The Twenty-Seventh Annual Session of the Western Conference, met with the church at Spring Hill, Wayne County, on October 16th, 1913.

Eld. R. F. Pittman, who was appointed, preached the Introductory Sermon, text: Eph. 5.18. "Be ye filled

with the Holy Spirit."

On motion the resolution passed at the last conference in regard to receiving the funds by the Finance Committee be recinded, and we follow the plan of previous years.

After the organization, prayer was offered by Eld. E.

T. Phillips.

Cn motion, we empower the Moderator to invite the visitors from other Conferences to seats with us.

Eld G. C. Vause of the Central Conference was invited and made a few short and appropriate remarks. Mrs. Frances Barfield of the Central was also welcomed.

Prof. J. E. Sawyer of the Eastern was made welcome. The alternates addressed the body. Eld J. F. Carey and J. F. Hill from the Cape Fear were extended a welcome.

The roll of the ministers was called and their Chris-

tian conduct inquired into.

On motion each one of our ministers, who has departed from the faith be dealt with by the ministerial Committee, and they report to this Conference.

On motion Eld. Z. P. Ferrell write an obituary of

Albert Roberson to appear in the Minutes.

Devotional Committee reported that N. B. Wall open

and G. C. Vause, preach to night at 7:30 o'clock.

On motion G. C. Vause be invited to preach to as many churches as he can in the Western Conference On motion, Conference close until 9:30 a. m., Friday Benediction by Eld. J. H. Whitley,

FRIDAY-Morning Session.

Conferece met as per adjournment. Praise by Con-

gregation. Prayer by Eld S. P. Scalf.

The resolution passed at Eastern Conference for change in Book of Discipline (Sec. 6 Art. 2.) was lost.

On motion by Eld B. W. Tippett the trustees of the Western Conference give the proceeds from Rock Springs Church, Wake County to Level Grove Church in the same County.

On motion, a Committee composed of Eld. L. T. Phillips and W. M. Howell be appointed to dispose of Neuse Chapel and devote the proceeds to the First Union meeting district of this Conference.

On motion, we consider the condition of Princeton

Church and come to some conclusion at once.

On motion, this Conference pay off the debt of Princeton Church.

On Motion, Eld. G. C. Vause go as early as possible and investigate the condition of Princeton Church.

On motion, Conference draw on mission funds to

settle debt on Princeton Church.

On motion of Eld. J. W. Valentine, this Conference appoint an executive Committee of five Ministers to look after the interests of all churches and ministers that may need any special care from the Conference at any time between sessions of the Conference.

and A. R. Flowers.

FRIDAY—AFTERNOON SESSION.

Met at 1:20.

The report of the Educational Committee was read

and adopted. (See report of committee.)

Devotional Committee reported as follows: J. W. Valentine open and J. F. Hill preach at 2:30; J. H. Whitey open and J. C. Griffin preach at 7:30.

On motion, D. B. Sasser be made permanent Moderator of this Conference. A collection was taken for the school amounting to \$16.15. Pledges were made to the

amount of \$285.00.

Eld. A. R. Flowers was elected to work churches and solicit individuals in the interest of the school for next year.

On motion we allow Eld. A. R. Flowers \$50.00 for his services in raising funds for the school the next

year.

List of churches called for and reports read. (See table of statistics.)

On motion, all educational money be sent to the Sem-

inary.

On motion, Conference close until Saturday a. m., at 9:30 o'clock. Benediction by Eld. J. E. Davis.

SATURDAY-MORNING SESSION.

Conference met as per adjournment. Praise and prayer by Eld.J. C. Griffin. Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

On motion, Conference receive license of Henry Rent-

frow and destroy the same.

On motion, Eld. L. T. Phillips make report to Conference that he was to make through the Baptist paper.

The report is as follows: We your Committee appointed to investigate the matter between J. W. Valentine, Z. P. Ferrell and the church at Henderson find that the statement make by J. W. Valentine through the 'Baptist' was correct, that the said Z. P. Ferrell and Hills Chapel at Henderson acknowledge that they had done wrong and ask forgiveness, and we forgave them with the understanding that they were not to do so any more.

Committee L. T. Philips, J. K. Ruffin.

On motion, the license and credentials of F. M. Hinton and S. B. Norton be destroyed.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the treasure and he report.

E. T. Phillips and D. B. Sasser were re-elected trustees of the Ayden Seminary for the coming year.

Devotional Committee report that S. D. Scalf open and G. W. Ferrell preach to-day.

Eld J. E. Davis made a verbal report in regard to an orphanage, which was very appropriate and forceful, advising the support of the same.

On motion, we re-consider the motion to pay off the church debt at Princeton.

Devotional Committee report L. T. Phillips preach to night at 7:30 and Eld. A. R. Flowers to-morrow at 11 a. m.

On motion we appoint a Committee composed of A. J. Fitzgerald, L. T. Phillips, and Cyrus Johnson with the understanding that the money raised on Friday for Princeton church be turned over to them. That they investigate affairs and dispose of the means as they may see best.

EDUCATION.

We your committee on education beg leave to submit

the following report:

Realizing the great need of education and the interest we ought to take in our School at Ayden, in order to help supply this need. Be it Resolved,

(1) That we do all we can both by precept and example towards supporting and patronizing our school.

(2) Knowing the urgent needs for the sum of \$8,660.00 in order to secure the donation of \$4,330.00 from the town of Ayden, and that the present needs of the school demand an expenditure of about \$10,000 in

improvements, in order to meet the demands made upon the school. We heartily recommend that the Western Conference put forth the following efforts to raise \$3,000.00 within the next two years, said \$3,000 being an equal share as part we ought to raise. The said two years being the time required for the whole amount to be raised, in order that we secure the Ayden donation.

(3) First, that we raise all the cash we can during the sitting of the present session of this Conference, Second, that we ask for all the pledges we can get during this conference from individuals, ministers and

delegates.

Third, That we ask ministers and delegates to pledge amounts for their churches during this Conference.

Fourth, that we request ministers and delegates when they return to their respective churches to present this matter as it is to their churches and make all reasonable efforts to secure cash and pledges. Pledges

to be paid as fast as possible.

Fifth, that this Conference appoint one of its members, whose duty it shall be to receive all money raised for this purpose, to make an effort to have this matter properly brought before all our churches, and their membership, both by personal work and in visiting and corresponding, also to solicit cash donations and pledges from individuals and that he make a monthly statement through the "Baptist" of what is being accomplished.

That we do not lose sight of the great educational value of our church organ THE FREE WILL BAPTIST that we, at this trying hour of its history, do all that we can to encourage it with our partonage and means, that it may continue to grow and be a great power in

our development for good.
