Proceedings

The 53rd annual session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association met with Mt. Pleasant church on Saturday before the third Sunday in October 1933.

The Introductary sermon was preached by Rev. E. W. Graves. One hour was taken for refreshments. At one o'clock the Ministers and Delegates assembled in the house, the congregation sang a song.
