PROCEEDINGS

The ninety-ninth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with Mt. Willing Free Will Baptist Church on October 20, 1979. Rev. Edward Puckett served as moderator, Rev. Walter D. Jaggers served as assistant moderator, and Raphael H. Yerby served as clerk.

The meeting opened with a song, "Glory To His Name". The opening prayer was by Rev. Tom Scott.

We were welcomed to the Mt. Willing Free Will Baptist Church by the host pastor, Rev. Ambers Aldridge.

We had another song, "Where The Soul Never Dies".

The morning devotion was brought by Rev. Byron M. Meyer, using 1st. John 4:7-11 as his scripture. His subject was "God Is Love". Also at this time Bro. Meyer expressed his appreciation to the people of the Vernon Association for their many prayers, cards, visits, and the love offering from the friends of the association during the illness of his wife last year.

The nineth-ninth session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Edward Puckett. The moderator welcomed everyone to this session of the association and used Acts 5:39 in his opening remarks.

We had a roll call of the delegates to the association by the clerk. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to seat the delegates.

The moderator called for a report of the Committee on Committees. The report was given by Bro. Roger Lucas, chairman, and the various committees were appointed. (See List). We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator appointed a Committee on Committees for the 1980 associational year. (See List).

Next we had a report of a Constitution and By-Laws Committee that was appointed by the moderator of the last session of the association to study the Constitution and By-Laws and make the necessary changes to bring them up to date. The report was given by Bro. Raphael Yerby, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to table the report until the afternoon session.



The moderator recognized visiting brethren and invited them to seat with us during this session of the association. Those present were:

We had a recommendation by Rev. Walter Jaggers to appoint all pastors of the association to the Youth Camp Committee. No action was taken on the recommendation at this time.

We had a report of the Digest Committee by Sister Kitty Taylor, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator called for petitionary letters. None were received.

Next we had a song, "I Feel Like Traveling On".

We had a very interesting report by Rev. Dennis Kizzire on the summer youth camp activities and report on the Board of Christian Education. Bro. Kizzire requested that we have special prayer on behalf of the Mark Dubose family. He reported that Mark was saved during the Youth Crusade last year and later lost his life in an automobile accident. The prayer was offered by Rev. Tom Scott. We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report as information.

The moderator dismissed the various committees to make their committee reports.

The moderator called for a report of the Temperance Committee. The report was given by Bro. Michael Rogers, using Romans 14:21 as his scripture on the subject of temperance. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report as information.

We had a recommendation from the Digest Committee for all churches to complete their letter to the association as correctly as possible and send them to the committee chairman by the specified time so the committee can make a correct report and have it ready when the association meets.

We were dismissed by the moderator for a short recess and time of



fellowship.

After recess, we had a congregational song, "Heavenly Sunlight", directed by Bro. Hollis. Prayer was by Bro. Howard Simmons.

Next, we had a report of the Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee. The report was given by Sister Alice Ann Carruth, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator called for a report of the Deceased Members Committee. The report was given by Bro. Leonard Corbett, chairman. A motion, second and vote carried to receive the report. After the report, the congregation sang "Precious Memories" in memory of these loved ones. Prayer was by Rev. L. B. Nix.

We had a report of the Finance Committee by Bro. H. L. Williams, chairman. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

At this time the moderator appointed Rev. Milton Gann to serve a

five year term on the Credential Committee.

The moderator called for the election of one member to serve a three year term on the Youth Camp Board of Directors. Rev. M. H. Hollis was elected to succeed himself on this board.

The moderator called for the election of one member to serve a three year term on the Board of Christian Education. Rev. Dennis Kizzire was elected to serve on this board.

At this time we had a congregational song, "Let Him In", directed by Bro. Hollis.

The Key Note Message was brought at 11:00 A.M. by Rev. Walter D. Jaggers, pastor of the Belk Free Will Baptist Church. The subject of his message was, "The Lord's Return", using Matthew 24:43-51, Titus 2:10-15, and 1st John 2:2-3 as his scripture text. Prayer was by the speaker.

After a very inspiring message, we had a song of invitation, "I Surrender All".

We were dismissed for the noon hour. The dismissal prayer was by

Rev. Dennis Kizzire.

AFTERNOON SESSION

After a delicious lunch, which everyone enjoyed, and the noon hour of fellowship, we convened at 1:00 P.M. We had a congregational song, "It's A Grand And Glorious Feeling". Prayer was offered by Rev. Gurley Roberts.

The moderator called for a report of the Credential Committee. The report was given by Rev. M. H. Hollis. A motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report.

The Ordination Service was held next. Bro. Roger Lucas of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Vernon was ordained to preach the Gospel. Rev. Roy Barnes delivered the Ordination Message, using 1st Timothy 3 and St. John 15:1-7 as his scripture. The Charge was given by Rev. M. H. Hollis. The Ordination Prayer was by Rev. Tom Scott. After the Ordination Service, we had a song "We'll Work Till Jesus Comes", while the congregation was invited to come by and shake hands with Bro. Lucas and the other new ministers coming into our association and welcome them to the Vernon Association.

A report of the Appreciation Committee was given by Bro. Dickie Dees, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to give the Mt. Willing Free Will Baptist Church a rising vote of appreciation for their fine hospitality.

The moderator appointed an Executive Committee for the next year.

The moderator called for a final report of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. The report was given and voted on article by article. Article 18 of the By-Laws was amended from the floor to include all pastors on the Youth Camp Committee. All the other articles were adopted as given by the committee.

