REV. ROY H. BARNES

On May 25, 1981 the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association lost one of our most beloved ministers. Rev. Roy H. Barnes, Sr. died in the Lamar County General Hospital after a short illness.

Bro. Barnes was presently serving as pastor of the Union Ridge Free Will Baptist Church. He had been a minister for approximately 35 years, serving as pastor of many churches in our area. He was sometimes referred to as the Dean of Ministers of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association.

Bro. Barnes was saved in 1924. He preached his first sermon on June 1, 1946 at Free Will Chapel Free Will Baptist Church. He was licensed to preach in 1947 and later ordained to preach the Gospel in 1947.

Bro. Barnes has pastored the following churches in the Vernon Association and surrounding area: Mt. Pleasant, Philadelphia, New Bethlehem, Union Ridge, New Center Point, Depriest Chapel, Free Will Chapel, Barnesville, Mt. Harmony, First Free Will Baptist Church of Sulligent, Springfield, Piney Grove, Union Chapel, Pleasant Site, and Friendship.

Bro. Barnes served as the first pastor of the Sulligent Church.

In addition to his preaching, Bro. Barnes was a great lover and promoter of Gospel singing. He taught singing schools in many of the churches he pastored. He helped to organize the State Line Harmoneers Quartet and sang with the Quartet for about 18 years.

Bro. Barnes helped with hundreds of funerals in our area, either as officiating minister or singing for the funerals.

Bro. Barnes has served our association in many different official capacities. He has served as Moderator of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association, Assistant Moderator, and served on most of the committees of our association. He has also served on the Board of Trustees at the Free Will Baptist Childrens Home in Eldridge, Alabama.

He was often called upon for good sound advice by fellow ministers. He also helped countless others in various ways. Whenever a need arose, Bro. Barnes was always there to help.

Bro. Barnes will be greatly missed by all of us of the Vernon Association, but his works, his great love and influence will long be remembered and cherished by all of us.

PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred and first session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was held with Springfield Free Will Baptist Church on October 17, 1981. Rev. Walter D. Jaggers served as moderator, Rev. Milton Gann served as assistant moderator, and Raphael H. Yerby served as clerk.

The meeting opened with a song, "To God Be The Glory," directed by Rev. Mike Foster. The opening prayer was by Rev. Edward Puckett.

We were welcomed to Springfield Free Will Baptist Church by the host pastor, Rev. Dennis Kizzire. The response was given by Rev. Milton Gann.

The morning devotion was brought by Rev. Willard Pless, using Matthew 16:1-4 as his scripture. His subject was "Sign of the Times." Prayer was by the speaker.

The 101st session of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association was called to order by the moderator, Rev. Walter D. Jaggers. The moderator gave a special welcome to everyone to this session of the association.

We had a roll call of the delegates to the association by the clerk. We had a motion, second and vote carried to seat the delegates.

The moderator excused the Credential Committee to complete their report, along with anyone needing to meet with them.

The moderator called for a report of the Committee on Committees. The report was given by the chairman, Rev. Fred Graham, and the various committees were appointed. (See List.) We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator appointed a Committee on Committees for the 1982 associational year. (See List.)

The moderator recognized visiting brethren and sisters and invited them to seat with us during this session of the association. Those present were: Rev. Bill Smith, Rev. Jerry Smith, Rev. James Walden, Harold Goode, Betty Jo Goode, Sallie Mae Chason, Jack Carter, Danny Ballard, Lesia Petty, Teresa Petty.

We had a report of the Digest Committee by Bro. Leonard Corbett, chairman. We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator called for petitionary letters. None were received.

We had a report of the Board of Christian Education by Rev. Mike Rogers on the youth activities of our association for the past year. M.S.C. We had a financial report of the Northwest Alabama Free Will Baptist Youth Camp by the moderator. Copies of this report were prepared by Rev. Woodrow Matthews, secretary of the Youth Camp and given out to members of our association. M.S.C.

We had a report of the Temperance Committee by Bro. Robert Carter, chairman, using several different scriptures in his remarks on temperance. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report as information and discharge the committee.

