PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday Morning, August 16, 1983

Brother Bobby Greene called the 111th annual session into order at 9:00 A.M. "I Want to be a Worker for the Lord" and "Pray for the Night is Coming" was sung.

MSC to seat all ministers, deacons, and delegates as the voting power of the association.

MSC to seat all visitors as advisory council. Brother Marlin Vaughn gave the scripture and prayer reading from Acts 1:8.

MSC to permit the Moderator to alter the program as needed.

The Moderator appointed the Committee on Committees. It is as follows:

For reasons that our Promotional Secretary is a layman and a working man, the Moderator called on Ed Hall to give the Promotional Secretary's report early.

MSC to adopt report.

A recess was declared to give way to Minister's Conference. All the proceedings of the Minister's Conference will be found under the Minister's Conference section in this book. The Minister's Conference recessed to give way to the Ladies Auxiliary meeting in the sanctuary. The Men met in the cafeteria for the seminar by Dr. Charles Thigpen from the FWB Bible College. There was 36 men present.

Following is a brief outline of Dr. Thigpen's morning seminar:

What Will Bible Study Do?

1. Discover and convict of sin
2. Cleanses from sin
3. Imparts strength to those who study word
4. Instructs Bible students in right living
5. Provides Bible students with a reward over sin
6. Makes Bible students fruitful
7. Gives power in prayer

Brother Don Sexton brought the morning message for the Ladies Auxiliary. He preached a wonderful message about *When the Vision is Lost, the People Perish*. After the message fellowship was enjoyed by all as we ate lunch in the cafeteria.

In the afternoon seminar Dr. Charles Thigpen spoke about Building Sunday Schools for the Glory of the Lord.

Tuesday Night Sunday School Convention

The services were started on time with some good singing. Brother Gary Franklin, President of the Sunday School Convention, called the session into order to conduct any business that might come before the body.

Brother Frank Russell was introduced to bring the scripture and prayer. He read from 2 Kings 6:1, and the anointing of the Spirit was upon him.

President Franklin read a thank you note from the Woolsey's, thanking us for the offering from last year's convention.

The Nominating Committee was appointed which is as follows:

They were excused to meet and come back to the Conference with a report.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report was given which showed \$31.99 brought forward, an offering of \$76.72 was received last year and \$75.72 had gone to the Woolsey family, leaving \$32.97 on hand. MSC to accept minutes and treasurer's report.

The attendance banner went again this year to Greeneville First Free Will Baptist Church with a total of 74 present.

An offering of \$77.79 was received. MSC to give the money to the FWB Bible College. MSC to give \$32.97 to Dawn Sweeney. This was the amount on hand at the close of the Convention.

The Nominating Committee gave their report as follows:

Frank Russell was elected President for the coming year. Gary Franklin was elected Vice President, and Connie Southerland was elected Secretary.

Two great songs were sung before Dr. Charles Thigpen was introduced to bring the evening message. He stated his first trip to the Union Association was in 1948 or 1949, and it rained that day. He read as a text 2 Timothy 2:2, and his subject was "A Teaching Ministry."

A great message was presented to us under the power, demonstration, and anointing of the Holy Ghost. He closed by adding that one should be ready to

preach, teach, or die at a moment's notice.

Wednesday Morning

Brother I. L. Stanley got things rolling by leading the congregation in some good old songs of the faith. Brother Ray Neas called the session into order and recognized our visitors, ministers, deacons, and delegates. The voting power of the association was seated.

Brother Allen Presley gave the opening scripture and offered prayer. He read from Psalms 1:1-6.

The Moderator was introduced to bring us his message.

Dr. Charles Thigpen was recognized as the representative from the Free Will Baptist Bible College.

Dr. Thigpen told us three things the Free Will Bible College does:

1. It is a place of prayer (staff, students, classes, societies)
2. It is a place of preaching (chapel)
3. It is a place of christian service (every student required to be involved in some kind of christian service every week; jails, nursing home, street preaching)

Over 1200 people were won to the Lord by students alone last year. The college needs \$54,167.00 per month to operate. Dr. Charles Thigpen encouraged us to remember the college in our wills and to support the college with our offerings from the churches.

MSC to receive report as information.

A letter from Brother Raymond Riggs was read and received as information.

Each Moderator from each quarterly meeting was recognized as follows:

Brother Carl Callahan gave the General Board report which had some constitutional changes included in the report. Report was received and laid on the table by the voting power of body.

