REPORT OF COMMITTEES COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

Committee on Resolutions was read and received, as follows: First section was tabled.

Second section was received and read as follows: "That we hold an annual meeting to discuss or explain the different points of doctoring. We also urge that this meeting be held on the Fifth Sunday and that all Postors and Deacons attend when it possible and all others who will. We recommend that Article 21 be removed from the Decorum and the Resolution be substituted in its place. We recommend that the Decorum be printed annually, together with the Articles of Faith, in the minutes of the Association.

COMMITTEE ON AUXILIARIES

We find that the Churches are in better working condition, which have Leagues, Sunday Schools and Ladies Aides. These are the great arms of the Church and should be put into more churches We notice that the Churches are in better spiritual condition and have had more additions to them.

We find that out of 16 Churches, we have 6 Sunday Schools, with 294 scholars; 3 Leagues, with 165 pupils, and 2 Aides with 26 members.

We earnestly ask the Preachers and Deacons to encourage this work in the Churches, for they do not get along very well without some encouragement.

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CHURCH DECORUM

1. The church may choose a pastor annually at last conference in Association year, or, if they prefer, may choose a pastor for an indefinite length of time to continue from year to year as long as he may deem it proper to keep up the connection.

2. When it becomes necessary a pastor may be chosen at any other time, but if the choice be made at a special Conference, the time must be appointed at a monthly meeting of the church.

3. The pastor shall be Mcderator of church, but when the Moderator, being present, same is absent, or does not sit, a suitable brother shall be appointed in his place.

4. There shall be two or more deacons in the church whose duty it shall be to superintend the collection and distribution of all contributions made for pastor, etc., and to distribute the bread and wine in the administration of the Lord's Supper.

5. The deacons shall also take notice of such members as refuse or neglect to partake of the Lord's Supper, and endeavor to ascertain the cause, that the same may be laid before the church conference if necessary.

6. Some suitable member shall be appointed Clerk and it shall be his duty to do all the recording and other writing pertaining to the business of the church and preserve a file of the minutes of the Association.

7. When a clerk is appointed all the books, minutes, etc., belonging to the clerk shall be immediately turned over to him by his predecessor.

8. When it becomes necessary, a committee of notless than three male members, well acquainted with business, shall be appointed, whose duty it shall be to give advice to brethren who apply to them relative cases of dealing, etc., with the church.

9. The church shall hold two day's meeting embracing Saturday and the Lord's Day following, the first of which shall be the regular time for conference.

10. It shall be the duty of every member, male or female to attend each conference, if they can, for on that day the pastor is expected to instruct the church in a special manner by giving plain and pointed lessons on church doctrine, discipline and rules of holy living.

11. Any male member who shall fail to attend three successive conferences, and any member who may be generally remiss in at ending meetings of the church according to convenant [Article 10] shall be cited to appear in conference and answer for his conduct, but the church may exempt members from this if necessary.

12. Conference shall be opened as follows: First prayer, unless divine service has just been concluded, and generally then; Second, invite visiting brethren to seats with us; Third open the doors for reception to members; Fourth, call for absentees; Fifth, for acknowledgements; Sixth, for references or deferred business; Seventh, for matters of dealing which are in order to come before the church; Eight, for miscellaneous business.

13. Visiting brethren called in as help from other churches shall be allowed to vote.

14. An ordinary member of a Baptist church which does not hold this church in fellowship, may be received into this church without a letter when it is made apparent that his Christian character is unreproachable and that he has applied for a letter and could not obtain it because he wanted to join this or some sister church. All other persons must join by letter or baptism.

15. We receive members by experience or baptism; on confession of faith; by letter or restoration.

• 16. When the Moderator calls for absentees the Clerk

shall inform the church what male members have been absent from three successive conferences, and the Moderator shall appoint some brother or brethren to cite each of them the next conference.

17. No member shall be expelled unless he has been cited verbally or in writing to attend his trial, provided his residence be known to the church.

18. When a witness, not a member of the church, is introduced he shall not be examined until the question has been put to the church: "Will you hear the testimony of the witness?"

19. The evidence in every case of dealing and acknowledgement shall be printed in the church book.

20. Members dismissed from the church by the letter who become disorderly or continue to hold their letter without good reason shall be cited to conference to answer for their conduct.

21. Expelled members may be restored to fellowship

on their petition, if their walk since expulsion has convinced the church that they have sincerely repented of their former evil.

22. A vote shall not be taken on any question without a move and second, and on all important questions the vote shall be taken by rising to the feet.

23. No motion shall be made while a move and second is before the conference.

24. It shall be considered disorderly for a member to absent himself from conference when an important question is to be decided; but a member upon request may be exempted by the church from voting on either side in peculiar cases.

25. No member shall leave the house during conference without a sufficient excuse, nor engage in conversation or whispering, without being subjected to be called to

order by the Moderator.

26. All discussion in conference must be conducted with calmness and good feeling. Those who speak must rise to their feet and keep to the point in debate.

27. No one shall speak more than three times on the same subject without permission of the Morderator, nor shall the remarks on any one be unreasonably long.

28. When the Moderator speaks he must nominate some brother as Moderator in his stead.

29. No. one shall be interrupted while speaking unless it be necessary to call him to order.

30. We believe it to be the duty of the church to communicate, wash the saint's feet as often as the church sees fit, the expenses to be paid by the church.

31. Members not in good standing should not commune, but the adminstration should not be deferred on

account of any ordinary matter of dealing.

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32. Public fasting, humiliation and prayer shall be observed on proper occasions.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe there is but one living and true God, whose name is Jehovah, the maker and ruler of the uniyerse.—1st Cor. 8:6; 1st Tim. 2:5:6.

2. We believe that there is one Lord Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and by whom salvation is made secure -Heb. 2:9; St. John 3:16; 1st John 2:2.

3. We believe that in the beginning that God made man upright and placed him in a state of glory, without the least mixture of misery from which he voluntarily, by transgression fell, and 'by that means brought on himself, a miserable and mortal state, subject to death.—Genesis 2:17; 3:19. 4. We believe that no man shall suffer in hell for the lack of Christ.—Mark 16:15; Luke 24:47; 1st Tim. 2:4.

5. We believe that the holy scriptures are the word of God and they are the only rule of faith and practice.— Acts 17:30; Heb. 3:10; 1st John 5:10.

6. We believe that sinners are drawn to God, the Father, by the Holy Ghost through Jesus Christ, the Son. -2nd Tim. 3:16-17.

7. We believe that good works are the fruits of faith and faith without work is dead.—Luke 14:16; Math. 28:19; Luke 13:3.5; Acts 3:19 38; St. Mark 1:15,

8. We believe that the blessings of salvation are made free and attainable by all mankind.— Math. 11:27 30; St. John 6:44-65; Psalms 1:1; Titus 2:11-12.

9. We believe that Commemoration and Feet Washings are the ordinances of Christ and immersion only is baptism —St. John 13:1; Tim. 5:6; Psalms 28: 17

10. We believe that all Christians should unite in performing the sacred ordinances.—Rom. 12:4 5.

11. That the end of the world is approaching when Christ will descend from Heaven and raise the dead from their graves to final retribution; that a solemn separation will then take place, the righteous being adjudged to everlasting happiness and the wicked to endless punishment and this judgement will fix forever the final state of men in heaven or hell, on principles of righteousness.—Rev. 22:12; St. John 14:2-3.
