PROCEEDINGS

Wednesday Morning, August 15, 1984

After the eleven o'clock message, the Union Association was called into order briefly for the Committee on Committees to give their report.

MSC to permit Moderator to deviate from program if necessary.

MSC to lay on table a constitutional change to item 12 of the standing rules.

MSC to recess until Thursday Morning. All present enjoyed a fine meal prepared for us by some of the ladies. A big thanks for those who helped in the kitchen.

Thursday Morning, August 16, 1984

The Union Association was called into order by Moderator Bobby Greene. Then Moderator appointed E.H. Brock, as Parliamentarian, who spoke to the association of his duties as Parliamentarian. Brother I.L. Stanley led the congregation in "The Old Rugged Cross." Brother Carl Callahan had the scripture reading from our theme found in Micah 6: 6-8 and offered prayer.

Brother Phillip Kimbrough gave the report of the Superannuation Board.

MSC to adopt report of the Superannuation Board.

Brother Thurman Pate was called to give the Treasurer's report.

MSC to adopt the Treasurer's report.

Brother Ed Hall was called to give the Master's Men report.

MSC to adopt the Master's Men report.

A recess of the Union Association was declared to give way for the morning message. Brother Lynn Neas was to preach, but had been in the hospital and was present, but was not able to preach. His Father, Ray Neas, brought the morning message.

Brother Ray Neas read from Ruth 2: 9-17, and preached a wonderful message on "Home Coming". He shared with us the picture of the Jews coming home and the Gentiles as seen in Ruth coming home. After fellowship, we had a good lunch once again prepared by some of the ladies.

Thursday Afternoon

The Union Association was called into session. Brother Alfred Cutshall had the Scripture and prayer.

MSC to adopt the report of Ladies Auxiliary.

MSC to receive the report.

MSC to give the Camp Board of the Union Association full permission of the body to go ahead with the plans to build a new dining hall for the camp, and they are to raise the money necessary for the construction of a dining hall.

MSC to adopt Camp Board report.

MSC to adopt Sunday School Convention report.

MSC to give Statistician \$1.00 for each church from the General Fund and all money he received from churches should be turned in to the Treasurer.

Brother Ken Smith told the Association that the Home Mission Board was a Non-functioning Committee, and did not have anything to report.

MSC to give money in Home Mission Fund to the three (3) works in Tennessee sponsored by the Tennessee Home Mission Department which are as follows:

Hugh Ellis - Parris

MSC for above motion concerning money in Home Mission Fund be laid on table.

MSC for Moderator to write a letter in reply to Newport First Church who invited the Union Association to meet in Newport in the year 1985 for the Annual Meeting.

MSC to bring off table constitutional change to general rule # 12 which states "Associational Monies will be divided as following:

50% General Fund
20% Camp Fund
25% Superannuation Fund
5% Home Mission Fund

MSC to accept constitutional change to General Rule # 12.

A letter from some of the people of Greene Ridge FWB Church signed by eleven (11) members requested the Central Quarterly Meeting to send committee from the quarterly meeting to the church on August 19, 1984 to advise on Parliamentary procedures during pastor election, and also stated that the church did not have no deacons. The letter was received by the Moderator of the Central Quarterly Meeting after the meeting. Brother James Bowers, the Moderator and Clerk, of the Central Quarterly Meeting signed the letter and it was turned over to the Union Association for action.

After reading of letter to the association, a motion was made and seconded for the Moderator of Union Association to appoint a committee to go to Greene Ridge FWB Church on August 19, 1984.

Brother Greene appointed E.H. Brock and Carl Callahan on the committee.

P.S.: The above appointed committee did go to Greene Ridge FWB Church on August 19, 1984. The election was conducted as planned, and the church did elect a pastor. There was no reported problems to the committee. The committee feels that all is well.

The report of the nominating committee was given, and election of officers was conducted. All the officers, with the exception of the Assistant Secretary, were reelected to serve another year.

Brother Gerald Fender was nominated as Assistant Secretary.

MSC nominations ceased, and we proceeded to elect Brother Fender as Assistant Secretary.

Brother Earl Whetsel was elected to General Board to serve until 1988.

Brother Dallas Nance was elected to Camp Trustee Board to serve until 1989.

Brother Bernie Bradley was elected on the Camp Board in the place of D.H. Garland who resigned to serve until 1986.

Brother Chester Phillips was elected to the Home Mission Board to serve until 1988.

Brother Joe Jones was elected to serve on the Superannuation Board until 1989.

MSC for Moderator to appoint State delegates and alterant delegates.

Prayer Request Committee had given out the various request for prayer in the prayer session yesterday. Almost all of the people present assembled around the altar for prayer and began to pour their hearts out to the Lord for needs everywhere. The Lord honored the request by coming into our mist and touched hearts.

The Association had the feel of the old time meetings that they talked about years ago with the power to deliver from sin, and how else would the Union Association comr to a close?

MODERATOR'S MESSAGE REPORT

The God of grace and promise also is a God of requirements. One does not earn Salvation, but we are expected to display certain behaviour before God in response to what He has done for us.

The Talmud, saying of the Rabbies, says that David reduced the 613 Commandments of the Law to only eleven (PS 15:2-5). Micah here reduced them to three. The demands the prophet stipulated were not of his own invention. God had set them forth as His requirements. "What doth thy Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God." (Micah 6:8) There are three actions demanded. The first two commands "to do justly and to love mercy" governs the horizontal relationship of man to man. Believers have an obligation to treat all men with justic and compassion.

Micah began with God's requirements on the human level because this is the area where man's relationship to God is evident. Micah stated the most difficult requirement last which is "to walk humbly with thy God." This describes man's vertical relationship to God. These three commands cannot be torn apart. They must be considered together.

There is no just act without the love of mercy and a humble walk with our God. One cannot exist without the other two. What therefore God has joined together let not man put asunder.

The Woman's Auxiliary is doing a great job. They are to be commended for the great job that they have done. Ladies we congratulate you.

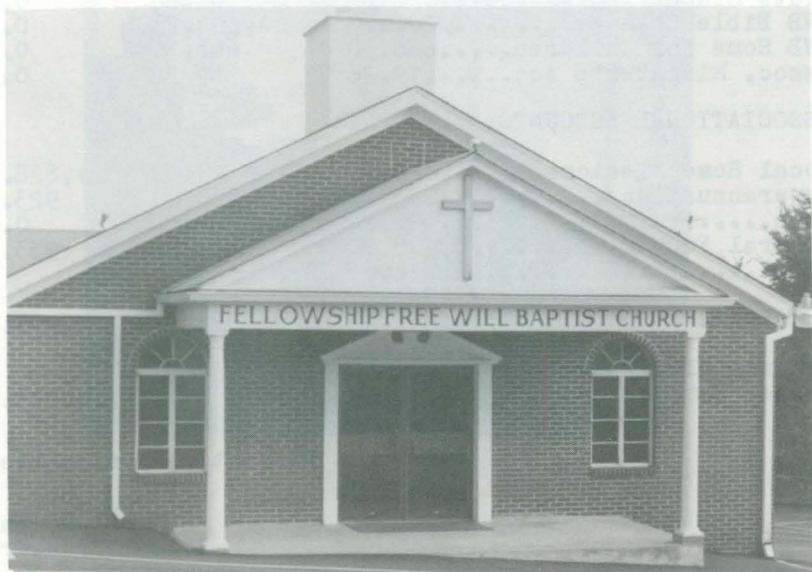
Master's Men is beginning to get its feet on the ground. State retreat at camp grounds should give us a big lift. If you church is not participating, we would like for you to come on board and go with us.
