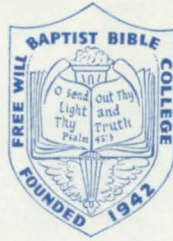

The Minister's Conference met with the Johnson's Chapel church, Powder Springs, Tenn., Sept. 5, 1907 and was called to order by the clerk T. H. Woolsey.

**Report of Ordaining Council.**

Ordained J. S. Burgess, member of Liberty church and licensed Wm. Gardner, member of Grassy Creek, church. Report received and committee released. The President appoints the following Ordaining Council viz:

Adjourned to be called to order by the President.

**Friday Morning.**

Called to order by the President.

Devotional Service conducted by Rev. D. E. Greene. Roll is called and minutes of previous meetings read.

**THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS ADOPTED:-**

Resolved That each minister who has the care of a church or churches appoint a Finance committee to raise funds for Home Missions. The committee to be composed of three or more members.

On motion Resolved, That we empower the president with the authority to call a meeting whenever necessary.

Rev. G. S. Porter is elected Vice-President by acclamation.

**Call Meetings.**

First session met with Mount Carmel church March 29th, 1907, called especially for the reception of Bro. W. B. Jones. This being the only business done at this meeting. Adjourned.

Second Call meeting at Midway church Feb. 1907. This meeting being called for the express purpose of investigating some grave charges against some of our ministers.

The charges against W. F. Buckner being immoral conduct, charges sustained and Buckner excluded.

Charges against J. L. Case contempt of this conference, charges sustained and Case excluded from the Ministers Conference.

Charges against J. S. Crough contempt of conference, charges sustained and Crough dismissed from this body.

Ministers Received at this Session:

Adjourned.

Resolved that each minister or person who feels called to the work of the Public Ministry shall consult the Ordaining Council, who will prescribe a definite course of study which shall be pursued for at least one year, then he shall have a fair examination and upon satisfactory answers to questions touching on Free Baptist doctrines he may have a certificate of license for one year only, he shall then follow a prescribed course of study for the preparation for ordination and further no man or woman will be recognized as a minister who does not comply with the above requirements, and whereas no church has any right to allow one of its members to go out as a minister.

Second, Resolved That anyone coming to us under the name of a Free Baptist shall show his authority for preaching and give reference for his character, and that we advise our churches to know a man is right before he be allowed to preach in our churches.

Rev. D. E. Greene of the Clinch Valley Association accepts a seat in our body as an advisory council.

Adjourned to be called to order by the president.

**Friday Afternoon.**

Met at 1:30 P. M. Devotional service led by Rev. W. R. Stallard. Minutes read and approved. Ministers paid \$4.10 as their pro-rata for printing the minutes.

Adjourned to meet with next session of the Association.

**Report of Ministers.**

G. S. Porter, Alpha, Tenn., delivered 194 sermons and addresses, visited 1162 homes, organized 13 Sabbath Schools with a membership of 252, distributed 225 Bibles and Testaments, witnessed 117 conversions, visited and otherwise aided 35 Sabbath Schools, helped to organize one church, gave for the advancement of the cause of Christ's Kingdom and other benevolent causes \$75, funerals 10, traveled 4391 miles.

A. H. Burgess, Baileyton, Tenn., Route 6, had the care of one church, dedicated one church, witnessed 32 conversions, received 10 members into the church, baptized 4, married 1 couple, funerals preached 2, miles traveled 500, 58 sermons, money received \$30.00, collected for missions \$2.50.

W. M. Clendenen, Dandridge, Tenn., Route 7, preached 92 sermons, assisted in two revivals, preached 7 funerals, had the care of 2 churches, witnessed 35 conversions, married 6 couples, baptized 4, traveled 250 miles, received \$23.65.

Wm. Stroup, Baileyton, Tenn., preached 68 sermons, funerals 2, married 1 couple, organized 2 Sabbath Schools, baptized 18, held 1 revival, witnessed 23 conversions, burials 4, miles traveled 230; received \$41.

W. H. H. Morelock, Baileyton, Tenn., Route 6, had the care of 2 churches, preached 85 sermons, baptized 6, held 2 revivals, married 6 couples, dedicated 1 church, as colporter have had our Sunday School supplies placed in 3 Free Baptist churches, and have sold 150 books of our work, received \$50.

