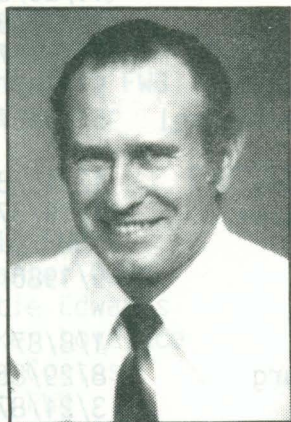

"The Union Association Free Will Baptist, during the session of 1986, voted for the Camp to finish paying the note for the money which was borrowed to build the Bailey Dining Hall, and was due, with money in the Camp Treasury that normally would have been used to pay the bills of the Camp during the winter months. The Union Association, in turn, would raise the money needed for the camp. After talking with Brother Ken Smith, I was informed that the money had come in real good and the needs had been met."

MSC to obtain 500 Book Markers with the theme and names of the General Board printed on them for promotion.

MSC to adjourn to meet May 9, 1987, at Home for Children, at 1 PM.

MAY 9, 1987

The General Board of the Union Association met at the Home for Children to finalize the 1987 program and any other un-finished business which might come before board. Members present were: Carl Callahan, Earl Whetsel, Dewey Bernard, Burnie Bradley as proxy for Don Sexton, Doug Roberson, and Howard Munsey. Ken Smith was ask to set in on meeting.

MSC that Dewey Bernard serve as moderator.

Brother Roberson opened meeting by reading II Tim. 4:1-5 and had prayer. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Max Hardin from Church Mutual Insurance Company was given the floor to talk about insurance for the Union Association. The following plan was presented to the Board. He could cover one building for \$29,000.00. Building will be new dining hall. Contents of dining hall would be covered for \$2,000.00. Liability for the entire camp and any other area where the Union Association might be using (Minister's Conference, Ordaining Council, General Board, or any other board of the Association) would be \$300,000.00. Medical payment coverage per person would be \$3,000.00. Campers would not be covered by the medical part because they would be covered by another camper insurance. The premium for this coverage would be approximately \$1,458.00 per year. Contract would run for a period of three years with out premium going up. Effective date will be May 21, 1987.

MSC that General Board accept and purchase insurance plan as proposed by the insurance representative, Max Hardin, from Church Mutual Insurance Company.

(note concerning insurance premium; the actual cost of the insurance was \$948.00 due to a good deal which the Company got and passed on to Association.)

MSC to Give Howard Munsey voting rights.

Brother Ken Smith said that Camp Fund could take care of paying the premium if the Union Association would reimburse one-half of premium.

MSC that Camp Fund be reimbursed one-half of insurance premium from the General Fund of the Union Association.
MSC to let Brother Munsey incorporate Union Association
MSC to print 500 programs.

MSC that Union Association bear burden of postage to mail flyer promotion of the Union Association which Brother Munsey is having printed.

MSC to adjourn meeting until Annual Association meeting.

"The clerk will be a standing proxy on the Ordaining Council in case of absence of any member from the Council, provided member has not sent a proxy in his stead."

MSC to adopt above Constitution change by unanimous vote of the members present.

MSC that a letter of detailed _____ of actions explaining why the word "void" is used on the back of the Ordination papers be issued from the Ordaining Council to all ministers who have Certificates of Ordination with the word "void" on the back, along with a letter stating these men are in good fellowship and are doctrinally sound.
