Home Missions Board Report - February

- At the yearly Association meeting the body voted \$1700.00 to the West Florida Youth Camp Project. Check for that amount mailed to Bro. Dockens who presented it to Bro. Hutchinson, youth camp board member.
- Bro. Dockens called that Crestview church desired to borrow \$5000.00 to build sanctuary. HMB members agreed.
- 3. Bro. A. D. Carr, now pastor of Crestview church, notified HMB that schedule visiting Associational ministers no longer needed.
- 4. Bro. Carr, by phone, agreed the church to sign a second mortgage to HMB for amount owed and deeds signed to Crestview church, notifying the Episcopal Diocese of the new duly organized autonomous church's responsibility to them and for the insurance. Episcopal Diocese holds first mortgage.
- 5. Crestview church officers: A.D. Carr, Pastor; Danny Cook, Trustee; Frank E. Lavender, Trustee-Treasurer; Thomas Ward, Deacon.
- 6. Notified Bro. Dockens of Crestview's indebtedness and the new inter-

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est to be paid, he to contact Bro. Carr and notify results.

- 7. Mailed check for \$5000.00 to Crestview church, received receipt.
- 8. Bro. Dockens visited Crestview church and reported their desire to pay only interest on loan until able to pay on principal also. HMB agreed temporarily pending Association's approval.
- 9. Sent Bro. Carr the following information: Balance on first note as of 11/21/73 \$2072.46 Additional loan <u>5000.00</u> Interest-424.35 per year Total \$7072.46 Interest per mo.\$35.36

Home Missions Board Report - September

1. There has been no Board activity during this period.

The Board Chairman notified the Treasurer that Crestview's Pastor requested that the church be permitted presently to pay only the interest on their loan from the Association. Later the pastor of Crestview told the treasurer that they were not at this time able

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to pay that and so the issue has not been pressed further and no payments have been made since December of 1073. The amount of the note stands at \$7072.46. Also due to the discussion reported to Treasurer that happened at the February Association meeting, no second mortgage forms have been sent for signature.

II. The treasurer, at Bro. Carr's request, sought advice of local attorney in regard to the nearness of a liquor establishment to the church. After much delay, report was sent to Bro. Carr that according to Florida Statutes 561.44, the cities of the state were the ones to determine by ordinance the distance between churches and bars. The advice was to check the city ordinances and make protest there.

III. Financial:

Association check of \$186.70 was deposited in Mutual Federal on February 14th. Balance there presently -- \$306.27 plus dividends, total \$313.10. Balance in checking account to date -- \$177.00 --First American Bank.

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CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS OF THE WEST FLORIDA HOME MISSION BOARD OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

CONSTITUTION

Article 1. Name:

This board shall be known as The West Florida Home Mission Board of Free Will Baptists.

Article 2. Purpose:

The purpose of this board shall be that of promoting mission work among Free Will Baptists in the West Florida Association.

Article 3. Membership:

This board shall be composed of members elected by the West Florida Association and shall serve terms established on a rotational basis; one member's term shall expire annually. The number of members of this board shall be determined by the constitution & by-laws of the West Florida Association.

Article 4. Officers:

Officers of the board shall be: A Chairman, A Vice-Chairman and a Secretary-Treasurer. These officers shall hold office for one (1) year and may be elected to serve succeeding terms. Memebers of the board shall elect the officers of the board.

Article 5. Meetings:

Meetings shall be held as the need arises. Necessary meetings may be called by the Chairman or the Secretary-Treasurer. Mileage for board members expenses shall be paid from the general fund limited to 10¢ per mile one way.

Article 6. Reports:

A complete report of the board meetings and activities and a complete financial report must be presented to the annual West Florida Associational Meeting.

Article 7. Finances:

This board shall receive it's finances from churches and individuals making special contributions, cooperative program allocations, interest on loans, and special offerings received through promoting missions.

Article 8. Miscellaneous:

Section I. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board must be Free Will Baptists which prove themselves sound in doctrine and practices as Free Will Baptists.

Section II. Missions and churches receiving financial support from this board shall consider this board as an advisory body in such matters as the selection of a pastor and further financial obligations.

Section III. Any work receiving financial support must aggree to support the denominational cooperative program.

Section IV. Any work receiving financial support must accept such as a loan on terms and conditions agreed upon by them and the board as set

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forth in this constitution and such information shall be made available to them and fully understood by those receiving the support. Section V. Proper security must be granted the board for loans received. First mortgage is desired but second mortgage may be accepted; however no loan shall be granted in excess of the appraised value of the property. Interest shall be paid at the rate of 6% per annum. Monthly payments shall be paid at the rate of \$10.00 per \$1,000.00 loaned. Section VI. Missions or churches receiving financial support must be in good standing with the West Florida Association & must have a pastor who is in good standing with the West Florida Free Will Baptist Assoc. Section VII. An agreement must be understood between the borrower and the board that in the event financial obligations cannot be met, rights to the property must be relinquished, said rights shall be turned over to the Mission Board and the decision of the board in regards to the property shall be final.

Section VIII. Contracts shall be considered delinquent when three(3) successive payments have not been met. It shall be determined by the board if contracts may be held valid and open for a longer period of time.

Section IX. The board shall have the right by majority vote to purchase property in desirable locations when there is good potential for organizing a Free Will Baptist Church. This action shall of necessity be subject to the availability of funds. In such matters full title must be acquired and no investment shall exceed the appraised value of property. Organizational work under such conditions shall be under complete supervision of the Mission Board.

