#### PROCEEDINGS

The ninety-eighth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with Sulligent Free Will Baptist Church on October 14, 1978. Rev. M. H. Hollis served as moderator, Rev. Edward Puckett served as assistant moderator, and Raphael H. Yerby served as clerk.

The meeting opened with a song, "When We All Get To Heaven," directed by Bro. Russell Cole. The opening prayer was offered by Rev. Leander McAdams.

The morning devotion was brought by Rev. Don Taggart, using John 15:4-6 as his scripture. His subject was, "What Kind Of A Christian Are You?" Prayer was by the speaker.

After the morning devotion, there was a song, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes," directed by Bro. Russell Cole.

The ninety-eighth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was called to order by the moderator, Rev. M. H. Hollis. The moderator welcomed everyone to this session of the association and used Phillipians 4:13 in his opening remarks.

The moderator called for a report of the Digest Committee. The report was given by Sister Elsie Boyett. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

We had a roll call of the delegates to the association by the clerk. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to seat the delegates.

The moderator excused the Credential Committee to take care of some business

that came to their committee before they made their report.

Next we had a song, "Everybody Will Be Happy Over There," directed by Bro. Russell Cole. Prayer was by Rev. Malone Cobb.

The moderator recognized visiting brethren and sisters and invited them to seat with us during this session of the association. Those present were:

After an intermission and time of fellowship, we had a congregational song, "Victory In Jesus," directed by Bro. Russell Cole.

The moderator called for a report of the Committee on Committees. The report was given by Bro. James Price, chairman, and the various committees were appointed. (See List). We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee. At this time, a Welcome was given to everyone by Rev. Edward Puckett, pastor of the host church.

The moderator called for petitionary letters. None were received.

The moderator called for a report of the General Board. The report was given by Raphael Yerby, clerk of the association. We had a motion, second and vote carried to vote on the report item by item. Items one and two carried by vote. Item three was amended by a motion, second and vote carried from the floor. Then we had a motion, second and vote carried to table item three until the afternoon session, since it dealt with a change of the Constitution.

We had a very interesting and informative report by Rev. Dennis Kizzire on the Summer Youth Camp Activities. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and make it a part of the printed minutes.

The moderator dismissed the various committees to make their committee reports.

We had a song, "Heaven's Jubilee," directed by Rev. Edward Puckett.

The moderator called for a report of the Credential Committee. A partial report was given by Bro. Dewey Jordan. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report as a partial report.

After this report, we were dismissed for a short recess before the eleven o'clock message. The dismissal prayer was offered by Rev. Byron Meyer.

After recess, we had a song, "Just A Little Talk With Jesus," directed by Bro.

Troy Cole. Prayer was offered by Bro. Roger Lucas.

We had another song, "I'll Be A Friend To Jesus," directed by Bro. Troy Cole.

The moderator recognized Bro. Pascal Yerby of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Vernon for thirty (30) years of perfect attendance in Sunday School.

Just before the eleven o'clock message, we had a congregational song, "Amazing Grace," directed by Bro. Troy Cole.

The Key Note Message was brought at 11:00 A.M. by Rev. Milton Gann, pastor of the Liberty Free Will Baptist Church. The subject of his message was, "We Are Witnesses of All Scripture", using Luke 24:45-48 and Acts 4:31 as his scripture text. Prayer was by the speaker.

After a very interesting and challenging message, we had a song of invitation, "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes." We had a prayer of dedication offered by Rev. M. H. Hollis, moderator of the association.

We were dismissed for the noon hour. The dismissal prayer was by Rev. Malone Cobb.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

After a delicious lunch, which everyone enjoyed, and the noon hour of fellowship, we convened at 1:00 P.M. with Bro. Troy Cole leading a congregational song, "I Feel Like Traveling On." Prayer was offered by Rev. Dennis Kizzire.



The moderator asked Bro. Richard Dean from the Eastside Free Will Baptist Church to give us an oral report on Master's Men. After a very informative report Bro. Dean encouraged each church in the association to organize a Master's Men and be active in the work.

The moderator called for a report of the Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee. The report was given by Sister Sandra Carter, chairman. We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

Next we had a report of the Finance Committee. The report was given by Bro. Robert Carter, chairman. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The Deceased Members Committee report was given by Bro. Reedus Wheat. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report. After the report the congregation stood and sang "Precious Memories" in memory of these loved ones. Prayer was offered by Rev. Walter D. Jaggers.

The moderator called for a report of the Temperance Committee. The report was given by Bro. Robert Carter using several different scriptures on the subject of temperance. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report as information.

The moderator called for a report of the Board of Christian Education. The report was given by Rev. Dennis Kizzire, chairman. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report.

The Ordination Service was held next. Bro. Norman G. Berryhill was ordained to

preach the Gospel. Rev. Edward Puckett delivered the Ordination Message. The Charge was given by Rev. M. H. Hollis. The Ordination Prayer was offered by Rev. Roy Barnes. We had a song, "Ready," while the congregation was invited to come by and shake hands with Bro. Berryhill.

After the Ordination Service, we selected places for the Youth Rally each month, October through May. The meeting places are:

October, 1978 - Springfield November, 1978 - Youth Camp December, 1978 - Mt. Harmony January, 1979 - Vernon February, 1979 - Banquet March, 1979 - Area Youth Revival April, 1979 - Liberty May, 1979 - Davis Chapel

The moderator called for a final report of the Credential Committee. The report was by Bro. Dewey Jordan. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report.

