## **PROCEEDINGS**

The Twenty Sixth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of N. C. met with the church at Kenly, N. C. Oct. 17th, 1912.

Eld. E. T. Phillips preached the introductory sermon,

Gal. 6: 2. "Bear ye one anothers burdens."

After an intermission, the body reassembled and elected D. B. Sasser Moderator, who called to his assistance, Eld. W. M. Howell. Eld. E. T. Phillips was elected secretary who called to his assistance Eld. R. F. Pittman.

On motion, we reinstate Pine Level church to its former position.

On motion, the church at Mt. Zion, Wilson County, be received into the body.

On motion, the church at Sandy Plain, Henderson County be received and entered on the minutes.

On motion a committee of five be appointed to investigate the question of receiving Plain View church into the body and jno. W. Wood having his license restored.

The following committee was appointed: J. W. Valentine, Ed. Wood, J. K. Ruffin, J. H. Whitley, D. U. Oliver.

Devotional Committee report that Luke Wetherington open and S B. Scalf preach to night.

On motion, J. W. Barnes be elected treasurer for 1913. On motion conference close until Friday morning at 9:30.

Prayer by Eld. G. C. Vause. Praise by the congregation.

### FRIDAY MORNING SESSION.

Conference met as per adjournment. Reading Scripture by moderator. Prayer by Eld. W. B. Everett.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved. The list of ministers was called.

On motion Elds. F. M. Hinton and S. B. Norton he excommunicated from the conference for having departed from the faith.

On motion, Bro. Calvin Strickland call for license and

credentials of F. M. Hinton and L. M. Mitchell obtain those of S. B. Norton.

On motion, a committee be appointed to write an obituary of Eld. P. T. Lucas. The following were appointed: B. B. Deans, G. W. Ferrell, J. H. Newsome.

On motion, a committee be appointed to write an obituary of Eld. J. R. Watson. The following were appointed: L. T. Phillips, J. R. McCaskey, J. W. Alford.

On motion, T. C. Marks of Durham be referred to the examining board of the conference

On motion, H. W. Johnson of Henderson be referred to the examining board.

On motion, the name of N D. Wiggs be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

Report of receiving Plain View church into the conference and restoring license of Jno. W. Wood was favorably reported.

On motion the moderator and secretary of this conference furnish Jno. W. Wood with license.

Devotional committee report that J. K. Ruffin open and B. B. Deans preach in the Presbyterian church to-day 11 o'clock.

On motion, L. T. Phillips and G. W. Ferrell be a committee to go to Hill Chapel in Henderson and with a committee of three from that church investigate the work of J. A. Robinson and report to this body next year.

On motion this body endorse the action of the ministers meeting and union conference in regard to the establishment of an orphange.

The following resolution by Eld. J. H. Whitley was adopted:

Be it resolved, That no minister be recognized as member of this conference that is not a member of some church belonging to this conference, or a church or

conference that we recognize as the Original Free Will

The chairman ruled as to the Pine Level church, that all ministers and members that had not been enrolled on the church b ok of the old church building were not members of this conference.

On motion, the matter between Elds. Ferrell and Valentine be referred to the ministerial committee.

Eld. R. F. Pittman was appointed to represent this conference in the committee to belp get out a hymnal which committee is to meet at Hull Road church at the time of the Central Conference.

On motion, the moderator appoint a committee of five to receive the reports from the different churches, at any time during recess or any other time without condicting with the conference business and when the acport is complete present the same to the conference.

Devotional committee report that J. C. Griffin open and W. B. Everett preach at 3 o'clock this evening in the Presbyterian church. Tonight: A. B. Utky open and G. C. Vause preach at the church.

On motion, the church at Rock Spring, Wake county, the referred to the trustees of the conference to dispose of as they see fit.

On motion this conference endorse the action of the Ministers' Meeting and Union Conference in constituting the same into a state convention.

The following report was adopted:

We hereby recommend that the case between Elds. Valentine and Z. P. Ferrell be referred to the committee that was appointed to investigate the conditions that

exist at Henderson. Also we suggest that conference appoint another committeman in place of Eld. Valentine.

## SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met as per adjournment. Praise and prayer by Eld. A. R. Flowers. Minutes of Friday read and approved.

On motion, J. L. Ruffin be added to the committee to. investigate matters at Hills Chapel at Henderson, N. C.

On motion, the committee that is appointed to go to Henderson report through the Baptist.

Reports from the various committees were called for-(See reports of committees).