Brother Brock was appointed as Parliamentarian.

The item of business in the General Board report concerning the insurance premiums, by vote of the body, was referred back to the Camp Committee, and they were to bring a recommendation to the association on how the insurance premiums could be taken care of the best way.

Brother I. L. Stanley gave the Superannuation Report. Report was adopted by vote.

Brother Thurman Pate gave the Treasurer's Report which was adopted by the voting power of the association.

Mrs. Wolfenbarger gave the Appreciation Committee report which was adopted by vote.

Brother Ray Neas introduced our morning speaker, Brother Rodney Bailey, Pastor of Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church. He read from 1 Kings 17:1 and 19:1-4 for a text. The subject was "*Discouragement*" in connection also with our theme "*Work While It is Day.*"

After the heart felt message that touched the soul of every member present, many came to the altar to seek after the face of God. After the morning message, a fine hour of dining and fellowship was enjoyed.

Wednesday Afternoon

The meeting was called back into order at 1:30 with Brother Roy Ketron bringing the scripture and prayer. He read from 2 Timothy 4:1-4 and Romans 10:8.

The Moderator called on the Nominating Committee to give a partial report for electing members to the Camp Board. Brother Howard Munsey was nominated for term to expire in 1987, and Brother Rodney Bailey was nominated for a term to expire in 1988. MSC for nominations to cease and elect by acclamation.

MSC to adopt camp report.

MSC to adopt statistician's report without him reporting to association.

MSC to adopt UDWA report.

MSC to lay on table Number 3 standing rules for admendment by stricking from rules completely.

A recess was called to give way to the Minister's Conference.

Wednesday Night

Brother I. L. Stanley opened up the services by leading the congregation in the song "He Lives." Brother Gary Norton read from Luke 19:29-34 and inspired us with a thought that we need to be loosed from the cares of World and ready for the service of the Lord. His devotion was wonderfully tied in to our theme "Work While It is Day".

Brother Stanley lead "Love Lifted Me." He inquired if anyone had a birthday. The response was Marlin Vaughn who was 79 years old, and he selected the song "How Great Thou Art" which was sung by all.

Brother Ermine Butler was introduced to bring the message of the hour. He stated this was his first time ever to preach at the association. Reading from Galatians 2:20 and 6:14, he used as a subject "The Glorious Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ."

2. Cross has power to send men into service.
3. Cross has promised, Heaven is just ahead.

After a wonderful message, the service was dismissed in prayer.

Thursday Morning

August 18, 1983

The services were opened by the congregation singing "Amazing Grace". The devotion were brought by Gary Lovett. He read from Habakkuk 2:1-2, and brought a very challenging devotion, he then closed in prayer.

The meeting was then called to order by the moderator, Bobby Greene. He then opened the floor for a time of testimony. There were many inspiring and challenging testimonies from members of the congregation.

The moderator asked everyone to stand as E. H. Brock lead the congregation in prayer.

The moderator introduced James Earl Raper, the Superintendant of the Home for Children, who had some of the staff and children of the home to sing and give testimonies. Nancy Wigmore, one of the house parents sang, "This is Just What Heaven Means To Me". Dawn Valanty, one of the children from the home who was returning to Free Will Baptist Bible College for her second year gave her testimony. Brother Raper then introduced the staff of the home who were present. Afterwards, Trina Valanty from the home sang, "If Ever I Love Thee, My Jesus Tis Now".

Brother Raper gave a brief report of the condition of the home, which he said was very good. He shared some of the needs of the home with the congregation and encouraged the people to continue their generous support.

The moderator then received a special offering for the Children's Home

as the congregation was led in singing by Brother I. L. Stanley. The total offering received was in the amount of \$104.30.

At this time, many special requests of prayer were received from members of the congregation, and Brother Earl Langley led this time of special prayer.

Motion was made and seconded that the Ladies' Auxiliary report which had been delayed, be added to the minutes when received. This motion was passed.

Brother Ray Neas read a letter addressed to the Association from Brother Carl Callahan telling of expenses he had incurred in the office of clerk. The total expense was in the amount of \$185.76.

The motion was made and seconded that the Union Association reimburse Brother Callahan for this expense. This motion was passed.

The moderator then called for miscellaneous business. The Nominating Committee gave their report at this time.

