MINUTES

FIRST DAY-MORNING SESSION

This, the Thirty-sixth Annual Session of the Water Valley Free Will Baptist Association, of Mississippi, met with Bethlehem Church, on Friday and Saturday, the 7th and 8th days of September, 1934.

The opening lesson was read from the 8th chapter of Romans, by Eld. J. H. Norwood, and prayer, by Eld. H. B. Rogers. The Moderator called for letters from the churches, and the following were handed in and the Clerk read them: Bethlehem, Antioch, Stetson Chapel, Springdale, New Life, Pleasant Grove and Gauley.

CONSTITUTION OF THE WATER VALLEY FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

1. This Association shall be known as the Water Valley Free Will Baptist Association of Mississippi, and shall be composed of delegates from different churches forming the same, each church being entitled to three delegates and their ministers, clerks, deacons and treasurer.

2. Each church in this Association shall be an advisory body and shall control its own internal affairs.

3. This body shall be an advisory council but having no authority over the churches.

4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be chosen at each session by a majority of votes.

5. This Association shall meet annually on Friday at 8 o'clock A. M., before the second Sunday in September of each year, and hold together until Saturday night and have communion and feet washing on Friday night of each session.

6. Churches wishing to become members of this Association must adopt the Articles of Faith and this Constitution, and conform to its usage.

7. We agree, as churches of this Free Will Baptist Association, to use our best influence to promote the cause of Christ.

8. The minutes of this Association shall be the order of the business.

9. The Moderator of this Association, at each annual session, shall read the Articles of Faith in the minutes to the Association when convened.

10. The Treasurer of this Association is to collect from the delegates of each church at the annual session and report to this body the first day of its meeting, ten cents per capita membership fee for

each church.

11. Each member of this Association, at each session, must remain until the Association adjourns.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF THE WATER VALLEY FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

1. THE BIBLE—The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were given by the inspiration of God, and the Scripture of the New Testament is our infallible rule of faith and practice.—I Cor. 1-21; Matt. 28:19-20; Rom. 1-16.

2. GOD—There is one true and living God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son. and Holy Spirit, and yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.—Isa. 40-28; I Cor. 8-6.

3. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh. In His divine nature, truly God; in His human nature, truly man; the mediator between God and man. Once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.—Heb. 2-9; I Jno. 3-16; I Tim. 2:5-6.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT—The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.—I Jno. 16:7-8; Acts 2-4; Eph. 2-1; Eph. 4:4-6.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD—God exercises a wise and benevolent Providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of man requires—Judge 1-3; I Tim. 2:1-8; I Tim. 4-16; Gal. 1-8.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation; his posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.— Gen. 2-17; Gen. 3-19.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection, effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith. —Acts 3-19; Matt. 28:19-20; Eph. 2:5-10; Luke 14:16-20.

8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION—The conditions of Salvation are repentance, or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. Faith, or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose and love to obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin. and becomes a child of God, continuing in faith and obedience until death.—Luke 13-3; Acts 17-30; Rom. 10-10.

9. ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salavation, hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.—Matt. 28-20; I Cor. 1-21; Matt. 25:31-46.

10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL—The human will is free and self-

controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.—Tit. 2 ch.; Rev. 2:10-15. 11. SALVATION FREE-God desires the salvation of all; the Gospel invites all; the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will, may "come and take the water of life freely."-Cal. 1 ch. 13 to 14; Rev. 22-17.

12. DIVINE ORDINANCE—Baptism or the immersion of believers in water, and night communion and feet washing are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel of universal obligation, and are to be administered to all true believers.—Acts 8 ch.; 1st Tim. 5-10; Luke 22-49-20; St. John 13 ch.

13. PERSEVERANCE—All believers in Christ, who through grace, perservere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of a Crown of Life.—Rom. 6 ch. 18 to 22; Rom. 5 to 21.

14. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employment and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities and for personal communion with God.-Duet. 5:12-14; Heb. 4-4.

RESURRECTION AND FINAL RETRIBUTION—The Scrip-15. tures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done ill, unto the resurrection of judgment; then the wicked "will go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous unto eternal life."-St. Jno. 5:28-29; II Cor. 5-10; I Cor. 15:4-53.
