PROCEEDINGS

—OF THE—

WESTERN CONFERENCE.

The Twenty-first Session of the Western Conference, of the Original Free Will Baptist convened with the church at Marsh Swamp, N. C., Oct. 17th, 1907.

Eld. E. T. Phillips who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, attended and preached.—Text: St. John 1: 35. "What seek ye?"

After an intermission of one hour, conference was duly organized, by electing Eld. B. B. Deans moderator, Eld. Curtis Howell, assistant moderator.

Eld. E. T. Phillips, Secretary, who called to his assistance Eld. R. F. Pittman.

The following committees were appointed:

Devotional—J. W. Barnes, C. A. Brame, and Robt. Deans.

Finance—R. A. Boyette, John W. Wood and Jerry Crumpler.

Mission Fund—W. B. Vail.

Disabled Ministers Fund—L. P. Mazingo.

Temperance—J. W. Vandiford, F. C. Fitzgerald, and J. H. Newsome.

Sunday School—W. M. Howell, W. H. Collins, and Sister J. W. Barnes.

Education—Elds. W. M. Bagley, W. B. Everett and S. W. Jones.

Mission Committee—B. H. Pate, B. W. Tippet and J. K. Ruffin.

Text Recorder—Miss Elva Deans.

Ministerial Committee—Geo. W. Davis, B. H. Pate, J. K. Ruffin, C. E. Brame and W. M. Howell.

After the organization and singing by the congregation, prayers were offered by Elds. A. R. Flowers, W. B. Everett and S. W. Jones.

On motion we empower the moderator, to invite visiting brethren of our denomination, and others as he may see fit to seats in the body.

The following were enrolled from the different conferences:

Central—J. H. Whitley and R. I. Corbitt.

Cape Fear—Eld. M. R. Allen.

South Carolina—Eld. W. E. Gibbons.

Eld. W. E. Gibbons, of the South Carolina Conference, made some remarks that were encouraging from his conference, they were well received by the brotherhood.

Eld. M. R. Allen, of the Cape Fear Conference, made some appropriate remarks, that were well received.

List of ministers was called, and their Christian conduct enquired into.

Elds. J. W. Valentine, J. K. Ruffin, and B. W. Tippet, were appointed to write a biographical sketch of Eld. C. C. King, to appear in the minutes.

The names of C. S. Churchill and W. C. Stuart, were referred to the ministerial committee, also J. W. Stancill licentiate.

On motion, the name of J. W. Wood, of Louisburg, No. 4, be enrolled on the list of licentiate ministers.

On motion, the name of Eld. W. A. Benson, Dudley, N. C., No. 1, be restored to the list of ordained ministers.

Devotional committee report: R. F. Pittman open, and W. M. Howell preach tonight, Eld. W. E. Gibbons preach tomorrow morning.

On motion conference close until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock.

Prayer by Eld. M. R. Allen; praise by the congregation.

Friday Morning.

Conference met as per adjournment. Praise by the congregation, and prayer by Eld. G. W. Davis.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

Letters were read from Elds. P. T. Lucas, H. E. Martin, J. S. Thompson, and W. R. Holder, and were received by the body.

On motion we empower Eld. P. T. Lucas to write any literature that he may see proper, for the good of the order, and distribute the same among the people at large, and that he be allowed, what he may make from the proceeds, same to be in accord with the views of this conference.

The list of churches was called. (See Table of Statistics.)

On motion the name of Union Hill church be dropped from the list.

On motion we recognize Vaughn's Hill as a mission point, and send them twenty-five cents worth of minutes.

On motion, we receive the report of G. W. Ferrell from Wendell church, and drop the work at that point for the present as a mission point. (Not adopted.)

Devotional committee report: W. H. Collins open, M. R. Allen preach this evening. Tonight J. W. Wood open and R. I. Corbett preach.

On motion, Union Hope church, Franklin county, be dropped from the list of churches.

On motion, Christian Hope church, Warren county, be dropped from the list of churches.

On motion, the land of Christian Hope church be given to Eld. J. W. Valentine, to make such disposition of as he may see fit.

The committee that was appointed to confer with committee from Flood's Chapel, are extended for another year, and asked to report at the next conference.

On motion by Eld. J. W. Valentine, all ministers elected to the pastoral care of the churches in the Western conference, shall take charge of their work at said

churches, at the first appointment after the conference meets and hold in charge until the last appointment before the annual conference meets.

On motion, Eld. R. F. Pittman fill the vacancy caused by the death of Eld. C. C. King, on the list of the examining board for ministers.

Finance committees report:

Saturday Morning.

Conference met pursuant to adjournment, prayer by Eld. A. B. Utley, praise by the congregation. Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

Devotional committee report that W. B. Everett open, and S. W. Jones preach this morning. Geo. W. Davis open, and A. B. Utley preach this evening.

Eld. W. B. Everett is appointed to take in the license and credentials of C. S. Churchill. Eld. L. T. Phillips, was appointed to take in the license of W. C. Stuart, and J. W. Stancill licentiates.

On motion Eld. W. E. Anderson is elected on the educational board.

Committee Reports.

The following committee reports, were read, discussed, and adopted.

TEMPERANCE—We your committee on temperance beg leave to submit the following:

Be it Resolved. 1st. That this conference will not tolerate intemperance in any form.

2. That we will not recognize any one as a minister of the gospel, who will tolerate intemperance in any form.

3. We will not aid, assist, vote, or support any person for office, who advocates the use, sale, or manufacture of strong drink in any way if we know it.

4. That we advise churches of this conference to especially look well to our interest in stamping out this great evil, among the laity, and report to our ministerial committee, any minister who fails to abide by these resolutions.

5. That we as the church of God, do all that we can in using our influence, to get this evil from before our people.

5. That we insist upon our people, to subscribe for, and read our church organ, The FREE WILL BAPTIST, and that our Sunday Schools use our own literature, published by the Free Will Baptist Pub. Co.

6. That we ask our ministers, both in and out of school, to study carefully the Bible, so that they may be approved unto God.

son whom we may know to be in harmony with the workings of our church.
