ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

A piano prelude by Mrs. Harold Teague opened the Ninetieth Annual Session of the Union Association of Free Will Baptists at the Central Camp Grounds near Greeneville, Tennessee, on Tuesday evening, August 13, 1963. Mr. Ray Turnage led the congregation in singing "There Shall Be Showers of Blessings." Rev. Coy Patterson read II Peter 3:9-18 as a background for the devotional thoughts for the evening.

The Moderator, Rev. E. H. Brock, seated those who had registered as the voting power of this meeting. He then named the Committee on Committees and Nominations as follows: Rev. Donald Sexton, Rev. Dewey Bernard, Rev. Henry D. Bailey, Rev. Jerry Pressley, and Rev. Wiley Vaughn.

The report of the General Board, given by Rev. Donald Sexton, was adopted.

The report of the Camp Board was given by Rev. Guy Foster and was adopted. Rev. Foster then requested a report from the Camp Director on the activities of the camp. This report, by Rev. Harley Brown, was received as information. The Director was given a standing vote of thanks for his services.

Omitting the recess, the Moderator introduced Rev. Harold Harrison, Promotional Secretary of the Sunday School Department. He gave a brief report and explained the promotional plans.

Mr. Ray Turnage led us into the worship hour by leading the congregation in singing "Trust and Obey." Prayer was offered by Rev. Herman Christian.

The Moderator presented Rev. Bobby Olterman, pastor-elect of Eastern Star church. He read Ephesians 3:8-21 and used for a subject, "God's Dimensions." This was a masterpiece seldom equaled. We witnessed a wonderful outpouring of God's Spirit in the fellowship.

The blessing upon the food was included in the prayer of dismissal. Lunch was then served in the Camp Cafeteria.

The report of the Sunday School Convention was read by Martha Hughes. She requested permission to combine all reports for publication. Permission was granted and the report was adopted. (See Sunday School Convention.)

Rev. Henry D. Bailey gave the report of the Superannuation Board. This report was adopted and is in the Report Section.

Complying with a request made last year, the Clerk appointed a Clarity Committee to read the minutes at the close of each day. This Committee included Rev. E. H. Brock, Rev. Howard Munsey, and Rev. Jerry Presley.

The afternoon session adjourned for the Minister's Conference.

A piano prelude aroused the singing spirit in the congregation. They sang with inspiration a number of songs directed by Mr. I. L. Stanley. Prayers were offered by Rev. Lloyd Light and Rev. E. M. French.

The Assistant Moderator, Rev. Howard Munsey, presented Rev. Guy Foster, pastor of the First Church in Johnson City, as the speaker of the hour. Knowing the impact that reading material has upon the thinking and the actions of the reader, both young and old, we are compelled to take cognizance of the type of reading matter so easily accessible to all of the reading public. Almost all drug store and supermarkets, have at finger tips the most obscene, vulgar and soul-debasing books and magazines that the pens of the most depraved, debased and sin-loving writers of this twentieth century can produce. In these periodicals, illicit sex is glorified, gambling is a pastime, murder is an easy way of settling every-day problems and sin in general is a minor offense to be winked at and forgotten. Dope peddlers and bootleggers are the gentlemen of society. Those who indulge in such have for a paltry excuse, "it is all

right because everybody is doing it." We are sowing to the wind and soon we will reap a whirlwind. Many well-meaning folk are inclined to think because it is in print, it is all right. Your committee realizes that there is no universal cure for this outside of a consecrated Christian life, and this is not too general, but we offer a few suggestions, humbly, for your thinking.

1. We insist that each pastor preach upon these evils at least once each year, and that he secure from the F.B.I., or other law enforcement agency, facts and figures to verify each statement.

2. That families be urged to purchase regularly for the family library, some good wholesome and interesting books and magazines. That they be made to feel that this is even more important than the grocery list.

3. That every family be encouraged to subscribe to the denominational papers and periodicals.

4. That we insist upon every church within our connection adopting and using the literature provided by the National Association in all departments of the church.

5. That we extend our thanks to the State Bureau of Investigation for the clean-up campaign which was recently initiated for removal of obscene literature from news stands, but which seems to have bogged down in recent months.

6. And, not the least among these, is a return to daily Bible reading. Someone has well said, "The Bible will keep one from sin, and sin will keep one from the Bible." **MAY THE GOOD LORD LEAD US BACK TO HIS WORD!!!** is our prayer in His name.
