13th. Took up a request of Fairview Church to investigate the dectrinal views set forth in the Minutes of the Salem United Association in 1513; and after investigating satisfactorily, we did not feel fully prepared to recommend them.

14th. Called for, read and received the Circular Letter.

15th. Appointed Bro. T. B. Cooper to preach the next Introductory Sermon-Bro. J. J. Cumbic his alternate.

16th. Appointed Brother Wm. H. C. Dodson to write a Circular.

17th. Appointed the next meeting of this body with New Hope Church, Fayatte county, (12 miles north of Fayetteville,) to meet on Saturday before the second Sunday in September, 1817.

18th. Appointed brethren T. B. Cooper and R. H. Daned to prepare a form

of Decorum, to present to our next Association.

19th. Agreed to insert in our Minutes the Sharon Abstract of Principles, instead of the Circular Letter.

20th. Called for contribution for Minutes, and directed the Clerk to have then printed and distributed to the Churches.

21st. After prayer by Brother James M. Hill, adjourned.

## Abstract Principles, as set forth by the Sharon Convention, 1840.

Inasmuch as most of the Churches have requested a publication of the district of principles set forth by the Convention field at Sharen, in 1) remner, 1 = 0, we agree, in compliance with their request and in order that our vertex may be rally known, to publish the same, but wish it distinctly understant to the test set it forth as a Creed, Combession of Paith, or as a test of religious characters, but that we take the word of God as the only infallible rule of him and result.

1. We believe in one only true and living God, the Creater and Provinces. all things, and only Law Giver, and that there are three persons in the God. Head, the Father, Son and Hely Ghost, and these three are one.

2. We believe the Scriptores of the Obl. and New Testaments of the event of God and only rule of Paith and practice.

3. We believe in the doctrine of original sin.

4. We believe in man's inability to recover himself from the fallen state, in

which he is in by nature, by his own strength.

5. We believe in a Covenant between the Father and Son in which if Grais treasured up, and in the doctrine of Election according to the forest, which of God through Sanctification of the Spirit, and belief of the to have read a 1st Peter, 1st chap, 2nd verse, and 2nd Thess, 2nd chap, 13th verse; who is from the beginning chosen you to salvation, through sanctification of the sunday belief of the truth; but that Election should be to construct as to be God the author of sin either directly or indirectly, nor on the other hand he we believe the creature can do any thing meritorious in his salvation.
