shall be the duty of the meeting to keep unity between the brother ministers, and to understand each other's work, so our preaching will not conflict with each other in preaching the Gospel.

Art. 7. All ministers who wish to become members of the "Minister's Meeting," shall make application at the regular sitting of said meeting, and shall be received by the regular

vote of that meeting.

Art. 8. All members composing said meeting shall be required to attend annually, unless providentially hindered.

Art. 9. This meeting shall have the power to exclude any member of said meeting, tor any disorderly walk.

Art. 10. This meeting shall have the power to make or amend any rule or by-law they may think necessary, in carrying out its benevolent purposes.

Art. 11. All members composing this meeting shall be required to vote pro or con, unless excused by the President.

Art. 12. The President shall have supreme power to call any person to a point of order during the state of th

ing the sitting of the meeting.

Art. 13. No person shall speak over ten minutes on any subject, without the consent of the President, and shall be allowed to speak twice if necessary.

Art. 14. The proceedings of the Minister's Meeting" shall be published in connection with her minutes of the Union Conference.

UNION CONFERENCE.

According to previous announcement, the ministers and delegates composing the Union Conference, from the Eastern, Western, and Cape Fear Conferences of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at

Wood's Grove, Wayne County.

Eld. T. F. Harrison who was appointed to preach the Introductory Sermon, not being present, Conference called upon Eld. D. Davis, who preached from Psalms 84th chapter and 11th verse—"For the Lord God is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory: no good thing will he withhold from them that walk uprightly."

Resolved-That Art. 7th, of the Constitution, be changed by inserting the word "Church," af-

ter the word "Conference," thus, "Any Minister, Conference or Church," etc.

RESOLUTIONS BY ELD. R. C. JACKSON.

Seeing the great need of all our churches being governed by the same rules of church government.

Be it resolved 1st—That the Moderator of this Conference appoint a committee of six, three of the Western and three of the Cape Fear Conference, to take the rules of church government of the two Conferences, compare, revise and consolidate into one. The same to be presented to the next Annual Setting of this body, for adoption or rejection.

Resolved 2nd—That this Body ask the Eastern Conference to appoint a committee of six of her members to confer with the committee appointed by this Body, and act with them in said revision, earnestly requesting that said committee be present at the next Annual Setting of

this body.

The Moderator appointed on said committee, from the Western Conference, Elders D. Davis, P. T. Lucas and E. T. Phillips; Cape Fear Conference, Elders J. F. Hill and R. C. Jackson. Jackson in the chair, H. W. Jernigan was also appointed.

The following resolution by J. F. Hill was

adopted:

Resolved—That Art. 5th be, and is hereby amended, to read as follows: "The delegate from each church, shall bear to the Conference, a letter certifying his appointment, showing the amount of contribution raised for benevolent purposes during the year, and total number of members, and nothing more.

On motion of J. F. Hill, we have 700 minutes printed, send 25 to S. C. Conference, 50 to the Eastern, 25 to the French Broad, and the remainder to the Cape Fear and Western Conferences; also send 25 to the Pee Dee Conference.

On motion of Elder R. C. Jackson, the Secre-

tary be paid \$5,00 for his services.

On motion of Elder J. A. Hodges, the Treasurer put into the hands of the Secretary, the minute funds, to pay for his service and the printing of the minutes.

On motion of J. V. Barefoot, we have 75 letters printed in contormity with Art. 5th of the revised constitution.

Friday night—R. C. Jackson preached—Text: Matt. 25th chapter, 10 verse. "And they that were ready, went in with him to the marriage, and the door was shut."

Saturday morning 11 o'clock—J. M. Barfield preached—Text: 1 Cor. 13th chapter, 13th verse. "And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity."

Article 1. This body shall be known as the "Original Free Will Baptist General Union Conference."

Article 2. The object of this Conference shall be to promote Christ's kingdom among men, by means in strict conformity to the Holy Scriptures, in our co-operation together in having the doctrine of Christ preached for the salvation of souls.

Article 3. The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Treasurer, Corresponding and Recording Secretary, who shall be elected for a term of two years, who shall hold their office until their successors are elected, which election shall take place one year previous to their entering upon the duties of their office.

Article 4. This Conference shall be composed of the ministers who are members of churches belonging to the body, and of delegates from these churches, each church being entitled to one delegate.

Article 5. The delegate from each church, shall bear to the Conference, a letter certifying his appointment, showing the amount of contribution raised for benevolent purposes during the year, and total number of members, and nothing more.

Article 6. This Conference may, at each regular meeting, elect as many boards of standing committees as may be necessary in carrying out its benevolent purposes. These shall keep a record of their proceedings and make a report at each regular meeting of this Conference.

Article 7. Any minister, conference or church, desiring to become a member of this body shall present his or her petition at a regular session of Conference through delegates appointed for that purpose. If he or she be received, the Moderator shall extend to her delegate, the right hand of fellowship.

Article 8. The Moderator may extend to visiting brethren all the privileges of the body save

that of voting.

Article 9. Each annual Conference is a distinct and independent organization with full authority to manage its own internal affairs, elect its own officers, etc.
