Siminar On The Minister's Ethical Conduct By Dr. Charles Thigpen

Why should there be good relationships among ministers?

1. We are all Christians and in the family of God.
2. We all have the same ministerial calling.
3. We all share the same basic doctrine.
4. We all are in the same fellowship. (Denomination)
5. We have different but complimentary gifts and abilities.
6. We should all seek to encourage one another.

Ethics:

:The science of moral duty. Ideal human character and deportment.
:The best summary — The Golden Rule — Matt. 7:12; Lk. 6:31

The gospel minister has ethical responsibilities in a number of relationships. The four which I will discuss are:

1. His relationship to fellow ministers.
2. To his own congregation.
3. His relationship to society.
4. To his own denomination.

I. Relation To His Fellow Ministers: Exercising care in treatment of.

1. Give a careful and concerned hearing to the preaching of fellow ministers. (Give full undivided attention)
 - a. Members of a fellowship.
 - b. Fellowservants of the Lord.
 - c. Blessings enjoyed in the same service.
 - d. Subject to the same needs.
 - e. Some dry and uninteresting, however, oftentimes needed.
2. Answer mail or return phone calls from brother ministers promptly.
3. Read and return borrowed books promptly.
4. When you leave a pastorate do not meddle in the affairs of your successor.
 - a. Do not call or write letters to former members. (Advising them on how the church should be run, etc.)
 - b. In no way should you discredit the new pastor's work. (It is almost impossible to get professionals such as medical doctors etc. to criticize others in their profession)
 - c. However, get-well cards, birthday greetings, Christmas cards and cards of congratulations are always in order.
5. When returning to the area of a former pastorate, it is a courtesy to call on the present pastor first before calling among the membership.
6. Never speak disparagingly of your predecessor.
7. When called back to former fields for a funeral or a wedding, insist that the present pastor be included in the service.
8. When absent from your church, be certain that the supply pastor is properly remunerated.
9. When a fellow minister visits your church and you invite him to preach, there is no financial responsibility.
10. When a fellow minister visits your service, you are not under obligation to ask him to preach.
11. The pastor must guard constantly against jealousy.
12. The pastor must beware of acting as though his congregation was ignorant before he became their pastor.

II. Relation To His Congregation:

1. He should be impartial in the treatment of his membership.
 - a. Fair and unbiased toward everyone. (Children, youth, etc.)
 - b. Be the leader of all of the church. (Choir, auxiliaries, etc.)

2. He should keep confidences with great care.
3. He should not be dictatorial in his attitude toward his people.
(1 Peter 5:1-4)
4. Be very careful and discreet in his conduct toward women and girls in his congregation.
5. He must exercise great caution in making changes early on in his administration of a new pastorate. (Needs great patience)
6. He should refrain from undue familiarity with members of his congregation.
 - a. Do not develop close friendships to the exclusion of others.
 - b. Do not call them by their first names, etc. (First names are appropriate to children and young people)
 - c. The minister should not encourage his members to call he and his wife by their first names.
7. He should learn to take criticism without becoming angry or bitter.
8. In preaching or teaching, the pastor must always be true to his convictions. (Not pander to special interests, etc.)
9. Avoid scolding people from the pulpit concerning those who are absent from the service.
10. Do not whip people from the pulpit.
 - a. Present the glorious gospel and teach the Word of God.
 - b. Feed the sheep, don't throw rocks at them.
11. The pastor should be honest with his church in the use of time.
 - a. He is left mostly on his own.
 - b. Personal visitation, sermon preparation, soul-winning, etc.
 - c. Do not neglect responsibilities to own family.
12. The pastor must not put himself under obligation to certain members by accepting special favors or obtaining financial loans from them.
13. Do not talk about how busy you are.
14. Be very slow in taking action on complaints presented by disgruntled members.

III. In His Social Relationships:

1. Be diligent & punctual in keeping all appointments.
 - a. Call ahead, if necessary if you see that you may be tardy.
2. Do not proselyte members from other churches.
3. Beware of developing a critical spirit toward other churches.
4. Do not give the impression that you are a privileged member of society. Consider yourself on an equality with all other people.
 - a. Hospitals and emergency rooms, etc.
 - b. One is not due a special discount because he is a minister.
 - c. Neither is he entitled to break the traffic or other laws.

5. A minister must always live within his income.
 - a. Pay your bills on time. If you need or must have clemency, be sure to see and clear it with the party owed.
 - b. Failure to be candid and honest in financial matters brings a reproach upon the great cause which you represent.

IV. Relationship To Your Denomination:

1. A minister has an ethical responsibility to his denomination.
 - a. Honesty requires you to leave it if you cannot or will not be faithful to it.
 - b. One has no right to raise funds in it or receive funds from it if he is not faithful to it.
2. Denominational ministers have a vital interest in its success.
3. Your denomination deserves your support to the best of your ability. (Attend & participate in conferences & Associations)
4. Make certain that the Treasurer carries out faithfully the wishes of the church.
5. Always exhibit the cardinal virtue of loyalty.
 - a. To Christ. b. To one's church. c. To one's denomination.