We had a speical report by Rev. James Walden, a home missionary in Alabaster on the work in Alabaster, Alabama.

Next we had a report of information on the Master's Men by Bro. Richard Dean from the Eastside Free Will Baptist Church. We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report as information.

Next we had a report of the General Board by the clerk. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to take the report and vote on it item by item. Item number one and two were adopted. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to table item number three, four, and five until the afternoon session, since they dealt with changes in the constitution.

We had a song, "Blessed Assurance," directed by Bro. Mike Foster. We were dismissed by the moderator for a short recess and a time of fellowship.

After recess, we had a partial report of the Credential Committee. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report as a partial report.

Just before the eleven o'clock message, we had a song, "Brethren, We Have Met To Worship," directed by Bro. Mike Foster. Prayer was by Rev. M. H. Hollis.

We received a special Love Offering for our guest speaker, Dr. Robert Picirilli. The offeratory prayer was by Rev. Tom Scott.

The Key Note Message was brought at 11:00 A.M. by our guest speaker, Dr. Robert Picirilli, from the Free Will Baptist Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee. Prayer was by the speaker. The subject of his message was "Caleb's Faith," using Numbers 13:17-20, 25-33, 14:1, 6-10a, and Joshua 14:6-14 as his scripture text.

After a very inspiring message, we had a song of invitation by Bro. Mike Foster, and prayer by the moderator.

We were dismissed for the noon hour. The dismissal prayer was by Rev. Byron Meyer.

AFTERNOON SESSION

After a delicious lunch, which everyone enjoyed, and the noon hour of fellowship, we convened at 1:00 P.M. We had a song, "Victory In Jesus," directed by Bro. Mike Foster. Prayer was by Rev. Milton Gann.

The afternoon devotion was brought by Rev. Ray Lewis. His subject was "Peace," using Isaiah 26:3 as his scripture text. Prayer was by the speaker.

The moderator called for a final report of the Credential Committee. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to take the report item by item for a vote.

The Ordination Service was held next. Bro. Tommy Dubose of the Liberty Free Will Baptist Church was ordained to preach the Gospel. Rev. Milton Gann delivered the Ordination Message, using Second Timothy 4:1-4, Titus 1:7-9, 2:11-15 as his scripture. The Ordination Charge was given by Rev. Dennis Kizzire, using Second Timothy 4:1-4 as his scripture. The Ordination Prayer was by Rev. Tom Scott. After the Ordination Service, the congregation was invited to come by and shake hands with Bro. Dubose and welcome him as a minister to the Vernon Association.

We had a very interesting report by Rev. Dennis Kizzire on the activities of the summer youth camp. M.S.C.

The moderator called for a report of the Finance Committee. The report was given by Sister Martha Bynum, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and discharge the committee.

The Sunday School and C.T.S. report was given by Sister Jackie Atkinson, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to adopt the report and discharge the committee.

The moderator called for a report of the Deceased Members Committee. The report was given by Bro. Gary Sorrells, chairman. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to receive the report and have a moment of silent prayer and a song in memory of these loved ones. The congregation stood and sang, "Face To Face," and after a moment of silent prayer, Rev. Edward Puckett led in prayer.

We had a report of the Appreciation Committee by Sister Elwanda Oakes, chairman. We had a motion, second and vote carried to receive the report and give Springfield Free Will Baptist Church a rising vote of appreciation for their fine hospitality.

The moderator called for a final report of the General Board. We had a motion, second, and vote carried to take up the items of the report that were tabled in the morning session. The report was given by the clerk, Bro. Raphael Yerby. The report was voted on item by item. Item number three (3) and item number five (5) were defeated by a majority vote. Item number four (4) was adopted.

Next we had a report of information by Rev. Milton Gann, a member of the State General Board, on the ministry of the Free Will Baptist Children's Home and some decisions that may be made at the State Associational meeting this year.

The moderator called for the election of one member to serve a three (3) year term on the Board of Christian Education. Bro. James Dunbar was elected to serve on the Board.

The moderator called for the election of one member to serve a three (3) year term on the Youth Camp Board of Directors. Rev. Dennis Kizzire was elected to serve on the board.

