PROCEEDINGS OF THE 97th ANNUAL SESSION

AUGUST 11, 1970-7:30 P.M.

Mr. I. L. Stanley opened the session with some old familiar choruses with which the congregation responded with vigorous singing. Afterwards he led the hymn, "The Lily of the Valley." Mrs. Stanley played the piano.

Rev. Ralph Staten, Moderator, welcomed every one present. He introduced the assistant moderator Rev. George Higgins who in turn introduced Rev. V. E. Condrey the devotional speaker of the hour. He read from Gen. 28:10-23. Rev. Roscoe Higgins led in prayer.

MSC to seat the delegates as the voting power for this session.

Moderator recognized the four quarterly meetings.

Moderator named the Committee on Committees as follows: Henry Bailey, V. E. Condrey, C. G. Mulkey, and Wiley Vaughn.

MSC that E. C. Jennings be elected secretary pro tem in the absence of the secretary Winston Sweeney.

The Association adjourned for the work of the Ministers' Conference.

After the work of the Ministers' Conference Rev. Millard Taylor presented Rev. Ralph Staten to bring the keynote message. His topic was "Stand Up and Be Counted." His key scriptures were Eph. 10:19 and Psalm 94:16. The message was very scriptural and informative.

The Committee on Committees named the nominating as follows: Paul Woolsey, Roscoe Higgins, Martin Oxendine, and Marlin Vaughn.

WEDNESDAY AUGUST 12

Mr. I. L. Stanley opened with hymns, "Leaning on Everlasting Arms," and "Old Time Power."

Assistant Moderator introduced Rev. Jack Cox who in turn gave the devotions from selected scriptures: II Pet. 3:16 and Rev. 22:18-19.

Called to order by Assistant Moderator, Rev. George Higgins.

Ministers' reports were received.

Visiting ministers were recognized: Revs. Ferrel Sparks, Jacks Creek Assoc.; Assistant Moderator presented the moderator Rev. Ralph Staten who gave the Moderator's Message which is as follows:

ACTING MODERATOR, OFFICIALS, of this 97th Annual Session of Union Association of Free Will Baptists, pastors, ministers, delegates, laymen and visitors, my highly esteemed audience:

It is again that I come to you as Moderator of this august body of born again believers in the atoning blood of Jesus Christ for the redemption and forgiveness of our sins, the bodily resurrection, ascension and return of the Divine Son of God, for the called, chosen and faithful (Rev. 17:14). May we re-echo in this hour, "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God" (I Pet. 4:11). "To the law and to the testimony: if they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them," Isa. 8:20.

As fundamentalists we believe in a supernatural God, in a supernatural Christ and in a supernatural Bible as the infallible and inspired Word of God. The Bible

has God for its author, salvation for its ends and truth by which God shall judge us; and therefore is and shall remain to the end of the world the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, opinions shall be tried.

As the theme of our associational meeting is "Marks of Modernism," we still believe while in a world of confusion, conflict and chaos we have a solid foundation in the Rock of Ages with a church of which the gates of hell shall not prevail against (Matt. 16:18) and a kingdom which cannot be moved (Heb. 12:28) and things which cannot be shaken may remain. Great and eternal truths upon which the unshakable throne of Christ stands or rests:

1. His power as Creator, things visible and invisible.
2. His priesthood as Redeemer after the order of Melchizedek.
3. His pedigree as King of kings and Lord of lords
4. His priority, the kingdom of God first.
5. His precious promises as exceeding and great.
6. His prospect sure and soon.
7. His person in attributes; same yesterday, today and forever.

The adversities as destroyers, apostates, demon-inspired rebels against God and His word is not something new, though it has new names.

Modernism has no gospel; ecumenism has no faith; apostasy has no moral or spiritual power; science has no light; communism has no soul; humanism has no god; and atheism has no salvation.

The Bible warns against: "false prophets" (Matt. 24:24-26), "grievous wolves" who speak "perverse things" (Acts 20:29-30), "false apostles" (II Cor. 11:13-15), those who by the "sleight of men, in craftiness" seek to carry men about by "every wind of doctrine" after the "wiles of error" (Eph. 4:14), those who "pervert the gospel" (Gal. 1:6-9), "false prophets and teachers" who teach and preach the "doctrine of demons" (Tim. 4:1-5), those who teach "fables" (II Tim. 4:1-5), "false prophets who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly are ravening wolves" (Matt. 7:15), "false apostles, deceitful workers" who make themselves appear to be "apostles of Christ" but are really the ministers of Satan (II Cor. 11:13-15), those who do not walk by the same rule the faith once delivered to the saints, (Jude 3), and thus, who are enemies of the cross of Christ and "whose end is perdition," (Phil. 3:15-19).

The modern ecumenical leaders tell us that the church of the living God, cannot stand aloof; it must be "involved" in this, in that, in everything. These are men who seek involvement with everything because they have lost its spiritual dimension. All they can do is to seek absorption in the temporal because they have lost their grip on the Eternal. The modern ecumenical leadership seeks an alliance with the state because its functions have become no different than the state. These leaders want the church to undertake everything because they have lost the one distinctive thing for which the church exists: they have lost the Gospel. They have substituted for it the ecumenical mush concocted of a little bit of everything and adding up to nothing.

