We further recommend that each of our Pastors request each of his members of his local church to send a letter of their desent to their legislator and congressman asking them to voice their vote in opposition to the "Liquor by the drink" bill. CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE NO. 1

This Association shall be known as the West Virginia State Association of Fr.e Will Baptists.

ARTICLE NO. 2

The object of this organization shall be to more thoroughly unify the work of the Free Will Baptist of the state of West Virginia and to advise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ and for the salvation of souls in connection with the various Quarterly or Yearly Meetings comprising this state association.

ARTICLE NO. 3

The memb.rship of this State Association shall consist of the Quarterly Meetings and district association or yearly meetings that from time to time upon approval shall become members of this body.

ARTICLE NO. 4-Discipline

EF . M. MONTH

The State Association shall have the right to settle any questions of discipline, doctrine or usage that may properly come before it from time to time, from any quarterly meetings or yearly meetings composing the said State Association, or act upon any appeal that may be made by any of the bodies that belong to the State Association. The said appeal shall have been written and sign d by the Association making the appeal, then forwarded by mail or in person to State Association and Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLE NO. 5-Officers

, The officers of the state Association shall be a Moderator and Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and Promotional Secretary. Each of whom shall be nominated from the floor and elected by a standing vote, from the floor, at each regular meeting, provided however, that the Moderator shall not be elected two years in succession from the same Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting except in case of necessity.

Election shall be determined by a majority vote. Those persons and officers thus elected shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and installed (Vote unanimous).

ARTICLE 6-Executive Board

The Executive Board shall be composed of the following: The moderator, the Secretary, the Treasurer of the State Association, and one representative from each Quarterly Meeting.

ARTICLE 7-Boards And Committees

All Standing Boards shall be composed of three members to be elected as follows: The first named for the term of one year, the second for a term of two years, the third named for a term of two years, the third named for a term of two years, the fourth named for a term of three years in succession to office thereafter shall be determined as order required. Standing Boards include the Foreign Mission, Home Mission, the Board of Education, the Board of Superannuation, a Free Will Baptist League, and a Woman's Auxiliary Board and a Sunday School Board. Section 2—The duties of the various boards shall be to plan a program and supervise its operation in their respective fields. They shall organize themselves and regulate their work as may become necessary, and may be found in harmony with the principles and tenets of the State Association.

Section 3—This State Association shall have as many committees as it is necessary to carry out the program that it may determine to promote.

ARTICLE 8-Dues

Annual dues shall be five dollars (\$5.00) per each Quarterly Meeting that is represented to this State Association plus (\$2.00) for each church belonging to the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting composing this body.

ARTICLE 9

Section 1—All ordained ministers, deacons, and delegates shall voice and vote that are represented by their Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting to this body.

Section 2—Each Quarterly Meeting shall have one delegate for each church belonging to it.

ARTICLE 10-Meetings

This State Association shall hold its regular meetings annually on Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in June at a place fixed by the regular session and made known before adjournment. Special meetings may be called by the Executive Board when extreme necessity demands, provided that the clerks of each Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting has been properly notified fifteen days before the date of the meeting. Twenty-five legal representatives shall constitute a quorum for any special or regular meeting of this organization.

Article 11-Trustees

This State Association shall have a Board of Trustees, consisting of five members, each of whom shall be nominated from the floor, elected by a standing vote, two-thirds of all voting members shall be final. This Board shall receive property only at the order of the State Association, it shall be a permanent Board unless body sees fit to distontinue.

ARTICLE 12-Duties Of Officers

It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings to see to it that all the Constitution and the By-Laws are obeyed and respected, and to exercise all the rights of any other member except the right to vote. The right to vote shall only be given the Moderator in case of a tie. He shall be allowed to speak on any subject provided the Assistant is in the chair. He shall not speak at any other time except in way of explanation. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator in any way that he can in the discharge of his duty. This duty shall not be construed to abridge his right to votwhen in the chair, in which he shall be governed by same rule as effecting the Moderator. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a complete record of all meetings, to publish same in book form, minuted and distribute to the various Quarterly Meetings or Yearly Meetings composing this State Association. All expenses of such records and printing to be defrayed by the treasury.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold and keep all such money as may come into the State Association and disburse it only at the direction of proper authorities. He shall make a bond of not less than all funds coming into his possession.

I PROMOTIONAL SECRETRY

It shall be the duty of the promotional secretary to strive for the enlistment of new conferences and associations into the membership of the West Virginia State Association. Also to promote the work of Free Will Baptists in new fields. The office of Promotional Secretary shall not be used to settle disputes between brethren and conferences. This office term shall not exceed three years and he shall not succed himself.

II THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

It shall be the duty of this board to propare the program of the State Association at the close of each session of the State Association each year. The executive board shall act as an arbitration committee when called. This committee shall be composed of not less than five members of the executive board and they shall not be from the same conference.

III FOREIGN MISSION BOARD

It shall be the duty of this board to cooperate with the Foreign Mission Board of the National Association of Free Will Baptist, and to end avor to raise funds for the Foreign Mission work of our denomination. This board shall organize within itself with a Chairman and a Secretary-Treasurer. All money for Foreign Missions shall be sent to the Chairman of the Foreign Mission oBard. This board shall arrange for missionary conf rences throughout the State work as it feels necessary.

