

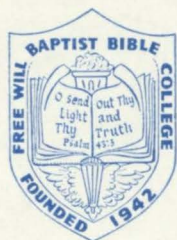

Report of the Supervisor was read and adopted:

SUPERVISOR'S REPORT

To the Moderator and Brethren of the Union Free Will Baptist Association—Greetings:

I herewith submit my annual report as Supervisor of our work for the past year.

I have visited all churches in the association except four. All of our churches during the past year have been under the leadership of splendid pastors who are doing all they can for the advancement of our work and the establishment of the Kingdom.

I have visited all the Quarterly Meetings except one. Much interest has been manifested in these meetings and most of our constructive program is due these organizations. The church reports to these meetings are very good.

I have organized one church at Graystone Chapel, Greene County, with twenty-one members. I have dedicated two church buildings, Jackson's Chapel in Greene County, and Valley View in Loudon County.

I have received from the Treasurer \$49.50. My free-will offerings have totaled \$28.00. My Expenses have been \$68.00.

I have discovered a number of places where people are anxious to have help in establishing Free Will Baptist churches. Many of these are worthy of our consideration.

I have had some part in the work of the Clyde Street church since its organization. During the past year this congregation has purchased a well furnished and attractive building in which it now worships and all indications are that this will become a strong and thriving church.

I have been actively engaged in the Christian ministry for the past thirty years. I have served as your Supervisor for the past eight years. In these eight years you have placed upon my shoulders a weighty responsibility of which I have ever been mindful. I have tried to face this task in a heroic manner. With the assistance of my brethren in the ministry and co-laborers of our militant laymen, I have seen evidence of much progress in our worthy organization which I sincerely hope will only inspire us to greater achievements in the work of the Kingdom. Needless to say, my work has not been easy, but it has been pleasant.

I wish to make the following recommendations:

First: That we elect a Conference Evangelist who will work under the direction of the Supervisor.

Second: That our pastors make a stronger effort to get our people to support the work financially.

Rev. Geo. D. Dunbar of Chuckey, Tennessee, was unanimously elected as Supervisor for the ensuing year. A Field Evangelist to be elected by the Association must work under the direction of the Supervisor, and all Young Peoples' work to come under the same direction. The Supervisor is to have the authority to call into service anyone needed to extend any phase of the work mentioned.

A committee consisting of J. S. Burgess, C. L. Long and G. F. Cannon, were appointed to fix the salary of the Supervisor. This committee retired immediately and reported that fifty per cent of all funds coming into the associational treasury and all free-will offerings be paid to the Supervisor and that he be allowed to hold the Forest Grove and Valley View churches during the year.

The conference then stood adjourned until the time of evening worship.

Brother Roy Paxton was present and led the choir in some excellent singing at the hour of evening worship.

Rev. Jesse Laws was at his best when he entered the pulpit for the evening message. His subject, "The Three Witnesses." This was well taken.

FRIDAY MORNING

Assembled following the work of the Ministers' Conference.

Mrs. Henry French and C. M. Cobble of Eastern and Mrs. G. F. Cannon of Western Quarterly Meetings were enrolled.

Deacons, L. A. Cobble and Chas. French were also enrolled.

Reports of Quarterly Meetings were read and adopted as follows:
Eastern, Northern and Western.

New members arriving and enrolled were: Rev. C. L. Long, Deacons Ike Dickson and Onnie White, and from the E. Q. M., Mrs. I. N. Wilson and Vena Price, and Prof. Frank Stroup and Mrs. Cora Wagner of the Northern Q. M.

The Conference voted to have the Clerk secure enough clean advertisements and have them printed in the Minutes, to pay for the printing of at least 1000 copies.

A request was entered by the Clerk for a Publicity Director, and another for a change of the time of meetings by Rev. J. C. Howington. Neither received favorable attention.

Adjourned for the preaching hour.

At 10:30, the hour of worship, Rev. J. C. Howington, pastor of the First Church of Elizabethton, spoke on the power of the "Holy Spirit," using as a text Luke 24:49. A great message for this age.

A single, small association in Ohio is now supporting a missionary in Venezuela. Why cannot we do something to spread the Gospel of the

Kingdom? Christ said "Go ye into all the world and make disciples of all men." "How can they go except they be sent?"

Let us go back home to make an honest effort to do something for so worthy a work as this.

Rev. P. A. Paxton was unanimously elected as Associational Evangelist by a standing vote. His work to be under the direction of the Supervisor or at the discretion of any pastor desiring his service.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

We recommend the adoption of last year's report.

We, your committee on Education, are basing our recommendation on the fact that the greatest hindrance to the advancement of our denomination is the lack of preparation among our ministers and other leaders for the tasks assigned them. There are two primary things necessary for the work a Christian leader is supposed to do. First—an intelligent understanding of the Holy Bible, and Second—A literary training as a means for interpreting the Scriptures. There is a woeful lack of both of these qualifications among our people. The responsibility for this condition rests first, with the individual and second, on the denomination. Inasmuch as the church cannot rise above the leaders, we therefore recommend:

First. That we not only urge but insist that our leaders use all possible means and opportunities afforded them to prepare themselves for their labors. We especially urge the careful and constant study of the Scriptures. Every Christian leader should know his Bible. We also urge that our ministers learn to use the English language correctly when speaking in public.

Second. That we provide Church Schools to be held regularly at different places for the benefit of our workers.

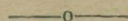
