

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NOTES

CONSTITUTION OF THE WEST VIRGINIA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS PREAMBLE

Having received salvation through faith in Christ Jesus, and having been baptized as an outward sign of our separation from the world, and realizing the necessity of being identified with and sharing the fellowship of other believers, have joined ourselves to a local visible church, we do ordain this Constitution to unify the work of Free Will Baptist in the State of West Virginia, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of Christ and for the salvation of souls in cooperation with various quarterly or yearly meetings comprising this State Association. **May God Bless our labor.**

Article No. 1

Section 1. All ordained Ministers and Deacons belonging to member Quarterly Meetings and District Associations shall make up the standing delegates to this State Association. Each quarterly meeting shall be permitted to send three lay delegates to the State Association plus one delegate from each Church composing that Quarterly Meeting.

Section 2. The membership of the State Association shall consist of the Quarterly Meetings and District Association of Yearly Meetings from time to time upon approval shall become members of this body.

Section 3. Any Minister, Deacon or Delegate voting in State Association must be a member of a Church in good standing with the Quarterly Meeting recommending them to the State Association.

Section 4. This State Association shall be affiliated with the National Association of Free Will Baptists of the United States of America, and recognize the Treatise of Faith and Practice as our guidelines for denominal fellowship, as long as they remain an independent denomination.

Article No. 2 – Discipline

Section 1. The State Association shall have the right to settle questions of discipline, doctrine or usage that may properly come before it from time to time from any Quarterly Meetings or Yearly Meetings composing the said State Association or act upon any appeal that may be made by any of the bodies that belong to the State Association. The said appeal shall have been written and signed by the Association making the appeal then forwarded by mail or in person to State Association and Quarterly Meeting.

Section 2. No Quarterly Meeting shall license or ordain to preach or serve as a Deacon any Man having two living wives. No Man having married a divorced Woman shall be licensed or ordained to preach or ordained as a Deacon in this State Association.

Section 3. No Quarterly Meeting shall license or ordain a Woman to preach.

Section 4. No Quarterly Meeting shall be accepted or retained as a member that license or ordain Women to preach.

Section 5. The Executive Board shall investigate any charges, after they have been properly presented to the Quarterly Meeting of which the grieved party or parties are a member. Any charges presented to this State Association Executive Board for consideration must be presented in writing and signed by the person or persons making the charges.

Section 6. The Executive Board shall be paid for travel expenses, at the United States Government rate when traveling to meetings for business of the State Association. The party or parties requesting the Executive Board to meet with them, shall be responsible to pay their expenses.

Article No. 3

Section 1. The Officers of the State Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer and Parliamentarian. Each of whom shall be nominated from the floor. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator for two year term and able to succeed themselves for an indefinite period of time; the Clerk and Assistant, the Treasurer and Assistant for three year term: the Parliamentarian for a two year term beginning at the 54th session.

Election shall be determined by a majority vote. Those persons and Officers thus elected shall hold their office until their successors are elected and installed.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings to see that all the Constitution and By-Laws are obeyed and respected, and to exercise all the right to vote.

The right to vote shall be given the Moderator only in case of a tie. He shall be allowed to speak on any subject provided the Assistant is in the chair. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Moderator to assist the Moderator in any way he can in the discharge of his duty. This duty shall not be construed to abridge his right to vote when in the chair, in which he shall be governed to the same rule as that affecting the Moderator.

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to keep a complete record of all meetings to publish in book form, minutes and distributed to various quarterly meetings composing this State Association. All expenses of such records and printing are to be defrayed by the treasury.

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to hold and keep all such money as may come into the State Association and disburse it only at the direction of proper authorities. He shall make a bond of not less than all funds coming into his possession. An Assistant Treasurer will be elected to act in any absence of the Treasurer, or act of emergency. **I. Promotional Director** – It shall be the duty of the Promotional Director to strive for the enlistment of new Conferences and Associations into membership of the West Virginia State Association. To promote the works of this State Association first and the work of Free Will Baptists in new fields. The office of Promotional Director shall not be used to settle disputes between brethren and Conferences.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

POSITION: Promotional Director. FUNCTION: To promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist. To actively interface with WV FWB Conferences and Churches. To promote the WV State Association and its works to other FWB State Associations, Colleges, and National Organizations. To maintain an office for the WV State Association. **ORGANIZATION RELATIONSHIPS:** The office of the Promotional Director shall be filled. supported and supervised by the Executive Committee of the West Virginia State Association. The Executive Committee may by two-thirds vote modify the duties of the Promotional Director to the State Association. DUTIES AND **RESPNSIBILITIES:** Accountability: The Promotional Director shall provide a written report bimonthly to the Executive Committee and an annual written report to the State Association. The Promotional Director shall meet bimonthly with the Executive Committee.

The Promotional Director shall present an operating budget for approval to the Executive Committee. Once approved, the Promotional Director shall be responsible to operate the State Office within the budget.

National Meetings:

The Promotional Director, will attend and represent the WV State Association annually at the National Convention and the National Leadership Conference.

Conference and Church Meetings:

The Promotional Director shall attend and represent the WV State Association at as many local Conference/Quarterly Meetings as possible. He shall attend every Conference at least once every two years.

The Promotional Director will make as many Church visits throughout West Virginia as his schedule allows. To promote the works of the WV State Association; to minister to the pastors; and to keep people informed about the issues affecting Free Will Baptists.

