ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

The Eighty-Ninth Annual Session of the Union Association of Free Will Baptists convened in annual session on Tuesday evening, August 14, 1962, at the Central Camp Grounds near Greeneville, Tennessee. The Moderator, Rev. E. H. Brock, called the meeting to order and asked Rev. Wiley Vaughn pastor of Van Hill Church, to lead the congregation in singing. Mrs. Creed Allen was at the piano and Miss Karen Brown at the organ.

Rev. James Barham, associate pastor of the Greeneville Church, read devotionally Phillipians 3:13-21. He stressed verse 14, "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus." Rev. Jesse Kelley led in prayer.

A brief recess was granted for the Ministers' Conference to organize.

In preparation for the evening worship service Rev. Vaughn led the congregation in singing "He Keeps Me Singing," "Standing on the Promises," and "Blessed Redeemer." Rev. Lloyd Light led in prayer. The Moderator introduced the speaker of the evening, Rev. Jimmy Byford, pastor of Cherry Hill Church. I Corinthians 15:58 was the text for his message, "Steadfast and Unmovable." He exhorted men to pray, to study God's Word, to be steadfast, and to abide in an unmovable hope.

The Moderator named Rev. Donald Sexton, Rev. H. D. Bailey, Rev. Hubert Strickler, Mr. I. L. Stanley, and Rev. Guy Foster as the Committee on Committees and Nominations.

The meeting was adjourned until Wednesday morning at 10:00 o'clock.

Wednesday Morning

Registration began promptly at 9:00 on Wednesday morning at the registration booth.

At 10:00 o'clock, Mr. I. L. Stanley, music director, called the session to order. With Mrs. Stanley at the piano and Miss Karen Brown at the organ he directed the congregation in singing "Stepping in the Light" and "There Will Be Showers of Blessing."

The morning devotion was conducted by Rev. Glen Mulkey, pastor of the First Church in Knoxville. He filled in for Rev. Jerry Presley, who was absent due to a death in his family. Rev. Mulkey read Galatians 2:1-7 for the devo-

tional reading and led the opening prayer.

The Assistant Moderator, Rev. Howard Munsey, seated the ministers, deacons, and delegates who had registered at the registration booth as the voting body. He recognized our visitors and seated them as advisory council.

The program planned by the General Board was adopted as the working plan for the session with permission granted the Moderator to alter it if necessary.

Rev. Munsey presented the Moderator, Rev. E. H. Brock, of Loudon Tennessee, who read Ephesians 4:1-7. He then read a brief and concise Moderator's message.

Rev. Donald Sexton read the report of the General Board. This report was adopted and is printed in the Report Section of this minute.

The report of the Camp Director was read and adopted. (See in Report Section.)

Mrs. Creed Alen read a report of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention which was adopted and will be found in the Auxiliary Section of the minutes.

At this time the Moderator granted a ten minute recess.

The body reassembled and Mr. Stanley again led the singing. Everyone seemed to enjoy singing the old hymns of the church, such as "At Calvary," "There Is A Fountain," "He Brought Me Out", and "Love Lifted Me." Rev. Dan Cronk, missionary to India, led in prayer. As a prelude to the message, Mr. Stanley sang "Each Step I Take."

The Assistant Moderator presented Rev. D. C. Byrd, pastor of the East Side Church in Elizabethton, as the morning messenger. He read Galatians 2:20 and used for a subject, "Christ Who Loved Me And Gave Himself For Me." This was a message of encouragement and inspiration which was greatly appreciated. "I Feel Like Traveling On" was sung as a fellowship hymn. Rev. Garland Teasley prayed the benediction.

The highlights of the noon hour were the delicious food and the fine fellowship at the Camp Cafeteria.

Wednesday Afternoon

The afternoon session was called to order at 1:30. Mr. Stanley directed "My Lord Knows the Way" and "Come Unto Me."

Rev. Benny Turner, pastor of Trinity Church in Erwin, read Romans

13:1-2, made appropriate and inspiring remarks, and led in prayer.

The Statistician, Rev. T. F. Lewis, made his report which was adopted and is printed in the Report Section of this minute.

Rev. Roger Reeds of Nashville, Tennessee, reported the accomplishments of the National Sunday School Board. He stated that the department was not asking for money but for orders for Sunday School literature. This report was received as information.

Mrs. Paul Woolsey read the report of the Union Sunday School Convention. This report was adopted and is printed in the Report Section.

Complying with the request made in the report of the General Board, the Clerk appointed Rev. E. H. Brock Rev. Howard Munsey, and Rev. H. H. Tutterow as a Clarity Committee to check the minutes.

Miss Connie Brown read the report of the Union League Convention. This report was adopted for publication. (See League Convention).

