The Moderator then recognized Rev. Bill Van Winkle who gave a report of the growth of the work in Murfreesboro, Tenn., thanking the people of the Union Association for their financial participation and prayer support in this work.

CENTENNIAL PROGRAM

The Moderator recognized Rev. Paul Woolsey, Chairman of the Centennial Committee who seated the special guests and representatives of families of our founding Fathers.

Brother I. L. Stanley led the congregation in singing the Centennial theme song, "Faith of our Fathers," and "Onward Christian Soldiers". Rev. Lloyd Light led in prayer.

Rev. Paul Woolsey then recognized Brother Bernie Pierce, oldest living member of the Association (age 92) who as always, was present at the meeting. Rev. Jessie Laws, pastor of Greene Ridge was recognized and also delegates from Midway, Greeneville First (formerly New Cross), Liberty, Harris Memorial and former members of Woolsey College, an institution which played a vital part in the history of our Association.

Brother Stanley, with Mrs. Stanley at the piano led in singing, "How Firm a Foundation."

Brother J. B. Wolfenbarger read devotionally from Eph. 2:1-22 and based his remarks on the Centennial theme as revealed in verse 20.

"And are prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the chief cornerstone." Rev. E. M. French offered prayer, giving thanks to God for the leaders of the past, petitioning for inspiration for the future.

Brother I. L. Stanley then presented the following historical background preceeding the Union Association:

"In the beginning of the Union Association, that is, there was the Toe River Association, and it was not void.

The record indicates that the first meeting of the Toe River Association was held in Yancy County, North Carolina, at the Jack's Creek Church, on , November 15, 1850. The Moderator was Mosseui Peterson; the clerk, Wm. Bonapart Woolsey; the speaker, John Wheeler.

Eighteen years later (1868) a new organization grew out of this Toe

River Association known as the American Association of Free Will Baptist. For some unknown reason this organization was short lived and died in early infancy. In fact, the record does not indicate that it even functioned at all as an association. However, four years later (1872) two new groups were formed from the same churches that formerly had identified themselves with the American Association.

The two groups mentioned above were known as the French Broad Association and the Union Free Will Baptist Association. The latter was organized with six churches and a total of two hundred and twelve members. Both of these Associations still exist and have grown stronger with the years. Several new associations have grown out of the Union. Surely God's blessings throughout this one hundred years grants the right and privilege to celebrate this 1972 Centennial."

Mrs. Pearl W. Morgan then presented "One Hundred Years of Growth and Development", tracing the progress of the Association from its beginning to the present time.

The program was climaxed as Rev. James Munsey preached on "Looking Ahead". His message was unusually fitting and well prepared using Psalms 137:1-9, he challenged the Association to:

- I. Go forth in the Spirit of our forefathers who suffered innumerable hardships, fought numberless foes and labored diligently to give us what we have today.
- II. Gear our ministry to the challenge of our own day and not live in the accomplishments of the past.
- III. Look ahead to our Lord's return to earth.

The message was said by many to be a high light of the Association and was an inspiration and challenge to those present.

An offering of \$83.88 was received to help defray the expense of the Centennial Committee.

A motion carried that the Centennial Committee publish in booklet form their presentation, "One Hundred Years of the Union Association." This is to be done at the Association's expense.

Rev. Charles A. Thigpen offered the benediction for the morning service and the invocation for the noon meal after which there was a bounteous luncheon and a time of good fellowship enjoyed by the visitors and delegates.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

Services opened as Brother Stanley led, "At Calvary." Rev. Charles A. Thigpen gave a very inspiring devotion from II Timothy 4:6-8 closing with prayer.

Brother Thigpen brought greeting from Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tenn., where he is also Dean.

Rev. T. F. Lewis gave the report of the Statistician which on motion was adopted.
