- 3. The moderator and clerk shall be chosen by a majority of delegates present, at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 4. The names of delegates from different churches shall be enrolled and called as often as necessary during the session.
 - 5. A majority of the delegates shall rule in all cases, except

in the reception of churches, then it shall be unanimous.

- 6. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 7. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.
- 8. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 9. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the authority of the association nor more than fifteen minutes.
- 10. No person shall laugh or talk during discussions.
- 11. No person shall absent himself from the association withcut permission of the moderator.

CONSTITUTION

- 1. The association shall be known as Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama, being composed of ministers, deacons and delegates from different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates in addition to ministers and deacons.
- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council, having no authority over the internal affairs of the churches unless they depart from the Articles of Faith of this association. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matters of doctrine, character and etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with the Articles of Faith of this association the same shall be delt with by the association as it may seem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 3. Each church of this association shall be considered an advisory body and shall control its own internal affiars in matters of discipline etc. If any Brother feels impressed to preach the Gospel the church shall recommend such Brother to the association and upon examination of the Brother's qualifications, if in judgement of the body, the Brother would be useful, they shall confer ordination, same being done at the association by a legal Presbytery.
- 4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association, and the decision shall be final.
 - 5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, clerk, and treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote.
 - 6. The association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon at the previous session and shall not ad-

journ finally until all business matters are transacted.

- 7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.
- 8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions, such as temperance cause, Sabbath Schools, missionary work etc.
- 9. No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no ther member be competent to act in that capacity.
- 10. Any member of this association who shall be quilty of circulating reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be delt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be quilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as beverage, which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness, the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teachings of the Bible.
- 11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present, and any church or delegate failing or refusing to do so is and shall be considered by the association as being out of order. Each member is to be a party to the enforcement of same.
 - 12. The moderator shall receive \$10.00. The assistant moderator \$5.00 and the clerk \$15.00 for their services.
- 13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association.
- 14. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true Gid, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe, and in the scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature, truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes or God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the

constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become quilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1st Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2nd Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and belomes a chlid of God. 3rd Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvaion Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take the water of life freely.
- 12. Perserverence. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. Baptism, or the immerision of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet washing, an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The scripture teaches the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.