The report of the Committee on Christian Education, read by Rev. Glen Mulkey and the report of the Committee on Missions, read by Rev. Benny Turner, were adopted. (See Report Section.)

The meeting adjourned until the time of the evening worship.

Wednesday Evening

A prelude by Mrs. Stanley and Miss Brown introduced the evening worship hour. Mr. Stanley led the audience in singing, "I Must Tell Jesus" and Rev. Lloyd Light, pastor of Eastern Star Church; prayed the opening prayer. Mr. Stanley then directed "I Would Not Be Denied" and "He Lives."

Rev. R. T. (Bobby) Olterman, pastor of the State Line Mission in Morrison City, conducted the devotions. He read Psalm 133 and led in prayer. Mr. Stanley sang "Rescue The Perishing" and Rev. Guy Foster, pastor of the First Church of Johnson City, offered prayer.

The Moderator presented the evening speaker, Rev. Carl White, pastor of Hillcrest Church in Maryville, who read Luke 10:30-37 as a scriptural background for a challenging message, "The Other Side."

Thursday Morning

The morning session got off to a good start with Mr. Stanley and the musicians leading the audience in "Revive Us Again" and "Must Jesus Bear The Cross Alone."

Mrs. Trula Cronk, our missionary to India, read several verses from Psalm 37 as a basis for her lovely devotional comments. She led in prayer.

The report of the Promotional Secretary was read by Rev. Paul Woolsey was adopted. (See in Report Section.)

Reports of Board and Committees were read and adopted as follows: Superannuation Board, read by Rev. Guy Foster; Committee on Temperance, read by Rev. Howard Munsey; Appreciation, read by Rev. Edward J. Young; Christian Literature read by Rev. G. D. Dunbar. These reports are printed in the Report Section.

Motion carried that Rev. Dunbar handle the correspondence required in the report on Christian Literature.

Rev. Lloyd Light reported for the Committee on Necrology. This report was adopted and will appear on the Memorial page.

Rev. Elmer Carter read the report of the Resolutions Committee. The report was adopted item by item and is printed, as adopted, in the Report Section.

Rev. Donald Sexton read the report of the Committee on Nominations. After the reading of the report, the Moderator ruled that the two positions on the Home Mission Board had to be officially vacated before being filled. Upon sustained motions, the resignations of Rev. Guy Foster was accepted and the position of Rev. James F. Miller was declared vacant because of his retiring and moving away.

There were no additional nominations from the floor, so all the officers submitted by the Committee were elected.

A report of the Children's Home was given by the retiring Superintendent, Mr. H. C. Burgess, which was received as information. On motion, Mr. Burgess was given a rising vote of thanks for his years of loyal service rendered the Home for Children.

The offering for the Home for Children was \$93.20.

The business session was adjourned for the morning worship service which was opened by singing, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Rev. Winston Sweeney, pastor of Fellowship Church, prayed the prayer. At this time the Moderator presented Rev. Dan Cronk who brought a very timely and illuminating message on "The Word." This great message was based on John 1:1-9. The closing hymn was "The Lily of the Valley."

The meeting was adjourned until 1:30.

Thursday Afternoon

Mr. Stanley opened the afternoon session by singing "Happy Day."

In the absence of Rev. James Bowers, Rev. James Kelly pastor of Kingsley Avenue Church in Greeneville, led the devotions. He read Romans 12:1-4 and offered prayer.

On motion by Mr. Stanley, Karen Brown's name was added to the Appreciation Committee's report.

Rev. Paul Kettelman, promotional representative for the Free Will Bap-

tist Bible College, made a brief report which was received as information.

Delegates to the State Association were elected as follows, Mrs. T. M. Pate, Mrs. Winston Sweeney, Mrs. Donald Sexton, Mrs. W. H. Teague, and Mrs. I. L. Stanley. Alternates chosen were Mrs. Aubrey Samples and Mrs. David England.

Motion made by Rev. Dunbar passed to recommend Rev. Winston Sweeney to the National Home Missions Board for service, in the event of an opening for an assistant or promotional representative. Rev. Sweeney has a growing love for this work and it was felt that he could be useful in this field of service.

Motion was made to give Rev. Harley Brown and Rev. Henry D. Bailey a rising vote of thanks for their labor on the screening of the mess hall. This motion was amended to give each of them, from the Associational treasury, \$50.00 compensation for this time and service.

The report of the Home Missions Board was adopted. This was a financial report which showed a bank balance of \$347.73.

The report of the Coordinating Committee on Camp By-Laws, read by Rev. Henry Bailey, was adopted. By the consent of the Association, this report will not appear in the minutes; however, copies will be mailed to the Camp trustees and Camp officials.

Rev. E. M. French spoke briefly on some of the existing problems at the Home for Children.