Coordination:

The Promotional Director will participate in all WV State Association Board Meetings. To provide general oversight to the Free Will Baptist work in West Virginia and provide insight in regards to National Free Will Baptist issues.

The Promotional Director will work closely with the Publication Board in the publication of the State Paper *(The Messenger)*; and have direct impact as to its contents and format. This is to provide consistency in the promotion of West Virginia's Free Will Baptist.

Strategic Goals:

The Promotional Director shall proactively work towards the Strategic Goals defined by the Executive Committee and as listed in the Addendum.

Other Duties:

The Promotional Director will serve as a pastor's role to our WV pastors by counseling and encouraging them. He will also provide resources for them and their flock for their spiritual growth.

The Promotional Director will promote women and youth activities.

The Promotional Director will have a strong emphasis on missions, and promote our WV missionaries.

The Promotional Director will serve on the Co-Op Committee.

The Promotional Director will serve on the Disaster Response Committee, and serve as the liaison between the National Association and the State Association.

The Promotional Director will make himself available to the WV State Boards for special projects and to promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director will manage the Book Store account.

The Promotional Director will make a verbal report at the State Association.

The Promotional Director will be the states representative to Randall House Publications. He will comply with the promotional guidelines set forth by Randall House as follows:

> Promotional Director to write a minimum of four letters a year for promotion of Randall House Publications in conjunction with our campaigns.

Promotional Director will attend a minimum of two training events during the year.

Promotional Director will promote literature and books in churches, conferences, and at the state meetings.

State will provide a half page in state newsletter for use in promoting Randall House Publications.

The Promotional Director will promote our ministers and provide resources or them such as; training, retirement fund, insurance, church resources, etc.

The Promotional Director will provide connections with all FWB Colleges and provide resources for our young people to attend College.

The Promotional Director will work toward establishing a permanent State Office in the location approved by the WV State Association. It will be used for meetings and a repository for minutes, financial reports, historical records, and other documents of the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director may hold another job for means of additional income; however his employment is not to interfere with his required duties as Promotional Director.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The qualifications of the Promotional Director are as follows:

Must be saved.

Must be an active member of a Free Will Baptist Church associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must currently be an ordained minister from a conference or state associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must have been ordained for at least five years and have been in good standing with his Church, Conference, and State Association.

Must be willing to transfer by letter his membership and ordination papers to a Church and Conference associated with the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist, if not currently associated with West Virginia.

Must have prior experience in dealing effectively with various denominational groups (such as: Churches, Conferences, State Associations, FWB Colleges, National Organizations, etc.) and the public.

Must have adequate training and experience in business and computers.

CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS:

The Promotional Director shall have an annual contract effective from July 1 until June 30 of the following year. The contract shall be reviewed, and renewed or cancelled in January for the following year. This will give a minimum of six months notice in case of non-renewal, however, in case the Conference calls for the ordination papers, the Promotional Director will be relieved of duties while investigation and hearing is taking place, and given two month's salary.

Remuneration will consist of: (1) Salary and benefits set annually by mutual agreement of the Executive Committee and the Promotional Director. (2) Expense reimbursement for attending the National Association \$400, plus \$400 east, or \$600 west of the Mississippi River, and the National Leadership Conference (\$450). (3) Shall have two week's vacation after one year of employment, and have three week's vacation after five years of employment.

ADDENDUM EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S STRATEGIC GOALS FOR THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR

(for future use).

II. The Executive Board – The Executive Board shall act as the State Association when State Association is not in session, action subject to approval by State Association.

III. Program Committee – That a Program Committee be elected on Friday morning to prepare the program for the coming year. This Committee shall act as a Placement Committee and shall comply with the Constitution in making their choice for the Church, where the State Association is to be held. This Committee shall consist of two ordained Ministers, one Deacon, and four members of duly seated Delegates. This Committee shall prepare to report to the State Association by 1:45 p.m. Saturday afternoon.

IV. The Mission Board – This Board is to be an eight member Board, with expiration to be two at four years, two at three years, two at two years, and two at one year terms. It shall be the duty of this Board to work to promote International and Home Missions work throughout the State of West Virginia. This Missions Board shall cooperate with the National Association, and endeavor to raise funds for the Missions Board and our denomination. This Board shall arrange Missionary Conferences throughout the state work as it feels necessary. Also to promote new Churches and Conferences through the State of West Virginia where we do not have established Free Will Baptist Work. The Mission Board has the authority to organize within themselves, as to Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer.

V. Publication Board – The Publication Board shall consist of five (5) members elected for a term of five (5) years and elected so that one member is elected annually. It shall organize with an Editor, Associate Editor, Treasurer and three Associate Editors. It shall be the duty of this Board to publish a regular news publication concerning the various ministries of Free Will Baptist in West Virginia and in the world. Also, that the news publication include a news letter format. This Board shall be limited to new purchases of \$300.00 per year without approval of the Association or the Executive Board.

VI. Christian Education Board – This Board shall consist of five (5) members elected for a term of five (5) years and elected as so that one member be elected annually. It shall organize within itself a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. It shall be the duty of this Board to generally oversee the educational efforts of this Association.