J. G. Blizzard, Church Hill, Tenn., preached 47 sermons, witnessed 7 conversions, homes visited 97, Sunday Schools organized 1, attended 3 fifth Sunday meetings, conducted 2 revivals, pastor of one church, conducted 11 burial services, married 14 couples, traveled 550 miles.

J. R. Richards, Midway, Tenn., Preached 112 sermons, visited 67 homes, witnessed 17 conversions, baptized 4, organized 2 churches, attended 2 Fifth Sunday meetings, received 23 into the church, conducted 3 revivals, pastor of 3 churches, received \$41.22, traveled 930 miles.

J. F. Cash, Knoxville, Tenn., Route 4, preached 132 sermons, conversions 40, baptized 18, married 4 couples, funerals 11, visited 200 homes, gave \$12.00 to the Lord's cause, paid \$18.00 for Railroad fare, delivered 15 Sunday School addresses, received \$7.00, for Home Missions 65¢.

J. S. Burgess, Chucky, Tenn., Route 4, had the care of 1 church from Sunday Feb. 1st, preached 25 sermons, organized 4 Sunday Schools, preached 5 funerals, married 1 couple, traveled 510 miles, received \$20.

W. B. Jones, Greeneville, Tenn., preached 57 sermons, assisted in 3 revivals, witnessed 78 conversions, married three couples, traveled 600 miles received \$12.

R. H. Jones, Rogersville, Tenn., Route 4, preached 25 sermons, married 1 couple, conducted 2 burial services, organized 1 Sabbath School and Superintendent of 1, traveled 250 miles.

G. W. Day, Baileyton, Tenn., Route 5, preached 51 sermons, conducted 3 burial services, witnessed 17 conversions, Superintendent in Sabbath School, married 5 couples, had the care of 2 churches, traveled 350 miles, received \$29.85.

W. H. Johnson, Greeneville, Tenn., Route 10, preached 75 sermons, held 3 revivals, witnessed 93 conversions, baptized 1, married 3 couples, traveled 500 miles, received \$10.



W. P. McPhetridge, Knoxville, Tenn. preached 82 sermons, held 1 revival, witnessed 15 conversions, married 6 couples, preached 4 funerals, baptized 4, received \$5.

A. S. Robinson, Midway, Tenn., Route 2, preached 25 sermons, visited 26 homes, assisted in 4 revivals, witnessed 2 conversions, assistant Superintendent in Sunday School, received \$2.50.

J. L. Cagle, Knoxville, Tenn., preached 148 sermons, witnessed 60 conversions, visited 1043 homes, baptized 6, traveled 3666 miles, received \$84.40.

W. R. Stallard, Midway, Tenn., preached 155 sermons, delivered 37 S. S. addresses, assisted in baptizing 7, conducted 2 burial services, witnessed 97 conversions, organized 8 Sunday Schools and 3 Prayer Meetings, assisted in the organization of 1 church, received 26 members into the different Free Baptist churches, received \$15. gave \$9 to benevolent causes, traveled 2242 miles.

J. C. Stallard, Midway, Tenn., traveled 4528 miles, visited 816 families, distributed 829 Bibles and Testaments, organized 30 Sunday Schools with 1517 scholars, sermons and addresses for the year 222. Have reports showing 171 conversions in my Sunday Schools, have visited the sick, and helped in various ways with the Christian work in the bounds of the Union Association, raised for church buildings \$225, for my services I have received \$700.

### **Constitution.**

1. This body shall be known as the Minister's Conference of Union Free Baptist Association of Tennessee.

2. This Association is formed under authority from Union Association, and shall be composed of Licentiates and ordained Ministers from any Free Baptist Church, in good standing, by a vote of a majority of the conference.

3. It shall have entire jurisdiction over the ministry in said Association, issuing license, prescribing qualifications for the ministry, conducting examinations, and ordaining ministers, working for a most harmonious and effective ministry.

4. The officers of this Association shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, each performing the duties usually performed by such officers.

5. This Conference shall have power to make such By-Laws and other regulations as may be necessary to the performing of its duties.

