Nominated Rev. Elmer Stephens for 3-year man. Motion and second we close nomination and elect by acclamation. Carried.

Motion and second we recommend that Rev. Ernold Barker serve as our Director of Home Missions to National Association. Carried.

Report of Super-Annuation Board by Rev. Frank Johnson, he had not much to report only he had made several contacts. Motion and second we accept as given. Carried.

Nominated Rev. Arlie Joe Ball as 3-year man on Super-Annuation Board. Motion and second we close and elect. Carried.

Report of League Board, Rev. W. E. Kurfman. Motion and second we accept as given. Carried. Board elected: Rev. W. E. Kurfman, 3-year man; Rev. Turman Collier, 2-year man; Rev. Edgar Lawson, 1-year man. Motion to close and elect by acclamation. Carried.

Motion and second to take from table and dispose of items on constitution and By-Laws. Carried.

Start with No. 9, giving deacons privilege of voting.

Article 11 adding, "It shall be a permanent board."

Article 13, adding the word "Licensed" in the clause.

Item No. 3 of By-Laws changed to appear in minutes.

Motion to accept report as was taken and read from the table. Carried.

There were tears of rejoicing while singing at the close of the program "'Tis So Sweet To Trust In Jesus" and "Prepare To Meet Thy God." An offering was taken for the Home in the amount of \$100.00. Brother and Sister Stanley are leaving the home and he had with him Brother

Gerrald Medsker, the man who will take his place, who made us a very good talk and how much he thanked the folk of W. Va. and their fine work. Motion and second we give these men a rising vote of thanks for their good work well done.

Report of State Secretary, Rev. J. M. Henson: Sermons 185, Revivals 7, Conversions 32, Baptized 16, Funerals 6, Married 2 couples, offering \$1047.89. Expense \$210.87. Motion and sustained that we accept report. Carried.

Nomination for State Secretary: Rev. J. M. Henson. Motion and sustained to elect by acclamation. Carried.

Final business report:

Item No. I. We recommend that the seal of the W. Va. State Association be changed or a new one purchased, the Clerk being authorized to make the change. Carried.

Item No. II. A. A committee be elected for the purpose of bringing the National Association to Huntington, W. Va., for 1956 session.

B. We recommend the following men on this committee: Rev. Carl Vallance, Chairman, Rev. J. M. Henson, Rev. Caudle Adkins, Jr.

C. This committee endeavor to raise the finance to sponsor their part of the program. Carried as a whole.

Item III. We recommend that the necessary funds be taken from the treasury to accompany the letter to the National Association. Carried.

Item IV. That we pay Sister Mary Henson \$50.00 for services and supplies. Carried.

Item V. That we pay Rev. J. M. Henson \$150.00 for his services as promotional secretary. Carried.

Item VI. We recommend that the clerk of W. Va. State Association notify the Superintendent of the Orphanage to pay the amount of \$20.00 per each official trip of the trustee from W. Va. to the Orphanage. Carried.

Item VII. We recommend that the Clerk be authorized to have 1200 copies of the State Minutes printed, and they be sent to the Clerk of each conference and said Clerk be urged to give them out as quickly as possible. Carried.

Item VIII. We recommend that the name of each Church Clerk and their addresses be inserted in the minutes of 1955-56. The Clerk of each conference send to the state clerk these names and addresses as quickly as possible, also the name and address of each conference Clerk be inserted in the minutes. Carried.

Item IX. A. We recommend that the recommendation presented to the body by the State Secretary be withdrawn from the table. Carried.

B. That we adopt and carry out as far as possible until such time that it can be carried out to its entirety, we shall continue with State Secretary until plans can be carried out in full. Carried.

Recommendations to the State Association of Free Will Baptists when assembled in regular session June 10 and 11, 1955.

