



PROCEEDINGS

The Twenty-Eighth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina met with the church at Holly Springs, Johnston county, October 15th; 1914.

Eld. W. B. Everett, who was appointed, preached the introductory sermon. Subject: "Needs of the Free Will Baptist in North Carolina."

After a recess of one hour, conference met in regular session. Prayer was offered by Eld. J. W. Cox.

The organization was perfected by electing Eld. L. T. Phillips Moderator, who called to his assistance Eld. R. F. Pittman. Eld. E. T. Phillips was elected clerk and B. H. Pate reading clerk.

The organization being perfected, prayer was offered by Eld. G. W. Ferrell. All visiting brethren were invited to seats in the body.

Eld. J. T. Butler was present from the Central Conference and made some very interesting remarks.

The list of ministers was called and the Christian conduct of each inquired into.

It was found that two of the ministers had died during the year, namely, G. C. Mills and J. W. Wood.

Elds. B. W. Tippett and W. E. Anderson were appointed to write the obituary of G. C. Mills.

Elds. J. W. Valentine and B. W. Tippett were appointed to write the obituary of J. W. Wood.

On motion, N. D. Wiggs and R. B. Carroll go before the examining board for admission into the conference.

On motion the name of Robert Henderson be entered on the list of licensed ministers.

Devotional Committee report that Z. P. Ferrell open and S. D. Scalf preach tonight.

On motion, the hour following 11 A. M. Friday be given to the consideration of our publishing house and that J. W. Valentine and E. T. Phillips address the meeting.

On motion the meeting adjourn to meet Friday at 9 o'clock A. M.

FRIDAY MORNING, October 16th.—Met as per adjournment. Prayer by N. D. Wiggs. Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

The list of churches was called. (See table of Statistics.) The following churches were ordered dropped from the list of churches: Neuse Chapel, Bethsaida, Sandy Plain at Henderson.

On motion, Hill Chapel at Henderson be discontinued and the property turned over to the trustees of this Conference.

On motion, Cool spring church, Wake county, be turned over to the trustees of this Conference for their disposal.

On motion, the names of the trustees and all standing officers of the Conference appear on the minutes each year.

Devotional Committee report that Robert Henderson open and A. B. Utley preach today at the stand.

On motion there be a set of trustees appointed for this Conference. The following were appointed: D. B. Sasser, J. K. Ruffin, J. C. Griffin, B. H. Pate and J. H. Newsome.

On motion, the words "sell and" be inserted after

the word "conference" in resolution relative to Rock Spring church of last Conference.

The subject of our publishing house was taken up and discussed by Elds. E. T. Phillips and J. W. Valentine.

Devotional Committee report that R. B.Carroll open and W. E. Anderson preach at 2:30 P. M.

The following resolutions were offered by Eld. W. B. Everett:

RESOLUTIONS.—"Whereas, Section 6, Article 2 of our discipline gives the power of ordaining preachers to the local churches. And in order that this Conference may have a right to make disposition of our preachers who are disloyal,

Be it Resolved, 1. That said article of our discipline be changed to read as follows: 'After which, if either of those persons (that is the licentiate or the exhorter) is found useful, the church may recommend him for ordination, to an ordaining council consisting of five ministers to the Conference.' This committee shall examine him and if he be found worthy, he may be ordained and the said council shall attend to the ordination by prayer and fasting and through the laying on of the hands of the presbytery, the order shall be accomplished.'

2. That said change be sent to the other conferences for adoption or rejection. (The above resolutions were lost.)

Elds. R. F. Pittman and W. B. Everett offered their resignations as members of the Examining Board. Their resignations were accepted.

Eld. A. R. Flowers was appointed to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of R. F. Pittman; Eld. Geo. W. Ferrell that of W. B. Everett.

Devotional Committee report to preach at the church tonight: J. B. Cox open and L. B. Grice preach. At Micro, J. T. Butler. At Kenly, N. D. Wiggs.

On motion the Conference close until tomorrow at 9 o'clock.

Prayer by J. T. Butler. Benediction by the Moderator.

SATURDAY MORNING, October 17th.—Met as per adjournment. Prayer by Prof. J. E. Sawyer. Minutes of Friday read and approved.

On motion, E. T. Phillips and D. B. Sasser be elected trustees of the Seminary for the ensuing year.

On motion, the pastors of the various churches be requested to take pledges for the Orphanage and report at the next State Convention, this being in conformity with the action of said Convention.

The committee appointed last year to settle matters of last year in regard to the Princeton church, report that all has been settled.

The report of the treasurer was adopted.

On motion the resolution giving Rocky Chapel, Nash county, to Union Meeting, be recinded, and same church

be turned over to one man for his disposal.

On motion J. W. Valentine be the man to dispose of Rocky Chapel and he report to the Conference.

Prof. J. E. Sawyer of the Seminary at Ayden, made a strong plea for the education of the children of North Carolina, stating that her children were her greatest assett. He showed how our state had progressed during the last decade, due primarily to the great strides that had been made along the line of education. We are as a state too poor not to educate. What is true of North Carolina as a state is true of the Free Will Baptist as a denomination. Did not blame other denominations for being loyal to their denominational schools. As they are true to theirs and profit thereby, let us be wise and forget not our own interests.

