ASSOCIATIONAL PROCEEDINGS

The meeting was then adjourned for the organization of the Ministers Conference.

Succeeding the work of the Ministers Conference, Rev. E. M. French was in charge of the evening service. Brother Teague led the congregation in singing, "Send the Light," with Mrs. Ray Turnage at the piano. Rev. Clarence Phillips led in prayer. The congregation then sang, "He Keeps Me Singing."

Rev. French introduced the Keynote Speaker, Rev. Bobby Greene, Pastor of Lowes Chapel Church of Newport, who brought the Keynote message. He read from Matthew 5:14, 16 and John 5:35. His subject was "Ye are the Light of the World." The message was a challenge to all of us to live a higher and nobler life, letting our light shine forth in the midst of the darkness.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

The Rev. Ralph Staten gave the report of the Resolutions Committee. A motion carried that the report be received and adopted item by item.

We, your Committee on Resolutions, do hereby submit the following recommendations:

1. WHEREAS the duties of the Home Mission Board and the Committee on Missions have overlapping duties or similar functions; and

WHEREAS said services can be performed efficiently by the Home Mission Board:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Committee on Missions be dissolved.

M S C to adopt.

2. WHEREAS resolution # 1 of 1966 relative to the Sunday School Conventions charge to the pastors failing to rectify an attendance and interest situation for this year; and

WHEREAS the work of promotion and extension of the Church Training Service and Sunday School are so closely related:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the work of the Sunday School Convention be held on Friday before the fourth Sunday in May, the night before the C.T.S. Convention meets the next day.

After discussion and questions concerning the resolution, the motion carried for its adoption.

3. WHEREAS so many have remarked that they didn't know that they were on some of the programs of our meetings until they had arrived at the meeting place; and

WHEREAS program outlines serve to give extra publicity to the meetings:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we request program committees to forward said program outline a month ahead of date to be published in "The Voice."

M S C to adopt.

4. WHEREAS the flood of gross immorality that is deluging our land and promoted by modern theologians of the Ecumenical Movement and leaders of the National Council of Churches and others who promote the "new morality" or the philosophy of "situation ethics"; and

WHEREAS "situation ethics" erroneously teaches that in some situations unmarried love is infinitely more moral than married unlove; lying is more Christian than telling the truth; stealing is better than respecting private property; no action is good or right in itself--it depends on whether it hurts or helps people. In other words, the end justifies the means; and

WHEREAS the "new morality" is nothing but immorality--adultery or fornication--garbed in different terminology and "situation ethics" is a violation of the standards of God's word and a

revolt against God Himself in His authority in the affairs of men.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we warn its advocates of the dangers and the deceptive device of Satan to ensnare unsuspecting persons, especially young people, and that we repudiate this "new morality" philosophy as the work of the flesh and they which do such things without repenting shall not inherit the Kingdom of God. (I Cor. 6:9, 10) (II Cor. 12:21) (Gal. 5:19, 21) (Eph. 5:5) (Rev. 2:20, 23)

M S C to adopt.

5. WHEREAS the book of Revelation, chapters twelve through eighteen, give credence to the theme of one world government and a one-world counterfeit church, MYSTERY, BABYLON THE GREAT, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH (Rev. 17:5) the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird (Rev. 18:2), which could be very well the organization of the present day Ecumenical Movement, in growth and power; and

WHEREAS we have the warning, "Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not her plagues (Rev. 18:4):

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that we request that if any of our officials who should attend any convention or meeting sponsored by the Ecumenical Movement, National Council of Churches or any other body that is courting the same only do so as an individual observer and that we withdraw membership from any higher body that holds membership in the same.

M S C to adopt.

6. BE IT RESOLVED that we protest the National Council of Churches use of public funds for the establishment of a religion of modernism and liberalism by injecting courses of study in a school's curriculum as an historical Bible Survey Course which is only a critical attack upon the truthfulness of the Bible, its author, its authenticity and its being the only safe rule of doctrine and practice.

M S C to adopt.

7. BE IT RESOLVED that we urge our President and Congress to stop "building bridges" trading with communist nations, giving aid and assistance to them, while our men are dying in Viet Nam.

The afternoon session began with Brother I. L. Stanley leading the assembly in singing "You Can Have a Song in Your Heart." Mrs. Stanley was at the piano.

The Moderator introduced Rev. Roscoe Higgins who gave the devotion, reading from Dan. 9:3,10. The remarks that followed were both timely and weighty. Rev. Jerry Presley led in prayer.

The Moderator called for delayed reports.

Rev. Herman Christian gave an oral report of the Superannuation Board. A written report was to be submitted for inclusion in the minutes. Motion carried for its adoption.

Miss Amanda Mosier gave the report of the Church Training Service Convention. Motion carried to adopt.

Rev. James J. Kelley read the report of the Appreciation Committee.

Richard Cordell of Nashville, Tennessee requesting that he, as Treasurer of the Tennessee State Association of Free Will Baptists, officially endorse the publication of a State paper. A motion was made that we, the Union Association of Free Will Baptists, do hereby endorse the publication of a State paper. The motion passed.

Rev. Woolsey spoke of the financial needs of the Camp, urging more support in the form of freewill offerings from local churches.

Rev. T. F. Lewis inquired if it were on record that the Association had adopted the "Star Book For Ministers" as a standard for our ministers to use. Rev. George Dunbar confirmed that it was on record.

The Moderator then ruled that on the basis of previous action of the Association, the "Star Book For Ministers" is endorsed for use by our ministry.

Rev. George D. Dunbar spoke very forcefully and eloquently on the need for publicity so that the general public may be informed as to our stand on the issues of the day and as to our existence and actions as a church body which makes the world a better place in which to live.

A motion carried that Mrs. I. L. Stanley, Zula Lee Wolfenbarger, Mrs. Ralph Staten, Mrs. Ray Turnage and Mrs. T. M. Pate be appointed as delegates to the Tennessee State Association of Free Will Baptists. Mrs. Harold Pitts was designated as an alternate.
