PROCEEDINGS OF 98TH ANNUAL SESSION

TUESDAY EVENING – AUGUST 10, 1971

The evening service began with a piano prelude by Mr. Dean LeMacks, musician at Faith Church of Morristown, Tenn. Congregational singing was then conducted by Mr. I. L. Stanley from Faith Church in Knoxville, Tenn., who led in singing "Jesus Saves." Rev. E. C. Jennings led the opening prayer, after which the assembly sang the chorus, "I've Discovered The Way of Gladness" as conducted by Mr. Stanley.

Rev. J. J. Kelley then called the session to order and on motion seated the delegates as the voting power and the visitors as advisory council.

The following brethren were named to serve as the Committee on Committee's and Nominations: Rev. Richard Holt, Rev. E. M. French, Rev. Paul F. Hall and Rev. Wiley Vaughn. The session was then adjourned for the purpose of organizing the Minister's Conference.

The evening worship service got underway as Mr. Stanley led the group in singing, "He Lives," "He Brought Me Out," and "What A Friend We Have In Jesus," as the presence of the Holy Spirit permeated the singing with great blessing. Mrs. I. L. Stanley accompanied at the piano. Rev. Ted Reynolds offered prayer and the singing continued with renditions of "Blessed Redeemer" and the old time favorite "Amazing Grace" which was accompanied with much rejoicing.

Brother Kelley recognized Rev. Paul Kettelman, member of the Faculty of the Free Will Baptist Bible College, Rev. Wallace Hayes and Rev. Richard Cordell, members of the Tennessee State Home Missions Board and Rev. Bill VanWinkle, State Home Missionary to Murfreesboro, Tenn. who were visiting with us, representing their respective departments.

Rev. Hal Kirk, pastor of Union Chapel Church, was presented as the Keynote Messenger. He read from Genesis 18:14, "Is Anything Too Hard For The Lord?" and from Jeremiah 32:17, "There Is Nothing Too Hard For Thee." A well prepared message was brought on the subject, "There Is Nothing Too Hard For God."

1. There is no prayer that He cannot answer.
2. There is no promise that He cannot keep.
3. There is no place that He cannot send a revival.
4. There is no person that He cannot save.

An invitation was extended as we sang, "I Have Decided To Follow Jesus."

The service was concluded as we sang, "God Can Do Anything But Fail." Brother J. D. Sisk offered the benediction.

WEDNESDAY MORNING – AUGUST 11, 1971

At the opening of the morning session the assembly sang the chorus,

"Everybody Ought To Know" and "Whisper A Prayer In The Morning," led by Mr. Stanley with Mrs. Stanley at the piano.

Rev. Roger Dinsmore, pastor of Magnolia Church, conducted the morning devotions. He read from Isaiah 11:1-6 and called for an altar prayer. Many knelt at the altar as prayers were offered in unison for the needs of the hour.

The Assistant Moderator, Rev. Ralph Staten called the session to order and on motion seated the registered delegates and recognized the visitors. He then presented the Moderator, Rev. James J. Kelley who delivered the following message:

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE

I greet you in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord and Saviour. We find that in this time of history that we are living in a drifting age, where churches and individuals are drifting far from the Biblical foundation of truth; where governmental and educational institutions have left the principles of right and are conducted contrary to the Biblical foundations of truth. But brethren, let us be optimistic in this time of darkness and chaos and look again at Psalm 119:105, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path."

Free Will Baptists everywhere now have the greatest opportunity in history to let the light of Jesus Christ shine out through our lives to a lost and dying world. Brethren, let us omit the fads and fancy of modern day religion and proclaim the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. May we neither go to the right nor to the left but teach and preach the exact truth as is revealed in the Bible.

I pray that when we leave this ninety-eighth annual session of the Union Association that we may go forth in the power of the Holy Spirit, trusting God to do exactly what His Word tells us He will do.

May God give us wisdom in conducting the Association's business and may our deliberation be done in a Christian's spirit and with Christian courtesy.

He also expressed the need to properly train our future ministers and lay workers so as to make them capable of greater effectiveness in performing God's work. A motion carried to receive the report as information, extending to the School a rising vote of thanks for the splendid work which they are doing for Free Will Baptist youth.

REPORT OF THE CAMP DIRECTOR

The Union Camp Director made the following report:

Junior youth camp began June 27th and ended on July 2nd. One hundred two campers registered for this camp. A wonderful response was experienced as thirty-eight boys and girls answered the invitation and made decisions for Jesus. Of this number, fourteen made first time decisions and were wonderfully saved.

Senior camp started on July 25th and ended on July 30th. After all the dust was settled at this camp, it was discovered that there were sixty-five campers. At this camp two were saved and there were thirteen other type decisions.

This is the most rewarding work that I have ever been in. It would be more rewarding if more people would be willing to carry the ball. Why don't all of you fall behind the next Camp Director and really make this thing go for God.

Mr. Cordell then spoke to the meeting in behalf of State Home Missions, of which he is a board member, "The Echo" State periodical, of which he is the editor, and State Associational work. A motion carried to receive this as information.

His report was interlaced with his usual timely and humorous anecdotes and incidents which never fail to arouse a keen interest.