Motion sustained for final adjournment.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of the Union Association met, with all members present, in a special called session on November 11, 1961, to discuss the Literature Program in our denomination. A plan was formulated and a letter was mailed to each church in our Association.

On May 26, 1962 the Board met again at Greeneville, Tennessee, to plan the program for the next session of the Association. Only one member was absent. The program was planned and accepted.

A report from the Coordination for the Camp Grounds Committee was read and adopted. The motion was by Rev. Brown and the second by Rev. Strickler.

A motion carried to give the necessary funds to Rev. Brown from the general treasury for the shower fund, provided there was at least \$600.00 left in the treasury.

A motion carried that we strongly urge the Association to support Rev. and Mrs. Daniel Cronk since Mrs. Cronk is the only foreign missionary representing East Tennessee.

A motion carried to supply a committee of three to check the minutes of the Association, immediately after each session, for completeness and clarity. It is also to be understood that the Clerk asked for this committee and the members will be selected by him.

REPORT OF THE CAMP DIRECTOR

Th many improvements at the Central Camp Grounds show that it was the scene of much activity during the summer.

The camp dining hall was extended 12 feet, widened approximately 5 feet, and the entire dining area and kitchen were screened. Mr. H. C. Burgess and Rev. Henry Bailey donated the concrete blocks for the extension and Rev. Bailey worked on the project until it was completed. Mr. Western Cureton of Newport spent a day laying the blocks and getting the framework started. Rev. H. H. Tutterow also helped with this work.

The W. tern League Convention built a shower house in the boys' area. Although it was not completed, the three showers were ready for use during

the Youth Camp and the Associational meeting.

The Oak Grove Church solved the housing problem for boys by erecting a cabin to accomodate sixteen campers. This cabin was finished just in time for the Youth Camp.

The additional facilities mentioned above drew many favorable comments, and great appreciation was expressed by the campers and their parents and friends as they arrived on Sunday afternoon, July 22, 1962, for the week of encampment.

These one hundred six campers from 25 churches represented 6 Quarterly Meetings from 3 Associations in 2 States. There were 15 adults serving as counselors and cooks or instructors.

Enough applications had been received to fill all the cabins and two late applicants brought their own cots; however, eight applicants did not come and we were able to keep five campers who had not filed applications. Again no one was turned away.

A very fine group of campers, excellent instruction, an effective evangelist, and above all, the presence of the Spirit of the Lord, made this week of encampment one to be long remembered.

The classes, under the supervision of Professor L. W. Vinson, the Assistant Camp Director, included: Missions, taught by Rev. and Mrs. Dan Cronk; the Gospel of John, by Rev. Donald Sexton; the Acts of the Apostles, by Rev. Paul Woolsey; Evangelism, by Rev. T. M. Pate; and League Work, by Rev. Jerry Presley.

The kitchen staff included Mrs. Theda Vinson, Mrs. Helen Brown, Mrs. Gussie Clark, Mrs. Billie Sexton, Mrs. Maxine Dover, and Mrs. Rebecca Bowers. These ladies also served as counselors in the cabins.

Dr. L. C. Johnson, President of the Free Will Baptist Bible College, was the evangelist. His message emphasized Christian living His Knowledge of and experience with young people made these services very meaningful and full of practical applications. The results were soon manifested as revivals broke out in the grove, in the cabins and in the sanctuary. There were 16 conversions and 4 recommitments. To our knowledge only one camper went away who was not a Christian.

The camp activities ended with the Union Asociation League Rally on Friday, July 27. This was attended by approximately 200 people which included campers, league delegates, and ministers.

The following is a summary of the work done by the Promotional Secretary during the past year:

I have attended 15 Quarterly Meeting sessions and had a report made for me at the 16th; given out some 5,000 pamphlets and booklets of all phases of our denominational work; visited 28 churches (some more than once) on behalf of our work; sent out 375 cards and letters (not including 85 S. S. Convention programs); attended 6 Auxiliary Conventions and 4 Sunday School Conventions; gave Missionary Programs in 2 churches; arranged 3 different itineraries for the Bible College Quartet and 2 itineraries for the Cronks (attended, with them, 13 churches which are not included in the 28 listed above); and traveled some 4,500 miles, not including trips to the State and National Associations. 5. We further recommend the encouragement of local newspaper editors to publish articles and reports of outstanding evangelists in our modern day.

6. Inasmuch as, we have observed the work of the Tennessee State Bureau of Investigation in clearing public newsstands of pornographic publications; and inasmuch as, these publications are a great temptation to our youth, we recommend that a letter of commendation be sent to the above organization thus encouraging them to continue their outstanding work in this area. Finally, we suggest that a copy of this report be offered to all newspapers within the bounds of the Union Association for publication.