This would include but not be limited to (A) organize and conduct a State Bible Institute; (B) Establish Sunday Schools; (C) Promote Church Training Services (CTS) and generally oversee competitive events on the state and district levels.

VII. Trustee Board – The duties of this Board shall be to hold titles to all real property belonging to this body; the maintenance and upkeep of all such properties; the planning and supervision all developments; and the expansion of these properties as directed by the West Virginia State Association.

It is agreed, in this connection, that the Board of Trustees shall at no time sell or encumber these properties by mortgage, lien, or otherwise without the express consent of this body given in regular session of this Association.

The Board of Trustees is hereby authorized to receive, in behalf of and for the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists, gifts, grants, monies, real estate, or other valuable assets.

The Board of Trustees shall act for and in behalf of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists in any and all transactions involving any of it's properties, but shall do so strictly in accordance with instructions given by said State Association in regular or called session.

VIII. Nominating Committee – The Nominating Committee shall consist of five (5) ordained Ministers elected for a term of one (1) year. It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to select candidates, who are qualified and available to fill Boards and or Committees. They will begin their search for candidates from time they are elected until they make their report at next scheduled State Meeting. They shall meet with the Executive Board semiannually and yearly Pre-State Meeting.

IX. Executive Committee – This Committee would be made up of the Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Treasurer, Chairman of Missions and Christian Education Board, Editor of State Paper, Ex officio member, President of the Women's State Auxiliary, and two Members at Large from the Executive Board to be chosen by this body to supervise and oversee the Promotional Director, Bible Book Store, State Office, and Newspaper. The duties of this Board would be Executive and Promotional.

The Executive Committee will set an annual budget for the four Ministries under their supervision.

The Executive Committee will submit this budget to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Committee will provide an annual report to the Executive Board to include goals, milestones, financial status, and any important concerns.

The Executive Committee will report the number of meetings conducted the past year.

The Executive Committee will report to the West Virginia State Association during the annual session.

X. Master's Men Board – The purpose of the Master's Men Board shall be to promote and encourage the Men of Free Will Baptist Churches in West Virginia to become active in the Master's Men program and to assist in starting Chapters in the local Churches or Conferences, and will be responsible for maintaining and dispersing the West Virginia Master's Men fund.

This Board shall coordinate work projects to assist the Churches of West Virginia to build and remodel as needed on a volunteer basis. This Board shall also

coordinate programs for fellowship and spiritual growth for the Men in the Churches throughout the state. These programs may be in the form of retreats, workshops and seminars, etc.

All members of this Board shall serve as corresponding messengers to the Conference and Churches of West Virginia and give report to Chairmen who will then give report to the West Virginia State Association.

The Master's Men Board shall consist of seven (7) members serving from one seven member to a one year member, with one new member elected annually. The Board will have the right to replace any member that resigns with another man to serve pro-tem until the next State Meeting.

XI. Women's Auxiliary – The West Virginia State Women's Auxiliary Convention will be recognized as subordinate to the West Virginia State Association; but it shall organize as its own discretion and have power to create and adopt a Constitution and By-Laws and maintain management of the work for which it is constituted. The State Auxiliary shall report its accomplishments and financial operations annually to the West Virginia State Association.

The purpose of the WV State Women's Auxiliary is to promote and encourage the Women of Free will Baptist Churches in West Virginia to become active in the program of WNAC and to assist in starting Auxiliaries in local Churches and will be responsible for maintaining and dispersing all funds received by the State Auxiliary.

The Officers of this Convention shall be a President, Vice President, Secretary, Historian, Treasurer, Mission Chairman, three (3) Field Workers and three (3) Members at Large. Six of these shall compose a quorum. These will be elected every two years. All Officers are to be a member of a Free Will Baptist Church and an Auxiliary which reports to the State Convention.

Article No. 4 – Executive Board

Section 1. The Executive Board shall be composed of one ordained Minister from each Quarterly Conference that is in good standing with the State Association.

Section 2. If any member of the Executive Board is unable to attend, he must send a proxy in his place.

Section 3. At a regular scheduled session, 10:00 a.m. the Saturday before the State Meeting, this Board shall hear the reports of all Standing Boards and Officers. It shall serve as a Budget Committee and make recommendations as deemed pertinent to State Association. This Board will also examine the Conference letters and report findings at State Meeting.

Article No. 5 – Boards

The standing Boards shall be the following: Mission Board, Christian Education Board, Publication Board, Master's Men Board, and the Board of Trustees.

Article No. 6

Section 1. Annual Dues from conference to State Association shall be as follows: Churches with 0 to 25 membership will pay \$25.00, Churches with 26 to 50 membership will pay \$50.00, Churches with 51 to 75 membership will pay \$75.00, Churches with any additional membership above 75 members will pay an additional \$25.00 per each additional twenty-five membership, plus National Dues.

Section 2. All Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates shall pay Five Dollars (\$5.00) registration fee (dues), with the exception of those Ministers who are Sixty-five years of age or disabled. Two dollars (\$2.00) to go to the host church, Three Dollars (\$3.00) to go to the State Association.

Section 3. Any Minister receiving a good standing card must pay his Five Dollar (\$5.00) registration fee. Each Quarterly Meeting is requested to collect this fee and send to the State Association with their letter.

