# PROCEEDINGS

The Eighty-Ninth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with Friendship Free Will Baptist Church on October 18, 1969. Rev. Dewey Thomas, Moderator, Derrell R. Wheeler, Clerk.

This meeting opened with congregational singing under the direction of Rev. Leander McAdams. The song "Are You Washed in the Blood" was followed by a prayer by Bro. R. T. Mixon.

The Eighty-Ninth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was called to order by Rev. Dewey Thomas.

Next we had congregtaional singing, the song, "I'll Fly Away" was directed by Rev. Leander McAdams.

Rev. Leander McAdams extended a hearty welcome to all the people attending this associational meeting at Friendshi Church.

A devotional message was given by Rev. B. T. Alexander. This message was taken from St. John, chapter 10.

Congregational singing of the song "The Promised Land" was directed by Rev. Leander McAdams.

We next, had a prayer by Rev. A. L. Warren.

Letters from the various churches were called for and turned over to the clerk. Rev. Ottis Parmer and Sister Wilda McAdams were appointed as reading clerks.

After approximately one half the letters were read, the clerks paused while a prayer was offered by Rev. Henry Crawford. Reading of the letters resumed. All letters were read. Accepted as read and the delegates seated as listed. (See churches and delegates as listed.)

A call was given for petitionary letters. None were received.

Two churches in the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association have joined other associations. Pleasant Grove Free Will Baptist Church joined the Cahaba River Association and Hubbard Springs Free Will Baptist Church joined the Mt. Moriah Association.

Appointment of the committee on committees was made. Those oppinted were: Bro. Pascal Yerby, Rev. M. H. Hollis, Rev. Bert Graves, Rev. A. L. Warren.

Recognition of our oldest ministers, Rev. A. L. Warren, Rev. S. F. Lee, Rev. M. H. Hollis and Rev. W. D. Glasgow was given at this time. Each offered his comments, all of which were enjoyed by the congregation.

Next, the congregation, sang "Some Glad Day After Awhile" directed by Rev. Leander McAdams. We were then dismissed for a short intermission.

Following the intermission, the congregational sang "Press Along to Glory Land" after which Rev. Dewey Thomas offered a prayer.

We recognized the other associations represented. They were: Progressive, Northeast Mississippi and Mt. Moriah.

A call was given for reports of the various committees at this time.

The Business Committee report was read, received as read by the proper vote and seconded. The committee was dismissed. (See reports)

The Sunday School and C.T.S. committee report was read and received by proper vote and seconded. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

The Temperance Committee report was read next. The report was aeccepted as read by the proper vote and second. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

Next The Devotional Committee report was read and received as read by vote and second. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

The Deceased Members committee report was given and received as read by vote and second. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

A song, "Precious Memories," was sung for all the deceased members of our association, by the congregation followed by a prayer by Rev. A. L. Warren.

The Finance Committee report was read and received as read by vote and second. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

The Resolutions Committee report was read and received by vote and second. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

The Church Extension Committee report was given. Discussion of this report was tabled until after noon.

A committee of Ministers was appointed for the purpose of ordaining any ministers or deacons.

Our key note message was given by Rev. G. C. Lawrence. The text for this sermon is First John, chapter 2. Subject: "Men Shall be Lovers of Themselves."

After the key note message, the congregation sang "Is Thy Heart Right with God," followed by a prayer by Rev. Leander McAdams.

The congregation was dismissed for lunch.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The meeting reconveined at 1:00 p.m. with a song "When I See The Blood," directed by Rev. Roy Barnes followed by a prayer by Rev. G. C. Lawrence.

Bro. R. H. Yerby, Sr. was appointed to the Executive Committee. Bro. Dewey Jordan was appointed chairman of this committee for the coming year. Other members names appear in list of committees.

An afternoon sermon was given by Rev. W. D. Glasgow.

Next a special quartet composed of Rev's. Roy Barnes, Henry Crawford, M. H. Hollis, and Leander McAdams sang "I Want to be Ready to Meet Him."

Discussion on the Church Extension Committee report resumed. The committee was changed to The Vernon Home Mission Board with a committee appointed to transact business throughout the coming year. This committee consists of: Rev. Roy Barnes, Chairman; Bro. Loyd Turner, Rev. G. C. Lawrence The action was properly approved by vote and second of the delegated body. The committee was discharged. (See reports)

The report from the committee on committees was read, received as read by the necessary vote and second. The committee was then discharged. (See reports)

Rev. L. B. Nix gave us a report on the Free Will Baptist Children's Home in Eldridge, Alabama. Rev. Dewey Thomas then reported various items needed by the children at the Children's Home.

#### Constitution

- 1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons and delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons.
- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the churches unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matters of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 3. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the association to examine by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrines and convictions respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license, and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.
- 4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.

- 5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator and clerk-treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 6. The association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon at the previous session and shall not adjourn finally until all business matters be transacted.
- 7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usages.
- 8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral & benevolent institutions such as Temperance cause, Sunday School, Missionary work, etc.
- 9. No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other members be competent to serve in that capacity.
- 10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same may be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegates failing or refusing to do so, is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of same.
- 12. The moderator shall receive \$10.00, the assistant moderator \$5.00 and the clerk \$50.00 for their services.
- 13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association.

# By-Laws

- 1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The moderator shall appoint a committee on committees, whose duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee to consist of from 3 to 5 members. (See List).
  - 3. The officers shall be chosen by a majjojrity of delegates
- 3. The officers shall be chosen by a majority of delegates present, at the close of each session to take office at the begin-
- 4. The moderator calls for the letters from various churches, and appoints reading clerks. After reading of the letters, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the decretion of the body.
- 5. The delegates shall be seated at a designuated place in the assembly and a majority shall rule in all cases.
- 6. The Executive Committee shall recommend, or reject a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body.
- 7. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 8. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.
- 9. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the authority of the association nor more than fifteen minutes.
  - 11. No person shall laugh or talk during discussion.
- 12. No person shall absent himself from the association without permission of the moderator.
- 13. All Ordination shall be done by the association, either at the association, or by the ordaining council.

#### Articles of Faith

- 1. THE BIBLE. The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPRIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for as the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are: (1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. (3) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hen e by faith in Christ men become His elect.

- 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSERVERANCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace perserve in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. Feet Washing is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be administered to all true believers.
- 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorse it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him."—(1 Cor. 16:2).
- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."
