Report of Home Missions Board 9-1-71 to 1-31-72

- <u>Activity</u>: A meeting 9-11-71 (West Florida Association Meeting) Members present were, Robert Owens, Harlie Dockens, B. Mathews - met with Pastors E. Carroll, W. Compton and Bro. Wiggins to discuss Bro. Wiggins resignation from the Crestview Mission. Bro. Wiggins agreed to stay until God sent replacement or indicated otherwise. Churches to send family to visit each Sunday. Bro. Wiggins to call next meeting 10/11/71.
 - B. 10/11/71 Met at New Home Church Bro. Parham, Bro. Owens, Bro. Dockens Bro. M. Carroll and Bro. Mathews of board present. Bro. R. C. Wiggins present, tendered his immediate resignation. Board decided to place mission up for sale since a full time missionary was unavailable and the association could not finance such at present. Bro. Dockens and Bro. Mathews to go to Crestview next week and notify Bro. Cook. If God sends help before sale of property completed, then property to be withdrawn from sale.
 - C. 10/21/71 Bro. Dockens and Bro. Mathews met with Bro. Cook in Crestview. Discussed closing mission and selling property. Bro. Cook asked for more time, said he would keep it open. Decision made to keep mission open until Dec. 31st, 1971. If man for mission not secured and progress not made by then Bro. Cook would also be in accord and the mission would be sold. Bro. Dockens to visit.
 - D. 1/24/71 Received call from Bro. Cook and written report on 1/31/72 stating that a family named Carr had moved to area and had begun to work in the church, Church outlook much improved. Eighteen in Sunday School 1/23/72 and twenty-one in church. Bro. Cook requested Association preachers to come and preach for the church and help.

Report of Home Missions Board 2/1/72 - 8/31/72

1. Activity - No board meetings during this period.

- A. The following men, ministers and laymen volunteered to serve in the pulpit of Crestview Free Will Baptist Church on the appointed Sundays. R. Bartley, L. Bass, E. Carroll, H. Dockens, B. Mathews, J. Parham, R. Reddick, J. Wallis, and R.C.Wiggins. These men filled their appointments and have been re-scheduled to cover need for remaineder of this year. Additional men appointed are: J.C. Dortch, Wayne Hartzog,(lst Free Will Baptist Church of Chipley, formerly member of Bethel Church) and B. Eutcher, who recently moved into area from Arizona and is a member of Beulah Church.
- B. Commendation Those of the Home Mission Board and the men who filled the pulpit there (in the HMB Secretary's opinion) will concur in that Bro. Douglas Carr, layman of Crestview Church, is due our commendations for his consistent and tireless efforts, his enthusiasm, support, and promotion of his church as it's leader, in the absence of Bro. - 1. Since the 3rd week of July, following an operation Bro. James Cook has been unconscious in hospital bed. He is presently in the specialty care center of Baptist Hospital, Pensacola. Pray for his family.

Constitution & By-Laws of the West Florida Association of Free Will Baptist

Article 1. NAME:

This association shall be known as the West Florida Free Will Baptist Association.

Article 2. MEMBERSHIP:

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of such regularly organized and well discipline Free Will Baptist churches conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Section 11. Any church regularly organized, may be petition by delegation become members of this association provided they will adhere to Free Will Baptist Doctrine and fully support the benevolent and educational enterprises of the denomination.

Section 111. Churches from other Free Will Baptist Associations desiring membership must present a letter of recommendation from the association of which they were previously a member.

Article 3. OFFICERS:

Officers shall be composed of Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Ordaining Council. Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk Assistant Clerk and Treasurer to be elected annually.

Article 4. REPRESENTATION:

Section 1. Each church of this association shall be entitled to one vote and one vote for each additional twenty-five members or fraction thereof. Section 11. All churches of this Association to be represented at the regularly scheduled meetings by delegates and letter, to conduct the business of the association affecting the churches and the association. Section 111. All ordained ministers and deacons in good standing with the association and West Florida Associational officers shall serve as standing delegates.

Article 5. ORDAINING COUNCIL (Presbytery)

Section 1. This council shall be composed of five members, elected by the association to serve a period of two years each. The Moderator is also automatically a member of the Council and the vice-moderator is authorized to sit on the Council when it convenes if the moderator is absent. Section 11. The purpose of the Council is to license and ordain candidates after due examination as to their qualifications and to try all ordained members for un-christian conduct or the teaching of doctrine contrary to the Free Will Baptist faith. This council to convene upon request of any church of this association.

Article 6. BOARDS & COMMITTEES:

Section 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members except the Executive Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each church. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the Executive Board, shall be elected as follows; the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession of office thereafter shall be determined as order requires. Section 11. The Moderator and Asst. Moderator will have the priviledge to set on Executive Board Meetings or to moderate the meeting.

Section 111. The Executive Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the Association from one regular session to another, and shall have the power to elect such officers, except the moderator, as may be necessary for it's own government and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the association. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of the association.



BOARDS (cont'd)

Section IV. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in this respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the association. Section V. This Association shall have a Mission Board consisting of five members elected by the West Florida Association. This board shall have a constitution and by-laws approved by this association.

Article 7 MEETINGS:

Scheduled associational meetings will be as follows: The Associational Yearly Meeting will be held the second Saturday in September. The mid-yearly meeting will be held the first Saturday in February, at places designated by the body.

Article 8 FINANCES:

Section 1. Each church of the association shall be responsible for sharing the financial obligations of the association by paying into the treasury the tithe (10%) of their income.

Section 11. An additional fee of \$10.00 at the mid-yearly meeting will be assessed and a \$20.00 fee for churches with membership over 50, or a \$15.00 fee for churches of membership under 50 at the yearly meeting.

Section 111. Total cooperative income of the West Florida Association will be disbursed by a finance committee and approved by the body. The Finance Committee shall consist of the Executive Board. Moderator, clerk and treasurer to be present at Executive Board Heetings concerning finances.

Section IV. A sum of S25.00 shall be paid annually to the moderator, clerk and treasurer to cover expenses incurred in the line of duty to the association during the year. In event expenses exceed this figure or any other member or officers of the association is appointed a duty in which expenses are incurred, the body may take a vote to reimburse them.

Article 9 DISCIPLINE:

Section 1. This association shall have power to sidcipline churches of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if they practice doctrine contrary to bible principles & standards & those of the Free Will Baptist Treatise. Section 11. This association shall not have the right to reverse the decision of the individual church nor to interfere with its internal regulations. Section 111. All churches of this association shall call as their pastors only duly licensed or ordained Free Will Eaptist ministers.

Section IV. All ministers entering this association from another denomination or seeking ordination shall walk before this association one year before being fully and officially accepted or ordained into the associational ministry. All ministers coming into the association from another Free Will Baptist Association shall be re-examined by the Ordaining Council & shall be required to bring a letter of recommendation from the association in which they served.

Article 10. BY-LAWS:

This association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulations of its session.

Article 11. AM-ENDIENTS:

This constitution may be altered or ammended by the vote of the association at any regular session; notice of such intended alterations of ammendments having been given in writing and recorded at the previous session.

Article 12. QUORUM:

Representatives from two (2) member churches shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business of the association, at scheduled meetings.