Section 4. The State Association pay all Boards and Committees mileage at the United States Government rate, when traveling to meetings for business of the State Association. If any Conference does not pay the mileage expense for their Executive Board member, the State Association will pay that expense. Any other parties requesting a Board or Committee of the State Association to meet with them, shall be responsible to pay their mileage. This excludes mileage to the National Association or National Leadership Conference.

Article No. 7

Section 1. The State Association shall hold its regular meeting annually on Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in June at a place and date fixed by the regular session and made known before adjournment.

Special meetings may be called by the Executive Board when extreme necessity demands provided that the Clerk of each Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting has been properly notified fifteen days before the date of the meeting of this organization.

Section 2. Any Quarterly Meeting or Church desiring the State Association to meet with the body shall present in writing the seating capacity, the facilities for feeding, sleeping and parking.

Article No. 8

West Virginia Disaster Response Plan

Goal:

To provide a plan for reacting to disasters in our state and possibly in other states east of the Mississippi when emergency situations strike and Free Will Baptist people and property are affected. Although efforts to help others may be part of this effort, we are especially concerned with helping people of our denomination. The response must involve spiritual help as well as material and physical aid.

Purpose:

To glorify God by serving our fellow men in times of widespread need occasioned by a natural or man-made disaster affecting large numbers of people. Natural or man-made disasters include hurricane, earthquakes, tornado, flood, acts of terrorism, etc.

Strategy:

#1 To have a committee (<u>Disaster Response Committee</u>) that shall coordinate the preparation for responding to a disaster.

#2 Enlist and train a group of first responders. Encourage several workers to enlist in a Red Cross first aid course, a food handler's course, and other such training.

#3 Raise money to purchase and equip a trailer for immediate use when a disaster strikes. The trailer will be equipped with first aid equipment, generators, lights, saws, tolls, etc. needed in emergency situations.

#4 Establish a fund to cover expenses associated with getting a team to a disaster and maintaining them on site for a period of time.

#5 Have a contact person who will act as liaison between the State Association and National Association in times of crisis. This person should be familiar with National personnel and available to inform and disperse information.

#6 Purchase and provide decals and ID cards that will help our responders gain access to disaster sites.

Criteria for Mobilization:

Help must be requested by a responsible party, i.e. local pastor or state officer.

1. The request must be made to the Moderator, Promotional Director, or another State Officer.

2. The disaster must primarily affect Free Will Baptist people and/or property. It must be the result of one of the above mentioned disasters (we cannot to every call and every case especially if it is not of the magnitude to warrant such response). The decision to respond will be made by the <u>Disaster Response Committee</u>.

Organization:

1. A <u>Disaster Response Committee</u> will include the Promotional Director, President of the Master's Men, State Moderator and four members-atlarge elected for four year terms on a staggered basis so that one is elected each year.

2. The Chairman of the Master's Men will direct the Response Team.

3. The State Moderator will contact personnel when a response is needed.

4. The Promotional Director will serve as the liaison between the National Association and the State Association.

5. Members of the Master's Men will be responsible for the purchase and maintenance of any equipment and/or vehicles dedicated for use during a disaster.

6. The <u>Disaster Response Committee</u> will elect their own Chairman and Treasurer.

7. The Treasurer will deposit and disperse funds at the direction of the Disaster Response Committee. The Treasurer will make an annual financial report to the State Association and will be audited annually.

Article No. 9

This Constitution may be revised or changed at any regular session of the West Virginia State Association provided the change is presented in writing and stated one day before vote is taken.

BY-LAWS

- 1. A portion of the scripture shall be read and prayer be offered at the beginning of each morning and afternoon session of the State Association and prayer shall be offered at the close of each session.
- 2. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator shall call the meeting to order at the hour designated by the program committee. When Moderator nor Assistant is present, the Clerk shall call the meeting to order and elect a Moderator-protem.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the Quarterly Meeting or Yearly Meeting or Association so composing this organization, to send a letter to it giving accurately as possible the information requested by the National Association.
- 4. Not over one Deacon shall be appointed on any one committee. Except in case of emergency.
- 5. Only ordained Ministers shall be allowed to moderate this meeting.
- 6. All Sunday School Conventions and State Women's Auxiliaries Convention report to the State Association and their report be received as information.
- 7. In case of controversy regarding parliamentary procedures, Robert's Rules of Order shall be considered as final authority.
- 8. All business except routine shall be brought by Committee, but should the Committee refuse or fail to present to this body any business given it by any member of this State Association, then such business cannot be discussed unless by vote of this body.
- 9. No one shall speak for more than five minutes or more than twice on the same subject without the consent of the Moderator.
- 10. Each Conference shall have its letter and finance report sent to the State Association Clerk on or before May 24th, that the Executive Board may examine them the week prior to the State Meeting.
- 11. Any member of this body can appeal from the decision of the Moderator to the body and by a two thirds majority of all members present, thereon. This decision shall be sustained or rejected.
- 12. No one shall leave the body without consent of the Moderator. Anyone deciding to speak shall arise and say "Brother Moderator" and shall not speak further until he or she is recognized by the Moderator. The Moderator shall stop all discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or think it will lead to discord or division.

