MORNING SESSION

The Union Association of Free Will Baptist met in regular session on the 15th of August at the Antioch Church. Opened by singing led by Bro. James Murray.

Brother James Murray was elected moderator.

Brother Clarence Shepherd was elected as assistant moderator.

Fern Shepherd was elected as the assistant clerk.

Jimmy Ray Nichols was elected as the treasurer.

An invitation was given to all visiting brethren to say anything that might benefit the Association.

Moved and 2nd that we have the ordination of Brother Gar Wilson, as a deacon of the Antioch Church, and that Rev. Paul Bowser bring the ordination message at the eleven o'clock worship service.

Motion made and 2nd that we adjourn the business session until the afternoon session.

ELEVEN O'CLOCK SERVICE

Moved and seconded that the next Quarterly Meeting be held at Webb the first Saturday in November, the following Quarterly Meeting at German Church the 1st Saturday in February, and the next Quarterly Meeting at Enid the first Saturday in May. The Yearly Association will be held at Clinton Friday and Saturday before the third Sunday in August.

Motion made and 2nd that we have an introductory message on Thursday night, before the 3rd Sunday in August and that it would be continued each year hereafter.

Motion made and 2nd that the moderator be given the power to appoint the speaker for the Thursday evening service.

Report of the Executive committee was given. Brother Jasper Burnell from Guymon was examined for ordination as a minister and C. B. Russ was examined for licenses to the Ministry. They were both found sound in faith and doctrine. Brother Jasper Burnell requested ordination by this body at earliest time. The Executive Board referred Bro. C. B. Russ back to his church.

Moved and seconded that our treasurer write a check on our Association and send to the State Associationn for our delegates.

Motion made and seconded that we elect a standing Home Mission Board consisting of three members with one being elected newly each year, at all times retaining at least one minister on this board.

Brother Ralph Hutchinson was elected for the 3 year member on the Home Mission Board.

Brother De Arthur Yandell elected for 2 year member on the Home Mission Board.

Brother Gar Wilson was elected for the I year member.

Motion made and seconded that we hold our election of officers at the close of the business session instead of at the beginning.

Motion made and 2nd that we elect a League Board.

Motion made and 2nd that we have a number of three on the League Board. Brother Jimmy Nichols, Ralph Earles and Joan Rice were appointed by the moderator.

Motion made and seconded that we have an Associational Revival.

Motion made and seconded that the Associational Revival be held at Clinton.

Motion made and seconded that we dismiss for a ten minute recess.

The moderator called the meeting to order.

Motion made and seconded that our Associational Revival be held in the two weeks before the Yearly Association.

Motion made and seconded that we refer our unfinished plans for our Associational Revival back to The Association at the next Quarterly Meeting.

Motion made and seconded that we accept the report given by the League Board, that we meet the first Friday night in September at the German Church to reorganize our Associational League Rally with the election of officers for the coming year. Cletus Langley is to bring the message on this night and also will plan our program then according to the desire of the people present.

Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Ministers reports were read and accepted. Brother Yandell, Jimmy Nichols, Clarence Shepherd, Jasper Burnell, Clyde Hamar, Cletus Langley, and James Murray responded.

Motion made and seconded that the power to appoint the delegates for the National Association. Sister Yandell, Sister Kirby, Sister Clarence Shepherd, Sister Clyde Hamar, Sister Murray, Chad Russ, Mrs. Chad Russ, Russell Rayner, and Mrs. Russell Rayner.

CONSTITUTION OF THE UNION ASSOCIATION OF THE FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptists, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better associational government.

Article I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the Union Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

Article II

MEMBERSHIP: This Association shall be composed of Free Will Baptist Churches who maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrine and practices; and favor the enterprises that have been endorsed by this Association.

Article III

Delegates: Voting members of the Association shall be ministers, deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the League Rally of Association, Officers of Women's Auxiliary Convention of Association, officers of Sunday School Convention of Association, Church Clerks, and also three delegates from each local church of the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials. There must be a quorum of at least three churches present and a written record shall be made of all transactions. No member of the executive board shall delegate authority to any other member of said board to cast his vote for him in anything. The board shall have the power to call all the Association in conference by notifying each church ten days prior to conference and they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or associations is to meet is not able to care for the meeting, and their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church.

