#### **PROCEEDINGS**

The ninety-second session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with the Union Chapel Free Will Baptist church on October 14, 1972. Rev. M. H. Hollis served as moderator of this meeting and Raphael Yerby served as clerk.

This meeting of the Association opened with the song "The Old Gospel Ship," directed by Rev. Leander McAdams. Rev. Roy Barnes led in prayer. Rev. Mc-Adams directed another song "The Glory Land Way."

The Ninety-second session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was called to order by the moderator, Rev. M. H. Hollis. Rev. Jerry Edgill brought a devotional message using Ephesians 5:21-32. Prayer was by the speaker.

A report of the Digest Committee was called for. The report was given by Rev. Robert Franks. A motion, second and vote carried to receive the report, seat the delegates and discharge the committee. Next, we had a roll call of the delegates, by the clerk.

Next, all Deacons present at this meeting were recognized and given an opportunity to give a word of testimony.

A report was presented by the Resolution Committee, a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The Board of Christian Education gave a report, a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report.

A report from the Business Committee was read in two parts and offered for acceptance. A motion, second and vote carried to accept the report item by item. Another motion, second and vote carried to table item number 1 of part 2 of this report until later in the day.

After the report of the Business Committee, Rev. Jerry Edgill directed a congregational song, "At Calvary." Rev. Rickey Cash brought a very inspiring devotional message using Numbers 13:30-33. Prayer was by the speaker.

The devotional message was followed by a song, "Jesus Saves," directed by Rev. Jerry Edgill.

The Key Note Sermon was presented by Rev. Albert Lee Hamm. The subject of the message was, "The Lord Jesus Christ." The message was taken from Hebrews 3:1, First Peter 1:3, 1:19 and 2:21-25. Prayer was by the speaker.

After the message the congregation sang an invitation song, "Surrender All." We were dismissed for the noon meal with prayer by Rev. Ottis Parmer.

A motion, second and vote carried to correct the Bylaws and Order of Business of this association to conform to the instructions of the Business Committee.

#### **BUSINESS COMMITTEE REPORT, PART I**

- (1) We recommend that Article 13 of the Constitution that was adopted in 1969 be carried out. (M.S.C.)
- (2) We recommend that Article 5 and 12 of the Constitution that was voted on in 1969 be up dated as of this session. (M.S.C.)
- (3) We recommend that Article No. 8 of the Constitution be up dated to read Sunday School instead of Sabbath School as adopted in Business Committee report in 1968. (M.S.C.)
- (4) We recommend that the Clerk insert to the side of all adopted business the letters, M.S.C., meaning motion, second and carried.
- (5) We recommend that Article No. 2 of the 1971 Business Committee report be dropped. (M.S.C.)

#### **PART II**

(1) We recommend the appointment of a Credential Committee, consisting of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to Examine All Ministers who become a part of this body, either by Ordaination or by letter. Any item of business pertaining to Ministers or the conduct of Ministers must originate with this committee.

This committee shall consist of three (3) Ministers and two (2) Laymen.

This committee replaces the present Executive Committee. (M.S.C.)

(2) The creation of a General Board, which shall consist of the Moderator and Clerk, along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve for two (2) years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this Association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be approved by the association (M.S.C.)

- (3) We recommend that the application for Ministers approved by the National Association be used by the Credential Committee in the examination of men for Ordaination. (M.S.C.)
- (4) We recommend that items 1, 2, and 3 of this report become a part of our constitution. (M.S.C.)

#### CONSTITUTION

- 1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons and delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons.
- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the churches unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and practices of Free Will Baptist. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matters of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 3. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it will be the responsibility of the local church to license the member and later request the association to ordain the member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrines and convictions

respecting the work of the ministry and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordaination should include all that is required for license and also the Application For Ministers approved by the National Association of Free Will Baptist. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this Association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.

- 4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.
- 5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerk-treasurer and assistant clerk, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 6. The association shall meet annually at such time and place as may be agreed upon at the previous session and shall not adjourn finally until all business matters be transacted.
- 7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage.
- 8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions such as Temperance cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.
- 9. No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other member be competent to serve in that capacity.
- 10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same may be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegates failing or refusing to do so is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of the same.
- 12. The moderator shall receive \$10.00, the assistant moderator \$5.00, the clerk \$50.00 and the assistant clerk one-half that of the clerk for their services.
- 13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association and have them out to the churches within 90 days after the association meeting.
- 14. The moderator shall appoint a Credential Committee, consisting of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to Examine All Ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordaination or by letter. Any item of business

pertaining to ministers or the conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. This committee shall consist of three (3) ministers and two (2) laymen.

15. The association shall have a General Board, which shall consist of the moderator and clerk, along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve for two (2) years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be approved by the association.

#### **BYLAWS**

- 1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The moderator shall appoint a committee on committees, whose duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee to consist of from 3 to 5 members. (See List).
- 3. The officers shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the beginning of the next session.
- 4. The moderator calls for the report of the Digest Committee and a roll call of the delegates. After a reading of the report, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the discretion of the body.
- 5. The delegates shall be seated at a designated place in the assembly and a majority rule in all cases.
- 6. The Credential Committee shall recommend, or reject a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body.
- 7. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 8. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.
- 9. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the authority of the association nor more than fifteen minutes.
  - 11. No person shall laugh or talk during discussion.
- 12. No person shall absent himself from the association without permission of the moderator.
- 13. All Ordaination of ministers shall be done by the association, either at the association, or by the ordaining council.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for all the highest welfare of men requires.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Works of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life sufferings, death and resurrection affected all a redemption from sin that is full and free is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or unreserved committed of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

- 12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace perserve in holiness to the end of life, having promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. FEET WASHING is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Lord's Day. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."