Next we had an election of one member to serve out the two (2) year unexpired term of Rev. Walter D. Jaggers on the Youth Camp Board of Directors. Rev. Edward Puckett was elected to serve this position.

At this time the moderator appointed Bro. Bobby Joe Black to serve a five (5) year term on the Credential Committee. The moderator also appointed Rev. Dennis Kizzire to fill out the unexpired term of Rev. Roy Barnes on the Credential Committee.

We had a motion, second, and vote carried to feature a picture of Rev. Roy Barnes and some of his ministry in this association in the minutes this year.

Next, a place was chosen for the next setting of the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association. The First Free Will Baptist Church of Vernon requested, in their letter, the next meeting of the association. The body voted to hold the 1982 session of the association at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Vernon. The meeting will be held on October 16, 1982.

SUNDAY SCHOOL AND C.T.S. COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Sunday School and C.T.S. Committee submit the following report:

Our Sunday School enrollment is 1405 with an average attendance of 1141. We show a decrease in enrollment of 20 members but an increase of 23 in attendance.

Our C.T.S. enrollment is 685 with an average attendance of 599. Six churches in our association do not have a C.T.S., but all churches reporting have a Sunday School. Our C.T.S. enrollment is down by 44 members and our average attendance is also down by 39.

We rejoice that our attendance in Sunday School is growing, but we need to impress upon our people the need for good attendance in C.T.S. As the name implies, it is a Church Training Program and is not only for young people but for people of all ages.

CONSTITUTION

- 1. This association shall be known as the Vernon Free Will Baptist Association of Alabama being composed of ministers, deacons and delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote onall questions which come from before the association. Each church being entitled to three delegates for the first 50 members and one additional delegate for each 25 members or fraction thereof, in addition to ministers and deacons.
- 2. This body shall be considered an advisory council having no authority over the internal affairs of the church unless they depart from the Treaties of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists. In this event it will be investigated by the Credential Committee and their findings will be reported to the association for their action. This association shall have authority over all ministers in the mater of doctrine, character, etc. In case any minister in this association depart from and teach doctrine not in keeping with the Treaties of Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptist the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper according to the teachings of the Bible.
- 3. When a church desires one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it will be the responsibility of the local church to license the member and late the request the association to ordain the member. The examination for license should refer to piety, doctrine, and convictions respecting the work of the ministry and reputation for character and ability of the candidate. The examination or ordination should include all that is required for license and also the application for ministers approved by the National Association of Free Will Baptist. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who has more than one living wife, or whose wife has more than one living husband. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this association as a preacher who uses tobacco in any form.
- 4. All questions of doctrine and general interest shall be settled by a majority vote of the association and the decision shall be final.

- 5. The officers of the association shall be moderator, assistant moderator and clerk-treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by majority vote of the delegates present. The officers shall be chosen at the close of each session to take office at the close of that session with the outgoing clerk being responsible for the printing and distribution of the minutes. The clerk shall have the authority to secure any necessary assistance he needs, at his own expense.
- 6. The association shall meet annually on Saturday before the third Sunday in October each year and shall not adjourn finally unitl all business matters be transacted.
- 7. Churches wishing to become members of this association must adopt its Articles of Faith and conform to its usuage.
- 8. We agree as churches of this association to use our best influence to promote the interest of all moral and benevolent institutions such as Temperance cause, Sunday School, Missionary Work, etc.
- 9.(a.) No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator for more than two consecutive sessions unless no other member be competent to serve in that capacity.
- 9.(b.) No member of this association shall be eligible to serve as moderator of the association until he has been a member of the association for at least two (2) years.
- 10. Any member of this association who shall be guilty of circulating reports of any nature of aiding in circulating any report that is untrue on a brother minister, that is circulated to injure his moral reputation and religious influence, the same shall be dealt with by the association. Any minister of this association who is known to be guilty of using intoxicating spirits by drinking as a beverage which is calculated to destroy his influence and usefulness the same shall be dealt with by the association as it may deem proper, according to the teaching of the Bible.
- 11. The association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present and any church or delegate failing or refusing to do so is and shall be considered to be a party to the enforcement of the same.
- 12. The moderator shall receive \$50.00, the assistant moderator \$25.00, and the clerk \$75.00 for their services.