I made a tour of the different quarterly meetings starting on January 17 through 31, talked to many of our ministers, and from the talks I had with the ministers, I, therefore, recommend that the State Association adopt the cooperative plan of giving and that the State Budget be set at \$24,000 for the fiscal year to be used as follows:

1. That a state office be set up in or near Charleston, W. Va., and the sum of \$7,000 be used for renting, equipping, and maintaining the office; also, this amount is to include the employing of a full-time promotional director and a full-time secretary.

2. Other phases of the work to have designation of:

National Foreign Missions.....	\$2,500
Christian Education	2,500
Orphanage	3,000
Local Home Missions	8,000
National Home Missions	1,000

I further recommend that all money raised for any phase of the work be sent into one central state treasury and that any designated money raised for any specific purpose be deducted from the amount set forth in the budget.

I further recommend that two home mission stations be set up. One at Summersville, W. Va., and one at Clay, W. Va., since these are two of the most strategic points as all of our work is in the southern part of the state and the field is white and ready to be harvested.

I further recommend that a prayer week be designated as of November 6, 1955 through November 12, 1955, and that all churches in the State make it their business to pray, thank God for past blessings, and seek His face for future blessing.

For the past ten years it has been my pleasure to serve as your State Secretary. The task has been great and we have not been able to give any more time than we have with our responsibility of raising and educating our family, so we can proudly say that we have given our best to you as a servant of the Lord.

Item XI. We recommend that the Clerk and Moderator serve with the Treasurer as a board to distribute funds. Carried.

Report of the Buying Committee on property for youth camp site. Church building 50' x 72', cottage 16' x 62', kitchen and dining room 24' x 32', well, kitchen equipment includes 2 electric stoves, Frigidaire and tables, pots and pans, Gravelly tractor, 10 lots can be bought for \$10,000.00. Submitted by Board of Trustees. Motion and second we accept report and then work out a plan for our future. Carried.

Motion and second we give the pastor and host church and community a rising vote of thanks for their hospitality and their nice way of taking care of us while in their town. Carried.

Motion and second we stand adjourned till next regular session, Friday before the 2nd Sunday in June, 1956.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE NO. 1

This Association shall be known as the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE NO. 2

The object of this organization shall be to more thoroughly unify the work of the Free Will Baptist of the state of West Virginia and to advise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ and for the salvation of souls in connection with the various Quarterly or Yearly Meetings comprising this state association.

ARTICLE NO. 3

The membership of this State Association shall consist of the Quarterly Meetings and district association or yearly meetings that from time to time upon approval shall become members of this body.

ARTICLE NO. 4—Discipline

The State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or usage that may properly come before it from time to time, from any quarterly meetings or yearly meetings composing the said State Association, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any of the bodies that belong to the State Association. The said appeal shall have been written and signed by the Association making the appeal, then forwarded by mail or in person to State Association and Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLE NO. 5—Officers

The officers of the State Association shall be a Moderator and Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, each of whom shall be nominated before the floor and elected by a standing vote, from the floor, at each regular meeting provided, however, that the Moderator shall not be elected two years in succession from the same quarterly meeting or yearly meeting except in case of necessity. Election shall be determined by a majority vote of those persons and officers thus elected who shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and installed. (Vote unanimous).

ARTICLE 6—Executive Board

The Executive Board shall be composed of the following: The moderator, the Secretary, the Treasurer of the State Association, and one representative from each Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLE 7—Boards And Committees

All Standing Boards shall be composed of three members to be elected as follows: The first named for the term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third named for a term of two years, the third named for a term of two years, the fourth named for a term of three years in succession to office thereafter shall be determined as order required. Standing Boards include the Foreign Mission, Home Mission, the Board of Education, the Board of Superannuation, a Free Will Baptist League, and a Woman's Auxiliary Board and a Sunday School Board.

Section 2—The duties of the various boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary, and may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the State Association.

Section 3—This State Association shall have as many committees as it is necessary to carry out the program that it may determine to promote.

