The Sermon introductory to business, was preased by brother William Byars, from 2d Peter, 3d cla., 17 and 1-v.

Received and read letters from the different Chur as sand minuted their condition.

3d. Chose John P. James, Moderator, and Joel W. Dobson, Clerk.

4th. Appointed the following committees, viz:

On Business.—Eph. Strickland, James Cleveland and Joel W. Dodson.

On Preaching—Henderson Butlington. Jan's in Walker and John Davis, from the body, and Elijah S. kland and Thomas Brooks, on the part of Teman Church.

On Correspondence—Spencer Harvey, Jones Harvey Reeves, John P. James, Royal H. Daniel and John J. Cumbie.

5th. Received corresponding letters and delegates from the Chattahoochec United Association, viz: Andrew Chanbie, Wylie Bluett. The Armagedon Church positiones for correspondence—which was granted: and we received their letter by the hands of brother Moses D. White, John Hill and Answell Kitchens. The brethren, Wm. Byers and L. Roan, were received as delegates from Smyrna Church, although the church is not represented in the scale.

6th. Adjourned till Monday morning, half past 9 o'clock.
7th. On the Sabbath the brethren, Moses D. White. Wylie Bluet and Barnabas Strickland, occupied the smuol in
the order of their names and spake the word to a large and
attentive congregation. O! that the word spaken may occ
as bread cast on the waters, that it may be gathered after
many days.

Sth. Met Monday morning half past 9 o'clock, and after prayer by brother Andrew Cumbic, proceeded to business.

9th. Received the reports of the committees on business.

10th. Agreed to send correspondence to the following Associations, viz: Mt. Zion, Duck River and Concend Association, in W. Tennessee. The following beating a tenated those three Associations, viz: J. P. James, J.-. Canada, Association, viz: J. P. James, J.-. Canada, Association, No. Carolina, and East Tennessee Association, the brethern Royal H. Duniel, Spencer Harvey and James George, to visit them.

11th. In addition to the brethren appointed at our last Association to correspond with the Chattahoochee United Association, we further appoint the brethren James Cumbie and John J. Cumbie.

12th. Took into consideration the propriety of publishing a treatise on doctrine and discipline; and after some discussion being had thereon, agreed to instruct the brethren appointed to correspond with the Chattahoochee United Association, to unite with them in publishing a treatise on doctrine and discipline, if upon further investigation they think proper so to do.

13th. Our Executive Committee report an entire failure,

and here the matter ends for the present.

14th. Appointed the next Association to be held at New Hope Church, Jasper county, to commence on Saturday before the second Sabbath in October, 1541. Brother John P. James to preach the introductory Sermon, and brother James Cleveland his alternate.

15th. Resolved unanimsly, that all the Churches be requested to signify it, in their letters to the next session of this body, if they wish the Sharon Confession of Faith published in our minutes.

16th. Agreed to address a short letter, in form of a circular, to the different Associations with whom we correspond, and the Clerk to prepare the same.

15th. Directed the Clerk to superintend the printing and

distribution of the Minutes.

15th. Adjourned after prayer by brother Andrew Cumbic.
