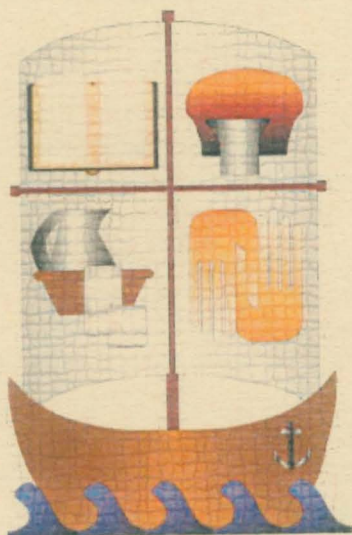

Rev. Weldon L. Bowman "I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith." II Timothy 4:7 Rev. Weldon L. Bowman, 89, of Rogersville claimed his crown of righteousness on Monday afternoon at Hawkins County Memorial Hospital in Rogersville. He was the eldest son of the late Elbert S. Bowman, Sr. and Martha Gladys Barnes Bowman of Johnson City. From an early age, Bowman was a minister of the gospel, pastoring numerous Free Will Baptist churches in East Tennessee and also doing evangelistic work. Even as a resident of Signature Healthcare, where he lived for the past year and a half, he continued his gospel ministry by witnessing to all with whom he came in contact. Bowman was well-known for his quick wit, musical skills, honesty, and integrity. He retired from Holliston Mills after 25 years of service

IN MEMORIAM

Rev. Weldon Bowman

The minutes for this year's Annual Session are respectfully and lovingly dedicated to the memory of Rev. Weldon Bowman, who had preached at previous meetings of Union Association, a fellowship he loved dearly. He had pastored in the counties of Carter, Washington, and Hawkins and had been an evangelist throughout much of northeast Tennessee.

During Weldon's part-time pastoring, he worked in textile mills, most recently at Holliston Mills in Church Hill, from which he retired after an employment of 25 years. While in his later teens, Weldon and two of his brothers formed a trio that sang for evangelistic meetings held by the late J. Bazzel Mull. Weldon regularly read the Bible to the blind Rev. Mull for hours and hours at a time.

Weldon spent the last year and a half of his life in a nursing home. There he took advantage of his situation, using his time, energy, compassion, and knowledge of the Bible to witness for his Savior. Although he never attended college or seminary, Weldon was well acquainted with Scripture, allowing the Holy Spirit to guide him through the Word. He was a helpful model for young preachers and an effective encourager to many.

Born March 8, 1922, on August 22, 2011 Weldon slipped peacefully into his eternal home, leaving a legacy many would do well to follow. His familiar admonition was "Preach the Word."

PROCEEDING OF THE UDWAC

Union Association WAC 2011 Secretary and Treasurer Report

The Union Association WAC meeting was held on August 20, 2011, at the Oak Grove FWB Church.

President Mitzi Satterfield opened the meeting with a short devotion reading from Ephesians 4:15-16. She spoke on the WNAC "Body Building" theme, which will be promoted all year.

Marion Reece led the group with congregational singing. Merle Archer was pianist.

Voting delegates were seated. Five WAC groups reported to the Union WAC. Total reporting membership is 39.

The President appointed the Registration, Finance, and Resolutions Committees.

Secretary Betty Fleshman read the Secretary's report from the 2010 yearly meeting. The voting body accepted the report as read.

Treasurer Jane Bailey gave the report of the Treasurer. The voting body accepted the report as read. The Treasurer report is included in this report.

Visiting missionary Dr. Paul Park gave a short report of the Free Will Baptist work among the Korean people both in the United States and in Korea.

Marion Reece reported on the ministry of encouragement to home missionaries she and her husband, David, provide.

Amanda Kilgore reported on the Free Will Baptist Home for Children.

Mitzi Satterfield reported on Berea Ministries.

Delegates to the Tennessee State Meeting were appointed. Amanda Kilgore reported on the 2011 WNAC meeting and the activities of the Tennessee WAC. She also reminded the ladies of the 2011 State Retreat and of the hosting responsibilities of the national meeting.

The Registration committee reported 13 delegates were present.

Eight visitors attended the meeting.

The Finance committee reviewed the records of the Treasurer and found them in order. They recommended that \$200 be taken from the treasury and added to the offering for Heath and Joni Hubbard, the morning speakers.

The Resolutions committee recommended the following:

Be it resolved that the UWAC stand and pray with the California WAC in support of Proposition 8 defining marriage between a man and a women and that we continue to oppose same sex marriage.

Be it resolved that following our Body Builders theme for 2011-2012, we each strive to strengthen our churches and ourselves.

We also agree with the recommendation of the WNAC that the Cleo Pursell scholarship is given to two ladies at the Seminary of the Cross in Reynosa, Mexico, and that the "Shine" project be extended for one more year.

The business session was adjourned.

Mrs. Reece led the congregation in another hymn.