BY-LAWS

Article 1. Duties of Officers:

Officers of the Mission Board shall hold office according to the terms set forth in the constitution and shall carry out those duties peculiar to their respective offices. The secretary-treasurer shall maintain a permanent record of the board's activities and financial transactions. All records and property mortgages and titles shall be surrendered to the succeeding secretary-treasurer.

Article 2. Voting and Quorum:

A majority membership shall constitute a quorum and be duly authorized to transact business. All items of business must receive a majority vote of board members before it is considered final. All members not present in meeting shall be notified of decisions made by the board.

Article 3. Duties of Members:

All members shall endeavor to support mission work through cooperative efforts of the board. Any member that fails to cooperate with the board for a period of one year may, upon recommendation of the board, be replaced by the West Florida Association.

Article 4. Amendments:

This constitution and by-laws may be amended by a majority vote of the board members and final approval of the West Florida Association.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE WEST FLORIDA ASSOCIATION OF THE FREE WILL BAPTIST

<u>Article 1</u>. NAME: This association shall be known as the West Florida Free Will Baptist Association.

Article 2. MEMBERSHIP:

Section 1. This association shall be composed of such regularly organized and well discipline Free Will Baptist Churches conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution. Section 11. Any church regularly organized, may be petitioned by delegation become members of this association provided they will adhere to Free Will Baptist Doctrine and fully support the benevolent and educational enterprises of the denomination. Section 111. Churches from other Free Will Baptist Associations desiring membership must present a letter of recommendation from the association of which they were previously a member.

Article 3. OFFICERS:

Officers shall be composed of Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer and Ordaining Council. Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk Asst. Clerk & Treasurer to be elected annually.

Article 4. REPRESENTATION:

Section 1. Each church of this association shall be entitled to one vote and one vote for each additional twenty-five members or fraction thereof.

Section 11. All churches of this Association to be represented at the regularly scheduled meetings by delegates and letter, to conduct the business of the association affecting the churches and the association. Section 111. All ordained ministers and deacons in good standing with the association and West Florida Associational officers shall serve as standing delegates.

Article 5. ORDAINING COUNCIL (Presbytery)

Section 1. This council shall be composed of five members, elected by the association to serve a period of two years each. The moderator is also automatically a member of the Council and the vice-moderator is authorized to sit on the Council when it convenes if the moderator is absent.

Section 11. The purpose of the Council is to license and ordain candidates after due examination as to their qualifications and to try all ordained members for un-christian conduct or the teaching of doctrine contrary of the Free Will Baptist faith. This council to convene upon request of any church of this association.

Article 6. BOARDS & COMITTEES:

Section 1. All standing boards shall be composed of three members except the Executive Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each church. The personnel of each of the foregoing, exclusive of the Executive Board, shall be elected as follows; the first named for a period of one year, the second named for a period of two years, and the third named for a period of three years. Succession of office thereafter

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shall be determined as order requires.

Section 11. The Moderator and Asst. Moderator will have the privilege to set on Executive Board Meetings or to moderate the meeting. Section 111. The Executive Board shall have the power to act in behalf of and for the Association from one regular session to another, and shall have the power to elect such officers, except the moderator, as may be necessary for it's own government and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the association. It shall be the duty of the Executive Board to make written reports of all its work to each annual session of the Association.

Section IV. The duties of the various standing boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in this respective fields. They shall organize them selves and regulate their work as may become necessary and as may be found in harmony with the principles & tinets of the assoc. Section V. This Association shall have a Mission Board consisting of five members elected by the West Florida Association. This board shall have a constitution and by-laws approved by this association.

Article 7. MEETINGS:

CALIFORNIA CONTRACTOR

Scheduled associational meetings will be as follows: The Associational Meeting will be held the second Saturday in September. The mid-yearly meeting will be held the first Saturday in February, at a place designated by the body.

Article 8. FINANCES:

Section 1. Each church of the association shall be responsible for sharing the financial obligation of the association by paying into the treasury the tithe (10%) of their income.

Section 11. An additional fee of \$10.00 at the mid-yearly meeting will be assessed and a \$20.00 fee for churches over 50, or a \$15.00 fee for churches of membership under 50 at the yearly meeting.

Section 111. Total cooperative income of the West Florida Association will be disbursed by a finance committee and approved by the body. The Finance Committee shall consist of the Executive Board. Moderator, clerk and treasurer to be present at Executive Board Meetings concerning finances.

Section IV. A sum of \$25.00 shall be paid annually to the moderator, clerk and treasurer to cover expenses incurred in the line of duty to the association during the year. In event expenses exceed this figure or any other member or officer of the association is appointed a duty in which expenses are incurred, the body may take a vote to reimburse them.

Article 9. DISCIPLINE:

Section 1. This association shall have power to discipline churches of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if they practice doctrine contrary to Bible principles & standards to those of the Free Will Baptist Treatise.

Section 11. This association shall not have the right to reverse the decision of the individual church nor to interfere with its internal regulartions.

Section 111. All churches of this association shall call as their pas-



tors only duly licensed or ordained Free Will Baptist ministers. Section IV. All ministers entering this association from another denomination or seeking ordination shall walk before this association one year before being fully and officially accepted or ordained into the associational ministry. All ministers coming into the association from another Free Will Baptist Association shall be re-examined by the Ordaining Council and shall be required to bring a letter of recommendation from the association in which they served.

Article 10. BY-LAWS:

This association shall have power to adopt any regulations or by-laws, not inconsistent with this association's constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulations of its session.

Article 11. AMENDMENTS:

This constitution may be altered or ammended by the vote at the association at any regular session; notice of such intended alternations of ammendments having been given in writing and recorded the previous session.

Article 12. QUORUM:

Representatives from two (2) member churches shall constitute a quorum for transaction of business of the association, at scheduled meetings.
