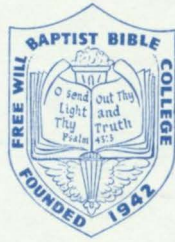

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

To the Moderator and members of the Union Association, Greetings:

The wheel of time has made another revolution and we are in another Yearly Meeting. The past year has been the most trying one, perhaps, that this generation has ever experienced. These depressing times have taught us some wonderful lessons. We have learned that we cannot depend upon the dollar or any worldly material for salvation. It is with a deep sense of our dependence upon God and a heart of gratitude to you all that I submit this annual report.

I have visited all of the churches but three, held revivals with five churches with good results, visited twelve Quarterly Meetings, and received three new churches into the Association.

The work in general is in good condition. There have been added 208 new members during the year. Some of the churches have made great sacrifices. Buildings have been improved, and even new churches built. Wooddale and Fairview have each dedicated new buildings during the past few months.

New fields are opening up and need our attention at once.

I have been paid from the treasury of the Association \$287.45. My expenses for the year have been \$68.00. The increase in expenses was largely due to the fact that I did not own my car this year and was forced to pay traveling expenses.

I wish to make the following recommendations for your consideration.

First. That a training school to train for leadership be established at an early date.

Second. That Young Peoples' Work receive more attention in the churches during the coming year.

Third. I ask that the ministry co-operate more effectively in this work for the glory of God and the advancement of His kingdom.

A motion to elect a Supervisor was tabled until the budget committee had reported.

Rev. J. L. Welch of the Cumberland Association at Nashville, Tennessee, was presented and made a very earnest appeal for a plan of union.

Mrs. Welch came forward with a few words, but reserved her address for the Ladies' Aid Convention.

The committee on Education reported as follows:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

We, your committee on Education, are basing our recommendation on the fact that the greatest hindrance to the advancement of our denomination is the lack of preparation among our ministers and other leaders for the tasks assigned them. There are two primary things necessary for the work a Christian leader is supposed to do. First—an intelligent understanding of the Holy Bible, and Second—A literary training as a means for interpreting the Scriptures. There is a woeful lack of both of these qualifications among our people. The responsibility for this condition rests first, with the individual and second, on the denomination. Inasmuch as the church cannot rise above the leaders, we therefore recommend:

First. That we not only urge but insist that our leaders use all possible means and opportunities afforded them to prepare themselves for their labors. We especially urge the careful and constant study of the Scriptures. Every Christian leader should know his Bible. We also urge that our ministers learn to use the English language correctly when speaking in public.

Second. That we provide Church Schools to be held regularly at different places for the benefit of our workers. A suggestive program for such a school is herein given.

Third. That we co-operate with our General Conference in its efforts to establish a centralized educational institution for our church.

Fourth. That we assist our worthy ministerial students who wish to attend school or take a Bible correspondence course.

Fifth. That we include the Dunn-Butler Theology in our course for young ministers.

The Clerk, Rev. Geo. D. Dunbar, presented Rev. J. L. Welch of the Cumberland Association, near Nashville, Tennessee. Rev. Welch held his listeners spellbound for almost an hour with a soul stirring message on, "A Changeless Christ in a Changing World." He used as a text Heb. 13:8, "Jesus Christ, the Same Yesterday, and Today, and Forever." He said in part, "Jesus Christ has met the needs of every age, and He is equal to the needs of the present day. The need of the times is a ministry that can ad-

just themselves to present day conditions and preach Christ in present day language." A burning message filled with inspiration and instruction.

Report of committee on Literature was adopted as follows:

We, your committee on Literature, submit the following:

Realizing that one of the most important factors in the spiritual and educational advancement of our denomination; that without good literature on inspirational and denominational matters, we are seriously handicapped; that it is very important, too, that we use that kind of literature that will bring us into closer fellowship with God and each other so that we may bring His kingdom on earth; we recommend,

First. That ministers and laymen not only read but study as comprehensively as possible the main text book of our church, the Bible; that the study of the Bible be encouraged in the homes and all departments of our work.