BY-LAWS CONTINUED

- 13. This State Association shall correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 14. The same person or group of persons shall not serve on more than one standing Board or Committee as long as it can be supplies otherwise.
- 15. Not less than three (3) Gospel Sermons shall be preached at any one session of the West Virginia State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 16. No person shall be elected to any office without being present, except the Executive Board. (The member is recommended by the Quarterly Conference).
- 17. The Moderator shall be elected at the close of each two year session on Saturday, and shall serve until his successor is elected at the same time the following two years.
- 18. No Ministers, Deacons or Delegates shall be permitted to vote that is a known Homosexual, Bi-Sexual or Lesbian in this State Association. The State Association will not retain any persons known to be such.
- The Officers of the State Association shall receive an honorarium as follows: Moderator - \$50.00. Assistant Moderator - \$25.00. Clerk - \$300.00.
- 20. The member of the General Board of the National Association, the Moderator, the Assistant Moderator, the Promotional Director, the Treasurer, the Assistant Treasurer, the Clerk, and the Assistant Clerk shall receive \$400.00 when the National Association convenes East of the Mississippi River, and \$600.00 West of the Mississippi River. \$300.00 annually to National Leadership Conference.
- 21. Any Minister having voting privileges in the State Association must have a good standing card issued by the State Association.
- 22. Any ordained or licensed Free Will Baptist Minister that assumes the position as Pastor of a church whose general doctrine teaches or advocates second works of grace, eternal security, or speaking in tongues must immediately surrender his ordination papers or license to the Conference of issuance.
- 23. These By-Laws may be changed or revised at any regular session of the State Association provided that they be plainly written and stated one day before vote is taken.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Revised Promotional Directors Job Description, as presented.

Article No. 3 (continued)

I. Promotional Director – It shall be the duty of the Promotional Director to strive for the enlistment of new Conferences and Associations into membership of the West Virginia State Association. To promote the works of this State Association first, and the work of Free Will Baptists in new fields. The office of Promotional Director shall not be used to settle disputes between brethren and Conferences.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

POSITION:	Promotional Director.
<u>FUNCTION:</u>	To promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist. To actively interface with WV FWB Conferences and Churches. To promote the WV State Association and its works to other FWB State Associations, Colleges, and National Organizations. To maintain an office for the WV State Association.
<u>ORGANIZATION</u> RELATIONSHIPS:	The office of the Promotional Director shall be filled, supported and supervised by the Executive Committee of the West Virginia State Association. The Executive Committee may by two-thirds vote modify the duties of the Promotional Director to the State Association.
<u>DUTIES AND</u> RESPNSIBILITIES:	<u>Accountability:</u> The Promotional Director shall provide a written report bimonthly to the Executive Committee and an annual written report to the State Association.
	The Promotional Director shall meet bimonthly with the Executive Committee. The Promotional Director shall present an operating budget for approval to the Executive Committee. Once approved, the Promotional Director shall be responsible to operate the State Office within the budget.
	<u>National Meetings:</u> The Promotional Director, will attend and represent the WV State Association annually at the National Convention and the National Leadership Conference.
	<u>Conference and Church Meetings:</u> The Promotional Director shall attend and represent the WV State Association at as many local Conference/Quarterly Meetings as possible. He shall attend every Conference at least once every two years.

The Promotional Director will make as many Church visits throughout West Virginia as his schedule allows. To promote the works of the WV State Association; to minister to the pastors; and to keep people informed about the issues affecting Free Will Baptists.

Coordination:

The Promotional Director will participate in all WV State Association Board Meetings. To provide general oversight to the Free Will Baptist work in West Virginia and provide insight in regards to National Free Will Baptist issues.

The Promotional Director will work closely with the Publication Board in the publication of the State Paper (*The Messenger*); and have direct impact as to its contents and format. This is to provide consistency in the promotion of West Virginia's Free Will Baptist.

Strategic Goals:

The Promotional Director shall proactively work towards the Strategic Goals defined by the Executive Committee and as listed in the Addendum.

Other Duties:

The Promotional Director will serve as a pastor's role to our WV pastors by counseling and encouraging them. He will also provide resources for them and their flock for their spiritual growth.

The Promotional Director will promote women and youth activities.

The Promotional Director will have a strong emphasis on missions, and promote our WV missionaries.

The Promotional Director will serve on the Co-Op Committee.

The Promotional Director will serve on the Disaster Response Committee, and serve as the liaison between the National Association and the State Association.

The Promotional Director will make himself available to the WV State Boards for special projects and to promote all works sanctioned by the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director will manage the Book Store account.

The Promotional Director will make a verbal report at the State Association.

The Promotional Director will be the states representative to Randall House Publications. He will comply with the promotional guidelines set forth by Randall House as follows:

- Promotional Director to write a minimum of four letters a year for promotion of Randall House Publications in conjunction with our campaigns.
- Promotional Director will attend a minimum of two training events during the year.
- Promotional Director will promote literature and books in churches, conferences, and at the state meetings.
- State will provide a half page in state newsletter for use in promoting Randall House Publications.

The Promotional Director will promote our ministers and provide resources for them such as; training, retirement fund, insurance, church resources, etc.

The Promotional Director will provide connections with all FWB Colleges and provide resources for our young people to attend College.

The Promotional Director will work toward establishing a permanent State Office in the location approved by the WV State Association. It will be used for meetings and a repository for minutes, financial reports, historical records, and other documents of the WV State Association.

The Promotional Director may hold another job for means of additional income; however his employment is not to interfere with his required duties as Promotional Director.

