REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Whereas, Tobacco using in any form is a poisonous, injurious and expensive habit, we urge, as a duty we owe ourselves and children, that all Freewill Baptists try to bring up our children without this habit fastened on them.

2nd. Whereas, Our temperance brethren of Escambia County have, just tried to stop the sale of strong drink in their midst and failed. And, whereas; our last legislature has just failed by a close vote to give us State-wide prohibition. And, whereas; it is reported that

the whiskey people have threatened to spend a half million dollars to defeat prohibitionist candidates to our next legislature. Therefore, be it:

Resolved, That we rise up as one man and support men who will go to our legislature and do for us what the last legislature of our sister State, Alabama, has done for that commonwealth—stop the sale of strong drink, the devil's weapon.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

ASSOCIATIONAL DECORUM

- 1. The Association shall be composed only of churches in good standing, and shall be called together by the Moderator of the last session if present.
 - 2. The Association shall be opened and closed by prayer.
- 3. The Moderator and Clerk of the last session shall officiate until another Moderator and Clerk are elected.
- 4. It is the duty of the Moderator to receive and submit all motions to the body, and see that order is preserved.
- 5. The Moderator and Clerk shall be elected by nomination and acclamation at each session of the Association.
- 6. This Association shall have a Treasurer and Executive Committee to be elected every two years.
- 7. No church will be considered in good standing that retains any member or minister who is known to practice hypnotism.
- 8. That no member shall be considered in good standing that officiates in the rites of matrimony where either of parties have divorced except for fornication.
- 9. No church shall retain a minister or deacon who drinks or deals intoxicating beverages.
- 10. That no church shall be considered in good order that does not commune and wash feet at least one time a year, and, further, that each church be required to state in their corresponding letters as to whether this ordinance has been kept or not.

CHURCH DECORUM

- 1. The church may choose a pastor annually at last conference in Association year, or if they prefer, may choose a pastor for an indefinite length of time to continue from year to year so long as he may deem it proper to keep up the connection.
- 2. When it becomes necessary a pastor may be chosen at any other time, but if the choice be made at a special Conference, the time must be appointed at a monthly meeting of the church.
- 3. The pastor shall be moderator of church, but when he is absent, or does not sit as moderator, being present, some suitable brother shall be appointed in his place.
- 4 There shall be two or more deacons in the church whose duty it shall be to superintend the collection and disbursement of all contributions made for pastor, etc, and to distribute the bread and wine in the administration of the Lord's Supper.
- 5. The deacons shall also take notice of such members as refuse or neglect to partake of the Lord's Super, and endeavor to ascertain the cause, that the same may be laid before the church conference if necessary.
 - 6. Some suitable member shall be appointed clerk, and it shall

be his duty to do all the recording and other writing pertaining to the business of the church and to preserve a file of the minutes of the Association.

- 7. When a clerk is appointed, all the books, minutes, etc., belonging to the clerk shall be immediately turned over to him by his predecessor.
- 8. When it becomes necessary, a committee of no less than three male members, well acquainted with business, shall be appointed, whose duty it shall be to give advice to brethren who apply to them relative to cases of dealing, etc., with the church.
- 9. The church shall hold a two days meeting embracing Saturday and the Lord's Day following, the first of which shall be the regular time for conference.
- 10. It shall be the duty of every member, male and female, to attend each conference, if they can, for on that day the pastor is expected to instruct the church in a special manner by giving plain and pointed lessons on doctrine, discipline and rules of holy living.
- 11. Any male member who shall fail to attend three successive conferences, and any member who may be generally remiss in attending meetings of the church, according to the covenant (Article 10), shall be cited to appear in conference, and answer for his conduct, but the church may exempt members from this if necessary.
- 12 Conference shall be opened as follows: First, prayer, unless divine service has just been concluded, and generally then; second, invite visiting brethren to seats with us; third, open the door for reception to members; fourth, call for absentees; fifth for acknowledgments; sixth, for references or deferred business; seventh, for matters of dealing which are in order to come before the church; eighth, for miscellaneous business.
- 13. Visiting brethren called in as help from other churches shall be allowed to vote.
- 14. An ordinary member of the Baptist church which does not hold this church in fellowship, may be received into this church without a letter when it is made apparent that his christian character is unapproachable and that he has applied for a letter and could not obtain it because he wanted to join this or some sister church. All other persons must join by letter or baptism.
- 15 We receive members by experience and baptism; on confession of faith, by letter or restoration
- 16. When the moderator calls for absentees the clerk shall inform the church what male members have been absent from three successive conferences, and the moderator shall appoint some brother or brethren to cite each of them to the next conference.
- 17. No member shall be expelled unless he has been cited verbally, or in writing to attend his trial, provided his residence be known to the church.

- 18. When a witness, not a member of the church, is introduced, he shall not be examined until the question has been put to the church: "Will you hear the testimony of the witness?"
- 19. The evidence in every case of dealing and acknowledgement shall be minuted in the church book,
- 20. Members dismissed from the church by letter who become disorderly or continue to hold their letter without good reason shall be cited to conference to answer for their conduct.
- 21. Expelled members may be restored to fellowship on their petition, if their walk since expulsion has convinced the church that they have sincerely repented of their former evil.
- 22. A vote shall not be taken on any question without a move and second, and on all important questions the vote shall be taken by rising to the feet.
- 23. No motion shall be made while a move and a second is before the conference.
- 24. It shall be considered disorderly for a member to absent himself from conference when an important question is to be decided; but a member upon his request may be exempted by the church from voting on either side in peculiar cases.
- 25. No member shall leave the house during conference without a sufficient excuse, nor engage in conversation or whispering, without being subject to be called to order by the moderator.
- All discussion in conference must be conducted with calmness and good feeling. Those who speak must rise to their feet and keep to the point in debate.
- 27. No one shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission of the moderator, nor shall the remarks of any one be unreasonably long.
- 28. When the moderator speaks he must nominate some brother as moderator in his stead.
- 29. No one shall be interrupted while speaking unless it be necessary to call him to order.
- 30. We believe it to be the duty of the church to communicate, wash the saints' feet as often as the church sees fit, the expenses to be paid by the church.
- 31. Members not in good standing should not commune, but the administration should not be defeared on account of any ordinary matter of dealing.
- 32. Public fasting, humiliation and prayer shall be observed on proper occasions.
- 33 The Decorum may be altered or amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any two successive monthly conferences.

ARTICLES OF FAITH.

- 1. We believe there is but one living and true God, whose name is Jehovah, the maker and ruler of the universe.
- 2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and by whom salvation is made secure.
- 3. We believe that in the beginning, God made man upright and placed him in a state of holiness under the laws of his maker, but by a voluntary transgression of his own he fell from that holy and happy state.
- 4 We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for the lack of Christ.
- 5. We believe that the holy scriptures are the word of God and they are the only rule of faith an I practice.
- 6. We believe that sinners are drawn to God the Father by the Holy Ghost through Christ his son.
- 7. We believe that good workers are the fruits of faith and faith without works is dead.
- 8. We believe that the blessings of salvation are made free and attainable by all mankind.
- 9. We believe that Commemoration and Feet Washing are the ordinances af Christ, and immersion only is baptism.
- 10. We believe that all christians should unite in performing the sacrad ordinances.
- 11. That the end of the world is approaching when Christ will descend from Heaven and raise the dead from their graves to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place, the righteous being adjudged to everlasting happiness and the wicked to endless punishment, and this judgment will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness.
