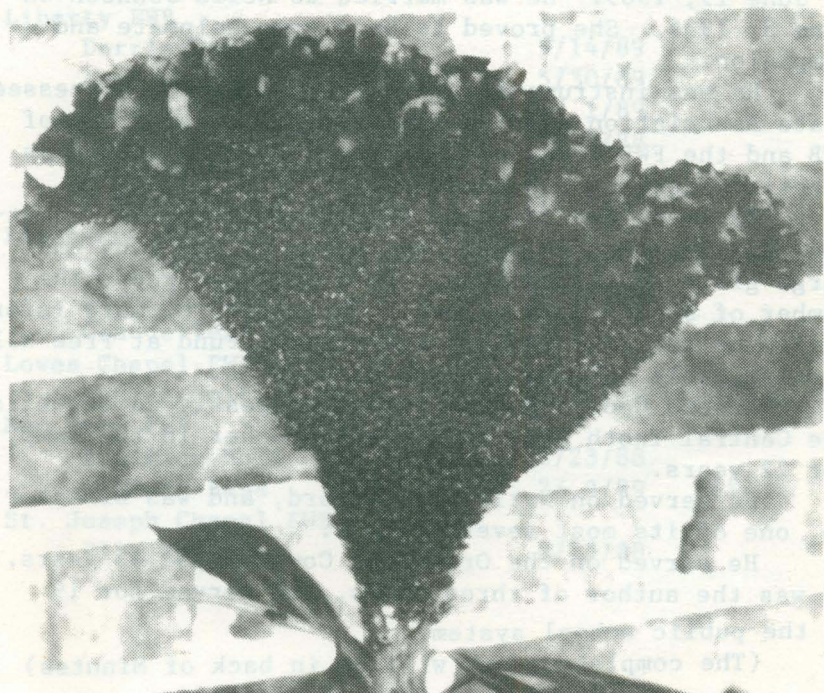

Paul Woolsey was licensed to preach the Gospel in 1930 in the Union Association, ordained in 1931. He served as Youth Director of the Association and helped organize many Youth Leagues in our churches. He served many of our churches as pastor, included are Harris Memorial, White Pine 1st., Bridges Chapel, Valley View, Lowes Chapel, Faith in Morristown, and 1st FWB of Sonapurhat, North India.

He was a missionary to North India from 1948 to 1952. He is still remembered there by the people he served.

He overcame a physical handicap of a speech impediment to become a leader unique among Free Will Baptist.

He was born in November 23, 1908. He passed away on June 19, 1989. He was married to Nelle Johnson on June 8, 1936. She proved to be a true helpmate and companion..

He was instrumental in establishing the Tennessee State Association of FWB, the National Association of FWB and the FWB Home for Children. He also served as Superintendent of the Home.

He loved and strongly supported Christian Education. His interest in FWBBC was shown by his many and large gifts to the college. Only the Lord knows the number of students he helped. There will be more information on the Paul Woolsey Educational Fund at Free Will Baptist Bible College in back of minutes.

He and George Dunbar worked endlessly to establish the Central Yuoth Camp. He was a teacher in the camp for 22 years.

He served on National SS Board, and was Director in one of its most severe crisis.

He served on the Ordaining Council for 43 years. He was the author of three books. He served for 19 in the public school system.

Wednesday, august 16, 1989

THE LICENSING COMMITTEE OF THE QUARTERLY MEETINGS MUST REPORT ANY ORDAINED MINISTER WHO IS NOT IN GOOD STANDING TO THE ORDAINING COUNCIL WITH REASONS STATED AS TO WHY THE MINISTER IS IN BAD STANDING SO THAT THE ORDAINING COUNCIL MAY INVESTIGATE AND DEAL WITH THE MINISTER IN QUESTION. THE LICENSING COMMITTEE OF THE QUARTERLY MEETING MAY NOT DROP AN ORDAINED MINISTER; THEY MAY ONLY RECOMMEND AN ACTION TO THE ORDAINING COUNCIL .