QUALIFICATIONS:

The qualifications of the Promotional Director are as follows:

Must be saved.

Must be an active member of a Free Will Baptist Church associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must currently be an ordained minister from a conference or state associated with the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

Must have been ordained for at least five years and have been in good standing with his Church, Conference, and State Association. Must be willing to transfer by letter his membership and ordination papers to a Church and Conference associated with the WV State Association of Free Will Baptist, if not currently associated with West Virginia.

Must have prior experience in dealing effectively with various denominational groups (such as: Churches, Conferences, State Associations, FWB Colleges, National Organizations, etc.) and the public.

Must have adequate training and experience in business and computers.

CONTRACTUAL ARRANGEMENTS:

The Promotional Director shall have an annual contract effective from July 1 until June 30 of the following year. The contract shall be reviewed, and renewed or cancelled in January for the following year. This will give a minimum of six months notice in case of non-renewal, however, in case the Conference calls for the ordination papers, the Promotional Director will be relieved of duties while investigation and hearing is taking place, and given two month's salary.

Remuneration will consist of: (1) Salary and benefits set annually by mutual agreement of the Executive Committee and the Promotional Director. (2) Expense reimbursement for attending the National Association \$400, plus \$400 east, or \$600 west of the Mississippi River, and the National Leadership Conference (\$450). (3) Shall have two week's vacation after one year of employment, and have three week's vacation after five years of employment.



NOTES

Who are Free Will Baptists?

Free Will Baptist roots can be traced to England as early as 1611. The first FWB church in America was begun by Paul Palmer in 1727 in Perquimans County, North Carolina. Some years later, in 1780, under the leadership of Benjamin Randall, Free Will Baptists were established in the northeast at New Durham, New Hampshire. From these early beginnings, Free Will Baptists in America have had a continuing ministry. Today, the National Association of Free Will Baptists is active in 36 states, 13 foreign countries, and a number of the islands of the sea. The work of the National Association is promoted from the National Offices and Randall House Publications located in Nashville, Tennessee.

What Free Will Baptists believe:

- God We believe that God is the Creator, Sustainer, and Righteous Ruler of the universe. He has revealed Himself in nature, and in the Scriptures of the Holy Bible as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit: yet as one God.
- Jesus Christ He is God's unique Son; the only one of a kind. The Scripture teaches that He is God revealed in flesh. In His Divine nature He is truly God and in His human nature truly man. He is the One once crucified for man's sin, the now risen and glorified Savior and Lord who mediates between God and man and who gives us access to the Father through His intercession. None can come to the Father unless they come through Him.
- Holy Spirit All of the attributes of God are ascribed to the Holy Spirit by the Scriptures. It is He who convicts and convinces men of their sin. He also convinces man of that which is right, and that a final day of judgment will come. He, it is, who comes to live in us at conversion, to open our understanding to the Scripture, and to lead us into the truth.
- The Bible God used holy men to write the Scriptures. They are, in both the Old and New Testaments, the very words God intended us to have. They are, as given by God, without error and are our only rule of faith and practice. We profit from them by learning the truth about many things: they also speak to us about wrong doing; they even correct us and get us back on course as well as instructing us in right living.
- Man God created man in a state of innocence. Man, being tempted by Satan, yielded and willfully disobeyed God, becoming a sinner and incurring God's judgment upon sin. All of Adam's descendants inherit his fallen nature and thus have a natural inclination to sin. When one comes to an age of accountability, he is guilty of sinning before God and in need of salvation.
- God's Relationship to His Creatures and Creation God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and things. He maintains the laws

- of nature and performs special acts as the highest welfare of mankind and His created order of things require.
- Salvation Man receives pardon and forgiveness for his sins when he admits to God that he is a sinner, when in godly sorrow he turns from them and trusts in the work of Christ as redemption for his sin. This acceptance of God's great salvation involves belief in Christ's death on the cross as man's substitute and the fact of God's raising Him from the dead as predicted. It is a salvation by grace alone and not of works.
- Who Can be Saved? It is God's will that all be saved, but since man has the power of choice, God saves only those who repent of their sin and believe in the work of Christ on the cross. Those who refuse in this life to repent and believe have no later chance to be saved and thus condemn themselves to eternal damnation by their unbelief.
- **Perseverance** We believe that there are strong grounds to hope that the saved will persevere unto the end and be saved because of the power of divine grace pledged for their support. We believe that any saved person who has sinned (whether we call him a backslider or sinner), but has a desire to repent, may do so and be restored to God's favor and fellowship. Since man, however, continues to have free choice, it is possible because of temptations and the weakness of human flesh for him to fall into the practice of sin and to make shipwreck of his faith and be lost.
- **Gospel Ordinances** Free Will Baptists believe the Bible teaches three ordinances for the church to practice: Baptism in water by immersion, the Lord's Supper, to be perpetuated until His return, and the Washing of the Saints' feet, an ordinance teaching humility.
- **Resurrection** Free Will Baptists believe the Scriptures teach the resurrection of the bodies of all men, each in its own order; they that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil to the resurrection of damnation.
- **Church Government** Free Will Baptist churches enjoy local church autonomy (self-governing). The local church is the highest authority in the denomination. Local churches voluntarily organize themselves into quarterly meetings, district, state, and national associations for the purpose of promoting the cause of Christ on the local, state, district, national, and world-wide level.
- **Christ's Second Coming** The Bible teaches that Jesus Christ, who ascended on high and sits at the right hand of God, will come again to close the Gospel dispensation, glorify His saints, and judge the world.
- **Missions** Free Will Baptists believe that Jesus commanded the church to go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature. For an in-depth study of Free Will Baptist beliefs and practices, ask for a copy of the Free Will Baptist *Treatise*.