Second. That our members subscribe for and read the papers printed by our denomination, as the support we give them will determine their success.

Third. That we encourage the publishing and distribution of such literature as helps, tracts and leaflets for use in our work.

Fourth. That our churches use the Free Will Baptist literature in their Sunday Schools, F. W. B. L., and Women's Work.

Fifth. That the parents in our churches be very cautious in the selection of literature read in the home, carefully avoiding the use of all that is not wholesome.

sions and make the necessary preparation to take their place among other denominations in this long neglected work.

The Committee on Resolutions make the following report:

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

Realizing that a long felt need of our people might be realized through a better organized Young Peoples' Work, Therefore, be it,

Resolved, That we create an office to be known as A Young Peoples' Secretary, whose duty it will be to visit all of our churches and co-operate with the pastors and other church workers in organizing and encouraging young people in League work. Be it further,

Resolved, That this Secretary shall be elected for a period of one year, and it shall be requisite upon him to report to each Yearly Meeting his activities and give a statistical report of all members obtained, money raised and expended, meetings held and such other data as may be of interest to the members of the Yearly Meeting.

Realizing that the present system of financing the work of the Association and that there is an unequal distribution of the money collected from the various churches, Therefore, be it,

Resolved, That a Finance and Equalization Board be created, whose duty it shall be to make out a budget for the year to cover Missions, Printing, Supervision and miscellaneous expenses for the running expense of the entire association. The Board shall then apportion this expense among the churches upon the basis of the enrollment of the church upon all members in good standing at the time of making of the last annual report. The said board shall also have power to make requisition upon pastors and church clerks for certified lists of all such members in good standing.

Be it further,

Resolved, That, the churches be asked to pay the amount so assessed in monthly installments, and not in a lump sum as has been the custom heretofore.

Be it further,

Resolved, That, every pastor shall, at the beginning of his year's work as pastor, appoint a committee on finance, whose duty it shall be to canvass the membership of the church, or churches, and insist that each member assume his share of the burden in the form of small monthly payments to be paid at regular monthly times as designated by the pastor.

Be it further,

Resolved, That, each church raising the amount so assessed, shall be

placed upon a Roll of Honor to be printed in each Annual Minute, and that the said Finance and Equalization Board be instructed to donate the said churches a Banner of suitable design to be displayed upon the walls of the successful church.

Be it further,

Resolved, That, no church report shall be considered complete and be accepted unless the amount so assessed is paid by the time of making the annual report.

Be it further,

Resolved, That, each pastor reporting full payment of the amount assessed to any one or all of his churches, shall be named in an Honor Roll to be published in the Minutes of the Annual Ministers' Conference.

Report of the Budget Committee was as follows:

REPORT OF BUDGET COMMITTEE

Taking the 1932 report as a basis of calculating, we find that an assessment of 2½ cents per capita will bring into the treasury a sufficient sum to defray the expenses of supervision, printing, mailing and all incidental expense.

We suggest the following for each church. That each church collect 3c per month per member or 30c if paid in advance for the year. We find that some of the churches are collecting the 5c per capita and are keeping the other in the local treasury. This is proving to be a good way of educating the folks into the habit of systematic giving.

Please collect and send in monthly to the Treasurer, H. D. Bailey, Chuckey, Tenn., Rt. 4, a sum equal to 2½c per member reported in the 1932 Minutes so that we may keep the Supervisor in the field regularly.

Committee on Temperance adopted the report of last year.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

Seeing the effects of intemperance on our church and social life, let us resolve that we will work, pray and preach against this great evil until we see its defeat.

We recommend that any church member or members found aiding or abetting this unlawful and sinful work shall be excluded from the church immediately.

Mrs. Dean Broyles of the Liberty Ladies' Aid Society, was re-elected clerk, for the ensuing year.

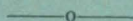
