Motion and second we give the churches, their pastors, and the people of this community a rising vote of thanks for their kindness and the way they have carried on the work. Carried by standing.

Report from Auditing Committee. We find \$10.00 difference as the Minutes shows as paid out not credited. Find only a minor difference in Treasurer's books and the bank books of 77 cents, the Treasurer was with the Clerk. Motion to accept same carried.

Motion and second we ask for next session of the National Association, voted down and a motion and second we postpone this request until next year. Carried.

Motion we suspend reading of minutes. Carried. Motion to adjourn. Carried.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE REPORT AS WHOLE

Item No. 1—That we receive the resignation of Rev. R. H. Doan, a member of Trustee Board of the Greenville Orphanage. That someone be elected to fill his place, and this request be approved by the Tennessee Association, and that \$20.00 for each official trip be paid by Treasurer. Carried.

Rev. G. E. Pauley was nominated and elected as member of Orphanage Board.

Item No. 2—That the clerk have 500 letterheads printed, 2,000 good standing cards for ministers, and paid for by State Association. Carried.

Item No. 3—That the name of the W. Va. State Meeting be changed to read West Virginia State Association so as to comply with the request of National. Carried.

Item No. 4--That all conferences abide by Article 13 of Constitution vote 4 to 1. Carried.

Item No. 5—That report to National Association by letter, delegates, and finance. Carried.

Item No. 6—That each conference name their own man to be placed on Executive Board in their letter, and that the Association approve same. Carried.

Item No. 7.—We recommend that Brother Archie Conway notify the Mingo No. 1 Conference that he is not satisfied of their decision and that he notify them of an appeal to the State Association, signed by the clerk. Carried.

Item No. 8.—That the clerk have 1,000 Minutes printed. Carried.

Item No. 9.—We recommend that we recommend some minister to National Association as State Home Mission worker. Rev. Willard Porter was named. Carried.

Item No. 10—That we pay Executive Secretary \$150.00 for his services. Carried.

Item No. 11.—That the Executive Secretary be sponsored on the field and that he go as a field man into our churches and that an offering be taken as his salary. In his visits he is to try to bring our work into greater unity, and to emphasize upon our churches the need to send in a monthly offering to all work. This offering to be united into a State Treasury and be divided into each department. 50 per cent Foreign Missions; 25 per cent Home Mission, and 25 per cent Christian Education. Carried.

Item No. 12.—That each conference ask their churches to appoint someone to work locally for the Orphanage and send the money to State Treasurer. Carried.

Item No. 13-That we pay out-going Treasurer \$10.00 for services. Carried.

Item No. 14.—That we pay Mary Henson \$30.00 for her services and supplies. Carried.

Item 15.—We recommend that a committee be authorized to study and set up a plan by which the Free Will Baptists of the State of W. Va., buy enough land somewhere near the center of state and build buildings, where state association can be held each year, which can be used for camp meetings, Bible Study, each summer and other ways that interests our Denomination be built up and God glorified. Carried.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

Article No. 1

This Association shall be known as the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptist.

Article No. 2

The object of this organization shall be to more thoroughly unify the work of the Free Will Baptist of the state of West Virginia and to advise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ and for the salvation of souls in connection with the various Quarterly Meetings comprising this state meeting.

Article No. 3

The membership of this State Meeting shall consist of the Quarterly Meetings and district association or yearly meetings that from time to time upon approval shall become members of this body.

Article No. 4 — Discipline

The State Meeting shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or usage that may properly come before it fom time to time, from any quarterly meetings or yearly meetings composing the said State Meeting, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any of the bodies that belong to the State Meeting. The said appeal shall have been written and signed by the Association making the appeal, then forwarded by mail or in person to State Meeting and Quarterly Meeting.

Article No. 5 - Officers

The officers of this State Meeting shall be a Moderator and Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, each of whom shall be nominated from the floor and elected by a standing vote, from the floor, at each regular meeting provided, however, that the Moderator shall not be elected two years in succession from the same quarterly meeting or yearly meeting except in case of necessity. Election shall be determined by a majority vote of those persons and officers thus elected who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and installed. (Vote unanimous).