Mitzi Satterfield introduced special guests Heath and Joni Hubbard, missionary appointees to the Hanna Project, who will be serving in Spain. Joni thrilled the congregation with a beautiful song. She spoke on how God had called them into missionary service. Heath preached from Philippians 1.

The service ended with a special offering of \$225 that was added to the designated treasury gift of \$200 and was presented to Heath and Joni.

Jan. 4, 2011 General Board Meeting of the Union FWB Association

The General Board of the Union FWB Association met at Peace FWB church on Jan 4, 2011 at 3:00 for the purpose of planning the 139th annual meeting of the association, and other items of business which will properly come before the board and on the agenda.

Members present were Union Moderator Chris Castle, Dr. Chris Dotson, Dr. Rodger Castle, Dr. Jeff Davis, Danny Willis, Tim Roach, Edward Maynard, and Carl Callahan. Brother Davis was proxy for

Jim Cox, moderator and Frank Woods was also present representing FWBFM.

The meeting was called to order by moderator Chris Castle asking Frank Woods to open with prayer. Moderator read from Psalms 139 and prayer was offered again.

MSC to adopt the program format which had been prepared by clerk and moderator for the 139th Annual Session of the Union FWB Association.

MSC to amend the motion by adding the words, "and for moderator to see who is present as guest that wants to speak greetings to the Association and divide up the time equally between them all."

The amended motion carried

A motion in the form of a letter from the Union District Ladies Actively for Christ, Mitzi Satterfield was seconded and passed. Letter as follows;

Carl Callahan read the names of those who will be serving on the prayer request committee, the resolution committee, and the committee on committees and asked each moderator to help get these men informed.

The Clerk asks everyone to help him get the information together for the program by April 30, 2011 and the material and reports by July 22, 2011.

MSC to let each Quarterly Meeting moderator know the committee needs of the Association and each Quarterly Meeting supply a name of person who will be willing to serve on that committee during the year 2012. If a minister is chosen, he must be in good standing with the Minister's Conference of the Union FWB Association. The following are the committees; each QM will send in one name to serve on the prayer request committee in 2012, one name to serve on the resolution committee in 2012, and one name from the Eastern Fellowship on the Ordaining Council for 3 years to replace Dr. Jeff Davis who will be coming off. Also, every third year, the QM will send in the name of one person who will serve on the nominating committee for the Union FWB Association election of officers. That will be 4 names of people who will serve the Union FWB Association on committees. Each year each QM will provide the music for a part of the Union Association serve. This year the Eastern Fellowship will provide the Friday morning, August 19, 2011 music at the early part

of the service, the Northern Quarterly Meeting will provide the music for the 11:00 worship hour, and the Central QM will furnish the music for the Friday night ordination service.

The clerk will get a letter to Brother Frank Woods as to the needs for breakfast, lunch, and lodge needs along with set up of equipment in worship area for the Association. Breakfast will be free fruit and cereal, lunch will be \$6.00 per person and FWBFM will provide a good meal. The board to stay overnight at the lodge will be \$40.00 per night per person.

MSC for the theme for the association 139th session to be taken from Jer. 6:16, "Walk in the Old Paths."

MSC that Brother Doyle Pruitt preach at the 11:00 hour.

MSC that Dr. Jeff Davie be preaching the ordination message and giving the charge to the candidates.

The Central QM has elected Brother Gary Norton to serve on the Ordination Council for the years 2011, 2012, and 2013. The Eastern Fellowship will be submitting the name of a minister in good standing to serve the years of 2012, 2013, and 2014 to the conference at the August 19, 2011 meeting.

MSC to ask each church to increase their annual representation fee to \$400.00 per church and the reason is that at the TN State Association meeting in Nov. 2010 their fees went up to \$150.00 per church and \$50.00 will be effective this year, 2011, and the \$150.00 will become effective in 2012. So we will be paying \$150.00 for National dues, \$150.00 for state dues, \$70.00 will be going to the Union FWB association, and each Quarterly meeting will be getting \$30.00 to use for them.

This year the fees will be \$200.00 per church that I send in with my report. Next year, I will be sending in \$300.00 with my report. The Union will get 70.00 and each QM will keep \$30.00 to use.

MSC that the assistant treasurer office come up for election in 2011 at this meeting.

MSC to recommend that the honorariums remain the same for this year as they were in 2010. For moderator, \$250.00; for clerk, \$250.00; for treasurer, \$650.00; for speaker, \$50.00 and that we give FWBFM a hospitality gift of \$275.00.

MSC that moderator and clerk finish filling out the program as needed.

Clerk asks all board members to turn in the mileage for the meeting and he will give to treasurer.

MSC to adjourn to meet on August 19, 2011 after the business of the association has been finished.

