

The Twenty-ninth Annual Session of the Western Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina met with the church at People's Chapel, Wilson County, North Carolina, October 14, 1915.

Eld. S. D. Scalf, who was appointed, preached the introductory sermon. Text II Sam. 23:11. "Shammah."

After a recess of one hour, Conference met in regular session and organized by electing Eld. L. T. Phillips, Moderator; who called to his assistance Eld. B. B. Deans: Eld. E. T. Phillips was elected Clerk and called to hi assistance as Reading Clerk, Eld. R. F. Piittman.

After the organization, prayer was offered by Eld. J. K. Ruffin.

On motion, the Moderator be empowered to invite any visiting brethren that are or may be present to seats in the body.

The list of ministers was called and the state of the ministry of each was inquired into.

The written reports of those who had them, according to the action of last conference, were handed in and read as the list was called as near as possible.

Eld. J. K. Ruffin was appointed as Chairman of a Committee to write a sketch of the life of Eld. S. A. Harris to appear in the minutes.

On motion, the conference give Eld. W. B. Everett a letter of dismission from this conference to unite with the Eastern Conference.

On motion the list of ministers be headed with the name of B. H. Boykin and T. H. Matthews be second.

Devotional Committee report that J. H. Whitley open and N. D. Wiggs preach to-night.

Conference adjourned till 9 o'clock Friday morning. Prayer by J. H. Whitley.

FRIDAY MORNING

Conference met as per adjournment. Prayer by W. M. Howell.

Minutes of Thursday read and approved.

The list of the churches was called and reports received and ead. (See table of Statistics.)

On motion Eld. L. B. Grice was put on the Examining Board in place of Eld. C. D. Howell who was absent: Grice to act for this meeting.

On motion the church at Zebulon, N. C., be received and entered on the list of churches for this conference.

Devotional Committee report that J. H. Whitley open and N. D. Wiggs preach to-day at 11 o'clock. (They did not open and preach Thursday night owing to rain, therefore they were re-appointed.)

G. W. Ferrell open and E. C. Morris preach at 3 o'clock p. m. to-day.

On motion the church at Pleasant Union, Nash County, be turned over to the trustees of the conference for their action.

The Book of Discipline as amended by the committee appointed from the State Convention at its recent session at Shady Grove church was adopted. Vote 66 ayes to 4 rcss.

It was agreed that a burial service might be added to the Pcok of Discipline for the use of ministers; but that a large number should be printed without the service for the laity in general.

It was found that the resolution offered at the last conference by L. Phillips to be offered to the individual churches for adoption rejection was rejected by the churches.

Devotional Committee report that L. L. Smith open and E. T. Phillips preach to-night at the church and that W. M. Howell preach to-night at Enon M. B. church.

The report of the Examining Board was adopted. (See reports of Boards and Committees.)

On motion, the name of B. P. Jones be enrolled on the list of Ordained Ministers.

D. R. Sasser, who was appointed at last conference to work for the Seminary, reported that he had collected \$188.00. That he finally became discouraged and quit work. He now reports that the school is in better condition than it ever has been become and that he is now very much encouraged over its future prospects. He further reported that he did not make any charge for what he had done, but that he gave it heartily and freely to the school.

A standing vote of thanks was given to Bro. Sasser to liberal and great work that he had done for the Ayden Seminary

On motion, we accept the report of Bro. D. B. Sasser and that we continue him in said work. Further that we instruct the Trustees of this Conference to borrow the \$3,000.00, pledged by this conference to build a brick dormitory at Ayden or that we borrow what we lack of having the tmount. That we co-operate with the trustees of the Seminary in borrowing the entire amount necessary for the building of said dormitory, and that the trustees act immediately.

(Said motion or resolution was offered by R. F. Pittman and adopted by the body.) Conference then closed with prayer

by Eld. J. T. Bundy.

The conference voted \$11.00 from the mission fund, making the total amount raised for the Zebulon church \$30.00.

It was decided that the next Annual Conference be held with the Church at Friendship, Johnston County, near Middlesex, a station on the Norfolk-Southern Railroad about midway between Raleigh and Wilson.

L. B. Grice is to preach the introductory sermon at the next conference and N. D. Wiggs is his alternate.

A vote of thanks was tendered to the community of People's Chapel for the very generous manner in which they have entertained this conference.

On motion there be 1,000 minutes printed and distributed as formerly and that we allow the clerk \$10.00 for his services.

At 11 o'clock, R. F. Pittman preached. After the sermon, a hymn was sung and the parting hand extended among the brotherhood.

Conference closed to meet with the church at Friendship, Johnston County, commencing on Thursday before the second Sunday in October, 1915.

ELD. SIDNEY HARRIS

Your scribe that was appointed to chronicle the life and death of Eld. Sidney Harris begs to say that he has failed to gather the details in full surrounding his ministry. Eld. Harris was born at Farmville, Pitt County, N. C., in the year of our Lord 1835 on September 22nd. He was the son of Timothy Harris and Farsby Harris, whise maiden name was Prince. He was married in the year 1852 to Miss Mary Ann Banks of Pitt County, who preceded him several years. Eld. Harris united with the church near King's X Roads in the 14th year of his life. I have found no record when he was ordained to the ministry. Bro. Harris was a man of afflictions and was not able to travel extensively and preach. He was one of our best men and his life was a sermon of its self. He was a Free Will Baptist first and last and died in the triumphs of a living faith.