D. B. Sasser and E. T. Phillips were elected trustees. of the Seminary from the Western Conference for the ensuing year.

J. W. Jomp of Lucama, was appointed in place of P. T. Lucas deceased on the committee to look after the Disabled Ministers' fund.

Devotional committee report that A. R. Flowers open and W. B Everett preach this morning. This evening at the Presbyterian church: W. M. Howell open and W. E. Anderson preach.

Sunday at 11 o'clock, E. T. Phillips preach at the Presbyterian church and G. C. Vause at the church here.

The following were appointed a permanent Orphanage committee: J. E Davis, L. T. Phillips, Geo. W. Ferrell, J. W. Barnes, J. W. Iomp, W. T. Kirby.

On motion the trustees of the conference give the

Warren County.

A letter was read from the pastor of the M. E. Church tendering the church to the use of this body.

A vote of thanks was tendered to both the Methedist and the Presbyterians for their liberality toward this body.

The church at Rocky Chapel was referred to the second union meeting district for their consideration.

The trustees of the conference were asked to look after the property of Old Sandy Hill in Wilson County.

On motion the trustees of the Seminary for the coming year for the Western Conference, apportion the amount of the financial needs of the institution among the various churches and report to each as early as possible, the Western Conference agreeing to share its wart of the entire indebtedness.

and encourage the deacons in this great work.

3. We ask all our conferences and associations to appoint two or more corresponding committees from their bodies to conter with each other in regard to the location of said orphanage. Also that they see what inducements may be offered by different places and report same at the state convention.

4. That said conferring committee keep each other and our people posted on these various matters

through the paper.

The subject of this sketch was born in the western part of Wilson county, July 28th, 1863 Was a son of Wm. and Pennie Watson and one among several children a number of whom are yet living in and around Kenly. On the 14th of February he was married to Miss Martha E. Edgerton. To them were born six children which survive him. Bro. Watson gave his heart to God in the year 1881 joining the church at Biolly Springs. Was licensed and ordained to the ministry in 1886. He was a quiet farmer and liked a peacable retired life for the most part. Was honored and loved by those who knew him. He was instrumental in bringing many to Christ and surely a bright frown is his in the world beyond the skies in the year 1912 on October 2nd, he was called from labor to reward. May God comfort the bereft family and may we all meet him in the happy land beyond.

By Committee. SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF ELDER P. T. LUCAS.

The subject of this sketch was born near Lucama, Wilson county, on the 8th day of September, 1854, and died near place of his birth on the 2nd day of July, 1912,

making his stay on earth near 5 \ vears; was the son of Silas and Martha Lucas of well known repute. He leaves one sister and five brothers. He was one of the charter members of Little Rock church and united under the p eaching of Elder D niel Davis in 1872. He was licensed to preach Aug. 17th, 1877, and was ordained to the ministry Aug. 30th, 1884, at Holy Springs church, Johnston county, the presbytery being Elders Daniel Davis, J. H. Worley, and B. H. Boykin. He was married in January, 1877 to Miss Frances Newsome. To them were born twelvechildren: Mary Etta, Martha Ellen, Minnie Effie, Lou Emma, Malachi Daniel, Loutoria, John Patrick, Cora Elizaberh, Loyd Thomas, Sadie Frances, Silas Redding and Earnest Carr. Lou Emma died in nfancy and Malachi Daniel died after being married some time. The married children are Mrs. Sidney Rentfrow, Mrs. J. J. Morris, Mrs. A. M. Branch and John P. Lucas.

Elder Lucas was sick twelve months or more prior to his death and was confined to his bed four months. His emains were laid to rest in the Lucas burying ground on July 3rd. Funeral services were conducted by Elders L. T. Phillips and G W. Ferrell. He was buried with the honors of the Masonic order of which he was an honored member He preached his last sermon at Marsh Swamp church on the first Sunday in

March. 1912.

Truly Elder Lucas was one of God's noblemen. He grew up a dutiful and worthy son In his domestic life he was a devoted husband and loving father. He provided well for his household and through toil and honest effort accumulated a good living and left his family in good circumstances Above all he was devoted to the work of his heavenly Father and has left a glorious heritage in a life full of good works He went far and near to carry the good news of salvation, and when he reached the heavenly throne there must have been many stars to ad rn his worthy crown He had great faith in God and many were born into the kingdom under his ministry. May we all meet him in the celestial land and with him and his enjoy the rich felicities of heaven.