On motion we make D. B. Sasser agent for our Seminary, to work for same during the coming year. That he get receipts for all monies paid in and report the same and also that he employ any help that he may see fit. That he be allowed \$1.50 per day and his expenses, same to be paid out of any funds collected for the above named purpose.

The following resolution by Elder J. C. Griffin was adopted:

RESOLUTION AS TO MINISTERIAL REPORTS.—Resolved, That this Conference require every minister to bring a written report of the work that is under his care, and all other religious work done by said minister in and out of this Conference, stating how many sermons preached, number of visits paid to the sick, how much finance raised for missions, education, and all religious purposes. Also the amount he has received for his services, and the amount expended out of his personal money.

Reports on Temperance, Sunday Schools, Missions, and the Ministerial Report were acted upon. (See reports of Committees.)

Conference called off one hour for dinner.

SATURDAY EVENING.—On motion, the funds that have been sent from each union for disabled minis-

ters, be returned to the union from which they came. (The motion was lost.)

The Devotional Committee report that for this evening at the stand: W. M. Ferrell open and Geo. W. Ferrell preach.

REPORT OF THE EXAMINING BOARD.—The following report of the Examining Board was adopted:

We the examining Board of Ministers, recommend that the following names be enrolled on the list of ordained ministers: N. D. Wiggs, Ayden, N. C.; R. B. Carroll, Bailey, N. C.; E. C. Norris, Clayton, N. C.

RESOLUTIONS BY L. T. PHILLIPS.—(Adopted.)
—Resolved, 1. That the General Conference, by a majority vote shall invest itself with the powers to govern each church and preacher and shall from time to time make such changes in the government of our local churches as would be best for the development of both church and ministry and for the progress of our denomination.

- 2. All meeting houses and property belonging to our connection shall be under the jurisdiction of the Conference or Executive Committee thereof; that is to say, the respective churches shall not dispose of the church or property except by order of the Conference or the Executive Committee thereof.
- 3. The same power shall be vested in the Executive Committee appointed by this Conference between the sitting of the Conferences.
- 4. That these resolutions shall be submitted to each local church in the Western Conference for adoption during the Conference year.
- 5. That these resolutions shall be in effect for the next Conference year and if adopted by the local churches during the Conference year, it shall be a standing resolution.

COOL SPRING CHURCH.—The Board of Trustees report that they have examined the matter of Cool Spring church. They find that the church belongs to Dudley Peed.

On motion the church at Cool Spring be dropped from the list of churches.

On motion we send the Mission money of this Conference to the Treasurer of the State Mission Board.

Devotional Committee report services as follows: Tonight at the church—W. T. Johnson open and A. R. Flowers preach. Tonight at Piney Grove—J. T. Butler; at Kenly—E. T. Phillips; at Micro—L. B. Grice. Sunday at 11 A. M.—W. M. Howell open and J. K. Ruffin preach.

Petitions were taken up for the next Conference and it was voted to be held with the church at People's Chapel, near Elm City, N. C., commencing on Thursday before the third Sunday in October, A. D. 1915.

Eld. S. D. Scalf is to preach the introductory sermon at the next Conference and W. M. Howell is his alternate.

On motion the incidental funds be turned over to the minute funds.

On motion there be 1,000 minutes printed. That the clerk prepare the copy, have the minutes printed and distributed and that he be allowed \$10.00 for his services.

On motion N. D. Wiggs be allowed \$15 of the Educational fund and that the remainder be turned over to D. B. Sasser to aid the educational work in which he is to engage.

A vote of thanks was tendered the community for the very liberal manner in which they entertained this Conference.

On motion the Conference close to meet at the time and place above mentioned. Prayer by Eld. W. E. Anderson.

4. That we use our own literature and request our literature editor to get us out a small leaflet or card for the primary department that our literature be ready in time,

so as not to lose any lessons in the study.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF ELDER J. W. WOOD

Ed.l J. W. Wood was born June 11, 1882. He was married January 3, 1904. Joined the Free Will Baptist church at Saints Delight, Franklin county in September, 1904. Was licensed to preach the Gospel on the 14th of October, 1912. He was ordained at the State Convention at Bailey, N. C., on the 18th day of September, 1913 by Elds. J. W. Valentine, J. E. Davis and B. W. Brother Wood died in John Hopkins hospital on the 12th day of February, 1914. His disease was a stone in the bladded and he died from the effects of an operation to have the stone removed. His stay on earth was 31 years, 8 months and one day. He leaves a good wife and five small children. We desire to commend his widow and children to the charity of the Free Will Baptist denomination at large. God help us all to aid their mother in taking care of the little ones and help us to spread a mantle of charity over the errors of our brother and to imitate his every virtue, that we may say when life is over, "Return thou unto thy rest, O my soul, for the Lord hath dealt bountifully with thee."