Article IV

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer and executive board consisting of five members. The board members to be elected so as to require one to be elected each year. This board is delegated power to act in behalf of and for the Union Association from one meeting to another of said Association, and shall have power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertakings of Union Association. The Board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur in its own body.

To this executive board is further delegated power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best and the means on hand may warrant. They shall have power to convey or mortgage any real setate or associational property. This executive board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to the next regular meeting of the Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control and convey any property entrusted to said Association for any purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donor or donors and in no case divert it from its original object.

The chairman and treasurer of said executive board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc., and any other papers by which Union is become legally held. It shall be the duty of this executive board to meet each regular or adjourned session and as often as may be necessary, and any member absenting himself from meetings three times may be dropped from the board and his successor elected. No meeting of the executive board shall be legal unless at least three members are present.

Article V

NEW CHURCHES: Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Church (Treatise Page 42, 1957), who desires to unite with Union Association may be received by letter and elected delegates.

Article VI

QUESTIONS: No questions from any church shall come under consideration of the Association unless it has been first considered in its own church.

Article VII

CREDENTIALS: When a church desires that one of its members should be examined for license or ordination, it shall be the duty of the council in the examination to find out as nearly as possible if the candidate is qualified.

The candidate is to be examined by a set of questions, if not scripturally and satisfactorily to the approval of the board, they will not be licensed or ordained.

A:

- 1. Are you in regular church attendance?
- 2. How many times have you been in church this year?
- 3. Do you attend prayer meeting?
- 4. Do you support the church with tithes and offerings?
- 5. How many have you saved under your ministry?
- 6. How many times have you preached in the last six months?

- 8. How much time do you give to study of the Gospel?
- 9. What are your convictions and purposes as a minister?

B: REPUTATION:

- 1. This information shall be learned from delegates from his respective church.
- As to the report from within and without the church, (this should consist of kindness, meekness and love.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infallable Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice. II Tim. 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21.
- 2. That there is but one true and living God, and in the God Head of Divine Essence, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Gen. 17:1; John 5:7.
- 3. That we are fallen and depraved creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. Pho. 5:1-19.
- 4. That salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are by life, death, resurrection, ascention and intercession of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5.
- 5. That the joys of the righteous and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal. Matt. 25:46.
- 6. That he that shall endure to the end the same shall be saved. Matt. 24:13: Rev. 2:10.

- 7. That baptism and the Lord's Supper, and the washing of the saint's feet are the ordinances of Jesus Christ, appointed in the church, and none but true believers are proper subjects and the only proper mode of baptism is immersion. Mark 1:4-9-10; Luke 22:30; John 13:14.
- 8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in the public worship of God, and that on it, we should abstain from our worldly concerns except in cases of necessity and mercy. Ex. 31:15; Deut. 5:12; Matt. 12:12.
- 9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both the just and the unjust, but every one in his own order; those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. 1 Cor. 15:34; John 5:28; I Thes. 3:16.
- 10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general, and to singly engage to promote the honor of God. John 13:15; Gal. 6:10.
- il. We believe that Jesus Christ, by the grace og God, tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of His divine benefit only by his repentance towards God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, infants and idiots accepted. Acts 20:21; Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:14-16; 1 Peter 3:21.
- 12. We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him and therefore should be one at His table. I Cor. I:I-II; 27-28; John 17:11.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association into conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such a quorum is present.

- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motion made and lost will not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- II. Any minister opposed to any of the enterprises endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in Conference and we will not seat any minister in this Association who teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration or the birth of the Spirit.
- 12. Each church will be entitled to three delegates and three alternates whose names must be in the church letter.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world; from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree to accept Christion admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit," in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak encourage the afflicted, admonist the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principal sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures. secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, or its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