In reaffirmation of my remarks given one year ago, I re-echo, "'Let us go hence, the hour is at hand, I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day, the night cometh when no man can work.'"

Rev. Eddie Young introduced the speaker for the message, Rev. M. C. Taylor pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church, in Church Hill, Tennessee. His scripture was Hebrews 4 and topic was "Needed." Need of Revival; Need of New Birth; Need of the Church. Dedicated people, preachers, and vision.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Mr. I. L. Stanley led congregation in several choruses.

In the absence of Rev. Fred Hall, Rev. Bill Van Winkle, missionary to Murfreesboro, Tennessee, led in afternoon devotions.

Scriptures used 2 Thess. 2:1-12; after making several inspiring remarks from the scripture, he gave an informative talk about the work at Murfreesboro and the project of establishing a Free Will Baptist Church there.

Assistant Moderator, Rev. George Higgins presided over the afternoon session.

At present, three ministers are receiving benefits in the amount of \$25.00 per month. Those receiving benefits are Rev. J. D. Bright, Rev. Hubert Morelock and Rev. Robert Cutshaw.

We recommend that those receiving superannuation be paid \$35.00 per month. We also remind you that all payments are assured only as long as income permits.

We further recommend that all ministers be given an 18 month grace period, to decide whether or not they want to join the Superannuation program. Provided that he qualifies.

We further recommend that the promotional Secretary remind all churches this year and every year hereafter to place special emphasis on Fathers Day of each year by receiving an offering or by making some special contribution to superannuation, declaring this Superannuation Day.

Rules passed in 1965 Annual Session concerning the covered of ministers by Superannuation Board of Union Association.

"That any minister of Association wishing to be covered by Superannuation Program of said Association, will be required to make quarterly contributions of at least \$3.00.

That this Association supplement said contribution with 30 per cent of her annual income.

This Association will in no way be obligated to any minister if and when funds are not available.

That each quarterly meeting of this Association be responsible for, and obligated to receive such contributions from these ministers and keep a record of these gifts or contributions, and pass the same onto the Promotional Secretary of the Union Association to be dispensed of according to the wishes of said Association and the need of said ministers.

A minister making an application for help from the Superannuation Board and/or the Union Association must be a member of the Union Association and Ministers' Conference in good standing as such; he must have been active in work as a pastor or evangelist for at least five years.

If said minister or ministers makes an application for help from this Superannuation Board and/or Association before he reaches the age of seventy, he shall furnish the Board with such evidence as will prove his disability and that he is no longer physically able to preach or otherwise earn a livelihood. His disability must be certified by a licensed physician. It is further provided that this certificate must be renewed each year. Any active approved minister may claim this compensation at the age of seventy.

No minister may be added to the superannuation roll until he has presented a written application signed by himself and by the moderator of the quarterly meeting of which he is a member. This application must be accompanied by a doctor's certificate and presented to the Superannuation Board.

Any minister not availing himself of this coverage when it is made available to him, and then later decided that he wants to be covered, will be required to go back and pay the full amount that he would have paid had he been from the beginning."

HOME MISSION BOARD REPORT

The Home Mission Board met August 12, 1970 and Rev. E. M. French was elected chairman.

A motion was sustained that we contribute \$100.00 per month for one year to the Home Mission work in Murfreesboro, Tennessee beginning when the missionary is resident on the field.

Dear Friends and Co-workers,

We want to thank you for the way you have shared in this work since we last saw you. We hope that you will tell your churches how much their giving and praying has meant to the witness for Christ here because without their support we would have been unable to stay.

This has been one of the best years of our time in India. At the same time it has brought many frustrations. For a while we thought our days here were few and numbered as we watched the Communists rise to power in Bengal and become a grave threat to law and order in Bihar. The Lord has undertaken and the Communist government in Bengal has fallen for the time being so that we have a short reprieve. Almost certainly they will regain and strengthen their position in a very short time. We must work while we can.

We expect to continue the literature saturation campaign during the winter months. We hope to reach every person who can read with the written gospel message. At the same time we hope to be opening adult education classes to teach others to read. Pray for us much as we try to teach our young church in India will soon be struggling for its very life.

While we feel the urgency here of working while there is still the opportunity to do so, we realize that conditions there where you are press just as hard, and we pray that during these days together you will re-commit yourselves to getting the message out.

We have been meeting many young people from the west—Americans, Canadians, English, Germans, etc. coming out here to study Hinduism and Buddhism. Our experience has been that almost to a man they are totally unevangelized. They have not heard the gospel message in terms which they have been able to understand. The materialism which results in the exploitation of man by man which they see in their home countries they think to be Christianity, or at least the result of Christianity. What a caricature our western countries have made of the Christian faith. These young people want nothing to do with it. We have come to a new understanding of what it means to be lost as we observe these young people groping for the bread of life and not finding it.

Another distressing thing is the way that young people from the young churches in the east who are sent to the west to study are losing their faith while there. Friends, we do need personal renewal and revival in the church. How patient the Lord has been, but will He go on forever bearing our lukewarmness, or will He soon spew us out of His mouth because we are neither cold nor hot? Let us join together in prayer that the fire may fall upon us all to purify and send us out more able witnesses to His saving grace.

Until He comes, let us be faithful.