RECOMMENDATIONS FROM THE GENERAL BOARD UNION FWB ASSOCIATION

We the General Board of the Union FWB Association beg leave to make the following recommendations to the full body of the Union FWB Association with each item to be considered separately and item by item:

1. That each Quarterly Meeting and Fellowship supplies the Union FWB Association with the names of persons who will serve the following year, 2013, on the prayer request committee and the resolution committee. If a minister, he must be in good standing with the minister's conference. Every third year the quarterly meeting will also furnish the name of a person to serve on the nominating committee for officers of the Union FWB Association. The quarterly meeting will replace their representative serving on the ordaining council. This year, 2012, it will be time for the Eastern Fellowship to replace Dr. Jeff Davis, who may succeed himself.
2. That each quarterly meeting and fellowship has an active part in the music of the association by selecting a song leader and provide special music for a part of the Union FWB Association. This year, 2012, the Central QM takes charge of the ordination service. The Northern QM takes charge of the 11 o'clock service, and the Eastern Fellowship will be in charge of the early Friday morning service, both with a leader and any special music provided.
3. That the agreement between FWBFM and the General Board of the Union Association be adopted as the FWBFM will furnish meals during the association at a cost of \$4.00 for breakfast and \$6.00 for lunch per person, and that all board members will be able to stay at the lodge for \$40.00 per night per person.
4. That the church annual representation fee be increased to \$350.00 per church for the year 2012 and thereafter. The reason for this increase is the fact that the National Association of FWB has increased their representation fee to \$150.00 per church and the Tennessee State Association of FWB has increased their representation fee to \$150.00. The Union Association of FWB is

asking for a \$50.00 fee and the quarterly meetings will set their own fees as they deem needed.

(Note)

There have been some pastors who have suggested to the clerk that \$70.00 per church is too much increase. Our budget is around \$3,000.00 annually, We may be able to get along with less money than \$70.00 per church. Some churches may consider these fees excessive and want to drop out the association rather than pay the fees. The real truth is that \$150.00 national and \$150.00 state representation fee is very high, and this increase comes at a hard time for churches who also are suffering for income. With 69 churches in the Union FWB Association, we may be able to get along with \$45.00 per church and the \$30.00 per church does not need to go to each QM, but that does not allow for any extras, like \$800 to a pastor for travel expense to go to see a doctor or the different times that the Union FWB Association has helped a church in need. These are real needs. Times are hard. Lots of people are out of a job. We want to do the right thing. We are going to be sending \$300.00 per church to the National and State Associations. The Union FWB does need some money. The money being paid out for speakers and honorariums to officers are not excessive. The members of the Board are paid mileage traveled to Board meetings and we have trimmed a lot from the budget in the past 2 years. We have 69 churches and we all need each other. Times are hard, and the general board wants to do the right thing. We all need to work together during these times.

5. That the following honorariums be paid for 2011 year: for moderator, \$250.00; for clerk \$250.00 For treasurer \$650.00; and for FWBFM a gift of \$275.00 be given.

6. The following is not being recommended by the general board of the Union Association, but FWBFM has agreed to host the 140th annual session of the Union FWB Association in 2012 at the Oaks Camp Ground and some would like to see that happen, for the Union FWB Association to accept the invitation from FWBFM to Greeneville, TN, the Oaks.

112 young people have received Christ as their personal Savior this year - 12 on one Sunday! And we are overjoyed that 7 of our young men will also be baptized on Sunday, August 14th. To God be the glory for these life changing decisions. Rev. Tim Roach, who leads our Sunday worship services, along with the house parents, ensures the youth realize the commitment they are making and encourage them in their new walk with the Lord. We praise God for each eternal decision made for His Kingdom!

Updates:

In a time when so much is going on across our nation and throughout the entire world, we witnessed firsthand devastation in our own backyard after a tornado ripped through the beautiful community of Camp Creek and other surrounding areas on April 27th. For Family Ministries, these events have certainly evoked feelings of ultimate gratitude for our Almighty God and His bountiful blessings and His protection during these times. We are reminded that in our storms, Jesus is not far from us. *Matthew 8: 23-27.*

Due to the massive destruction from the April F-3 tornado, Family Ministries and many emergency responders, volunteers, supporters, area churches and rescue units have answered the call in the community by providing shelter, food and water to those in need. We plan to continue its *efforts* in helping friends, family, and neighbors in the surrounding communities during this time of rebuilding and healing.

Our campus was appointed the official site for the disaster relief center in the Camp Creek community. We provided shower and laundry stations set up at The Oaks Retreat Center, and our cafeteria *staff* and numerous volunteers prepared and served over 15,000 hot meals, logging over 3,000 hours of volunteer service since this tragedy. FEMA's command post was adjacent to our campus, and all relief efforts were centralized in or around Family Ministries. be a witness to our community. There were substantial added costs in ministering to the community-with the purchase of generators, food, additional power expenses at the gym & damage to the ropes course at The Oaks, but it has blessed us beyond measure to be able to be of assistance to others.