Motion was made and seconded to receive the report and vote on item by item. On each item, motion was made and seconded for nomination to cease and proceed to elect, and passed by vote.

The session was recessed with prayer.

After a short recess, Brother Stanley led the congregation in singing, "When We All Get To Heaven" and "Wonderful Grace of Jesus". Brother Laws then led the congregation in prayer.

Prior to the morning message, Nancy Wigmore blessed our hearts with another beautiful song. Dewey Bernard brought the message, reading from John 9:1-5. He spoke on, "The Value of The Soul of Man". He brought a very inspiring message.

After the message, Brother I. L. Stanley led the congregation in singing, "Trust And Obey". There was a time of fellowship as the song was continued.

Brother James Earl Raper prayed the prayer of benediction as the Association recessed for lunch.

Thursday Afternoon

The afternoon session began with Brother Homer Ray Smith leading the congregation in singing, "At The Cross". David Cook had Scripture and prayer. He read from Titus 3:3-8.

Motion was made and seconded to appoint the following ladies as delegates to the Tennessee State Association: Mrs. I. L. Stanley, Alice Woolsey, Edna Dyer, Zula Wolfenbarger, and Dorothy Christian. The motion passed.

Motion was made and seconded to remove from the table an item from the General Board, which had been laid there the day before, because it involved a constitutional change. The motion passed to remove it from the table.

This recommendation from the General Board involved three items, which were dispensed with item by item, which were as follows:

- Item 1 Motion was made and seconded that under the Standing Rules of the Union Free Will Baptist Association, that Number 9, which reads; General Board members will receive 15 cents per mile driving to first

meeting after the close of the Association, be completely deleted.
Motion passed.

Item 2 Motion was made and seconded to amend Number 10 under the Standing Rules to read; General Board members will receive 20 cents per mile for every mile driven in the line of duty. The motion passed.

Item 3 Motion was made and seconded to amend Number 17 under Standing Rules to read; The Association shall convene on Wednesday morning and end on Thursday night following the second Sunday in August. If this passed then Number 18 would be changed to read; Ordination Council can meet on Tuesday before the Association convenes for the purpose of examining candidates. The moderator took a standing vote with 24 in favor of the motion and 14 against. The motion passed with the majority vote.

MSC to take off table Item 3 concerning \$1.00 for minutes.

MSC to amend standing rule number 3 by deleting from books.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the 111th Annual Session of the Union Association of Free Will Baptists. The motion passed. Brother Carson Whiteaker then closed our meeting in prayer.

UNION DISTRICT WOMAN'S AUXILIARY REPORT

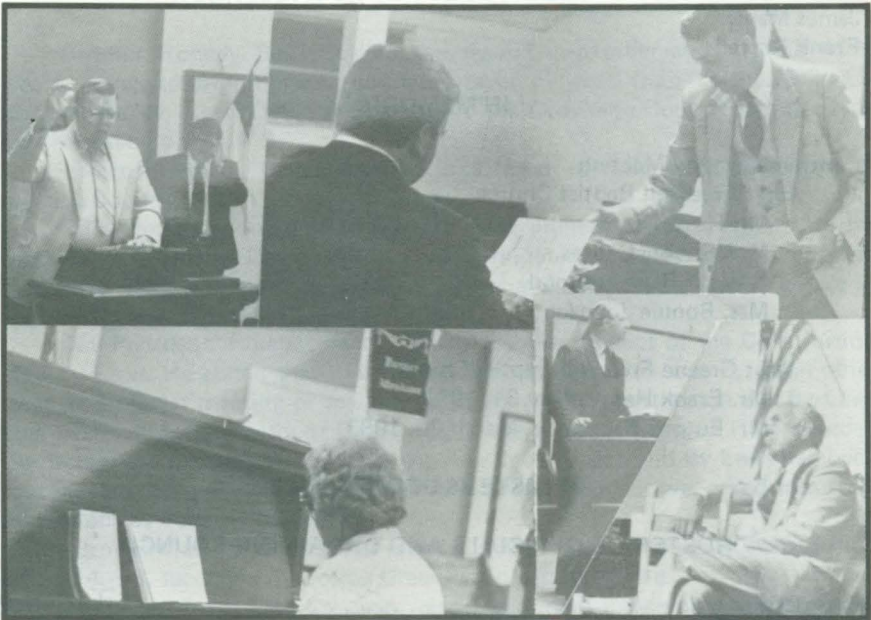
