REPORTS

TEMPERANCE

The word Temperance is mentioned only four times in the Bible. Twice in Acts 24:25, once in Gal. 5:23, once in II Peter 1:16. The word Temperance. an adjective describing temperance, is mentioned three times: in I Cor. 9:25, Titus 1:8, and 2:2.

Translated from the Greek word "EGKRATEIA", temperance in it's full meaning, means self-controlled and and/or self-rest-rained. It is the urging and prayer of this committee that all Free Will Baptists and Christians everywher be concerned with their witness of Jesus Christ to the extent that to the fullest of their human capacity, they will practice temperance, a fruit of the Spirit, that Jesus be glorified before men in each of their lives.

- Temperance, self-control, self-restraint) a "fruit of the Spirit" should be evident or manifest in the Christians life in the following things; (There are only a few, there are many others).
- 1 Diligence II Pet. 1:10—Wherefore the rather, brethern, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fail. God's people should be diligent in worship, work witness, study and prayer. We should be more diligent and not less diligent in the things of God, than in the things of this life.
- 2. Indebtedness Rom. 13:8— Owe no man anything, but to love one another. A non-paying indebted Christian, who buys or tries to live beyond their means is an abominable witness for Christ.
 - 3. Secret Sins Rom. 12:7— Provide things honest in the sight of

all men. Anything in yourlife that you have to hide, will sooner or later be brought to light and be subject to destroy you or others who are looking to you for leading to Christ. Confess your sins (I John 1:19, James 5:16) and do not mislead others or yourself by a life full of Lidden evil.

- 4. Alchol. II Cor. 6:17118— Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, said the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty. Any one under the influence of alchol even in the least cannot truthfully say that they are completely self1controlled. The effect o alchol is to eliminate inhibitions and absure morality. Total abstinence is Temperance when dealing with alchol.
- 5. Truth John 14:6— Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life; no man cometh unto the Father, but by me. Be truthful in all dealings with a fellow man. There is nothing that man hates in hs dealings with others more than a liar, and even though he is a liar himself, he doesn'twant others to lie to him. One of the quickest and easiest ways to bring shame to our Savior is to tell a lie! Sooner or later ,the truth will be known. Be very truthful in your vows and promises. Ecclesiastes 5:5 says Better is it that thou shouldet not vow, than that thou shouldest vow and not pay it. A promise to God should hold precedence over all else in your life.