Article 6 - Executive Board

The Executive Board shall be composed of the following: The Moderator, the Secretary, the Treasurer of the State Meeting, and one representative from each Quarterly Meeting

Article 7 -Boards and Committees

All Standing Boards shall be composed of three members to be elected as follows: The first named for the term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third named for a term of two years, the third named for a term of three years in succession to office thereafter shall be determined as order required. Standing Boards include the Foreign Mission, Home Mission, the Board of Education, the Board of Superannuation, a Free Will Baptist League, and a Woman's Auxiliary Board and a Sunday School Board.

Secition 2 — The duties of the various boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary, and may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the State Meeting.

Section 3 — This State Meeting shall have as many committees as it is necessary to carry out the program that it may determine to promote.

Article 8 — Dues

Annual dues shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per each Quarterly Meeting that is represented to this State Meeting plus (\$2.00) for each church belonging to the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting composing this body.

Article 9

Section 1 — All ordained ministers shall voice and vote that are representated by their Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting to this body.

Section 2 — Each Quarterly Meeting shall have one

delegate for each church belonging to it.

Article 10 — Meetings

This State Meeting shall hold its regular meetings annually at a time and place fixed by the regular session and made known before adjournment. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Board when extreme necessity demands, provided that the clerks of each Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting has been properly notified fifteen days before the date of the meeting. Twenty-five legal representatives shall constitute a quorum for any special or regular meeting of this organization.

Article 11 — Trustees

This State Meeting shall have a Board of Tustees, consisting of five members, each of whom shall be nominated from the floor, elected by a standing vote, two-thirds of all voting members shall be final. This Board shall receive property only at the order of the State Meeting, be permanent Board unless body sees fit to discontinue.

Article 12 - Duties of Officers

It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings to see to it that all the Constitution and the By-Laws are obeyed and respected, and to exercise all the rights of any other member except the right to vote. The right to vote shall only be given the Moderator in case of a tie. He shall be allowed to speak on any subject provided the Assistant is in the chair. He shall not speak at any other time except in vay of explanation. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator in any way that he can in the discharge of his duty. This duty shall not be construed to abridge his right to vote when in the chair, in which he shall be governed by same rule as effecting the Moderator.

It shall be duty of the clerk to keep a complete record of all meetings, to publish same in book form, minuted and distribute to the various Quarterly Meetings or Yearly Meetings composing this State Meeting. All expenses of such records and printing to be defrayed by the treasury.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold and keep

all such money as may come into the State Meeting and disburse it only at the direction of proper authorities. He shall make a bond of not less than all funds coming into this possession.

Article 13 - Licensing and Ordaining

Sectin 1 — No man, having been divorced and remarried or having married a divorced woman, shall be ordained to preach or for deacons.

Section 2 — No woman shall be ordained or licensed to preach or ursurp authority over men.

Article 14 — Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Meeting by a two-thirds vote of all members present provided the changes are recommended in writing at least one day before the vote is taken.

BY-LAWS



A portion of the scripture shall be read and prayer shall be offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session of the State Meeting, and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.

2—The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to order at the hour designated by the program committee. When neither the Moderator or Assistant is present the Executive Board shall elect a Moderator protem who shall call the meeting to order.

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll delegates to the Meeting who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein and those enrolled by the Clerk shall compose the State Meeting.

- 4—It shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting or Associations so composing this Organization to send a letter to it giving as accurately as possible the information requested by the National Association. In their letter forms published by the Free Will Baptist Gem Monett Mo.
- 5—Not over one deacon shall be appointed on any one committee.
- 6—Only ordained ministers shall be allowed to moderate this meeting.
- 7—All Sunday Schools and young people's leagues and Women's Auxiliaries shall work in their own body's and report to same.
- 8—In case of any controversy regarding parliamentary procedure, Robert's Roles of Order shall be considered as final authority.

9—All business except routine shall be brought before this body by committee but should the committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this State Meeting, then such business may be presented by any member of the body, but cannot be discussed unless by vote of this body.

10—No one shall speak for more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

11. That each conference have their letter and finance sent to the State Meeting clerk one week before the State Meeting convenes.

12—Any members of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the body and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

13—No one shall leave the body without the consent of the Moderator.

14—Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say Brother Moderator, but shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

15—The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will lead to discord or division.

16—This state meeting shall correspond by messenger or otherwise to other religious bodies.

17.—The same person or group of persons shall not serve on more than one standing board or committee as long as it can be supplied otherwise.

18—Not less than three Gospel Sermons shall be preached at any one session of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

19—These By-Laws may be revised or changed at any regular session of the State Meeting provided that they be plainly written and stated one day before the vote is taken.