ARTICLE 8—Dues

Annual dues shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per each Quarterly Meeting that is represented to this State Association plus (\$2.00) for each church belonging to the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting composing this body.

ARTICLE 9

Section 1—All ordained ministers, deacons, and delegates shall voice and vote that are represented by their Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting to this body.

Section 2—Each Quarterly Meeting shall have one delegate for each church belonging to it.

ARTICLE 10—Meetings

This State Association shall hold its regular meetings annually on Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in June at a place fixed by the regular session and made known before adjournment. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Board when extreme necessity demands, provided that the clerks of each Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting has been properly notified fifteen days before the date of the meeting. Twenty-five legal representatives shall constitute a quorum for any special or regular meeting of this organization.

Article 11—Trustees

This State Association shall have a Board of Trustees, consisting of five members, each of whom shall be nominated from the floor, elected by a standing vote, two-thirds of all voting members shall be final. This Board shall receive property only at the order of the State Association, it shall be a permanent Board unless body sees fit to discontinue.

ARTICLE 12—Duties Of Officers

It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings to see to it that all the Constitution and the By-Laws are obeyed and respected, and to exercise all the rights of any other member except the right to vote. The right to vote shall only be given the Moderator in case of a tie. He shall be allowed to speak on any subject provided the Assistant is in the chair. He shall not speak at any other time except in way of explanation. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator in any way that he can in the discharge of his duty. This duty shall not be construed to abridge his right to vote when in the chair, in which he shall be governed by same rule as effecting the Moderator.

It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a complete record of all meetings, to publish same in book form, minuted and distribute to the various Quarterly Meetings or Yearly Meetings composing this State Association. All expenses of such records and printing to be defrayed by the treasury.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold and keep all such money as may come into the State Association and disburse it only at the direction of proper authorities. He shall make a bond of not less than all funds coming into his possession.

ARTICLE 13—Licensing And Ordaining

Section 1—No man, having been divorced and remarried or having married a divorced woman, shall be licensed or ordained to preach or for deacons.

Section 2—No woman shall be ordained or licensed to preach or usurp authority over men.

ARTICLE 14—Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present provided the changes are recommended in writing at least one day before the vote is taken.

BY-LAWS

A portion of the scripture shall be read and prayer shall be offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon sessions of the State Association and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.

2—The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to order at the hour designated by the program committee. When neither the Moderator or Assistant is present the Executive Board shall elect a Moderator pro tem who shall call the meeting to order.

3—It shall be the duty of the Clerk to call the names of delegates, ministers, and deacons at the beginning of each session and assess them one dollar (\$1.00) each; who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein and those enrolled by the Clerk shall compose the State Association.

4—It shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting or Associations so composing this Organization to send a letter to it giving as accurately as possible the information requested by the National Association. In their letter forms published by the Free Will Baptist Gem Monett Mo.

5—Not over one deacon shall be appointed on any one committee.

6—Only ordained ministers shall be allowed to moderate this meeting.

7—All Sunday Schools and young people's leagues and Women's Auxiliaries shall work in their own bodys and report to State Association.

8—In case of any controversy regarding parliamentary procedure, Robert's Rules of Order shall be considered as final authority.

9—All business except routine shall be brought before this body by committee but should the committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this State Association, then such business may be presented by any member of the body, but cannot be discussed unless by vote of this body.

10—No one shall speak for more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.

11—That each conference have their letter and finance sent to the State Association clerk one week before the State Association convenes.

12—Any members of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the body and by a majority vote thereon, the objection shall be sustained or rejected.

13—No one shall leave the body without the consent of the Moderator.

14—Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say Brother Moderator, but shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

15—The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will lead to discord or division.

16—This State Association shall correspond by messenger or otherwise to other religious bodies.

17—The same person or group of persons shall not serve on more than one standing board or committee as long as it can be supplied otherwise.

18—Not less than three Gospel Sermons shall be preached at any one session of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
