MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

THURSDAY MORNING, AUGUST 16TH

At 10:00 o'clock the introductory sermon was preached by Rev. A. F. Hensley from Matt. 24:37.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON

Met at 1:00 o'clock P. M. After song and prayer the conference was called to order by the President and the following ministers were enrolled: J. S. Burgess, J. L. Cagle, G. D. Dunbar, A. F. Hensley, W. H. H. Morelock, P. A. Paxton, E. W. Knight, H. W. Morelock, W. H. Johnson, Claude Morelock, Lloyd Light, W. J. Holdway and J. R. Taylor.

The President retired and the Clerk proceeded to organize the conference for the ensuing year.

On motion Rev. J. N. Carroll was elected President and Rev. W. J. Holdway Vice-President.

The conference voted to accept the resignation of Brother Blaine Burgess as clerk of the conference.

On motion Geo. D. Dunbar was elected to succeed Brother Burgess as Clerk.

On motion Revs. A. N. Benfield, R. E. Jinks and R. A. Miller were dropped from the roll for contempt of the body in uniting with other associations without the recommendation of this Ministers' Conference.

The President appointed W. H. H. Morelock, J. E. Ellenburg and P. A. Paxton as a committee on resolutions.

Adjournment to meet on Friday morning at 8:00 o'clock.

FRIDAY MORNING, AUGUST 17TH

Assembled at 8:00 A. M. The devotional services were conducted by Rev. J. E. Ellenburg after which the minutes of the previous day were read and approved.

Rev. S. E. Parker arrived and was seated.

The President appointed J. R. Taylor and P. A. Paxton as a committee on finance.

On motion the conference stood adjourned for the work of the association until 1:00 o'clock P. M.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Devotion by Rev. J. R. Taylor, reading the XC Psalm and offering prayer.

Upon recommendation of the Ordaining Council the conference elected Brother W. D. Worley to membership in this body.

Upon recommendation of the committee on resolutions the conference voted to amend the by-laws of the conference so as to read: "A one year reading course for licentiate ministers instead of two."

Geo. D. Dunbar tendered his resignation to the body as Chairman of the Ordaining Council to take effect at once.

The Ministers' Conference adjourned to meet Saturday morning at 8:00 o'clock.

SATURDAY MORNING, AUGUST 18TH

Rev. C. R. Morelock conducted devotion by reading the 55th chapter of Isaiah and by prayer.

W. J. Sawyers arrived and made his report.

On motion the conference voted that any minister whose name does not appear in the minutes as having reported and having had his character passed shall not be eligible to pastor any church in the Union Association. And any minister leaving the conference while in session, without being excused by the body, shall be fined \$2.00 and his next year's report shall not be accepted until said fine is paid in full.

The conference by vote accepted the resignation of the Ordaining Council.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON, AUGUST 18TH

Devotion by Rev. W. H. H. Morelock.

The president appointed the following Presbytery to do the work in the absence of the Ordaining Council: J. S. Burgess, W. H. H. Morelock and P. A. Paxton.

Lloyd Light, C. R. Morelock and H. W. Morelock were ordained to the Christian Ministry in a very impressive manner by the Presbytery.

On motion we paid the Clerk \$10.00 for his services.

The conference adjourned to be called by the President or to meet with the association on Thursday before the third Sunday in August, 1929.

Brother Glen Wagoner was seated as a representative of Christian's Bend church.

Brother Clyde L. Long of the Missionary Baptist church and a brother-in-law of Brother William Stroup was given a hearty welcome as an advisory council during the entire session.

Following the Ministers' Conference the Moderator called the Association to order, and the reports of churches was resumed. The following churches made their reports: Christian's Bend, Johnson's Chapel, Mt. Carmel, Mt. Moriah, Midway, New Home, New Prospect and Forest Grove.

L. V. Kirk, James Jones and W. S. Dykes were seated as delegates from Hopkins Chapel and Mr. and Mrs. E. D. Kendrick as delegates from Wooddale.

Revs. C. D. Fine and Aaron Embler of the Church of God and the Apostolic Holiness, respectively, were invited to seats as Advisory Council.

At 1:30 Rev. J. S. Burgess preached from Acts 26:5—A wonderful defense of "Our Religion."

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

After the adjournment of the Ministers' Conference the Association convened. Minutes of the former sessions being read and approved, the reports of churches was resumed.

The following churches reported: Bridge's Chapel, Liberty, Wooddale, Bethany, Brown's Chapel, Hopkins' Chapel and Linden Avenue.

Brothers A. L. Knight and W. D. Worley were excused from further attendance in this session.

The Association voted upon the recommendation of the Resolution Committee to divide the Association into two quarterly meeting districts, the Clerk and Moderator to make the division.

The Association adjourned until Saturday morning following the Ministers' Conference.

At 7:30 P. M., Rev. E. W. Knight, of Knoxville, delivered a very earnest appeal from Jude 1:3 to "Contend for the Faith which was once delivered to the Saints."

SATURDAY MORNING, AUGUST 18TH

The Association was called into session by the Moderator.

Midway Union, Fair View, Magnolia and Van Hill churches were placed in the hands of the Church Extension Board for not reporting to the Association.

Delegations were received from the Ladies' Aid Society. Those from New Prospect and Linden Avenue in Knoxville, rendered beautiful and instructive programs. The Aid then organized a District Convention to meet in conjunction with the Association each year. The time allotted to them will be Friday afternoon of each session.

Rev. J. S. Burgess' report as Supervisor was read and adopted as follows:

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

To the Brotherhood of Union Free Will Baptist Association in its Fifty-Ninth Session, Greetings:

I have met and held services with twenty-two churches during the past year. My work has been hard, but I have been royally treated by all. I have found the work ranging from medium to good with a great lack of organization everywhere.

It is gratifying to know that all churches have pastors and regular services this year, which has not been so during the past.

I have organized Ladies' Aids and Young People's Leagues where conditions would merit. Some of these are doing wonderful work and deserve imitation by others.

We held 20 revivals in our churches with 510 conversions and 159 additions. This brings our total membership to date up to 1,295.

We have in this Association 26 churches with their value approximating \$35,000.00.

We paid to the pastors of these churches last year \$2,204.79; an average of less than \$100 each.

We hope that this year's work has been the ground work for a greater future, hence we recommend the following:

1. That as preachers of the gospel, we have a greater interest in one another's work and welfare to the glory of God.

2. We recommend that our ministers devote more time to teaching their congregations the art of giving to the support of the gospel and thereby aid in giving the message to the world.

3. We recommend that all our pastors organize their congregations into such co-operative and auxiliary societies as will be most likely to promote the general interest of the church and cause.

As your Supervisor I have received from the Mission Board the sum of \$50.00. My traveling expenses were \$49.54; leaving me the balance of .46.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON MINISTERIAL SUPPORT

We, your committee on Ministerial Support, beg to submit the following:

After hearing the reports from our churches we are embarrassed to see the decline in supporting the Gospel Ministry, and we recommend that each church belonging to this Association pay twenty-five cents per month for each member in supporting the ministry, and if in any church there should be those who are not able to pay this amount, we ask the church as a whole to make provision for such members as it sees best.

Therefore, in order to create more interest in this vital question, we recommend that this organization establish an honor roll and that only such churches as comply with the above request be permitted to have their names spread upon this honor roll.