We had a motion from the floor and vote carried for the Credential Committee to add the proper scripture to our Articles Of Faith, printed in the minutes.

We had a motion from the floor to appoint or elect a Historical Committee to get up a history of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association and report to the 1980 session of the association. **Committee Elected**

Let's stand in remembrance of the life and witness of Brother Mark Dubose.


Future plans include a retreat in November, a Valentine banquet and tenative plans have been made to secure a speaker for a 1981 youth crusade.

Only the Judgment Seat of Christ will reveal the true impact that this camp had on those that came as campers and those that so diligently worked on the staff.


We wish to express our heartfelt gratitude to each person that had a part, directly or indirectly in this year's camp.


CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the committee on Constitution and By-Laws recommend the following changes in our Constitution and By-Laws.

CONSTITUTION

2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the church unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist. In this event it will be investigated by the Credential Committee and their findings will be reported to the association for their action. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matter of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with Treaties of Faith and practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.

3. When a church desires one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it will be the responsibility of the local church to license the member and later request the association to ordain the member. The examination for license should refer to piety, doctrine, and convictions respecting the work of the ministry and reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license and also the application for ministers approved by the National Association of Free Will Baptist. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who has more than one living wife, or who's wife has more than one living husband. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who uses tobacco in any form.

5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator and clerk-treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the close of that session with the outgoing clerk being responsible for the printing and distribution of the minutes. The clerk shall have the authority to secure any necessary assistance he needs, at his own expense.

10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.

12. The moderator shall receive \$50.00, the assistant moderator \$25.00, and the clerk \$75.00 for their services.

15 (A). The association shall have a General Board, which shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator and clerk along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve for two (2) years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be reported to the association.

BY-LAWS

3. Delete (Same as article #5 of the constitution).

5. Delete (Hardly ever practiced).

6. The Credential Committee shall recommend the issuance, or rejection of a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter. The Credential Committee, in special called session, shall have the authority to grant letters to ministers leaving our association and receive ministers into our association, provided they are members of a church in our association, reporting their action to the annual association meeting.

10. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the permission of the moderator nor more than five minutes.

12. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without the permission of the moderator.

14. Combined with article #6.

15. No person shall be ordained by this association as a preacher unless he has been licensed by his local church for at least one year, or recommended for ordination by the Credential Committee.

18. The Youth Camp Committee shall meet within 60 days after the associational meeting to select a Camp Director and a Treasurer of the Youth Camp and make plans for the summer camp.

Article 18 was amended to include all pastors of the Vernon Association on the Youth Camp Committee and they would make up the Youth Camp Committee.

CONSTITUTION

1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons and delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons.

2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the church unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptist. In this event it will be investigated by the Credential Committee and their findings will be reported to the association for their action. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the matter of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with the Treaties of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teaching of the Bible.

3. When a church desires one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it will be the responsibility of the local church to license the member and later request the association to ordain the member. The examination for license should refer to piety,

doctrine, and convictions respecting the work of the ministry and reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license and also the application for ministers approved by the National Association of Free Will Baptist. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who uses tobacco in any form.

4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.

5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator, and clerk-treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the close of that session with the outgoing clerk being responsible for the printing and distribution of the minutes. The clerk shall have the authority to secure any necessary assistance he needs, at his own expense.

6. The association shall meet annually on Saturday before the third Sunday in October each year and shall not adjourn finally until all business matters be transacted.


7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usage.

8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions such as Temperance cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.

9 (a). No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other member be competent to serve in that capacity.

9 (b). No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator of the association until he has been a member of the association for at least two (2) years.

10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of any nature or aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealth with by the



association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.

11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegate failing or refusing to do so is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of the same.

12. The moderator shall receive \$50.00, the assistant moderator \$25.00, and the clerk \$75.00 for their services.

13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association and shall have them out to the churches within 90 days after the associational meeting.

14. The moderator shall appoint a Credential Committee, consisting of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all members who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or the conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. This committee shall consist of three (3) ministers and two (2) laymen.

15 (a). The association shall have a General Board, which shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, and clerk along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve two years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be reported to the association.

15 (b). The association shall have an Executive Committee, consisting of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and four (4) members from the General Board.

BY-LAWS

1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.

2. The moderator shall appoint a Committee on Committees, whose

duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee is to consist of from 3 to 5 members.

3. The moderator calls for the report of the Digest Committee and a roll call of the delegates. After a reading of the report, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the discretion of the body.

4. The Credential Committee shall recommend the issuance, or rejection of a card of good standing for the ministers. The final decision to be made by the body. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter. The Credential Committee, in special called session, shall have the authority to grant letters to ministers leaving our association, provided they are members of a church in our association, reporting their action to the annual association meeting.

5. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.

6. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.

7. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.



ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Bible. The Scripture of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preservor, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our present Savior and Lord.

4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided, for all the highest welfare of men.

6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.



7. The Works of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life sufferings, death and resurrection effected all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9.Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ all men become His elect.

10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. Perserverance. All beleivers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, having promise of eternal salvation.

13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEET WASHING is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.

14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God has prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).

15. The Lord's Day. The devine law requires that one day in seven by set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.



16. Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."

BY-LAWS FOR THE BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

1. It is the duty of this board to promote the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association Youth Rally, and other related projects.

2. This board shall, along with the duly elected officers and the host pastor, plan the programs of the rallies each month.

3. The Board of Christian Education shall work with all churches in getting them involved in the Youth Rally work and other related projects.

4. The board shall act in advisory capacity to the elected officers of the Youth Rally.