We recommend that the Constitution be amended in the following way. On page 28 of the green constitution booklet and after item #13, the following be added:

MINISTERS WHO ARE COMING FOR EXCHANGE OF CREDENTIALS FROM ANOTHER DEMONINATION WILL MEET THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS FROM THE ABOVE; ITEM 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13.

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PAUL AND NELLE WOOLSEY

as written by Rev. Howard Munsey

The time was 1980. The place, North India. A young minister from East Tennessee visits Carlisle Hanna and his family at the North India Sonapurhat mission station. Having been introduced to local Christians upon his arrival there, many of them asked, "What about Paul Woolsey?" They still remembered after 28 years. Their love and respect for this man had not waned since their five year term of service ended there in 1952. It is said that when he left North India, thousands of Moslems wanted him to return so much that they offered to sign petitions if it would help.

The India experience is indicative of the love and respect acquired by the Woolsey's in all places and in the many capacities in which they served. This is so because theirs has been a labor of love. Love for God and for people.

Paul Woolsey has overcome the physical handicap of a speech impediment to become a leader unique among Free Will Baptist. Born November 23, 1908 to Thomas H. Woolsey, M.C. and Lutie Gorst Woolsey. He was also a grandson Rev. William Bonaparte Woolsey, an early leader of the Free Will Baptist movement in East Tennessee, founder of Woolsey College in Greene County, Tennessee and one of the founders of the Union Association of Free Will Baptists. Prior to this he was clerk of the Toe River Association in Western

North Carolina.

Licensed to preach by the Union Association in 1930 and ordained in 1931 while a student at Tusculumn College, Paul was appointed youth director of the Association, organizing youth leagues in many of the churches. He and NNelle conducted the first vacation Bible school ever in the Union Association at Greggs Chapel in Newport, Tennessee. He graduated from Tusculumn in 1933, Magna Cum Laude, where he was captain of the debating tea. He was married to Nelle Johnson on June 8, 1936 who has proved to be a true helpmate and companion.

Pastorates served by Rev. Woolse over the fifty-two years since licensed to preach are Harris Memorial in Greene County, White Pine First and Bridges Chapel in Jefferson County, Valley View in Loudon County, Lowes Chapel in Cocke County, Faith Church in Morristown, and First Free Will Baptist of Sonapurhat, North India. He has assisted in many ways in the establishment and building several other churches. The writer can testify to his invaluable assistance in building the Church in Morristown, of which he and Nelle were charter members.

His interest in the work of FWB for Christ was varied and far-reaching. Much of what he did was behind the scenes. He took seriously his commitment to the Covenant of the Church, desiring only the glory of God and the salavation of souls. He was instrumental in establising the Tennessee State Association, the National Association of FWB and the Free Will Baptist Home for Children at Camp Creek. He was later to become Superintendent of the Home.

The Woolsey's were strong supporters of Christian education. Their interest in the Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee was manifested by the large number of deserving students which they assisted financially. No one knows how many they helped. The writer's son testified recently to receiving a generous grant during his student day when funds for us were hard to come by.

Paul was completely unpretentious about this. Even Mrs. Woolsey does not know all the students who were helped.

Many choice words could be used to describe the ministry of Brother Woolsey. He was the apostle of love and selfless service. He was energetic and devoted. No task was too small nor insignificant for him to do. True humility was characteristic of him, yet he was indeed a true scholar. In his preaching he could define the profoundest gospel truths in simple terms to where all could understand. His most outstanding characteristic, however, was wisdom.

Paul was wise in the Lord. Wise in understanding people. He possessed the most unique insights into the functions of church business and Associational affairs of any among us. He was on our wavelength as FWB people yet he loved us and served us in spite of what he saw and understood. More than one pastor has been heard to say that if he had a problem which was too much for his own ability that Paul Woolsey would be the first man of which he would seek advice.

Paul Woolsey believed in us as FWB. He cast his lot with us. He believed that we could make a difference in the world around us in spreading the influence of Christ in society and making life on earth a better place for ourselves and our posterity. Every FWB ought to get down on his knees and thank God for the ministry of this man and his wife. A simple reflection on what they have accomplished will show us that it will take an eternity to reveal the true worth of their lives and service to their fellow men.
