Item 4. Motion made and seconded that Terry Bailey be elected as Camp Treasurer. Item failed by vote. I.L. Stanley to remain Treasurer for camp.

Item 5. We the Camp Board request that we be allowed to study the possibility of building a new tabernacle and submit a proposal of plans and cost to the Association which passed by vote.

Item 6. To investigate buying insurance to cover our buildings and the activities of our people while here, final approval by the General Board, which passed by vote.

Motion by Rodney Bailey and seconded to let children from FreeWill Baptist Childrens Home come to camp each year at the cost of registration fee per child. Motion passed by vote.

Brother Don Lamb gave resolution concerning camp. A motion and second to lay on table passed by vote. Association recessed to give way to the Minister's Conference.

Brother Stanley led congregation singing and Brother Howard Munsey led in prayer. Scripture and prayer by Gene Swatzell reading Prob. 29:18 with Acts 2:38. Special singing by Chris White. Resolution offered to this effect: Because of his untiring efforts, faithfulness and allegiance to this campground facility and because of his love and devotion to not only the facilities but to the Free Will Baptist People, and because this is the year that marks his 75th birthday and thus marks many, many years of service.

Be it resolved that this tabernacle (or sanctuary) be officially named the I.L. Stanley Tabernacle with a fitting name plaque placed in an appropriate location to so designate.

Be it further resolved that similar action be taken on behalf of Brothers George Dunbar, E.M. French and Paul Woolsey to place their names on other buildings of this campground.

Be it also resolved that our clerk send appropriate letters to these men and/or their families.

This resolution was seconded by Winston Sweeney and passed by vote.

RESOLUTION

Whereas the youth camping program is one of the most effective means of reaching and teaching our youth,

And Whereas, the camping program is an extension of the local church ministry, Therefore, the camping program should receive extensive planning, preparation and organization, as much if not more so, as our local church situations, Therefore, Be It Resolved that the following organizational and planning structure be adopted for our Central Youth Encampment Program:

1.) Camp Board:

- a. Meet at least one time or as many times as necessary a year for the specific purpose of discussing and arranging for proper care and upkeep of camp properties,
- b. Take seriously the selection of directors in co-operation with Camp Co-Ordinator. Directors should be interviewed by Camp Board and Co-Ordinator as to doctrine, standards, and philosophy.
- c. Accept only directors who meet the requirements and whom the whole board can agree on.
- d. Not to encumber the Camp with any major indebtedness without the approval of the voting body of the Union Association.
- e. Be permitted to enforce Bible standards in dress and deportment.

2.) Camp Co-Ordinator:

- a. Secure, in co-operation with the camp board, the 3 camp directors for each camping year.
- b. Work hand in hand with the camp manager to see that campgrounds are ready for the 3 Union Association Camps.
- c. Take charge of kitchen and securing cooks for each of the three Union Camps.
- d. Purchase all good and camp supplies for each of our 3 camps.

3.) Camp Manager:

- a. In conjunction with the camp board he is to have sole authority over the physical plant at the campground.
- b. To be consulted by the Camp Co-Ordinator and/or Camp Director when a need in the physical plant arises.
- c. Be responsible to address youth before each week of camp in the proper care of camp property.
- d. Be responsible for paying all camp bills.

- e. Evaluate physical plant before each outside camp, who rents camp property, arrives so that they may be assessed for any damage incurred by camp property.

4.) Camp Directors:

- a. To have sole authority over campers, teachers, counsellors, and evangelist for their particular week.
- b. Have right to select his own counselors, teachers, and evangelist.
- c. Be permitted to re-imburse evangelist according to circumstances, - distance of travel, type of occupation, etc.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this planning and organizational structure supercede all previous rules for the Central Campground and the camps held at said campground.

Motion and seconded to adjourn 109th Annual Session of Union Association Free Will Baptist until Aug. 10, 11, 12, 1982. Carried by vote.

CAMP REPORT

You helped us to reach our goal this year in camp improvements, we asked for a new roof on the dining hall and three refrigerators. We got the roof fixed with a five year warranty and much cheaper than we expected. The freezing units are in use, one freezer and two refrigerators. We had 259 kids in camp this year - our attendance was up 40% over last year. Most of the kids went home saved and with a purpose in life. Three boys announced their call to the ministry.