A Brief History of Free Will Baptist

The Free Will Baptist denomination is a fellowship of evangelical believers united in extending the witness of Christ and the building of His Church throughout the world. The rise of Free Will Baptists can be traced to the influence of Baptists of Arminian persuasion who settled in the colonies from England.

The denomination sprang up on two fronts at almost the same time. The southern line, or Palmer movement, traces its beginnings to the year 1727 when one Paul Palmer organized a church at Chowan, North Carolina. Palmer had previously ministered in New Jersey and Maryland, having been baptized in a congregation which had moved from Wales to a trace on the Delaware River in northern Pennsylvania.

The northern line, or Randall movement, had its beginnings with a congregation organized by Benjamin Randall June 30, 1780, in New Durham, New Hampshire. Both lines of Free Will Baptists taught the doctrines of free grace, free salvation and free will, although from the first there was no organizational connection between them.

The northern line expanded more rapidly in the beginning and extended its outreach into the West and Southwest. In 1910-1911 this body of Free Will Baptists merged with the Northern Baptist denomination, taking along more than half its 1,100 churches and all denominational property, including several major colleges. On December 28, 1916, at Pattonsburg, Missouri, representatives of remnant churches in the Randall movement reorganized into the Cooperative General Association of Free Will Baptists.

Free Will Baptists in the southeastern United States, having descended from the Palmer foundation, had often manifested fraternal relationships with Free Will Baptists of the Randall movement in the north and west; but the slavery question and the Civil War prevented formal union between them. The churches in the southern line were organized into various associations and conferences from the beginning and had finally organized into a General Conference by 1921. These congregations were not affected by the merger of the northern movement with the Northern Baptists. Now that the remnants of the Randall movement had reorganized into the Cooperative General Association and the Palmer movement had organized into the General Conference, it was inevitable that fusion between these two groups of Free Will Baptists would finally come. In Nashville, Tennessee, on November 5, 1935, representatives of these two groups met and organized the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

This body adopted a Treatise which set forth the basic doctrines and described the faith and practice that had characterized Free Will Baptists through the years. Having been revised on several occasions, it serves as a guideline for a denominational fellowship which comprises more than 2,400 churches in 42 states and 14 foreign countries.

403(b) approved plan

Our 403(b) plan is approved by the IRS for all employees of Free Will Baptist Churches or Church Organizations.

Tax deferred contributions

Take advantage of tax deferred contributions to the Plan. Tax deferred contributions are not to be included in gross "reportable" income for tax purposes. Since the tax deferred contributions and interest are tax deferred, they will only be subject to taxes when the money in your account is distributed to you.

Flexible contributions

One can begin with as little as \$10 monthly. Generally, the maximum contribution allowable is 100% of taxable ministerial income or \$46,000, whichever is less. However, special "catch-up" provisions are available to certain participants. For an explanation of the catch-up provisions, please request Publication 571 from your nearest IRS office, or contact the Board of Retirement.

Personal and employer contributions

Participants may contribute personal "after-tax" funds. These contributions must be made by personal check or automatic bank dra't from the participant's personal checking account. Contributions can also be made by Salary Reduction or by direct contributions from the employer, i.e. the church or church-related entity. The employer (church/church agency) is permitted to contribute to the participant's retirement account as an added compensation benefit without such being taxable to the participant. All church checks must be payable to the Board of Retirement. NO PERSONAL CHECKS CAN BE ACCEPTED FOR SALARY REDUCTION OR EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS.

Other funds that may be available

Participants may find other funds available to them through State Association plans, (Check with your state leaders) and with the Randall House Rewards Program where a percentage of your Sunday School curriculum order is deposited into your account.

DISTRIBUTION OPTIONS

HOW WOULD YOU LIKE YOUR MONEY?

TOTAL LUMP SUM DISTRIBUTION

Mandatory 20% income tax withholding applies on tax deferred funds as required by the IRS.

PARTIAL WITHDRAWAL

Mandatory 20% income tax withholding applies and you must meet minimum distribution requirements.

INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS

An amortized distribution for a specified period of a minimum of 12 months up to a maximum of 120 months not to exceed a single or joint life expectancy.

ROLLOVER

Direct rollover of your account into an Individual Retirement Account (IRA), another 403(b) plan, a 401(k) plan, or another type of retirement account.

ANNUITY

Pays a monthly income for life. There are currently six types of annuities offered by the Board of Retirement that can be specially packaged to meet your need.

WHICH WITHDRAWAL OPTION IS BEST?

This is a question that each individual member must answer. In most cases it is best to defer distributions as long as possible. In addition, ministers should be aware that distribution under the installment payment option may be excludable from federal income taxes under the ministerial housing allowance exclusion.

IF I SHOULD DIE, WILL MY SPOUSE RECEIVE THE BENEFIT?