IV HOME MISSION BOARD

This board shall organize within itself and elect a Chairman and a Secretary-Treasurer.

It shall be the duty of the Home Mission Board to work with the Promotional Secretary in establishing new churches and Conferences throughout the State of West Virginia where we do not have established Free Will Baptist work. It shall also h lp in raising money for the support of the office of the Promotional Secretary. Sixty per cent of all money raised by the Home Mission Board shall be used in the promotional work of our own state. Forty per cent shall be channelled to the National Home Mission Board.

V ORPHANAGE BOARD

This board shall maintain a relationship with the Free Will Baptist Home of Children at Greenville, Tennessee, and help provide for its support. One member of this board shall be a trustee of the Board of Trustees of the Free Will Baptist Home for Children at Greenville, Tennessee. Expense of this trustee shall be provided for each official visit to the home, not to exceed Twenty dollars (\$20.00). This board shall raise money for and relate its work to the Childrens' Home. This board shall organize within itself with a Treasurer, Soliciting Member and Director and A Trustee.

VI BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

This board shall organize within itself with a Chairman, Secretary and soliciting member. The duties of this board shall consist of: The enlightenment of the Free Will Baptist of West Virginia to the cause of the denomination and to publish tracts and help in the financial support of the students at Free Will Bible College; also help in the support of the Bible College itself. This board shall endeavor to meet the quota set for the Bible College for our state.

All funds raised for this work shall be divided — 50% to the Bible College and 50% to the students that attend the Bible College at Nashville, Tennessee. This board shall provide funds only as they are available to the support of students. Any student willing to receive support from this board must be a Free Will Baptist and be in good standing in some church within the bounds of the State Association. They must also be recommended by their Church and Pastor.

VII AUXILIARY BOARD

It shall be the duy of this board to promote the work of the Woman's Auxiliary in our state. This board may be composed of three women interested in this work.

VIII LEAGUE BOARD

This board shall organize within itself with Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer. This board shall promote the Free Will Baptist League in our state and endeavor to get District and State Leagues into their proper place in our churches and conferences.

IX SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

This board shall organize within itself and have a Chairman and Secretary-Treasurer. This board shall endeavor to coordinate the Sunday School work in West Virginia and try to bring our Sunday Schools up to National Standards for Sunday Schools. The board shall endeavor to establish a Workers' Conference in our Sunday Schools and to work for the improvement of Sunday School literature and to help in establishing Teachers' Training Courses in our schools. These Schools shall be taught by those who have Evangelical Teachers' Training Association Certificates or are otherwise qualified. This board shall seek to establish a Sunday School Board in each Conference and shall be responsible for the over-all planning of Sunday School work in the State Association.

ARTICLE 13-Licensing And Ordaining

Section 1-No man, having been divorced and remarried or having married a divorced woman, shall be licensed or ordained to preach or for deacons. Section 2--No woman shall be ordained or licensed to preach

or ursurp authority over men.

ARTICLE 14—Amendments

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present provided the changes are recommended in writing at least one day before the vote is taken.

BY-LAWS

A portion of the scripture shall be read and prayer shall be off red at the beginning of each morning and afternoon sessions of the State Association and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.

2-The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to ord r at the hour designated by the program committee. When neither the Moderator or Assistant is present the Executive Board shall elect a Moderator pro tem who shall call the meeting to order.

3-It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll the names of delegates, ministers, and deacons at the beginning of each session and assess them one dollar (\$1.00) each; who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein and those enrolled by the Clerk shall compose the State Association.

4-It shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting or Associations so composing this Organization to send a letter to it giving as accurately as possible the information requested by the National Association.

5-Not over one deacon shall be appointed on any one committee.

6-Only ordained ministers shall be allowed to moderate this metting.

7-All Sunday Schools and young people's leagues and Women's Auxiliaries shall work in their own bodys and report to State Association.

8-In case of any controversy regarding parliamentary procedure. Robert's Rules of Order shall be considered as final authority.

9-All business except routine shall be brought before this body by committee but should the committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this State Association, then such business may be presented by any member of the body, but cannot be discussed unless by vote of this body.

10-No one shall speak for more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderatør.

11-That each conference have their letter and finance sent to the State Association clerk one week before the State Association convenes.

12-Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the body and by a two-thirds Majority vote of all members present, thereon. This decision shall be sustained or rejected.

13-No one shall leave the body without the consent of the Moderator.

14—Anyone desiring to speak shall arise and say Brother Moderator, but shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator.

15—The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will load to discord or division.

16—This State Association shall correspond by messenger or otherwise to other religious bodies.

17—The same person or group of persons shall not serve on more than one standing board or committee as long as it can be supplied otherwise

13—Not less than three Gospel Sermons shall be preached at any one session of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.

19—These By-Laws may be revised or changed at any regular session of the State Association provided that they be plainly written and stated one day before the vote is taken.