6. This Constitution may be amended at any regular meeting by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members present, the proposed amendment having been presented in writing at a previous meeting.

### **By-Laws.**

1. The regular meetings of this Conference shall be held annually in connection with the meeting of the Association.

2. Each member shall report at each regular meeting either in person or by letter.

3. Eight members shall constitute a quorum at all regular or legal meetings.

4. The President may call a meeting at any time at the request of five members.

5. At each regular meeting there shall be elected an Ordaining Council, whose duty shall be to examine candidates, grant license, conduct ordinations etc., and report at the next regular meeting.

6. Licentiates shall pursue a definite course of study under the direction of the Ordaining Council.

7. Necessary expenses of this organization shall be met by voluntary contributions or by assessments of members.

8. No member shall serve as pastor of a church which does not enforce discipline, pay pastor a stipulated salary, and contribute to the benevolent enterprises of the denomination.

9. No member will meddle unnecessarily with the work of another, or injure his reputation or usefulness. But members will watch over each other in love and seek to promote the harmony and union of the membership.

10. Each member not excused from age and infirmities is expected to improve himself and do something to advance the cause of Christ, and make a full report at each regular meeting.

11. There shall be created a ministerial relief fund under control of this body for the relief of aged and indigent members.

12. Membership in this body shall be proof of good standing in the ministry, and any member, when necessary, may have a certificate of good standing from the Secretary.

13. These By-Laws may be amended by a vote of two-thirds at any regular meeting.

### **Proceedings.**

The Thirty-fifth Annual Session of the Union Free Baptist Association was held with the Johnson Chapel church, Powder Springs, Tenn., September 5th, 6th, 7th, and 8th 1907. The Introductory Sermon was delivered by Rev. Wm. Stroup at 11 A. M., from John 3:16.

The meeting was called to order by the clerk at 2:30 P. M. Devotional service having been conducted at the previous meeting of the Minister's Conference, we entered immediately upon the work of enrolling delegates from the different churches.

We your Committee on Next Session have agreed that next annual meeting be held with Midway church.

Committee on finance reports that \$22.04 has been received as minute fund.

Rev. D. C. Greene, delegate from the Clinch Valley Association gave a very encouraging report of the work in South-western Virginia.

#### **Committee on Resolutions report—**

1. Resolved that this body pay the clerk \$5 for his services during this session.

2. Resolved that whereas our business meetings are becoming rather burdensome under the Association plan. We recommend the Quarterly meeting system as laid down in the Treatise.

3. Resolved that we recommend that the churches of Greene and Washington counties form themselves into a Quarterly meeting to be held the second Saturday and Sunday in each month in which the Quarterly meeting meets, and Hawkins county churches likewise to meet first Saturday and Sunday,

Coke and Jefferson county churches to compose one Quarterly meeting to meet third Saturday and Sunday, Grainger and Knox counties to compose one Quarterly meeting to meet the fourth Saturday and Sunday.

4. Resolved that the Greene and Washington county churches meet at woolsey College the second Saturday and Sunday in November, Hawkins county churches meet at Christian Bend the first Saturday and Sunday in November, Coke and Jefferson county churches meet third Saturday and Sunday in November, Knox and Grainger county churches meet fourth Saturday and Sunday in October.

5. Resolved that whereas there is a pressing need of a more systematic plan of missionary work among the Free Baptist in the Highlands of the South. That we organize a Home Mission Board for the mountain work, to be composed of at least nine members, four of which must be ordained ministers, two or more ladies and the remainder of said Board to be selected from delegates here present. Resolved further that the chairman be re-elected by this body who shall take care of all funds for Home Mission work, giving receipts for same and that this money shall not be paid out for any purpose except by order of a majority of said Board. That this Board put a man in the work as Field Secretary whose business it shall be to raise, collect or solicit funds for this work, and that he be required to keep a record of all moneys paid into his hands, together with a statement as to how said funds are to be spent if such is made known by the giver.

6. Resolved that we endeavor to raise \$200 in this association for Home Missions during this year.

7. Resolved that we tender our thanks to the kind people of Johnson's Chapel for their kind, untiring and unselfish hospitality in caring for the ministers and delegater of Union Association.