In the event of the death of the participant, generally, the surviving spouse has the same distribution options as the participant. If the participant and spouse die before accumulations are withdrawn, all benefits are paid to the secondary beneficiary or to the participant's estate.

As a general rule, allowable distributions from your 403(b) retirement plan may begin as early as age 62 or no later than age 70½ (unless you continue to work after 70½). Please keep in mind that you may defer making a decision regarding distribution option until age 70½ or until you retire if you are 70½ or older.

The Tax Reform Act of 1986 made required minimum distributions at age 70½ applicable to the Board of Retirement's Plan; however, members of the Board of Retirement Plan may delay required distributions beyond age 70½ if the participant remains employed by the Church. In this situation, required distributions must begin by April 1 of the calendar year following the actual date of the participant's retirement. The law imposes a 50% penalty (plus any applicable taxes) on distributions that all to meet the minimum distribution requirements.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who is eligible to participate in the Board of Retirement Pension Plan?

All ministers and missionaries, as well as other employees who receive compensation from local Free Will Baptist churches or agencies. All participants must be U.S. citizens.

When is my money available to me under the Board of Retirement Pension Plan?

Funds are available when a participant attains age 62. Limited circumstances may allow earlier withdrawals.

Do I have to retire in order to receive my benefits at age 62? No, you do not have to retire in order to close your account once you reach age 62.

Are my pension benefits taxable?

Benefits paid to an eligible minister can be designated as a tax-free housing allowance, subject to IRS rules (See IRS Publication 517 for more details). This is usually not available with other retirement plans. For non-ministers, distributions are taxable when received by the participant.

What if I become disabled before reaching retirement age? If you are declared totally and permanently disabled, your account balance is immediately available for distribution through one of the settlement options discussed in this brochure.

What happens to my account if I die before I retire?

If you are married, your spouse (or other beneficiary) will receive all the money in your account. If your spouse is deceased (or if you are not married), the beneficiaries you have named will receive the amount accumulated in your account. If you fail to designate a beneficiary, the remaining accumulations will be paid to your estate.

May I make a contribution in the year that I file my tax return to reduce my taxes for a previous year? No, all contributions must be received by the Board of Retirement no later than December 31 of each calendar year.

Is there a provision for "rollovers" from another plan? You can roll money into your retirement account from other 403(b) or 401(k) plans or from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). Please contact the Board of Retirement to obtain the proper forms to allow for such a "rollover" of funds.

Does my spouse have to be the primary beneficiary? Yes, unless your spouse signs a spousal waiver or a



Qualified Domestic Relations Order is in place. Others may be named as secondary beneficiaries.

Is there a maximum amount that I can contribute yearly?

With some stipulations a participant in the Board of Retirement Plan can contribute up to 100% of his/her compensation. A worksheet is available from the Board to calculate contribution limits.

If I contribute through the Salary Reduction Agreement method and change employers, what is the proper procedure? A new Salary Reduction Agreement Form must be completed with the clerk/treasurer of the new congregation or employer.

Is my retirement account guaranteed by any agency of the federal government?

No, the Board of Retirement's Plan is not insured or guaranteed by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or any other government agency.

What types of companies will my money be invested in? Investments are not permissible in any company that is publicly recognized as being in the liquor, tobacco, gambling, pornography or any company whose products, services or activities are publicly recognized as being incompatible with the moral and ethical posture of the Board of Retirement. The funds may not be able to take advantage of certain investment opportunities due to these restrictions.

Does my employer have to contribute?

Your employer is strongly encouraged to contribute to your retirement plan but is not required to do so.

- In October we started offering a Divorce Care ministry, in an effort to reach out to the hurting of the community, with the Gospel.
- The response was astounding as we received 20-25 phone calls (mostly men) about it and a local newspaper even did a story on our church and the ministry we were offering.
- This winter, we had over 100" of snow and our kids missed 3 total days of school (a shock to them and to us)
- We began looking for a meeting place in January and we were turned down by 10 different locations, including fire departments, empty office buildings, schools, senior centers, etc.
- Our first service was scheduled for Easter Sunday and by March 1st, we still had no meeting place.
- We finally contacted an AmVets Hall about renting their facilities. Typically, these either serve as a bar and/or a bingo hall. They agreed, however, to let us remove all the alcohol for our service and we hung up shower curtains to block off the bar area.
- On Easter Sunday, our first service, we had 52 people in attendance and the Gospel was preached in Satan's dwelling place!
- Our second service was on May 22, 2011, at Cayuga Heights Elementary School with 35 people present and 2 salvation decisions.
- Tim and Amanda York will join us soon and we will begin offering American Sign Language interpretation of our services to 3,000-5,000 deaf people in the immediate Buffalo area. (There are as many as 30,000-50,000 deaf people within a 100 mile radius). Virtually no church or denomination is targeting them in their language. Our goal is to eventually establish the 1st Deaf Free Will Baptist Church in Buffalo.

- Is missions worth it?

- *Our first convert in Buffalo was Jim Dobo. He passed away recently and I preached his funeral. He is now in heaven! Yes it is worth it!
- * I recently gave a 45 year old man his first Bible and he is reading it! Yes it is worth it!
- * One of our attendees nearly died recently and she said to me, "I can't imagine how I could have gotten through this without my church family. Again we say, yes it is worth it!

Pray for us as we seek to impact Buffalo, NY with the good news of Jesus Christ!!!