- 13. The clerk shall superintend the printing of the minutes after each session of the association and shall have them out to the churches within 90 days after the associational meeting.
- 14. The moderator shall appoint a Credential Committee, consisting of five (5) persons with the senior member in point of service being replaced each year. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all members who become a part of this body either by ordination or by letter. Any item of business pertaining to ministers or the conduct of ministers must originate with this committee. This committee shall consist of three (3) ministers and two (2) laymen.
- 15 (a). The association shall have a General Board, which shall consist of the moderator, assistant moderator, and clerk along with one person from each church. Each person from the local church shall serve two years, with one-half being elected each year as specified in the printed minutes. When this association is not in session this board shall have power to act as a body, but such action must be reported to the association.
- 15 (b). The association shall have an Executive Committee, consisting of the moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, and four (4) members from the General Board.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The association shall be called to order and presided over by the officers elected at the last session.
- 2. The moderator shall appoint a Committee on Committees, whose duty is to appoint various committees at each session. Each committee is to consist of from 3 to 5 members.
- 3. The moderator calls for the report of the Digest Committee and a roll call of the delegates. After a reading of the report, the delegates are enrolled by the clerk, at the discreton of the body.
- 4. The Credential Committee shall recommend the issuance, or rejection of a card of good standing for a ministers. If a minister misses one association meeting, unless providentially hindered, he will not be given a card of good standing. The final decision to be made by the body. It shall be the responsibility of this committee to examine all ministers who become a part of this body, either by ordination or by letter. The Credential Committee, in a special called session, shall have

shall have the authority to grant letters to ministers leaving our association, provided they are a member of a church in our association, reporting their action to the annual association meeting.

- 5. The moderator shall not be entitled to vote except in case of a tie and then he shall cast the deciding vote. He shall be entitled to speak on any question, after others have spoken, provided he shall appoint someone to the chair while he is speaking.
- 6. Only one person shall speak at a time and he shall rise and address the moderator and after recognition by the moderator shall proceed.
- 7. No person shall be interrupted while speaking unless he depart from the subject under discussion or use words of personal reflection.
- 8. No person shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject without the permission of the moderator nor more than five minutes.
 - 9. No person shall laugh or talk during discussion.
- 10. No delegate shall absent himself from the association without the permission of the moderator.
- 11.[a] All ordination of ministers shall be done at the association while in regular annual session, by the Ordaining Council.
- 11.[b] The General Board of the association shall have authority to authorize the Credential Committee to ordain ministers, between sessions of the association, who have been licensed by a local church and who has been accepted as pastor in a Free Will Baptist Church before his one year of license has expired.
- 12. No person shall be ordained by this association as a preacher unless he has been licensed by his local church for at least one year, or recommended for ordination by the Credential Committee.
- 13. The Vernon Free Will Baptist Associational year shall begin on the first day of September and end on the last day of August each year and hold the annual meeting on Saturday before the third Sunday in October of each year.
- 14. The Executive Committee shall secure a speaker for the 11:00 o'clock message and plan the program for each annual session of the association.

15. The Youth Camp Committee shall meet within 60 days after the associational meeting to select a Camp Director and a Treasurer of the Youth Camp and make plans for the summer camp. All pastors of the Vernon Association shall be on the Youth Camp Committee and will make up the committee.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Bible. The Scripture of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preservor, and Righteous Governor of the universe and in the Scripture as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our present Savior and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- 5. The Government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided, for all the highest welfare of men.
- 6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. The Works of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life sufferings, death and resurrection effected all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or unreserved commital of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the

domination of sin, and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

- 9.Election. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ all men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of Will. The human will is free and self-controlled having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. Salvation Free. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. Preseverance. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, having promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. Gospel Ordinances. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water and the LORD'S SUPPER are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEET WASHING is an ordinance teaching humility of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- 14. Tithing. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him in store as God has prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2).
- 15. The Lord's Day. The devine law requires that one day in seven by set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities and for personal communion with God.
- 16. Resurrection, Judgement, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but righteous into eternal life."
