UNION ASSOCIATION PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 12, 1992

The 120th. annual session was called to order by Moderator Bowers at 9:00 A.M., meeting at Peace FWB Church, Morristown, Tenn. This is the first year that the Association met with a church since 1957, or some 35 years. Attendance was very good with 29 ministers, 3 deacons, 11 delegates, and 5 visitors for the opening note.

PROCEEDINGS

WEDNESDAY MORNING AUGUST 12, 1992

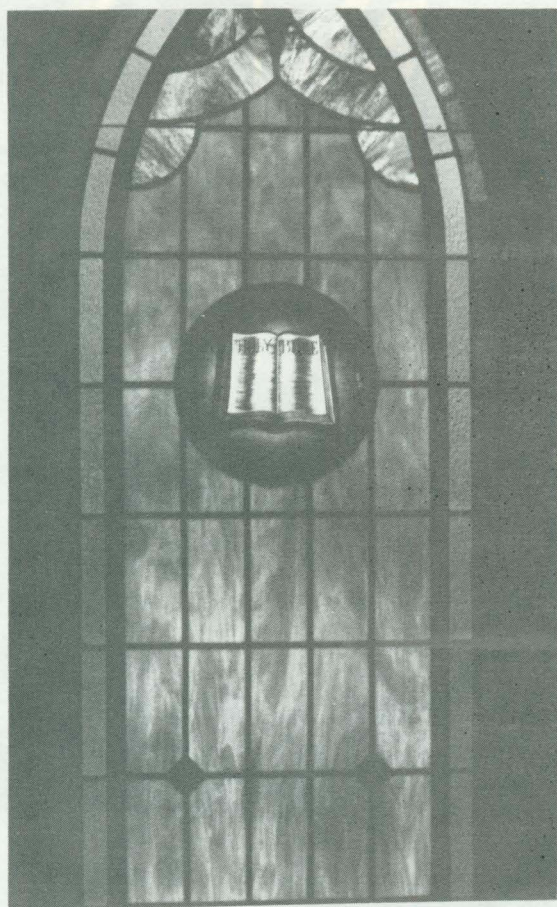

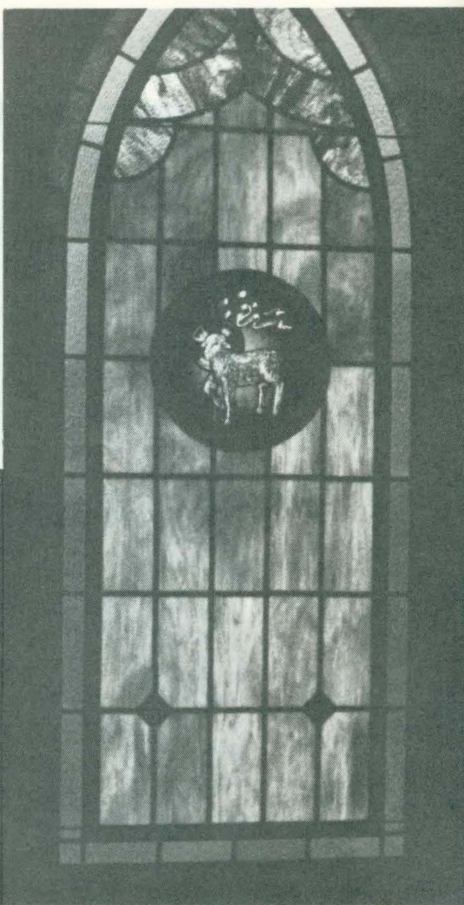
