The next session of this association will be held with East Side F.W.B. Tuscaloosa, Ala. beginning at 8:00 o'clock on Saturday before the third Sunday in October, 1968. Rev. M. H. Hollis to preach the introductory sermon Rev. B. T. Alexander to be his substitute.

PROCEEDINGS

The Eighty-Seventh Session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with Piney Grove Free Will Baptist Church on October 14, 1967. Rev. M. H. Hollis Moderator. R. T. Mixon Clerk.

The meeting opened with congregational singing under the direction of Rev. E. W. Graves and prayer by Rev. Leander McAdams.

The morning devotional was brought by Rev. Dewey Thomas, based on 2nd Timothy, Chapter 3, 14th to the 18th Verse and Chapter 4, 1st to 4th Verse. Songs by Rev. Roy Barnes, "I Want to Know More About My Lord" and "Love Lifted Me", together with an old time hand shaking.

Letters from the various churches called for and turned over to the clerk. Sisters Sue Hester and Patricia Milligan were appointed as reading clerks. The letters were read, by move and second the delegates were seated as listed (see churches and delegates as listed).

Call for petitionary letters, none.

The following committee on committees was appointed by the moderator: Raphol Yerby, Lowell Hankins, Chester Moore, Delmer Meyer.

Song by Rev. Roy Barnes and prayer by Rev. S. F. Lee. Dismissed for a short intermission.

Following the intermission the congregation sang "Where Could I Go But To The Lord". Prayer by Rev. James Walden. Short talks were given by visiting ministers and others which were inspiring and uplifting to those present (see list of visiting ministers).

It was decided that night service would be discontinued for this session of the association.

The following committees reported at this time. Business, Sunday School and CTS and Temperance. The reports were read and received. Committees discharged (see Reports).

Song by Rev. Roy Barnes, prayer by Rev. M. L. Hollis of Amory, Miss.; song, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arm" and prayer by Rev. Edward Puckett. At this time we had a few minutes of Intermission.

Following the intermission, song by Bro. Markham. The report of the Executive Committee was given and received (see reports). Song by the Miller family.

Key note message by Rev. E. W. Graves from Union Chapel Church. Reading from Ph. 2-12, Tit. 3-5, Eph. 2,8-9, Ech. 3rd chapter. Subject "Work Out Your Own Salvation With Fear and Trembling". This was a sermon well prepared, timely and well delivered. Song directed by Bro. Barnes.

Remarks by moderator as to lunch. Dismissed for one hour, after prayer and grace by Rev. Gurley Roberts.

AFTERNOON SESSION

1 P.M. song by Rev. Roy Barnes followed by Prayer.

The reports of the following committees were read and received. Committees discharged. Resolution, Deceased Members (see reports). Song in memory of deceased, "Precious Memories", was directed by Rev.

McAdams. Prayer by Rev. Clovis Tucker.

The report of Finance and Church Extension was read and received (see reports). Committee discharged. Bros. E. W. Graves, W. L. Turner offered their resignations on Church Extension. Resignation accepted. A vote was taken to continue the work of this committee but to keep all funds collected in this association. Bros. C. E. Roberts and Raphol Yerby were appointed on the Church Extension. Committee song by Bro. Barnes. The Ordination Service was held for two deacons, Bros. Bryon Meyer, Johnny Pike and one minister, Rev. James Donald Bussey. Charge by Rev. Dewey Thomas to the deacons, reading from Chapter 1 of Tim. Advice and admonition by Rev. M. L. Hollis. Charge by Rev. S. F. Lee to the minister, reading from 1st Chapter of Tim. Advice and admoniton offered by Rev. M. L. Hollis. Prayer by M. L. Hollis. Bro. Lee stated that he had been preaching 51 years, over half a century. Song by Bro. Barnes while the congregation extended the right hand of fellowship to the ordained deacons and minister.

Report of Committee on Committees read and received (see reports). Committee discharged.

The body elected the following officers for the next year. Rev. Dewey Thomas, Moderator; Rev. Roy Barnes, Assistant Moderator; Bro. Derrell Wheeler, Clerk. Key note message to be given by Rev. M. H. CONSTITUTION

- 1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons and delegate from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons
- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the churches unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matters of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 3. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the association to examine, by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrines and convictions respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license, and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this Association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.
- 4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.
- 5. The officers of the association shall be moderator assistant moderator and clerk-treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 6. The association shall meet annually at such time and place is may be agreed upon at the previous session and shall not adjourn finally until all business matters be transacted.
- 7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.
- 8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions such as Temperance cause, Sabbath School, Missionary work, etc.
- 9. No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other members be competent to serve in that capacity.
 - 10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating

reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, tht is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same may be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.

- 11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegates failing or refusing to do so, is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of same.
- 12. The moderator shall receive \$10.00, the assistant moderator \$5.00 and the clerk \$15.00 for their services.
- 13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The moderator shall appoint a committee on committees, whose duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee to consist of from 3 to 5 members. (See List).
- 3. The officers shall be chosen by a majority of delegates present, at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 4. The moderator calls for the letters from various churches, and appoints reading clerks. After reading of the letters, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the decretion of the body.
- 5. The delegates shall be seated at a designated place in the assembly and a majority shall rule in all cases.
- 6. The Executive Committee shall recommend, or reject a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body.
- 7. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 8. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.
- 9. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

- 10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the authority of the association nor more than fifteen minutes .
 - 11. No person shall laugh or talk during discussion.
- 12. No person shall absent himself from the association without permission of the moderator.
- 13. All Ordination shall be done by the associaton, either at the association, or by the ordaining council.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yt as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent ceatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His hauman nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: -1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. -2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. -3. Continunace in faith and obedience until death.

- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salavation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace perserve in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet Washing is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him."—(1 Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."