Next we had a final report of the General Board. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to take up item three of the report that was tabled in the morning session and bring it up for a vote. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to adopt the report.

The moderator called for any new business that anyone wanted to bring up from the floor. Bro. Richard. Dean suggested that we consider having associational quarterly meetings and wanted to hear the feelings of others on this matter. Several different ministers gave their views, both for and against, on this subject. No action was taken on the subject at this meeting.

A report of the Appreciation Committee was given at this time by Sister Lovie Jaggers. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to give the Sulligent Free Will Baptist Church a rising vote of appreciation for their fine hospitality.

The moderator appointed Rev. Roy Barnes to serve a five (5) year term on the Credential Committee.

The moderator called for nomination for one member to serve a three year term on the Youth Camp Board of Directors. Bro. L. C. Steedley was nominated and elected to serve a three year term.

The moderator called for nominations for one member to serve a three year term on the Board of Christian Education. Bro. Richard Dean and Bro. Michael Rogers were nominated. Bro. Michael Rogers was elected to serve.

The moderator called for the election of one member to serve a seven year term on the Youth Camp Committee. Rev. Walter D. Jaggers was elected to serve. The moderator also called for the election of one member to serve out the unexpired term of Sister Lonie Fay Franks on the Youth Camp Committee. Rev. Byron Meyer was elected to serve.

Next the moderator called for the election of officers for the next year. First, nomination was opened for clerk of the association. Bro. Raphael Yerby was nominated and elected to serve as clerk.

The body voted to hold the 1979 session of this association at Mt. Willing Free Will Baptist Church. The meeting will be held on October 20, 1979.

#### **GENERAL BOARD REPORT**


The General Board met on September 23, 1978, and we offer the following report:

#### **VERNON FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION**

#### CONSTITUTION

1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons, and delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons.

2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the churches unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and practices of Free Will Baptist. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matters of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.

3. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it will be the responsibility of the local church to license the member and later request the association to ordain the member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrines and convictions respecting the work of the ministry and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license and also the Application for Ministers approved by the National Association of Free Will Baptist. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who has more than one living wife. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who uses tobacco in any form.

4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.

5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator, clerktreasurer, and assistant clerk, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the close of that session with the outgoing clerk being responsible for the printing and distribution of the minutes.

6. The association shall meet annually on Saturday before the third Sunday in October each year and shall not adjourn finally until all business matters be transacted.


7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage.

8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions such as Temperance Cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.

9(a). No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other member be competent to serve in that capacity.

9(b). No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator of the association until he has been a member of the association for at least two (2) years.

10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of



any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same may be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.

11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegates failing or refusing to do so is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of the same.

12. The moderator shall receive \$50.00, the assistant moderator \$25.00, the clerk \$50.00, and the assistant clerk one-half that of the clerk for their services.

13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association and shall have them out to the churches within 90 days after the associational meeting.

14. The moderator shall appoint a Credential Committee, consisting of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to Examine All Ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or the conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. This committee shall consist of three (3) ministers and two (2) laymen.

15(a). The association shall have a General Board, which shall consist of the moderator and clerk along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve for two (2) years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be approved by the association. 15(b). The association shall have an Executive Committee, consisting of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk and four (4) members from the General Board.

#### **BY-LAWS**

1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.

2. The moderator shall appoint a Committee on Committees, whose duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee to consist of from 3 to 5 members. (See list.)

3. The officers shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the close of that session, with the outgoing clerk being responsible for the printing and distributing of the minutes.

4. The moderator calls for the report of the Digest Committee and a roll call of the delegates. After a reading of the report, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the discretion of the body.

5. The delegates shall be seated at a designated place in the assembly and a majority rules in all cases.

#### VERNON FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

6. The Credential Committee shall recommend, or reject a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter.

7. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.

8. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.

9. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.

10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the authority of the association nor more than fifteen minutes.

11. No person shall laugh or talk during discussion.

12. No person shall absent himself from the association without the permission of the moderator.

13. All Ordination of Ministers shall be done at the association while in regular annual session, by the ordaining council.

14. The General Board along with the Credential Committee, in special called session, shall have authority to grant letters to ministers leaving our association and to receive ministers into our association, provided they are a member of a church in our association, reporting their action to the annual associational meeting, with their action being subject to final approval by the associational body.

15. No person shall be ordained by this association as a preacher unless he has been licensed by his local church for at least one year.

16. The Vernon Free Will Baptist Associational Year shall begin on the first day of September and end on the last day of August each year and hold the annual meetings on Saturday before the third Sunday in October of each year.

17. The Executive Committee shall secure a speaker for the 11:00 o'clock message and plan the program for each annual session of the association.

#### **ARTICLES OF FAITH**

1. The Bible. The Scripture of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preservor, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our present Savior and Lord.

4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided, for all the highest welfare of men.

6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. The Works of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life sufferings, death and resurrection effected all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.

10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. Perseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, having promise of eternal salvation.

13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. FEET WASHING is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God has prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).

15. The Lord's Day. The devine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.

16. **Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution.** The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."

#### **BY-LAWS FOR THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**

1. It is the duty of this-board to promote the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association Youth Rally, and other related projects.

2. This board shall, along with the duly elected officers and the host pastor, plan the programs of the rallies each month.

3. The Board of Christian Education shall work with all churches in getting them involved in the Youth Rally work and other related projects.

4. The board shall act in advisory capacity to the elected officers of the Youth Rally.

5. The board shall consist of three (3) members, with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year.

6. The board shall be responsible each year for planning the District T-N-T Rally in May.
